



Community Description

The Blair Community Recreation Plan covers all of Blair Township, a 36 square mile township located in central Grand Traverse County, south of Traverse City, which is the nearest and largest urban center within the broader regional area. The Plan addresses all aspects of recreation planning and recreational services within Blair Township.



A description of the Township's social and physical characteristics is provided below with 2010 U.S. Census Data unless noted.

Social Characteristics

Population and Population Trends

With 8,209 people, Blair Township comprised 9.4% of the population of Grand Traverse County's year 2010 population of 86,986, an increase of 1.1% from 2000. From 2000 to 2010, Blair Township grew an average of 2.73% per year in population, far surpassing the State's 0.6% loss of population during that same period of time.

Grand Traverse County Planning and Development Department's population projections indicate that Grand Traverse County as a whole will continue to grow at a high and steady pace over the next twelve years, with a projected population of 106,600 by 2020 and 125,244 by 2030. Population growth in Blair Township is expected to mirror that trend.

Number and Location of Households

There were 2,296 households in the Township in 2010, an increase of 27.4% from 2000. As Census information for the Township is not divided into parts of census tracts and block groups, detailed Census information on the location within Blair Township of individual households is not available. Based on the pattern of State land ownership and local knowledge of Township officials and residents, however, it is known that the most intense concentrations of residential development within the Township are in the northwest and, to a lesser degree the northeast, areas of the Township. Residential development is less intensive in the southern areas of the Township.

Population Distribution

Comparatively, the Township has a younger population than the County overall and is also younger than the State overall. In 2010, the median age of 34.2 years was 7.1 years younger in the Township than the County median age of 41.3 years and 4.7 years younger than the State median age of 38.9 years. 38.0% of the Township's population was under 20 in 2010 compared to 24.5% to 26.9% for the County and the State. This is demonstrated in the following table.

The Township supports a younger population than does the County or the State overall. In 2010, only 8.6% of the Township's population was over 65 while 14.4% of the County's population was over 65. This indicates that the Blair Township community has a need to provide recreation services and programs for a younger population. As the population within the Township ages, however, recreation services and programs geared towards an aging population will become a higher priority.



The Blair Township community was somewhat unequal in gender ratio in 2010, compared to County and State statistics. While we normally expect to see a slightly higher ratio of women in a population, the Township was 50.1% male, down from 50.5% in 2010. The County was 49.3% male. These statistics compare to a State population that was 49.1% male in 2010.

Location of Populations with Unique Needs

Census information for the Township is not divided into parts of census tracts and block groups. Detailed information on the location within Blair Township of individuals having unique needs is therefore not available.

Local knowledge of Township officials and residents does not indicate any geographic concentration of individuals having unique needs on the basis of disabilities, low income, or age.

There is no population of ethnic background within the Township having a sufficient geographic concentration to warrant specific needs consideration.

Physical Characteristics

Land Use Patterns

Land use patterns within Blair Township have largely been influenced by the Pere Marquette Forest, the natural features of the Township, and the location of the state highways running through the Township.

Pere Marquette Forest is located in the central eastern portion of Blair Township. Comprising some 3,900 acres, this forest establishes a low intensity and low density character for the surrounding area and the eastern portion of the Township.

Also prominent within the Township is the Boardman River and the Boardman River Valley which cut through the northeast corner of the Township on their way towards Grand Traverse Bay to the north. A state designated Natural River, the Boardman River is a unique environmental feature that is treasured and enjoyed by many outdoor enthusiasts. Development along the river consists of both permanent and seasonal residential dwellings of a generally low density character. Higher intensity development has not yet taken place along this natural corridor.



The major transportation corridors within the Township are State highways US-31 running south from Traverse City to Chum's Corners, and then west towards Benzie County, and M-37 which runs in tandem with US-31 south from Traverse City but continuing south through the Chum's Corner area towards Wexford County to the south. These road systems have heavily influenced the locations of industrial and commercial development, which is located primarily along the US-31 corridor north and west of the Chum's Corner intersection. This development area consists of some 225 acres of commercial land uses, predominantly of a strip commercial nature, and 200 acres of industrial development.

Residential development is most concentrated within the northeast and northwest corners of the Township. Low density single family residential uses are predominant in both of these areas and, to a much less intensive nature, throughout the balance of the Township.

