

Stormwater Tips for Fireworks Etiquette



Fun, food, and fireworks are what July is all about! While you're enjoying the holiday celebrations with your friends and family, keep these suggestions in mind for maintaining clean neighborhoods, streets, creeks and rivers, as well as personal safety. Sweep the gutter clear of any yard maintenance debris that fall during yard work rather than using a garden hose. This will conserve water, and keep debris out of rivers and creeks.

Immediately following the fireworks party, sweep the fireworks from roads, sidewalks, and driveways and put them into a bucket with water. Fireworks left in the streets, gutters and driveways can end up in our creeks and rivers.

Try putting a small board on your front lawn and do the stationary fireworks there. This will protect kids from the dangers of roads and the cleanup will be easier.

UPD Corner: Solicitation City Code

During this time of year, an increase in door-to-door solicitation starts taking place. Below are some key points about how solicitors should conduct business. If you experience something that you believe violates the codes below, please call the Unified Police Dispatch at (801) 743-7000. If you feel unsafe with the solicitor please call 911.

When you read the entire <u>Residential Solicitation City Code</u> you can better understand your rights and the solicitor's responsibilities.


Riverton City Code 5.20.180

- Each Solicitor is required to look for a no soliciting sign or placard. If one is present they "shall immediately depart from such property."
- If they are asked to leave they "shall immediately and peacefully depart."
- "Shall not use obscene language or gestures"
- If they don't follow these guidelines it is a violation.

Riverton City Code 5.20.190

No contact before 9:00 a.m. or after 9:00 p.m.

All Solicitors are required to have a solicitor's certificate and identification badge. Below is an example of the identification badge. The identification badge should be worn by the person and it must contain the following:



- · The name of the registered solicitor
- Address and phone number of the solicitor, or the name, address, and phone number of the responsible person or entity is provided
- A recent photograph of the registered solicitor
- · The date when the certificate expires


In 2015, Riverton City switched to Jordan Valley Water. Your water now has a significantly lower hardness rating.
