

# CONSIDERATIONS FOR VOTERS WHO CHOOSE TO VOTE IN-PERSON

## BE PREPARED

- Choose a convenient location
  - Know early and election day voting hours and locations by checking [www.clarkcountynv.gov/vote](http://www.clarkcountynv.gov/vote)
- Review and mark your sample ballot prior to heading to vote
- If you plan to use same day registration, know what documentation is required
  - Information on same day voter registration can be found at [www.clarkcountynv.gov/vote](http://www.clarkcountynv.gov/vote)

## STAY SAFE

- Members of vulnerable populations may consider using their mail ballot rather than voting in-person
  - A mail ballot can be returned via the USPS; or
  - You or someone on your behalf can drop a ballot at any voting site, the County Election Office or any City Clerk's office
  - Remember all early voting sites and election day vote centers are mail ballot drop-off sites (a complete list of mail ballot drop-off sites is at [www.clarkcountynv.gov/vote](http://www.clarkcountynv.gov/vote))
- Voters who are ill or experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 should consider using their mail ballot rather than voting in-person
- All voters should wear a mask in accordance with the State of Nevada mandate
- Practice good hygiene
  - Wash hands regularly
  - Have a supply of hand sanitizer available
  - Cover cough or sneezes with a tissue or the inside of your elbow
  - Keep your distance – a minimum of six feet of distance from others whenever practical

## PLAN FOR SUCCESS

- Long lines are possible
  - Consider voting early to avoid high demand on Election Day
    - Consider voting during at a time when demand is lower (higher demand is usually first thing in the morning and afterwork hours, as well as the first and last three days of early voting)
  - You can monitor waiting times at [www.clarkcountynv.gov/vote](http://www.clarkcountynv.gov/vote)
  - Bring supplies to get through the wait
    - Mask
    - Hand sanitizer/wipes/tissues
    - Water/snacks/sun protection (such as sunglasses and hats)
    - Patience
  - If you are concerned about your ability to wait in line, consider using your mail ballot rather than voting in-person
- Electioneering within 100 feet of the entrance of a voting location is not allowed by law and it may be entirely prohibited on private property (a list of where it is and is not allowed will be at [www.clarkcountynv.gov/vote](http://www.clarkcountynv.gov/vote))
  - Please do not wear items (t-shirts, buttons, hats, etc.) or carry items (banners, signs, flags, etc.) that express support of a specific political party, candidate or question
- Poll workers are there to assist you and to ensure access to a fair and open election process, please be respectful and courteous to them
  - Please comply with their requests to:
    - Wear your mask
    - Maintain social distance
    - Comply with electioneering rules
  - If you have need assistance, please contact the nearest poll worker
