Mayor Bill's Message



Spring is just around the corner. I love spring as the outside vegetation comes alive and the beauty of nature starts to unfold. It is a time of renewal, hope, change and a hint of what is coming. Riverton City is in the spring of their new development west of Bangerter highway and on both sides of 13400 South. In this message, I would like to give you an update on where we are with this new development, and where we are going.

Has the City approved the developments? Yes, the City Council approved the 85-acre CenterCal commercial project in December. The remainder of this site was approved by the City Council in January. This portion of the site will be developed by the LDS Church, and will include a mixture of housing, office space, and additional retail commercial.

What is the time line of these projects? The CenterCal portion of the site will start construction during the summer of 2016 and should be totally developed by 2020. The LDS Church portion of the site will be started in the next few years, and may take as long as 10 to 15 years to develop.

Why is this development important to Riverton City?

There are two reasons: (1) It will provide increased tax revenue to Riverton City. (2) This beautiful development will provide many great amenities to our residents and surrounding communities.

What amenities will this development will bring?

There are three categories of amenities: (1) New housing. (2) Job creation, which will be one of the most significant components of this development. There will be a wide variety of employment opportunities ranging from entry level to high-paying management positions. (3) It will also be a place to hang out, be entertained, eat in wonderful restaurants, and shop in a variety of great stores.

Why did this development come to Riverton? The major catalyst for this development has been a very talented staff, with the support and vision of elected officials. From the late 1990's until now, decisions were made, and preparations were started to make this a very successful development. During Mayor Mont Evans' administration, Lance Blackwood was hired as the Riverton City Economic Development Director. Almost ten years ago, Lance was promoted to the position of Riverton City Manager. With the experience and skills that Lance has, he built a team of highly skilled professionals who worked with the elected officials to develop a vision for the future of Riverton. The vision of this site was defined in detail between 2007 and 2010. In 2014 Dan McCay, the representative for Suburban Land Reserve (the land development arm of the LDS Church) and his team met with us and announced it was time to start developing the LDS Church Farm property in Riverton. A team from Riverton City, SLR, and CenterCal, with the support of the elected officials of Riverton, have spent the last two years taking the vision of this site and making it a reality.

A big shout out to Lance Blackwood. Without the skills, experience, judgement, and determination Lance has, this development would have never come to Riverton. Thank you very much for all you do for our great City. Let the building begin!

Goin' Green Recycle Day

Riverton City is offering a free recycling day on Thursday, March 17 from 9:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. in the south parking lot at Riverton City Hall.

Recyclable items include: paper, cardboard, plastic containers #1-#7, tin and steel cans, small electronics, and car seats.

Paper shredding is also available from 5:00 – 7:00 p.m.



Is Radon a Problem in Your Home?

Radon is a naturally occurring gas that is invading many Utah homes. As the second leading cause of lung cancer in non-smokers, Radon detection can be an important part of protecting you and your family. Testing is easy with a simple kit you can purchase at local hardware stores or online at radon.utah.gov. And, right now you can also purchase a radon detection kit for \$7.99 from Peterson's Fresh Market, 1777 W. 12600 S. Price includes lab testing. The best time to test your home is while it's still cold outside. Supplies are limited, so hurry in and test your home this month!



Time to Shut Off Your Secondary Water Valve

The Water Department will start filling the secondary water system on March 15; however, it will not be available until May 1. It is now time to turn your secondary water valve in the closed position. This valve is located in the green box in your front yard. If your secondary ball valve is not turned off,

you may experience flooding or other problems when the Water Department starts filling the system. The City is not liable for any problems that may occur from winterization techniques in private sprinkler systems. Also, be sure the lid on your culinary water meter is closed down tight to prevent freezing.

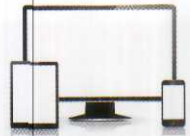
