Mayor Bill's Message

The Mayor's Proposed Budget for 2016-17 was completed and presented to the City Council at the May 3 meeting. This proposed budget was posted on the Riverton City website May 4 for public review. The City Council will review this budget and then come up with their own budget. I would strongly encourage you to get involved in the budgeting process. It is your money. It is your city. And your voice should be heard by the Council.



Highlights of the Mayor's Proposed Budget

- Absolutely no tax increases or Riverton City monthly utility fee increases.
- Of the ten budgets that were funded by taxes or Riverton City monthly utility fees, the 2015-2016 Riverton City Budget total was \$31,283,114 compared to the 2016-17 Mayor's proposed budget of \$30,793,850. That is a budget reduction of \$489,264, or almost a half million dollars. I didn't include the impact fees budgets because they are funded by developers and builders, not current residents.
- My budget includes one new employee in the Storm Water Department.
- A 3% increase to our wage and benefit budgets, which includes the new employee for Storm Water. Riverton doesn't give automatic raises to our employees. Our wage increases are performance based on measurable performance goals. Consequently, some employee may get more than a 3% raise, while others will get less than a 3% increase. You may remember that in my "State of the City" presentation in January to the City Council, Riverton City had the lowest Full-Time Equivalent employees per 1,000 population, and the lowest employee compensation cost per resident of our four sister cities (Bluffdale, Draper, Herriman, and South Jordan).

My budget is based on the following two principles: One, provide the best City services for the most reasonable cost. And two, decide if a City service is best provided by a City employee, contracting with another government entity, or contracting with a private company. At some time I may need to propose an increase in monthly fees; that time is not now. Government budgets should be based on service levels.

The three areas of the budget I continue to watch very closely are:

1. Riverton City only charges \$1 per month for pickup of the first garbage tote. I am very concerned about the sustainability of this fee to cover costs in the future.
2. Riverton City's ability to maintain the quality of their roads without an increase in revenue.
3. Maintaining culinary water rates at the current levels given that we now purchase our water from the Jordan Valley Water Conservancy District.

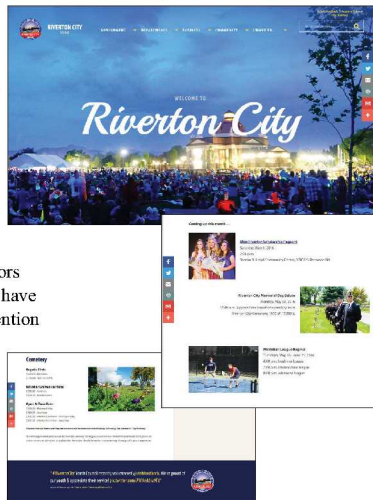
