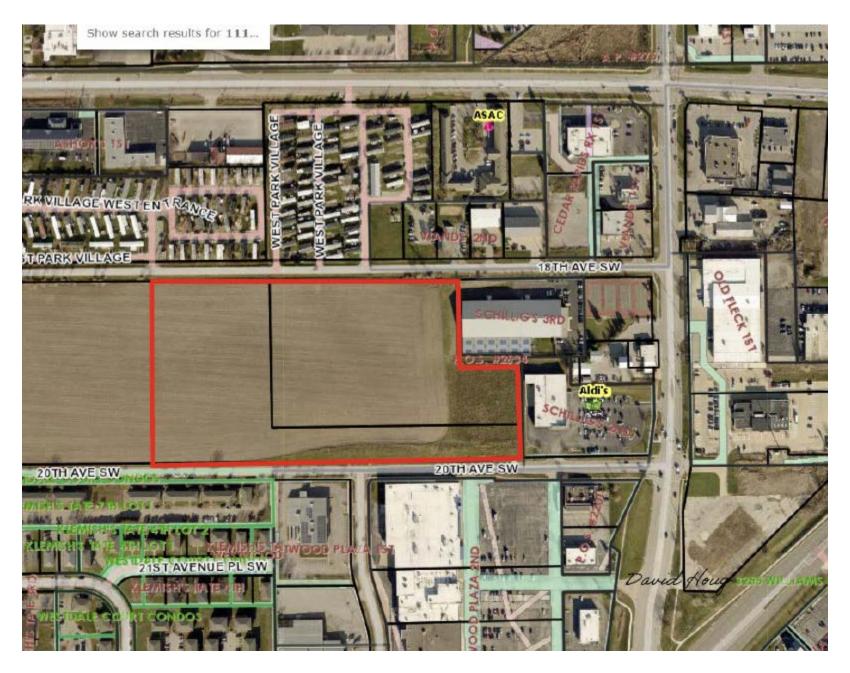

 - 2. Street frontage requirements for individual parcels may be waived, subject to approval by the city for utility connections and access.
 - 3. Development along D Street SW shall meet the development standards for the U-VR zone district to match existing development across the street, as determined by Development Services.
 - 4. By Minor Design Exception, Development Services is authorized to grant additional exceptions and modifications not listed above to meet the intent of the

Planned Unit Development and allow for development which generally conforms to the attached site plan.

Section 3. That the official zoning map of the city of Cedar Rapids is hereby amended accordingly and this amendment shall be reflected on the next official zoning map to be signed and dated by the Mayor and City Clerk and approved and adopted by the City Council.

<u>Section 4</u>. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.

Section 5. Following publication of this Ordinance as provided for by law, the City Clerk shall certify this Ordinance and the plat of the property described hereinabove, as shown by Exhibit A attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein, to the Linn County Recorder.

