On January 3, I presented my "2017 State of the City" report to the City Council. I would encourage you to go online to rivertoncity.com and view the written report, and/or listen to the audio tape of the presentation. The "2017 State of the City" report and the City Council's 2017 Strategic Plan are the foundation documents I use in preparing the Mayor's Budget.



State of the City report summary:

- 1. The bedrock philosophy for my 2017-18 budget is that I will not propose an increase to any Riverton City utility fees. In addition, Riverton City currently levies no property tax and I will not propose implementing one.
- One of my highest priorities for the upcoming year is developing a plan that will stabilize our culinary water supply for the long term. Riverton City is fortunate in that we have access to the amount of culinary water required for the total build out of our City. However, one critical concern is the storage capacity we have for culinary water. In the near future we must build a new culinary water storage tank on the western side of Riverton that will allow us to keep our culinary water rates as low as possible while providing adequate water pressure and fire flow for the coming development in the Western Commercial District. My responsibility is to develop the most cost effective financial plan that will allow for the construction of this tank as soon as possible.
- Tied very closely to culinary water is **the need for a sustainable secondary water system**. In reviewing historical flows of Utah Lake since 1884 you see major fluctuations of the water level in the Lake which of course is dictated by Mother Nature! My report reflects ways we can stabilize our secondary water system without increasing secondary water fees.
- We will continue to manage our labor costs by hiring and retaining competent, high performing employees. This will allow Riverton City to remain among the very best cities in terms of having the fewest number of employees per resident served.
- The Unified Police Department (UPD) provides the best law enforcement service Riverton City could have. This is possible because of the leadership of Precinct Chief Rosie Rivera and the fine officers working with her. The only issue remaining with our police service is how we pay for it. The question becomes whether Riverton City should continue to finance UPD by remaining a part of the Salt Lake Valley Law Enforcement Service Area or should we establish our own Riverton Police Service Area. Again, please let me make it clear that in either case the UPD would still be providing law enforcement service to Riverton. This issue is scheduled to be on the November 2017 ballot for our citizens to decide.

on November 7, 2017

A Riverton Municipal Election will be held to elect a Mayor and two Council Members to serve four-year terms. One nonpartisan candidate for Mayor will be elected at-large, one nonpartisan Council Member will be elected from Council District 3, and from Council District 4. If necessary, a Primary Election will be held on August 15, 2017.

Each person seeking to become a candidate must file a Declaration of Candidacy in person with the City Recorder during office hours between June 1 and June 7, 2017.

WATER NEWS

Household Water Maintenance Tips

Following are a few tips that every homeowner should be aware of for basic household maintenance:

- Flush your hot water heater at least every six months. There should be a valve on the side of the hot water heater near the floor. Attach a hose to the valve, run the hose to the floor drain and open valve to flush. This will allow water to be flushed from the hot water heater into the floor drain. Let the water flow for approximately 15 minutes to ensure the water heater has been properly flushed. After 15 minutes, close the valve and remove the hose.
- Exercise all control valves in your home at least every six months.

 Control valves are valves located under your sinks, behind toilets, and the main water shut off to your home (typically located in your basement). If you do not operate these valves regularly, they can seize up and not function properly in case of an emergency.
- Most water pressure regulators have a life span of approximately 10 years. Your water pressure regulator controls the flow and pressure to all toilets, showers, tubs, washing machines, etc. to your home and is located in your basement above your main water shut off valve. You will know when this valve needs to be replaced when for no apparent reason, you start losing water pressure within your home. Also, don't forget to close the ball valve in your secondary box located near the front of your property.

Riverton City is not liable for any damage caused by flooding from your winterizing techniques. Shutting the ball valve in the closed position will ensure water will not enter or flood your system in the spring when we start filling and testing the secondary water system.
