Water News: In-Home **Pressure Reducing Valves**

Is it time for a replacement? All homes constructed after 1970 will have a pressure reducing valve (PRV). The purpose for this valve is to lower the pressure from the City system to the homeowner's system inside the home. Appliances within your home like washing machines, ice makers, and dishwashers are not designed for high pressure. Most pressure reducing valves come factory set at 50 psi. The PRV in most cases is located in your basement directly above the in-home shut off valve. The PRV has a 10 to 12 year lifespan and will need to be maintained or replaced.

Homeowners should consult a plumber for replacement or maintenance. One easy way to know if your PRV is bad is if, after slowfilling your washing machine or after flushing toilets, you observe lower pressure in other areas of your home.