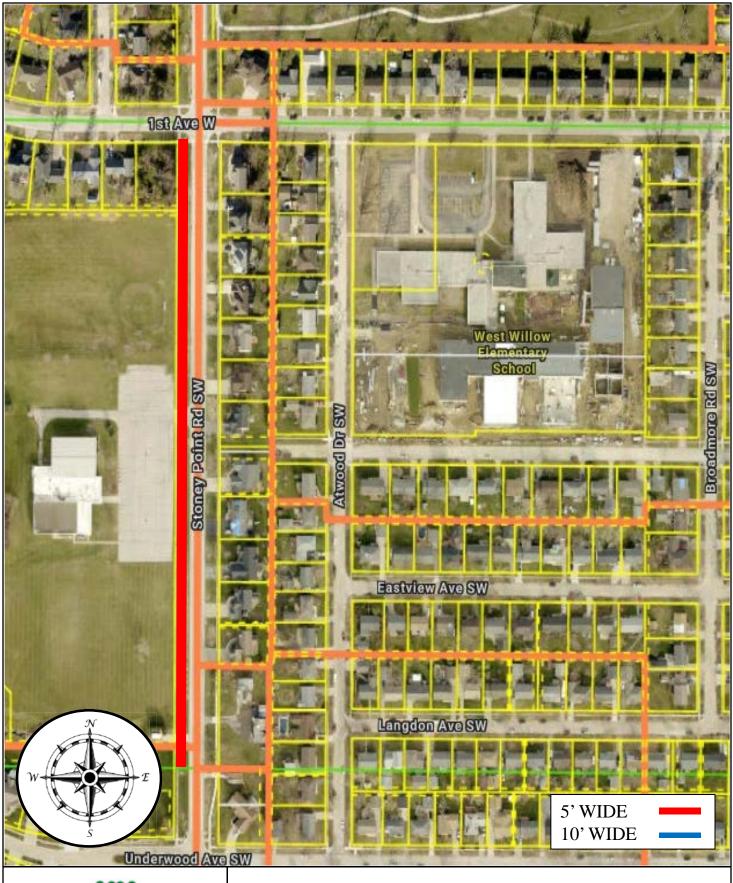

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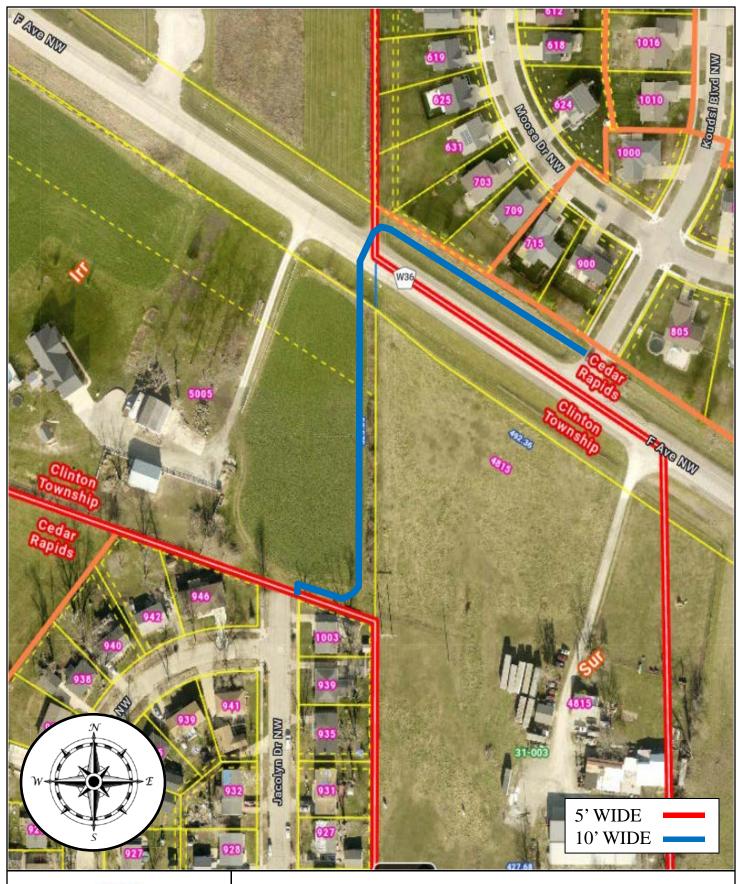