Vacant unforested lands and limited agricultural uses comprise the balance of the Township. These uses are not concentrated but are instead located throughout the extent of the municipality.

Water Resources

Surface drainage in Blair Township is affected by its soil types and topography. Blair Township's drainage system consists almost entirely of a natural system that includes the Boardman River (a state designated Natural River), as well as other smaller streams, swales and gullies. Water bodies and wetlands collectively cover approximately 3,688 acres of the Township, a little over 16% of the total Township.

Some of these watercourses are prone to flooding during major wet weather events. Though floodplain areas have not been specifically determined by the Township, steep slopes or valley walls may delineate floodplain limits. Recreational lands and their development within flood prone areas should be planned so that the floodway and floodplain areas can function properly as flood control systems.

Silver Lake is the largest inland lake in Blair Township. The portion of the lake, which lies in Blair Township, is approximately 210 acres in area. Silver Lake's water level has been established through a court order to permit operation of a manmade lake outlet and drainage into Beitner Creek. The draw down of the water is subject to water quality and temperature conditions established in a permit issued by the MDNR.

Wetlands are complex ecological systems that function in a number of beneficial ways. Wetlands reduce flood hazards by providing additional storm water storage. Wetlands that overlay groundwater recharge areas improve groundwater quality by filtering the water as it percolates through the soil. Wetlands located along a watercourse protect surface water quality by filtering surface water run-off. Finally, wetlands are highly productive ecosystems, providing an essential habitat to much of Michigan's fish and wildlife at some time in their life cycle.

The Goemaere-Anderson Wetland Protection Act, Act 203 of the Public Acts of 1979, was enacted by the State of Michigan to protect wetlands by restricting their use to certain activities (such as fishing, farming, among others) while permitting other activities only after permission and approval by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, and this act has been amended by P.A. 451 of 1994. Permits are approved based on a review of an environmental assessment filed by the petitioner and upon the finding that the activity is in the public interest. Under the Wetland Protection Act, the following wetlands are protected:

- 1. Those that are contiguous to an inland lake, pond, river, stream or similar natural watercourses, or one of the Great Lakes.
- 2. Those that are five acres or larger in area.
- 3. Determined by the M-DEQ to be "essential to the preservation of the natural resources of the state from pollution, impairment, or destruction".

The National Wetland Inventory (NWI), U.S. Department of Interior, Fish and Wildlife Division, based on high altitude aerial photographs taken in November 1981, mapped wetlands in Blair Township. NWI maps identify wetlands by type.

There are numerous wetland areas within the Boardman River Valley and Hoosier Valley which traverses Sections 9, 14, 15, and 16. The Weidenhamer Swamp is an exceptionally large wetland area, spanning portions of Sections 19, 20, 28, 27, and 26.

Topography

The topography of Blair Township was formed as the last ice sheet of the Wisconsin glacial period retreated. As the glaciers receded, two major landforms were created: moraines and outwash plains and spillways. Two major moraine systems cross Blair Township. The Manistee Moraine passes through the northeastern quadrant of the Township. The Port Huron Moraine traverses the southern tier of the Township. Between these moraines lie glacial spillways and outwash plains.

The Soil Conservation Service Soil Survey of Grand Traverse County describes the Township's topography as ranging from level to gently sloping to steep. United States Geological Survey maps depict the topography of Blair Township and provide contour data in 10-foot intervals, as well as spot elevations. Land elevations range from 700 feet to 1,100 feet above sea level. The lowest points of surface elevation are found along the Boardman River. The highest points of elevation are found in the southwest quadrant of the Township, most notably in Sections 31 and 32. Areas which have little topographic relief (level or flat) are predominately found in the midsection of the Township. Very steep slopes (25 to 45 percent) are found in proximity to the Boardman River and along the northern slopes of the Port Huron Moraine system.



The hilly terrain of the Grand Traverse Bay area contributes to its visual character and defines many of its scenic views. While not as extreme within Blair Township as it is elsewhere within the County, recreational land uses and developments should take care not to interfere with those scenic views visible from the public roadways and waterways.

Woodlands

At the time of settlement, much of Blair Township was forested. The three major groups of forest trees were: 1) sugar maple, beech, elm and other hardwoods on loams and limy soils; 2) white pine and red pine stands on low fertility soils; and, 3) white-cedar, balsam fir, and black spruce in the wetland areas.



