COMMISSIONER COMMENTS ON REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS:

On Item # 9 – Consider changing Medical Insurance to NCHIP in association with Gallagher.

MPT Harris question if changing our insurance from the League to NCHIP would affect the City’s relationship with the League. City Manager Thornton said, “No.”

On Item # 10 – Consider entering a contract with the NC Department of Public Safety Division of Adult Correction Prisons for the Inmate Labor program.