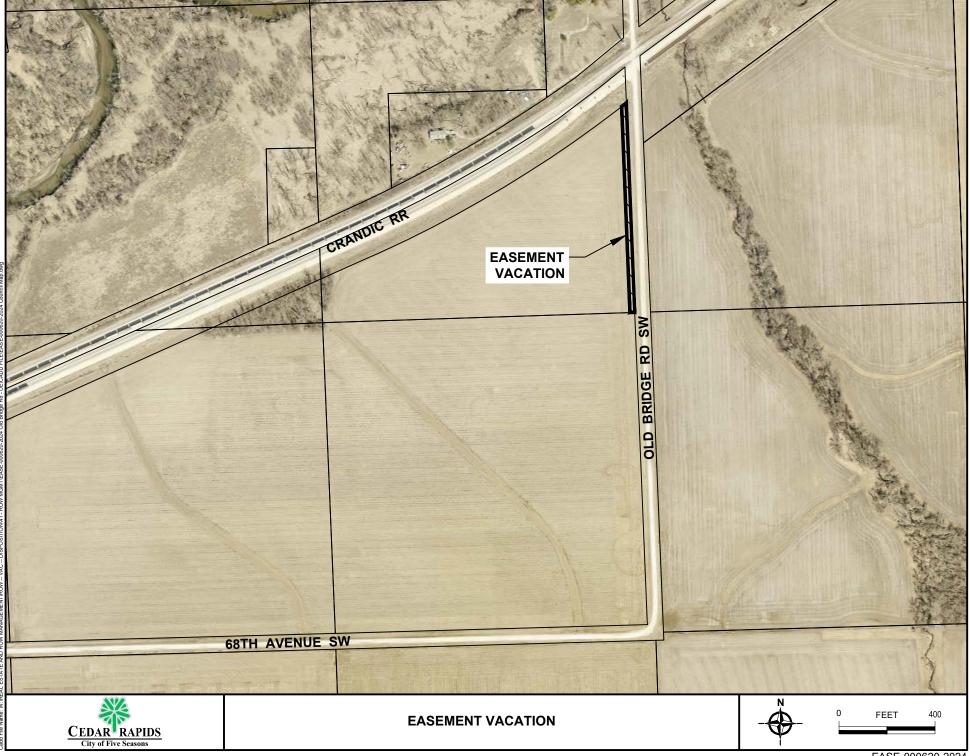

Background: For over forty years, the City of Cedar Rapids Water Pollution Control Facility (WPCF) has provided wastewater treatment for the residents of Cedar Rapids, Marion, Hiawatha, Robins and Palo, and is uniquely capable of handling raw wastewater from the large industry in Cedar Rapids. Over that time. WPCF has essentially utilized the same processes and facilities for treatment of wastewater and handling and disposing of waste solids, but many portions of the plant have reached the end of their useful life. That along with the need to address residential and industrial growth and future nutrient reduction requirements led to planning and design efforts for upgrades. Upgrades are needed for the solids handling system, secondary treatment, nutrient (nitrogen and phosphorous) removal systems and a desire to improve resource recovery (biogas and nutrients). Planning for upgrades at the plant began in 2015 and resulted in a series of phased improvement projects. Contract 1 involved improvements to existing equipment related to the WPCF anaerobic pretreatment system and is completed. This project, Contract 2 of the improvements plan, includes the installation of anaerobic digesters which will allow us to capture biogas, biogas cleaning and compression systems that will allow renewable natural gas injection into the natural gas pipeline, and installation of a new aerobic granular sludge treatment train for organic material and some nutrient removal. The project also includes Alternate Bids for an additional fifth aerobic granular sludge treatment basin, an additional secondary anaerobic digester basin, and an expansion to the Biogas Cleaning Building from what is included in the base bid. The Utilities Department has applied and been approved for an Iowa Clean Water State Revolving Fund (SRF) low-interest loan for this project.

Two bids were received on June 26, 2024 for the WPCF Process Improvements - Contract 2 project. A base bid and three alternate bid items were requested from each Contractor.

The low base bid from Bowen Engineering Corporation came in 23% above the estimated construction costs. The Utilities Department and the Engineering Consultant Team for the project have had extensive conversations with Bowen Engineering Corporation to determine reasons for this disparity in costs. Our analysis found the following:

- The bidding market within the region for projects of this size is very tight. Prior to bidding, the Engineering Consultants put forth a significant effort reaching out to General Contractors large enough to bond for and complete this project. A number of General Contractors who showed interest in the project prior to advertisement indicated they were not bidding due to the local labor market conditions. They indicated that they saw significant labor risk and as a result, increased costs of labor associated with importing labor or competing for the local workforce.
- There was limited competition for sub-contractors and equipment suppliers, which resulted in sub-contractor bids that were higher than anticipated. In addition, Bowen Engineering Corporation indicated that no sub-contractors submitted bids for the civil, concrete, and mechanical packages.
- To qualify for the tax credit under the Department of Treasury, Inflation Reduction Act, projects
 must be initiated by the end of 2024. This has led to a number of biomass to biogas projects being
 bid throughout the country, which has increased demand for gas equipment, extended delivery
 times and elevated equipment pricing.
- Only two General Contractors bid on the project. Having limited bidders typically results in an increase in bid price.