Much of the timber resources of Blair Township were exploited by forest products industry during the mid to late 19th Century. Large areas of timber were also cleared in an attempt to farm the area's sandy soils. After the timber resources were exhausted and most of the farming operations failed, many of these parcels became tax delinquent and eventually were acquired by the State of Michigan and made a part of the Fife Lake State Forest which is now the Pere Marquette State Forest. Subsequently, through natural reseeding, the deforested lands are now filled with stands of aspen, oak, and pin cherry, among other species. Total forest cover within the Township is now approximately 7,637 acres, or about 33% of the Township. The Pere Marquette Forest comprises 3,900 of these forested acres. An additional 3,317 acres of land, approximately 14%, is described as freshwater forested/shrub wetland.

Woodland areas are complex ecological systems and, consequently, provide multiple benefits to the environment and its wildlife and human inhabitants. Woodlands play a role in flood protection by slowing the flow of surface run-off to allow for greater storm water infiltration. Woodlands also reduce air pollutants by absorbing certain air borne pollutants. In addition to providing wildlife habitants, forest vegetation moderates effects of winds and temperatures while stabilizing and enriching the soil. For human inhabitants, forested areas offer a visual and audio barrier that is considered aesthetically pleasing and offer unique opportunities for recreation and relaxation.

Woodland resources contribute greatly to the Township's environmental quality. The conservation of woodlots will play a positive role in maintaining and enhancing the future environmental character of

the Township. The incorporation of woodland resources into recreation planning can have a significant and positive impact on these important resources.

Vehicular Transportation Network

There are two primary highways located within Blair Township. Federal highway US-31 runs south from Traverse City to Chum's Corner and then turns west, running towards Green Lake Township and then Benzie County. State highway M-37 runs in tandem with US-31 south from Traverse City to Chum's Corner, but then continues south through Mayfield Township and into Wexford County. Both highways function as high volume transportation corridors running through the Township, providing fast and efficient connection to the broader regional area.



In addition to the primary highway system, a network of county primary and secondary roads run throughout the Township. Most County roads are hard-surfaced. This road system provides an effective collection system for the primary County, State and Federal road systems.

Collectively, the existing road and highway system provides easy access into Blair Township for permanent residents, seasonal residents, and visitors. For Township residents, it provides easy access to larger centers including Traverse City to the north, Kalkaska, Grayling and Gaylord to the east and northeast, Cadillac to the southeast, and the Benzie County area to the west. This ease of access will be an important consideration and factor if the development of recreational facilities intended to serve more than just the local population is contemplated.

Environmental Issues

Due to the extensive waterway and wetland system in the township, ground water contamination is a concern with any development project. Any lands considered for recreational development, particularly those requiring extensive landform alteration, will need to be assessed for impact on the ground water.

Within the State forest in the eastern portion of the Township, a number of oil wells are present. Typical of any well activity, these facilities present possible contamination concerns. State monitoring of these wells will be necessary to ensure their continued safe operation.

There are no other environmental concerns within the limits of Blair Township, or nearby, of which the Township is aware at this time.

Administrative Structure


Boards/Commissions and Agency Relationships

The Blair Township Parks Committee that had functioned under the previous community recreation plan has ceased to function. The Blair Township Board remains responsible for all decision-making relative to recreation planning, recreation facilities operations, and budgeting within the Township.

At the County level, the Grand Traverse County Board of Commissioners has established an independent Parks and Recreation Commission. This Commission is responsible for all supervision, maintenance and financing of the County park system. Included in the County Parks Commission responsibilities is the maintenance and operation of the Grand Traverse Natural Education Reserve, including Beitner Park that is located within the limits of Blair Township. There is no formal relationship between the County Parks Commission and Blair Township.

In 1987, Blair Township passed Ordinance #112 to provide for the use, protection, regulation and control of Township-owned park property. This ordinance was amended by the Blair Township Board of Trustees on December 8, 2015.

Recreation Budgets & Current Funding Sources

In the last three years, the Township has budgeted \$59,900 in 2016, \$47,400 in 2017, and \$94,250 in 2018. This budgeted amount covers wages for the Township's groundskeeper, FICA expenses, and maintenance, supplies, services and repairs for all Township recreation parks and facilities. In general this budgeted amount has been generally consistent over recent years; however in 2018, there was a significant capital outlay that was not expended in previous years.

