**AGENDA MEETING OF THE OXFORD BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS**

**BOARD COMMENTS**

**Commissioner Woodlief** – wanted to know if we still have an employee that cleans the sidewalks? He also requested that the City look into paving the place in Green Acres that has been patched many times. Also, wants the City to look into paving Wall Street and the parking lot behind Ace Hardware. Per City Manager Thornton and City Engineer Ratliff, the City will have to go back to the contractors and see how much it would cost to add streets that were not approved by the Board in the original contract and both the City Manager and City Engineer Ratliff warned the Board about paving private property. He also informed the Board that the Fire Truck will be donated to Fairfield Volunteer Fire Department on Thursday, December 5<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 at the Fire Station.

**Commissioner Fields** – Inquired as to what to tell the citizens when they call complaining about Mr. McCoy being on their property and telling them that their property is blight. Commissioners Currin and Woodlief stated that they should call the police. The Mayor stated that those people have every right to complain to City Hall. City Manager agreed. She also stated the Mr. Burt Glover passed away. The Board had previously recognized him for his 100<sup>th</sup> and 101<sup>st</sup> birthdays.

**Commissioner Bridges** – Echoed Commissioner Fields concern about Mr. McCoy going on citizen’s property, he compared it to someone using a blue light and stopping people even though they are not a police officer. He also thanked the City for the Employee Appreciation Luncheon.

**Mayor Pro Tem Harris** – Congratulated Lt. Stockwell on his promotion from Sargent to Lieutenant. He wanted to know if we could do a ceased and desist similar to what we did when the gentleman used our City Seal.