Department staff and the Engineering Consultants have also been investigating means by which the project can be value engineered to reduce the cost further. These efforts are still ongoing but appear to be fruitful. The project will need to be awarded as bid before any value engineering changes can be made.

The Utilities Department continues to pursue grant funds for this project that could reduce the total out of pocket costs to the City, but these grants will not be awarded for several months. Some of these grants also have time constraints that require a significant amount of the construction to be completed by December 31, 2024. Given the urgency of the grant requirements, current inflationary pressures, and the continued aging of the existing WPCF facilities, Utilities Department staff recommends award of the base bid project at this time. Based on the total cost of the base bid project and an evaluation of the alternative bids, the Utilities Department does not recommend approving any of the bid alternates. The base bid work is anticipated to begin in September 2024 and be completed in January 2029.

Before Council may institute proceedings for the issuance of debt, a notice of the proposed action including amount and purpose, as well as time and place of the meeting where Council proposes to take action, must be published. Per discussions with bond counsel, it's recommended that the City set the

not-to-exceed amount with a reasonable cushion to allow for changes in estimates and amendments to the approved project amount. This will prevent delays and inefficiencies at later dates as future construction loans are issued. Though the approved not-to-exceed loan amount is set higher than the currently approved project amount, no loans will be issued above the approved project costs unless additional spending is approved by City Council.

Recommended Action: The Utilities Department – Water Pollution Control Division staff recommends approving motion to hold a public hearing on September 10, 2024, on the proposition to authorize a loan and disbursement agreement and the issuance of notes for WCPF Process Improvements – Contract 2 projects and publishing notice pursuant to Chapter 21 of the State Code of Iowa.