Within the Township, citizen driven efforts are also ongoing to raise funds for improvements to the facilities at Blair Township Park. The success of these efforts will provide additional financial resources to the Township for recreation purposes at Blair Township Park.

In addition to resources budgeted for by the Township and expected through citizen efforts discussed above, the possibility of land donations and special community fund raising campaigns will be explored for individual recreation projects. Community service groups will be utilized to assist in fund raising activities, as well as recreational program development and operation.

Description of the Planning and Public Input Process

Review of Existing Plans


In preparation for the development of the planning and survey materials, existing master planning and recreational planning documents were reviewed. The Northwest Michigan Regional Non-Motorized Plan of 2008 was reviewed. The plan included two specific projects for Blair Township: 1) construction of a trail that connects Traverse City to Cadillac through Kingsley, and 2) Extension of the Betsie Valley Trail through Chum's Corner to Traverse City and the TART system.

The Grand Traverse Parks and Recreation Plan 2018-2023 did not include any direct work within Blair Township, but it does recommend constructing non-motorized connections throughout the County.

The 2018 Blair Township Master Plan identified encouraging more parks and trails as one of its seven goals with several objectives including: 1) promote use of State and Federal land for recreational use; 2) collaboration with regional agencies including Traverse Area Recreation Trails (TART) and other municipalities; 3) explore grant funding for trail development and linkages through the Township; 4) support development of a regional trail network; 5) develop an up-to-date Park and Recreation Plan. The Master Plan also stated the desire to connect the TART through Chum's Corner to Interlochen and the Betsie Valley Trail. In the Action Plan, the Master Plan does not address additional park land, but does support additional regional motorized and non-motorized trails including a non-motorized trail along US-31 and partnership with the Grand Traverse County Road Commission to build shared pathways along primary county roads.

Public Input

Public involvement and input has formed a key component since the initiation of this plan preparation process. As outlined above, public comments were first sought during the preparation of the Blair Township Master Plan through a community survey distributed in August through October 2017. The survey results, among other matters of community importance, identified a desire for more recreational trails and opportunities within the Township.



As background, one of the outcomes from the revision to the Township Master Plan in 2003 was the realization that the existing Blair Township Park was underutilized and that the residents were not satisfied with the current programing. To address this issue, the Township hired a consultant who assisted in the development of the Township's first Parks and Recreation Plan, which was adopted in 2006. To be eligible for funding through the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (M-DNR), the community must have an adopted Parks and Recreation Plan that is less than five years old. The Township in August 2018 contracted with Wade Trim Associates to complete an update to the existing Parks and Recreation Plan and to ensure compliance with the M-DNR planning requirements.

The following public input steps took place during the preparations of this plan:

- A recreation survey was distributed from Monday October 15, 2018 to Thursday November 15, 2018 with over 216 respondents (over three percent of the Township population). The results illustrated a desire for additional recreational activities, services, and facilities be planned and operated by the Township. There was strong interest for a community center, and the over 70% of the respondents were definitely or probably willing to support a millage for recreational programming, new facilities, and purchase of new park land.
- Met with Recreation Plan Ad Hoc Committee on Thursday December 6, 2018 to discuss results of community survey, resource inventory, goals and objectives, and action program.
- Thirty Day Review Period ran from Friday December 7, 2018 to Sunday January 6, 2019
- A formal public hearing was held by the Blair Township Board of Trustees on Tuesday January 8, 2018
- Following the public hearing, the Blair Township Board of Trustees on Tuesday January 8, 2018, adopted the Blair Township Community Recreation Plan 2019-2023 by resolution.

Key Persons Involved in Plan Development

An Ad Hoc Committee was formed that was primarily responsible for the preparation of this Community Recreation Plan and review of the proposed plan recommendations. The Committee met and discussed the results of the community survey, the goals and objectives, and the action plan.


October - November 2018 Recreation Survey Summary

A survey form was prepared and a special link was created to the survey via SurveyMonkey.com. Over 215 responses were received which accounts for over three percent of all Township residents. This survey was open from Monday October 15, 2018 through Thursday November 15, 2018. The survey was distributed via listservs, posted on Township social media, postings at sites around the Township, on the Township website, and circulation via emails from members of the Township Board and staff. This level of response was high for a volunteer-circulated survey.

