Mayor Bill's Message

We are pleased to announce the completion and release of a historical pictorial book, "Riverton City, Utah: Looking Back One Hundred and Fifty Years". This elegant new book was prepared in honor of the 2015 Sesquicentennial Celebration and contains new photography never shared before with the public. You can purchase this book at the Utility Billing Department in City Hall, and Peterson's Fresh Market for \$35. There is a limited supply of these books. Four hundred of these books were printed and more than 100 have already been sold.

March 17: "Goin' Green Day"

As part of our Sesquicentennial Celebration, I have issued a Proclamation declaring Tuesday, March 17, as "Goin' Green Day". As part of this day, large recycle bins for glass, cardboard, and any recycle items you place into your blue recycle bins will be available at the Riverton City Hall parking lot and at CR Hamilton Sports Complex, from 7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. I also encourage you to consider making a plan that day for driving less, avoiding idling your automobile, tuning up your gasoline operated yard equipment, and looking at other ways you can reduce your carbon footprint.

Take some time this month to examine what you throw away in your trash can and determine what you can put in your recycle can.

- **Recycle Items:** food boxes, boxboard, paper bags, newspapers, junk mail, office and school paper, plastic bottles and containers #1 - #7, cardboard, tin and steel cans, aluminum foil and cans.
- **Not-For-Recycle Items:** plastic bags and clear plastic wrap, video and cassette tapes, shredded paper, polystyrene, glass, plates, mugs, pots/pans, food liquids, yard waste, food-soiled cardboard, paper cups/plates, carpet, cloth or textiles, used paper towels/tissues, construction/industrial debris, electronic waste, automotive parts, and medical/bio hazardous waste. Unaccepted items are not limited to those above. For questions about recycle items, call 888-496-8824.

If you need additional recycle cans, please call Riverton City at 801-208-3144. There is no monthly charge for recycle cans.

I hope March 17 will be a great green day for you. It is very important that we continue to think and act green every day. The greener we are, the better our environment will be, and using the City's recycling program actually saves the City money.





The Switch Happens May 1, 2015

Riverton's switch to culinary water sourced from the Jordan Valley Water Conservancy District (JVWCD) takes place May 1, 2015. Along with the switch to this new water source, the billing rate will also be changed for all culinary water utility customers. A new base rate of \$2.50, plus \$3.91 for every 1,000 gallons used will be reflected, beginning with May's usage.

Time To Shut Off Your Secondary Water Valve

All of the secondary water lines are drained and it's now time to turn your secondary water valve in the closed position. This valve is located in the green box in your front yard. If your secondary ball valve is not turned off, you may experience flooding or other problems when the Water Department starts filling the system in the spring. The City is not liable for any problems that may occur from winterization techniques in private sprinkler systems. Users are responsible for any damage due to water entering their systems during both the on and off seasons. If a water employee is required to respond to flooding to shut off the ball valve, there will be a \$60 charge to the resident.