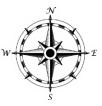

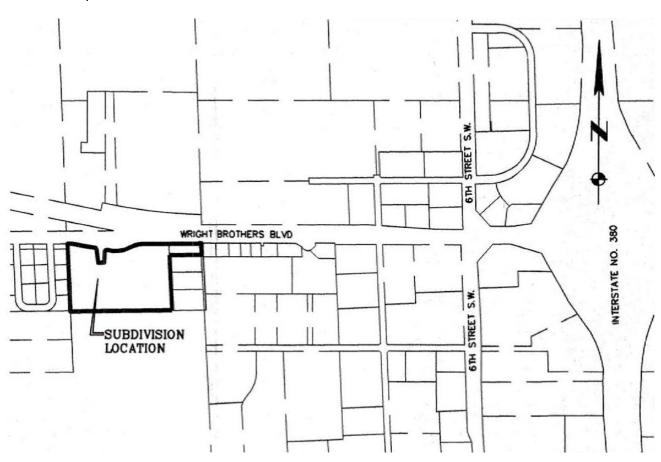

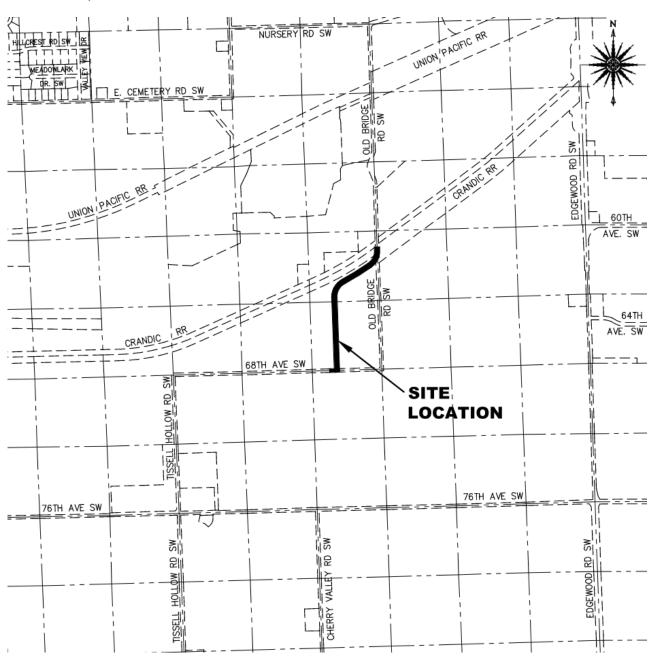

Background: The City and College Community School District have identified ways to collaborate to enhance the Prairie Summit YMCA development project. This supports a key Council key priority of providing recreational amenities, along with the City's commitment to serving people of all ages and abilities. The resolution authorizes the negotiation of a partnership agreement between the City and College Community School District. Following is an overview of the project, including key benefits to the community and proposed City participation to be detailed in the partnership agreement.

Project History

In fall of 2023, voters in the College Community School District approved a \$43 million school bond referendum to fund the construction of a swimming pool and wellness center that will be operated by the YMCA.

The Prairie Summit YMCA will include:

- aquatic center with a competition-size pool with diving and seating for spectators
- recreational pool with a splash pad
- walking and running track
- indoor turf field
- basketball and multipurpose courts
- cardio and weightlifting area

Construction on the new Prairie Summit YMCA is expected to start this fall with completion slated for early 2026.

Community Benefit

YMCA facilities provide recreational opportunities for residents of **all ages** and offer **membership assistance**, based on household income.

The YMCA also offers activities to **non-members**, such as **league sports** and **swimming lessons**.

An **indoor walking track** was the highest ranked amenity for older adults in the City's Dual-Use Facility survey and this facility will host the largest walking track in the region.

The location of this facility **fills a coverage gap**. The Linn-Mar School District is served by the Marion YMCA in the north and the Downtown YMCA is in the heart of the Cedar Rapids School District.

- Establish quarterly meetings for our Parks & Recreation staff to pursue opportunities with the YMCA for collaborative joint youth programming to:
 - o Maximize resources for increased efficiency and enhanced programming experiences.
 - o Provide consistent pricing for joint recreational programming.
 - o Optimize recreational space to meet the community needs.
- Promotion of the Silver Sneaker Program which is Medicare funding for YMCA memberships.

ORDINANCE NO. LEG NUM TAG

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING CHAPTER 44 OF THE CEDAR RAPIDS MUNICIPAL CODE, BEING A CHAPTER RELATING TO AUCTIONS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CEDAR RAPIDS, IOWA as follows:

- <u>Section 1</u>. Chapter 44 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code is hereby repealed.
- <u>Section 2</u>. It is the intention of the Council that each section, paragraph, sentence, clause, and provision of this Ordinance is separable, and, if any provision is held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance nor any part thereof other than that provision affected by such decision.
- <u>Section 3</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with any provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
- <u>Section 4</u>. The changes as provided in this Ordinance shall be made a part of the replacement pages of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code and made a part of said Code as provided by law.
- <u>Section 5</u>. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as provided by law. Licenses in force and effect as of the effective date of this ordinance shall be considered terminated. There will be no refunds of any license fees for current licenses.

Background: Upon passage of Chapter 33 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code, which adopts the 2021 International Building Code and the 2021 International Residential Code, it was noted that the reference to the edition of the American National Standard of Accessible and Usable Building and Facilities (ANSI) was inadvertently omitted. Therefore, this ordinance seeks to further clarify that the correct edition of the standard is the ANSI 117.1-2009.