Of the respondents, 76.9% live in the Township and 51% reported that they have lived in the Township for 11 or more years. Well over half (69.7%) of the respondents described themselves as living in the Grawn or Chums Corner area, 9.6% said that they lived on or nearby Silver Lake, and 20.8% described themselves as living in a rural part of the Township. These results are very similar to those found in the 2005 recreation survey that was mailed to all of the residents. Of those responding, 39.4% were between the ages of 25 to 44 years, 44.4% were between the years of 45 to 64 years of age; and 13.9% described themselves as over 65 years of age.

One question the survey asked "Thinking about the ideal number of parks in the community, do you believe that overall?" Many respondents desired more parkland while few thought there was too much parkland with 58.9% believe that much more or somewhat more parkland is need. See table below.

↑ Ceded Question 7: Thinking about the ideal number of parks in the community, do you believe that overall... Blair Township Recreation Survey, October - November 2018




Over three quarters of the respondents (78.2%) rated the Township doing an "excellent" or "pretty good" in providing recreational programs and facilities in Blair Township with 12.3% fair and 1.1% poor with 8.4% "undecided/don't know".

The survey asked respondents about their desires for non-motorized pathways, sidewalks, and bikeways. Over eighty-one percent (81.7%) strongly agreed or agreed with the statement "Should the Township be actively developing bike/walking paths to connect various sites and destinations together while only 14.4% neither agreed or disagreed with 3.3% disagreeing and one person strongly disagreeing. This question was followed up with a question about how often people would utilize a trail/pathway that was developed near their home. See table below.



To assist with facility planning, an extensive question was asked about the desire for certain types of recreational facilities within the Township. Indoor swimming pool, variety of trails and paths, additional nature areas, and sledding and toboggan runs all scored highly. Though the number of tennis courts in the Township falls below national recreational standards, 40.5% of the respondents believe that there is enough available now. The final three survey questions explored the general interest in funding for parks and recreation. These questions address funding for:

- 2) new parks and recreational facilities (community center, new ice skating facilities, outdoor swimming pools, etc.); and
- 3) new parkland.

The results for all three of the questions were very similar with those responding:

Definitely Would -	between 33.1% and 35.4%
Probably Would	between 45.4% and 46.0%
Probably Would Not	between 12.8% and 15.3%
Definitely Would Not	between 5.5% and 6.8%

These questions illustrate that the community would likely consider positively a special millage(s) to expand recreational activities within Blair Township.

All of the results from the recreational survey are included in Appendix A including all of the written responses to several of the survey questions.





Barrier-Free Compliance

In evaluating and improving facilities, the Township will conform to the guidelines listed in the U.S. Americans with Disabilities Act, Michigan Barrier Free Design Act, and to the guidelines developed by the Architectural and Transportation Barriers Compliance Board. Blair Township Park is rated as a four (4) for Park Accessibility. Significant portions of the site are accessible for individuals with a broad range of disabilities, but the ballfields and community garden are not fully accessible.



The small park parcel has only been developed with a sewer lift station on a portion of the site, parking area, and woodchip pathway. It is rated as a one (1) as the site does not have any readily accessible facilities.

Description of Methods Used to Conduct the Recreation Inventories


Township Recreation Opportunities

Blair Township controls Blair Township Park and a second, yet unnamed park that was willed to the Township by Elmer and Rose Schmuckal. The Township Park is developed for mostly active recreational purposes, a detailed inventory of which was provided by Blair Township staff. The second park is only modestly developed at this time with a parking area and short walking path.

In addition to the inventory provided by Township records, a visual inspection of the Township Park, as well as all churches, schools and subdivision parks was conducted. Recreational elements within the Township, as identified by the Grand Traverse County Regional Recreation Plan, were added to this inventory. A detailed review of websites and random resident interviews supplemented the recorded information. A review of the Township inventory by the Township Ad Hoc Committee, with their extensive local knowledge of recreational opportunities, completed the Township recreational opportunities.

Regional Recreation Opportunities

Regional recreation opportunities were identified from a number of available sources, starting with the Grand Traverse County Regional Recreation Plan and the Recreation Plans of the adjacent Townships. Building from this base of information, websites and random resident interviews were utilized to add other known recreation opportunities to the inventory. Once compiled, the regional recreation inventory was reviewed and discussed by the Blair Township Ad Hoc Committee. The experience and local knowledge of this Committee completed the regional recreation inventory for this plan.



