### 4. <u>ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS.</u>

Acting Public Works Superintendent, Bree Wilder

- They had a couple water main breaks; one at Westview and one at Sutter St.
- They have the Water Polo team at the swimming pool now every Monday-Wednesday-Friday.
- They have the new Maintenance Worker I, Tyke Woden, on board now, he's very knowledgeable and working out well.

Fire Chief, Debbie Mackey

- On September 18 they were called to a fire at Terrace View in the landscape area of the development. The fire was on a hill towards a fence line with no one in attendance. She is reviewing footage and questioning residents; fire remains under investigation.
- On September 22 they responded to a fire at Les Schwab Tires. The fire was brought quickly under control from responding personnel. A suspect is in custody, this is in Amador Fire jurisdiction so they will be conducting the investigation.
- Chief Mackey is reviewing the Weed Abatement Ordinance with CM Kimball to give clear direction on what constitutes a fire hazard as well as a simplified enforcement strategy.
- Our personnel are back from the North Complex Fire, getting caught up on much needed rest and we are preparing for the next deployment.
- The arson case for Ernie Marier was scheduled for jury trial today, he plead guilty to a lesser charge.
- The arson case for Jay Walters has been vacated, he passed away while in custody.
- Evacuation Maps for City of Jackson are completed and will be mailed out with the water bills and mailed to those who are on e-bill.

Police Chief, Chris Mynderup

• JPD issued a press release on September 18<sup>th</sup> regarding the arrest of 33-year-old Nicholas Federman on an investigation they conducted who was in possession of thousands of images

relating to child pornography. He was arrested after a search warrant and arrest warrant were obtained. They searched both his vehicle and motorhome; several cellular phones and iPad type devices were collected that are being analyzed. JPD found out Mr. Federman was arrested in January 2012 for the same charge and selling marijuana in the cemetery. He received his registration status of 290 on that case and has this case against him. Depending on the number of photos found on the devices collected, he could be looking at a Federal charge.

- JPD participated in a drive-by birthday celebration on Thursday. We believe for the oldest City of Jackson resident, 105-year-old Vivian Fernandez.
- JPD also went out to monitor the Pro-Trump vehicle procession through Jackson. There were no issues, they were for the most part following the traffic laws, had a chat with a couple people on riding safely in a vehicle. A lot of honking and flags waving and they ended up at Mel's, who probably had a record-breaking Taco Tuesday!

<u>City Attorney, Josh Nelson</u> updated Council on the Bill mentioned last week, 80992 which amends the Brown Act which clarifies that public officials can use social media postings as long as no other member of the legislative body responds to the posting. That bill was signed by the Governor and will take effect January 01, 2021. Nice to have clarity from the Legislature on exactly how social media plays with the Brown Act.

#### City Planner, Susan Peters

- General Plan, the consultants are working on the baseline studies and existing conditions in the city. Once this is done, after the Elections, new Council and probably a changed Planning Commission, we can start the Community Workshops on General Plan Updates. The League of California Cities Conference is coming up and will have some classes on General Plan that would be beneficial for you at a low cost. In January, we will be hitting the ground running with the workshops beginning.
- For the Planning Department after this Rezone, the only application she has pending is a planned development amendment in Jackson View for a couple different lots requiring front yard setbacks.
- Working with Rosanne Chamberlain at LAFCO on some cleanup annexations. There is a property owner on Jackson Gate who submitted an application to fix a previous annexation as their lot is basically split by city boundaries and at the same time LAFCO will be working with the city to clean up four other locative county properties.

#### City Manager, Yvonne Kimball

- The Polar Bears swimming team sent a Thank You to the City Council and Staff.
- Working with ACT on a promotion plan.
- Working with Chief Mackey on a preliminary evacuation map that will be mailed with the water bills and posted to the website.

<u>Councilmember Garibaldi</u> – Nothing to report however, he did meet with Mayor Stimpson and Supervisor Pat Crew reviewing questions and concerns relating to the PERS Funding and Unfunded Liability and their consensus was to hold off for the time being. The Financing Plan was okay, the big issue was that even though they would be saving the City over \$1 million, one of the risks it entails is putting \$6 million in new money into PERS' hands in Sacramento. In PERS, the return would be satisfactory. Their return in the latest year was 4.7% and they are charging COJ 7% which is part of the motivation in doing the re-financing. If we were to give PERS the additional \$6 million and the stock market and their investments happen to tank 10-15%, in which we are historically overdue for, we would be underwater another \$1 million. His personal suggestion to Yvonne and future Council's would be when we go into a recession next time and the stock market tanks 15-20%, you can be patient. As history occurs, there will always be peaks and troughs. It we were to give the \$6 million, give it to them at a time where the earnings would be more than the 4.7-5% than they are currently getting and reduce the risk.

