BOARD COMMENTS

City Manager Thornton - passed out a request from Granville Little Theater:

The Chairman of the Board for Granville Little Theatre has a request to be allowed to sell beer or wine during events occurring in City Hall. GLT believes that there may be an interest in this, and she, the chairman of the GLT, is reaching out to be an advocate in requesting that this be allowed.

City Manager Thornton pointed out that we would need a change in our alcohol policy not only for City Hall but for other city-owned locations as well. After much discussion, City Attorney Burnette was asked to work on the wording of the alcohol ordinance.

Ron Bullock – Reminded the Board about the tour and asked to have an update from Mr. Harry Mills on Granville County Economic Development. Mr. Thornton stated that Mr. Mills would be addressing the March Board meeting with an update.

Danny Currin – Asked the City Manager if it is time to consider adding an Inspection Department to the City. Mr. Thornton agreed it is time to consider this suggestion more seriously and has seen a report from the County Inspection Department, especially with the development that the City will potentially be undergoing.

Quon Bridges – Asked is the new pavement on Saddletree or Hunter Road being torn up? City Engineer Ratliff will check.