Evaluation of Existing Facilities Standards



Evaluation of Non-Motorized Facilities and Non-Motorized Transportation Planning

There is an extensive network of existing trails within the Pere Marquette State Forest, including the Shore-to-Shore Trail; however, there are many Township's traffic generators that are not yet connected via non-motorized trails. Over the last twenty years, Blair Township and the Grand Traverse region have begun to develop a regional non-motorizied network; but, there are still significant gaps remaining within both the intra-Township and the broader regional networks.



Non-motorized trails assist in supporting regional connectivity and encouraging recreation activities. Residents who live near trails are more likely to make trips by bicycle or walking than those residents that do not have nearby access to non-motorized transportation routes. Non-motorized trails also provide equitable options to the large minority of Township residents that do not have access to a vehicle. These residents may be too young to drive, too old to safely drive, disabled, cannot afford a vehicle, or have lost

their license privilege. In 2014, Southeastern Michigan Council of Governments estimated that 1/3 of the Michigan population does not drive or have access to a motor vehicle. Non-motorized routes allow these individuals to safely and easily traverse the Township to conduct their daily lives.

The recently adopted Township Master Plan includes Recreational Trails map that includes all of the County Primary Roads as potential connectors as a part of a Non-Motorized network. These primary county roads can easily accept eight-food wide paved shoulders that would provide a safe network, even on busier roads. Goal Five of the plan is to encourage more parks and non-motorized trails that would better connect the Township to regional facilities.


The attached Non-Motorized Transportation Map combines existing and potential trails with connections to trails in adjacent townships that meets the Master Plan's goal for the development of a trail network.

Since 2010, Complete Streets has become an accepted principle for the design of streets in the United States. That year, the U.S. Department of Transportation issued a policy statement that pedestrian and bicycle accommodation should be a part of road design and encouraged the states to follow suit. In the same year, the State of Michigan adopted PA 135 that required Complete Streets concepts to be evaluated to determine if relevant accommodations are necessary or appropriate when any road construction activities are undertaken by State-supported funds.

With Complete Streets design, all users of the roadway need to be accommodated as necessary. Previously, the motorized users (cars and trucks mostly) were considered while the pedestrian, bicyclist, and transit rider were rarely considered. Complete Streets are based upon bringing equity into the design process, and Complete Streets are safer, improve public health by encouraging non-motorized trips, while supporting economic development.

To ensure the use of Complete Streets concepts during the road design process, the Blair Township Board of Trustees should pass a Complete Streets resolution calling upon both the Grand Traverse Road Commission and the Michigan Department of Transportation to utilize Complete Streets design techniques for all road projects within the Township.

Constructing Complete Streets would significantly further the development of non-motorized options within the Township.



Goals and Objectives

The Goals and Objectives of the Township's Community Recreation Plan 2006 - 2011 plan were evaluated by the Ad Hoc Committee at its meeting on December 6, 2018 to determine ongoing applicability. In addition, new Goals and Objectives were added in response to the survey results.



Broad Goals and Objectives:

- 1. Provide recreational opportunities and programming that will encourage active, healthy lifestyles for children and adult residents of the Township.
- 2. Provide a range of recreational activities and facilities for all age groups.
- 3. Provide a range of recreational activities that will encourage year-round healthy lifestyles for all residents.
- 4. Locate, secure and develop recreational opportunities in diversified locations throughout the Township to better serve all geographic areas of the Township.
- 5. Provide for improved connection of motorized and non-motorized trail systems to those areas of the Township providing recreational, civic and core commercial services to residents and visitors.
- 6. Provide public recreation opportunities that will be available at little or no additional costs to Township residents.
- 7. Evaluate establishing a millage to fund additional recreational programming, facilities, and park land in the Township.

Specific Goals and Objectives:


1. Acquire, develop and expand an interconnected trail system that encourages non-motorized means of transportation between recreational, civic and commercial services within the Township and connectivity to the developing regional trail system.