# b. Possible Acceptance of the 2020 Cost Allocation Study and Direction of Designating the additional fund for Specific Purposes.

City Manager, Yvonne Kimball, was pleased to present the 2020 Cost Allocation Study as this has been a long journey. The last study the city had done was in 2005 and now we have the 2020 completed as provided in the packet. There was a significant amount of time and work involved preparing the study as a lot of detailed information has to be verified. The end result is, should Council decide to adopt this plan, there will be additional transfer from water and sewer fund into the general fund as shown on the table (page 46 in the packet) that describes the differences.

Councilmember Garibaldi asked Mark Hildebrand to provide a summary overview on how he approached this study and what the results are. Mark Hildebrand followed with a brief overview of the study as requested. He explained that the study develops a methodology to equitably allocate all operational departments expenses back to the internal services and the study determines how much the internal service departments should recover from each department or fund. The internal services include expenses for administration, council and other overhead costs. In the end, the water and the sewer funds will transfer enough dollars to the General Fund to cover the burden that the utility funds put on the general fund.

Following the presentation, Mayor Stimpson asked Council for any questions. No questions were brought forth. Councilmember Sweet stated he was pleased with the way the study was presented. He looked at the numbers very carefully with Yvonne and agrees with her suggestion of how to proceed. Mayor Stimpson opened for public comment, after hearing no comments, he brought back to Council. CM Kimball asked for 2 motions; one to adopt the cost allocation study and secondly, if Council does not need any additional discussion, would be to go along with staff recommendation to set aside the allocated amount aside for special purposes. CM Garibaldi agrees but would like to agendize at a future meeting, before the end of year, to discuss how we set aside that money.

#### c. Possible Acceptance of CARES Act Fund Allocations Agreements with Amador County.

CM Kimball explained this was a project that involved a lot of team work, including from Mayor Stimpson who worked with the County to get the city additional CARES funding that the County received from the State. There are 2 agreements in the packet; one for the City of Jackson in the amount up to \$65,000 and one for Jackson Fire Department for up to \$10,000. Both agreements are substantiated with vendor quotes explaining planned expenditures. CM Kimball requests Council to enter into agreement with the County.

Council had brief discussion with CM Garibaldi reminding us that the expenditures have to be COVID related. VM Gonsalves asked whether County was okay with the proposed projects because they looked different than a few weeks ago. CM Kimball confirmed that the requested expenditures were approved by County. She also recalled how this discussion was initiated a few weeks ago. CM Garibaldi wanted to publicly thank the County and District 1 Supervisor Crew for the CARES Act funds for City of Jackson.

Mayor Stimpson opened for Public Comment. After hearing none and seeing none, he moved back to Council.

The Building Department processed 18 total permits in September. The total number of permits decreased from August's total of 19 permits processed.

Construction projects continue to be unpredictable during this season. During the fall, as weather permits, projects should continue. Plans have been submitted for four new single-family dwellings. Site work has begun at Jackson View on lots 67, 68, 74 and 75. Applications for these lots were approved in December of 2019. Site Improvements at the Five Star Storage facility on Thomas Drive continues and new storage units are being erected as we speak.

TESLA Energy Operations Inc. continues their work to install charging stations at the Busi Parking Lot. All equipment and electrical infrastructure have been installed. Restoration of the parking lot will begin on Monday, October 12. This project is on schedule to be completed the middle of October.

City Staff and Adams Ashby Group continue to work with property owners who qualify for sewer replacement grant funds. An application has been submitted for a sewer lateral replacement on Peek Hill. This is a problematic area where multiple sewers are connected to one another

before they reach the City Sewer Main. Staff will keep Council updated on these projects as they relate to the City of Jackson SSMP.

#### CODE ENFORCEMENT UPDATE:

There have been several complaints made about out outdoor cannabis cultivation. The City of Jackson Development Code, Title 17, Article II, 17.07.45, "Personal Use and Cultivation of Marijuana", does not allow outdoor cultivation. When complaints are received property owners and tenants are notified and informed of the regulations set forth in the development code. These complaints have been handled without incident.

