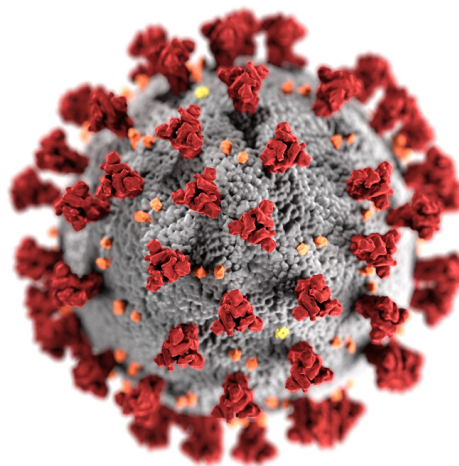

- Phase 2 of reopening extended until July 17, 2020.
- Executive Order 147 places face coverings in public spaces as a requirement, especially if physical distancing is not possible. However, if a medical reason prevents the wearing of a face covering that individual is exempt.
- Mass gathering limits: no more than 10 people indoors or 25 people outdoors.
- Restaurants, Salons & Personal Care and Pools are allowed to open at 50% capacity, with distancing and cleaning requirements.
- Gyms, Indoor Entertainment Venues, Playgrounds, Museums, Bars/Nightclubs are not permitted to open during this phase.
- Physical distancing at 6 feet is required.
