Riverton City Street Sweeping: Help us Keep Streets Clean!

The street sweeping truck is in use all year, except during wet weather and when temperatures are below freezing. One street sweeping operator takes on 130 miles of road every work day. To help us sweep as much dirt and leaves as possible we need your help to keep roads clear of obstructions, including: over-hanging trees, vehicles, trailers, dirt piles, forgotten trash receptacles, basketball hoops and temporary gutter ramps. The occasional parked or visiting vehicle is not a big concern because these vehicles are usually gone the next time around. It is the regular parking of vehicles during work hours and other obstacles that are abandoned or stored in the road that hinders sweeping capabilities. Thank you for your help as we strive to increase the productivity of our sweeping operations.

Promoting Health & Safety in Your Yard

Now is the best time to stress your lawn by watering less. Stressing your lawn causes the roots to grow deeper to look for water. When the roots are forced to grow deeper, they reach a level farther away from the surface

making them less vulnerable to heat and lack of water. Also, most of Riverton's soil is a clay base. The clay base will hold water longer and is considered to be a cooler soil than top soil. If the roots are allowed to reach the clay soil, your lawn will stress less and become healthier, requiring less water for maintenance.

In addition, if you have a fire hydrant in front of your home, help keep the hydrant accessible by removing surrounding weeds. If there is a fire on your street, the fire department will be able to respond better if they do not have to search for the hydrant. Keeping your water meter accessible by mowing around it is also important and will be greatly appreciated by your water meter reader.