There are no other pressing Code Enforcement Issues at this time.

#### PROJECTED:

The Building Department will remain optimistic, as usual, moving into the final months of 2020. All around... The pulse within the construction community remains strong.

For comparison... September of 2019 produced 16 approved building permits.

#### RECOMMENDATION

That the City Council review the reports.

#### DISCUSSION

Enclosed are summary status reports for the FY 19/20 which ended on July 31, 2020. All inter fund transfers or yearend journal entries have taken place; all revenues and expenditures have been accounted for. **Barring any corrections by the auditors**, the General Fund ended with a very good fund balance, at over \$600,000. This helped us for the time in the last decade to meet the requirement of a committed fund balance at 16.67% of total expenditure. I want to congratulate the Council and the staff on this achievement!

The final accounting closure of the New York Ranch road project in August 2019 contributed to this surplus. This is an indication of better accounting practices. Additionally, the early cost saving measures the city implemented played a role coupled with higher than anticipated property taxes and sales tax revenues. However, COVID economy is not unpredictable. We are not quite certain how FY 20/21 will end at this point.

The first quarter in FY 20/21 appeared to be on track and somewhat over spent at this point. This is consistent with past years: the first two quarters usually see more expenses as revenues have not been received. However, COVID years can be unpredictable. I remain cautious about future revenues.

#### RECOMMENDATION

That the City Council authorize staff to submit the attached application for a pilot homeless crisis intervention outreach program.

#### DISCUSSION

On Monday, we learned that the Homeless Emergency Aid Program (HEAP) fund round II became available for Amador County agencies. A total of \$79,000 is available as grant money for eligible programs. The City has received \$14,000 in 2019 via ATCAA.

Police Chief, Fire Chief and I met on Tuesday and decided to apply for this money to institute a homeless outreach pilot program. See attached application.

On Wednesday, ATCAA Housing Service Director approached the City to discuss the shower needs and suggested the City to consider a joint application with ATCAA. Details need to be worked out in the following days. Should we decide to proceed with this option, staff will amend the details of the application. The application deadline is October 19.

At any rate, it is recommended that Council authorize staff to apply for the HEAP round II dollars. Alternatively, since this fund is unexpected and considering staff's workload, Council can direct staff to forgo this application, which will allow other agencies more chances to obtain this fund.

#### Jackson Background:

The City of Jackson is a full-service municipal government entity. We provide services in the areas of police, fire, streets, parks, planning, building, water, and sewer. The City of Jackson has very limited financial and human resources. Its general fund budget is only \$4 million. The City has a staff of 30. Approximately 5,000 permanent residents live in Jackson.

Jackson is the home to many essential service providers in Amador County, including the County jail, the hospital, well-used parks, numerous restaurants, a variety of grocery stores, the post office and gas stations. Additionally, Jackson Rancheria Casino is only a few miles away. While it is an attraction, the Casino also contributes to the homeless issue in Jackson. Due to its unique location, Jackson houses the majority of the county's homeless individuals. A recent informal count indicated there are about 108 homeless individuals residing within the city. Based on data collected by the police department, the City has at least 64 interactions with homeless individuals each month or 2 incidents a day.

Recognizing Jackson's need, in January 2019, the City received \$14,000 of HEAP fund to provide outreach services to the homeless population. The prior outreach effort was largely conducted by police officers. It has proven to be important to build rapport with the community.

#### **Our Initiative:**

Since then, the City has expressed its wishes to have a larger funding in order to hire designated "homeless outreach coordinators" who are not law enforcement personnel. The Coordinators then reach out to homeless individuals daily and endeavor to connect them with necessary services or job opportunities. The Coordinators will be accompanied by the city's Police and Fire Department personnel in the field. They are the Jackson "crisis intervention task force".

We request **\$75,232** to hire four part-time Coordinators and institute a pilot crisis intervention task force" program for 12 weeks. The scope of this pilot program may be evolving around these basic perimeters: daily log of interaction with homeless individuals, build a rapport with homeless individuals, refer homeless individuals to connect with services they need, collect data and provide future program recommendations to the City Council and the City Manager for consideration and implementation. The ultimate goal is to keep the community safe and clean and reduce homelessness.

#### Jackson Funding Request/ Budget:

1. Personnel Cost:

Coordinator costs: 4 coordinators divided into two teams and each team cover a 3- or 4-day shift alternatively so that daily outreach can be conducted.

