The federally funded ARPA Sewer Improvement Projects are in process, with road improvements taking place once those projects are completed. The sidewalks on Hall Station Road are a great addition, providing connectivity from Hall Station to Highway 140 to Main Street to King Street and back to Hall Station. The Adairsville Elementary School is now surrounded by sidewalks with the addition of the Railroad Street section connecting King to College. This will provide an additional layer of safety for our students and their families.