ORDINANCE NO. LEG NUM TAG

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 33 OF THE CEDAR RAPIDS MUNICIPAL CODE TO INCLUDE REFERENCE TO THE 2009 AMERICAN NATIONAL STANDARD OF ACCESSIBLE AND USABLE BUILDINGS AND FACILITIES

WHEREAS, on August 13, 2024, the City Council of the City of Cedar Rapids passed Ordinance No. 035-24 repealing Chapter 33 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code and enacting and adopting in its place a new Chapter 33, entitled "Building Code" of the 2021 International Building Code; and

WHEREAS, best practices require that Chapter 33 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code include reference to the 2009 American National Standard of Accessible and Usable Buildings and Facilities.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CEDAR RAPIDS, IOWA as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. Section 33.03 of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows [underlining indicates added language]:

"33.03 REFERENCED CODES <u>AND STANDARDS</u>. The Building Code is hereby amended by amending Section 101.4 of the International Building Code as follows:

IBC 101.4.1 Gas.

The provision of the Iowa State Plumbing Code adopted in Iowa Administrative Code 641—25 shall apply to the installation of gas piping from the point of delivery, gas appliances and related accessories as covered in this code.

IBC 101.4.2 Mechanical.

The provisions of the Mechanical Code as adopted in Municipal Code Chapter 36 shall apply to the installation, alterations, repairs and replacement of mechanical systems, including equipment, appliances, fixtures, fittings and appurtenances, including ventilating, heating, cooling, air-conditioning and refrigeration systems, incinerator and other energy-related systems.

IBC 101.4.3 Plumbing.

The provisions of the Plumbing Code as adopted in Municipal Code Chapter 35 shall apply to the installation, alteration, repair and replacement of plumbing systems including equipment, appliances, fixtures, fittings and appurtenances, and where connected to a water or sewage system and all aspects of a medical gas system.

IBC 101.4.4 Property Maintenance.

The provisions of the Property Maintenance Code as adopted by Municipal Code Chapter 29 shall apply to existing structures and premises; equipment and facilities; light, ventilation, space heating, sanitation, life and fire safety hazards; responsibilities of owners, operators and occupants; and occupancy of existing premises and structures.

IBC 101.4.5 Fire Prevention.

The provisions of the Fire Code as adopted by Municipal Code Chapter 37 shall apply to matters affecting or relating to structures, processes and premises from the hazard of fire and explosion arising from the storage, handling or use of structures, materials or devices; from conditions hazardous to life, property or public welfare in the occupancy of structures or premises; and from the construction, extension, repair, alteration or removal of fire suppression, automatic sprinkler systems and alarm systems or fire hazards in the structure or on the premises from occupancy or operation.

IBC 104.4.6 Energy.

The provision of the International Energy Conservation Code 2021 Edition shall apply to all matters governing the design and construction of buildings for energy efficiency with the following exception.

EXCEPTION: Buildings complying with the lowa Energy Code as adopted by the lowa Administrative Code 661—303.1(103A) Scope and applicability of energy conservation requirements.

IBC 101.4.7 to remain unchanged.

IBC 101.4.8 Electrical.

The provisions of the Electrical Code as adopted by Municipal Code Chapter 34 shall be controlling in the installation, alterations, repairs, removals, renewals, replacements, connection, disconnection, and maintenance of all electrical equipment within the corporate limits of the City. For the purpose of this Chapter, the term "electrical equipment" means all materials, wiring, conductors, fittings, devices, appliances, luminaires, signs and apparatus or parts thereof comprising an electrical system within a structure or facility.

IBC 101.4.9 ANSI 117.1

Any reference to ANSI 117.1 shall refer to ANSI 117.1-2009

The 2009 American National Standard of Accessible and Usable Buildings and Facilities published by the International Code Council, Inc., which hereinafter may be referred to as "ICC A117.1-2009," is hereby adopted by reference and is effective as if fully set forth in this article."

<u>Section 2</u>. It is the intention of the Council that each section, paragraph, sentence, clause, and provision of this Ordinance is separable, and, if any provision is held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance nor any part thereof other than that provision affected by such decision.

<u>Section 3</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with any provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

<u>Section 4</u>. The changes as provided in this Ordinance shall be made a part of the replacement pages of the Cedar Rapids Municipal Code and made a part of said Code as provided by law.

<u>Section 5</u>. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.