- 2. Preserve open space areas and scenic views in the development of recreational opportunities and facilities.
- 3. Encourage the development of neighborhood parks that have been and will be set aside within existing and developing residential subdivisions through private funding.
- 4. Modernize and expand existing recreational equipment and playgrounds at Blair Township Park.
- 5. Enhance the usability and safety of the Blair Township Park for all demographic groups by improving its lighting, landscaping, pavilions, restrooms, handicapped accessibility, and splash pad.
- 6. To expand use of local recreational programs and facilities, better inform the public about available recreation resources through newsletters, websites, signs, maps, and other means.
- 7. Re-establish and maintain an outdoor ice skating rink with warming hut at the Blair Township Park.
- 8. Make improvements to the walking trail at the Blair Township Park, including expansion and lighting of the trail.
- Develop a landscaping plan that will allow donors to choose to sponsor plantings that fit into a
 unified planting plan for the park, including planting canopy shade trees to develop naturally
 shaded areas for spectators at all ballfields, courts, playgrounds, etc.
- 10. Add stripping to existing tennis court to allow its use as a pickleball court.
- 11. Make on-going improvements to the Blair Township Park including picnic area and barbeque stations, concession stands, benches, increased landscaping including canopy shade trees, and perimeter fencing.
- 12. Maintain and enhance existing ball field facilities at Blair Township Park.
- 13. Improve connections between regional snowmobile trail systems and supportive commercial service facilities within the Township.
- 14. Provide the facilities and programming for children ages 4-18 to play organized competitive tee-ball and baseball.
- 15. Provide the facilities and programming for children and adults to play recreational baseball and softball.
- 16. Provide the facilities and programming for adults to play shuffleboard.
- 17. Provide the facilities for recreational basketball activities including the construction of a second basketball court.
- 18. Develop and provide recreational facilities appropriate for an aging Township population.

- 19. Have Board of Trustees pass a resolution in support of Complete Streets and support Grand Traverse County Road Commission in developing local bike lanes and paths intra-Township that tie into the County's regional trail system.
- 20. To address the lack of Township-owned facilities in the densely populated parts of the Township and to respond to the lack of facilities within other parts of the Township, prepare grant applications to the M-DNR to purchase and develop additional park land in the northwest and in the eastern portions of the Township.
- 21. Evaluate the creation of a community center to serve the needs of Blair Township.
- 22. Based upon interest, explore expanding the community garden at Blair Township Park.
- 23. Propose changes to the Township Zoning Ordinance that require developers of properties along identified Township bike routes to install the paths across their properties as a part of their overall site development.

Action Program

Blair Township has committed to pursuing the action schedule below to meet the goals of improving recreational opportunities for its citizens. The priorities and action plan were set as follows.



Priority A Projects

- Projects identified as being of highest priority in the community survey (park improvements, connections to regional trails);
- Projects of a local recreation nature (park and field facilities);
- Projects with limited budget implications capable of early construction and implementation (park improvements, cooperative trail connections).

Priority B Projects

- Projects identified by the Parks Committee or community survey to be high priority item but regional in nature (development of regional trails systems).
- Projects needed to meet national standards, high cost item or low interest at this time (tennis courts).

Priority C Projects

- Projects which scored high on the community survey but are not of immediate need in the community to meet accepted standards or have high maintenance costs (ice skating rink)
- Projects with moderate to high support on the community survey that serve a regional need and may be part of a large area community facility and that would involve significant costs (skate park).

Blair Township Park is the largest, most developed and most heavily used recreational facility within Blair Township. Improvements to this park have been made over a number of years and continue to be made. Ongoing local fundraising efforts to help support new playground equipment demonstrate the continued community support for this park and the recreational opportunities it provides. Moving forward, it is the collective intent of the community that active and passive recreational opportunities continue to be provided, that such opportunities be enhanced, and that new opportunities be provided. Enhancements and new opportunities presently identified are listed above, but are not considered exhaustive of the opportunities and facilities that may be provided at Blair Township Park.

Existing snowmobile trails coming into the Township from the south east provide a relatively untapped recreational and economic opportunity to Blair Township. Connection to and extension of these trails into the commercial areas of Chums Corners and Grawn will provide additional economic benefit to these areas. Connection of the Traverse City/Kalkaska trails to the east and the Benzie County trail systems to the west will provide greater attraction to local and visiting snowmobilers, thus providing both recreational and economic benefit to not only Blair Township but also a broad part of northern lower Michigan. Potential trail extensions and locations are identified on the Trail Facilities Map, but alternative, yet unknown trail locations will also be considered should they become available to the Township.






