Season of Hope and Renewal

Spring is my favorite season when the plants start budding and the grass turns green. This winter has been very cold and snowy, but spring is the season of hope and renewal—the time to review our lives and see what we have accomplished, and plan for what we have yet to accomplish. As a City we have achieved a lot during the last year, and now it is time to report on what to expect in the coming months.



The State Legislature. The session started January 23 on a cold winter day. It will end on March 9, which I hope will be a beautiful spring day. So far I have had the opportunity to meet with legislators on several mornings during the session. I haven't agreed with all of the bills that passed, and some of the bills that I hoped would become law were defeated. However, one thing all of us can agree on is that our legislators have worked very hard during the session. A big thank you to the members of the Utah House of Representatives and of the Utah State Senate. You are awesome! We appreciate all the late nights and early mornings you have been working in order to make Utah an even better place to live.

Redwood Road Widening Project. The planning is over, the financing is in place, and the work is going forth on this great project. This project will cost almost 40 million dollars to complete. Our project manager, Jessica, has been very good to work with. She has had to make hard decisions on the project, but her decisions have always been based on how to build the safest road possible.

Mountain View Village. At the writing of this article, there is a ground breaking set for March 15. This project has literally been a team effort in which everyone has done their part. This hasn't been a one or two person effort, it has been a coordinated effort of many people pulling together to get to this point. Phase One of the project should be completed during the next 18 months. This phase is the big commercial area which includes Harmon's Grocery Store and other large retailers. The movie theater and the village area will be part of Phase Two.

We will see a lot of physical changes in the City this year with the construction of buildings, roads, and hopefully an additional water tank, as well as other infrastructure. The great news is that all of this building will be done with no tax increases, no fee increases, and no bonding.

Trash Containment Tips

Along with being just plain unsightly, littering creates a negative impact on our neighborhoods. While litter can occur from careless people dropping their trash, most often it takes place because of simple neglect and apathy to our own waste management practices.

March is a prime month for wind where loose trash will be quickly carried away and trapped along fences and gutters. Sadly, it can also end up in our creeks and rivers. By working together we can minimize this negative impact with the following practices:

- Remember to close dumpster and receptacle lids
- Compact and bag trash before placing it in the trash receptacle
- Hold excess trash back until the next pickup cycle
- Wait to put trash receptacles out the morning before pickup rather than the previous night when weather could tip cans over and spread loose trash



Riverton UPD Update

Friendly reminder regarding the City's Limited Winter Parking which occurs from November 1 to April 1, between 12:00 – 7:00 a.m. This ordinance is being enforced to assist in helping our city plows with snow removal. Thank you for your continued support.



Riverton City Ordinance (10.10.050)

(1) It shall be unlawful for any person or owner of any vehicle to park a motor vehicle, travel trailer, horse trailer, utility trailer or other like vehicle on any street in Riverton City between the hours of 12:00 a.m. to 7:00 a.m., from the date of November 1 of each year until the date of April 1 of the following year.

Time to Shut Off Your Secondary Water Valve

All of the secondary water lines are drained and it's now time to turn your secondary water valve in the closed position. This valve is located in the green box in your front yard. If your secondary ball valve is not turned off, you may experience flooding or other problems when the Water Department starts filling the system in the spring. The City is not liable for any problems that may occur from winterization techniques in private sprinkler systems. Users are responsible for any damage due to water entering their systems during both the on and off seasons.