Weekly cost

a. Coordinator hourly rate at \$30 / hr; 4 hours a day; 3 -4 days a week;

2\*30\*4\*3= \$720

2\*30\*4\*4= \$960

b. City FTE personnel cost:

2 police officers and/or Fire Fighter; hourly compensation rate @ \$65/hour. accompanying the team of coordinators daily for outreach and debriefing.

Total: 2\*65\*4\*7=\$3,640

c. City administration cost (employees OT to cover hiring, record keeping & accounting) 5% of total costs: \$266 (=0.05\* \$5,320)

Total weekly personnel cost: \$5,586

Total for a 12-week program: \$67,032

2. Expenses:

Coordinator uniform, supplies: \$400\*4= \$1,200

Computer, camera, etc.: \$2,000

Supplies and materials to hand out to homeless individuals: \$5,000

Total Expenses: \$8,200

#### Grand total (personnel + expenses): \$75,232

#### INVITATION TO ENTER INTO SETTLEMENT NEGOTIATIONS PRIOR TO ISSUANCE OF ADMINISTRATIVE CIVIL LIABILITY: CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, CITY OF JACKSON, AND CENTRAL COAST FINANCIAL GROUP, DBA CCFG CONSTRUCTION

**Please read this notice carefully.** The purpose of this letter is to inform you of a forthcoming Administrative Civil Liability Complaint (Complaint), and to notify you of your opportunity to enter into settlement negotiations with Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Regional Board) Prosecution Staff regarding the assessment of monetary penalties for your alleged failure to comply with the California Water Code.

Water Code section 13385, subdivision (a)(5), authorizes the Water Boards to impose administrative civil liability when a person violates certain provisions of the federal Clean Water Act, including Section 301 (33 U.S.C. Sec. 1311), which prohibits the discharge of any pollutant except as authorized under a Clean Water Act permit.

In November 2017, the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) initiated a contract to repair and replace two storm drain lines within the state right of way in the City of Jackson (City) at 516 Sutter Street. Central Coast Financial Group, Inc., doing business as CCFG Construction (CCFG), was awarded the contract to replace the storm drain lines. On January 24, 2018, CCFG notified Underground Service Alert of Northern California and Nevada (USA) that it would begin excavation on January 26, 2018. USA sent the dig ticket to several utility companies, including the City of Jackson Public Works Department; however, the City did not respond to the dig ticket. On January 28, 2018, CCFG began excavating to replace the storm drain lines. On February 1, 2018, CCFG hit a sewer line in the excavation, resulting in the release of 81,012 gallons of sewage, with approximately 68,912 gallons being discharged into the North Fork of Jackson Creek, a water of the United States.

# Caltrans, the City, and CCFG are potentially jointly and severally liable for over \$699,000 in administrative civil liability for the alleged violation.

Based on our review and after conducting a preliminary penalty calculation, the Assistant Executive Officer of the Central Valley Regional Board intends to issue a Complaint seeking an administrative civil liability assessment against Caltrans, the City, and CCFG. A proposed penalty amount has been calculated using the methodology in the State Water Resources Control Board's Water Quality Enforcement Policy (Enforcement Policy) and is based on facts known to date. However, this proposed penalty amount is subject to modification, should additional information come to light. The full Enforcement Policy may be found here:

By way of this letter, you are formally notified of the opportunity to meet to discuss the facts regarding the alleged violations, including the option of settlement. This meeting affords you the opportunity to potentially reduce the proposed penalty amount if you present new information to Central Valley Regional Board Prosecution Staff, or other information you believe is relevant to determining an appropriate monetary penalty. Upon agreement, all settlement communications would be kept confidential in accordance with Evidence Code sections 1152 and 1154.

In order to initiate confidential discussions to settle this matter, you must contact me by October 18, 2019, to schedule a time to meet with Central Valley Regional Board Prosecution Staff. In addition, please provide the name and contact information for the attorney who will be representing you in this matter. Once a meeting has been arranged, you will be provided additional information regarding the violations.

If you do not intend to avail yourself of the opportunity to discuss a potential negotiated resolution, the Assistant Executive Officer will issue the Complaint and this matter will proceed to a formal enforcement hearing before the Central Valley Regional Board, or the Assistant Executive Officer may seek to refer the matter to the Attorney General's Office or other prosecution agency.
