- Complete boundary adjustments for 13400 S, 12600 S, and 13800 S
- Design 12600 S widening project from Bangerter Hwy to Mountain View Corridor
- Design and reconstruct Pinto Way detention basin
- Update 5-year road maintenance plan including capital equipment requests
 - Purchase asphalt zipper machine to achieve cost savings on road resurfacing

5. Traffic Signals

- Coordinate construction of Morning Cloak traffic signal with Herriman City
- Coordinate construction of 12600 S and Park Avenue traffic signal with UDOT

6. School Zones, Bike Lanes, and Pedestrian Routes

- Complete pedestrian crosswalk warrant study at Riverton High School
- Assess school zone signage on 2700 W from Riverton/South Jordan border to Bangerter Highway
- Make improvements to safe-walking routes
- Create bike lanes on 2700 W from Riverton/South Jordan border to 12600 S
- Coordinate creation of bike lanes on 12600 S with CMAQ
- Continue to research potential funding sources for a mid-block pedestrian crossing on 12600 S with access to the Riverton City Park

7. Improve Capability of the City to Manage and Utilize Culinary Water Supply **Engineering**

- Complete energy savings studies and propose improvements
- Analyze needs for a 5-million gallon water tank and effects on peaking and water rates
- Construct bleed-off valve at 11800 S and ~3200 W (chlorine residual project)
- Design and construct 11400 S 1300 W system connection (chlorine residual project)
- Install tank mixing equipment at the High Tank to keep water fresh in tank
- Construct fence around High Tank site
- Analyze the potential use of media filters or other technology to allow for secondary water usage on City-owned properties that are currently irrigated with culinary water

Culinary Water Distribution

1. Culinary Water System Maintenance

- Paint interior piping in three culinary vaults
- Exercise 15% of the culinary infrastructure valves
- Replace 100 culinary meter dual check valves
- Complete 10% of blue staking pin marker project for identification of meter and valve locations
- Complete the construction of the second floor of the water facility

2. Chlorination

• Install a dosage meter at the Hill Well Booster Station to maintain the required level of chlorine residual

3. Improve Capability of the City to Manage and Utilize Secondary Water Supply

- Complete secondary water share study for irrigable land
- Design and construct the 4200 W surge tank

Water Distribution

- Install secondary meters as required by new ordinance
- Complete 25% of the City's bi-directional flushing

- Exercise 30% of the secondary infrastructure valves
- Paint interior piping in three secondary vaults
- Complete 10% of Blue Staking Pin Marker project for identification of meter and valve locations

1. Emergency Planning and Preparation

Emergency Preparedness

- Hold two table-top emergency exercises
 - o Participate in one regional activity
 - o Invite staff to participate in a training exercise

Priority: Safety and Risk Management - Create and Develop Risk Management and Safety Protocol for all City Operations

1. Initiate Programs to Implement and Monitor Safety and Risk Management

Attorney's Office / Risk Management

- Audit new-hire safety checklist
 - Interview employees to verify that required new-hire safety training has occurred
- Train each department on new Hazard Communication Safety Data Sheets (SDS)
 - o Conduct SDS audit in each department

Human Resources

- Update Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual
- Schedule quarterly supervisory training sessions

Risk Management / All Departments

- Implement new Confined Space Entry Policy
 - o Update inventory of all areas that would be considered confined space
 - o Identify which confined spaces require alternate entry procedure permits
 - o Train all departments on new policy
 - Propose necessary equipment for confined space entry together with budget and funding source
- Train Water Department in traffic control setup
