Mayor Bill's Message



I have been asked by some of you what my position is on a Trax line coming to Riverton. In response, please refer to the following excerpt of a letter I wrote to UDOT, UTA, and Wasatch Front Regional Council: "As our four organizations contemplate the 12600 South corridor between Bangerter Highway and the Jordan River, I believe it is critical we follow the "Performance-Based Planning" principles of Safety First, then Economic Vitality, and Air Quality."

I would like to share with you my vision, hope, and potential timetable, for the 12600 South Corridor:

1. The Riverton City Council has unanimously approved a locally preferred alternative for corridor preservation to extend the part of the new Trax route in Riverton City between the Day Break Station and a future station that will be built on Suburban Land Reserve (SLR) property. I recommend this Trax line extension be built as soon as possible.
2. Significant commercial retail and office development is being planned at Mountain View Place, an 85-acre project that will be constructed north of 13400 South between Mountain View Corridor and Bangerter Highways. It is anticipated that the first two phases of construction will be completed during 2018. I recommend a new bus route, with an enhanced schedule, become operational during 2018 on 12600 South. This new route should connect the Mountain View Place development, with the Draper Front Runner Station, and then continue on to the Draper Trax Station.
3. Any further study of the 12600 South corridor should be postponed until 2020. By 2020 the widening of Redwood Road and I-15 should be completed, the Point of the Mountain Development Commission study and recommendations should be in final form, and all phases of the Mountain View Place project should be under construction or finished. With the addition of this information, I believe a study will be more accurate and reliable for the 12600 South transportation corridor. I recommend that Riverton City, UTA, WFRC, UDOT, and the public be involved in a combined study between 2020 and 2025 to determine if this transportation corridor should be improved by additional road lanes, and/or a fixed guideway corridor. The recommendations of this study could be incorporated into the "Utah's Unified Transportation Plan" for implementation between 2025 and 2050.
4. I would recommend that intersection improvements be done along this corridor at 1300 West, Redwood Road, 2700 West, and Bangerter Highway when they are needed and when UDOT has the funding to do these projects."

This is a very important decision that doesn't need to be made until after there has been more study and public input. I feel we should resume this study in 2020 when more information has become available to us.

UPD Safety Tips for Home Security!



Alarm and security systems are great to deter burglaries; however, they can be expensive. If you are unable to afford such systems consider the following safety tips for crime prevention at your residence:

- **Lock your doors.** At a minimum, lock your doors when you leave the residence and before you go to sleep.
- **Keep valuable items secure.** Lock items in a safe or other protected location. At a minimum, keep valuable items out of sight.
- **Use exterior and motion lights.** Extra lighting helps reduce dark areas around your residence.
- **Minimize shrubbery or trees around windows and doors.** Extra foliage may provide hiding places for potential burglars.
- **Get to know your neighbors and other residents.** Report any unusual or suspicious behavior noticed to police immediately.

If you come home and see a door or window open or broken, or notice other indicators of a break-in, do not enter your house. If you have already done so, leave immediately. Call police from a cell phone or a neighbor's residence.

Remember, most crimes that happen are crimes of opportunity.

Time to Shut Off Your Secondary Water Valve

The secondary water system is being filled; however, it will not be available until May first. It is now time to turn your secondary water valve in the closed position. This valve is located in the green box in your front yard. If your secondary ball valve is not turned off, you may experience flooding or other problems. The City is not liable for any problems that may occur from winterization techniques in private sprinkler systems. Users are responsible for any damage due to water entering their systems during both the on and off seasons. If Water Department Staff has to respond to your home to shut off your ball valve in your secondary green box, you will be assessed a \$60 fee.
