Councilman Harrison moved for approval of **ORDINANCE NO. 2372**, seconded by Vice-Mayor Browne.

Before the vote, Ms. Duke explained that this was to appropriate fund balance for repairs at the Industrial Park.

Manager Stasiak distributed a map of the proposed areas of the railroad spurs in the Industrial Park that were in need of repair. He explained that this problem was caused by a failure of the base under the railroad spurs and two (2) of the areas the City was requesting \$22,800.00 to use for the necessary repairs. He added that the City would go out for Request for Proposals for the other four (4) areas that were in need of repair.

There was a brief discussion among the Council concerning how long these repairs would take, if there were mines in the area that could have caused this problem and if routine maintenance would help to prevent this in the future. There was no further discussion, and the vote was taken as follows:

Councilman Garvin moved to declare certain vehicles and equipment surplus property in accordance with the Code of Ordinances Sec 2-286 and authorize the City Manager to sell them in accordance with the Code of Ordinances Sec 2-287. The motion was seconded by Councilman Karr.

Before the vote, Mr. Modzelewski explained that the Public Works Department had two (2) fairly new sanitation trucks that could be transformed into dump trucks by removing their compactor units, selling them and replacing them with dump beds. He added that the Public Works Department also had a 1994 Scarab Window Composting Machine that had not been used for severable years and was not serviceable at this time. Mr. Modzelewski stated that the Community Services Department had a used Senior Citizen van that had been replaced by a new van and was no longer needed. He added that the vehicles and equipment to be declared surplus and sold were listed as follows:

3. Consider, and act upon, authorizing the Mayor to sign a Service Agreement with iWorQ Systems "iWorQ" located in Logan, Utah. (Peter J. Stasiak, City Manager)

Executive Summary

The item involves a motion to authorize the Mayor to sign a Service Agreement between the City of McAlester and iWorQ Systems.

Vice-Mayor Browne moved to authorize the Mayor to sign a Service Agreement with iWorQ Systems "iWorQ" located in Logan, Utah. The motion was seconded by Councilman Garvin.

Before the vote, Manager Stasiak explained that the iWorQ Systems was the first company to offer city and county government management applications as an internet service. He added that the City would concentrate on Code enforcement initially and this application would allow the City to track permits, violations, inspections and licenses. He stated that the system would generate numbers for each case, detailed reports and track the steps or progress used to mitigate the various reported problems. Manager Stasiak commented that this would be a way to be more responsive to the citizens concerns.

There was a brief discussion among the Council regarding when this would be ready to implement, if citizens could still call to lodge complaints and that this would be a better way to manage complaints and work with the citizens.

Manager Stasiak added that beginning Monday there would be an information person in the foyer and the City would also have a live receptionist.

There was no further discussion, and the vote was taken as follows:

New Business

Vive-Mayor Browne commented that he had an item that he wanted to address at this time if it qualified for new business. He explained that he was concerned with the amount of graffiti around the City and would like the City to donate money to Crime Stoppers.

Mr. Ervin stated that this did not meet the new business requirements; it could be taken up between the meetings or even placed on the next agenda.

Vice-Mayor Browne asked that this item be placed on the next Council agenda.

Manager Stasiak stated that he thought there was money in the Crime Stopper's account and he would have Ms. Duke verify that information.

City Manager's Report

Manager Stasiak reported that the City had switched back to the cleaned clear well and were not having any reports or complaints of dirty water. He reported that the Public Works Department was preparing for a large roadway reconstruction project in Northgate. He stated that the Dura Patcher had been in North Town preparing for the Old Town Festival and then would move to the school areas then into the central business district. He added that people continue to invest in the City. He commented that the City was already at \$21 million in building permits for the first eight (8) months of this year, the average for new home construction was forty (40) and the City

was at forty (40) new homes. He commented that the City had eighty-one (81) building permits with \$106,000.00

Remarks and Inquiries By City Council

Councilman Fiedler thanked all of the individuals in the upcoming Chili Cook Off, Car Show and the North Town Festival. He thanked all of the individuals involved in the State Fair booth. He commented that there were twenty-six (26) sponsors and with the help of Allegiance Communications citizens would be able to view a live broadcast of the Fair on channels 16 and 21 and the City's website.

Councilman Harrison commented on his quarterly newsletter and mentioned the opening of the recycling center on Monday.

Vice-Mayor Browne stated that he had received complaints about a truck going around town selling furniture. He asked if they were paying sales tax.

Manager Stasiak stated that the individuals did have a City permit but there was no way to verify if they were paying sales tax.

Vice-Mayor Browne asked if there was any way to set this up.

Manager Stasiak stated that the City would need to establish an ordinance.

Vice-Mayor Browne commented that a local kid, Brandon Keith would be starting for the Arizona Cardinals. He added that it was great to see local people succeeding. He then complimented Councilman Harrison on his newsletter.

Councilman Karr thanked the City for fixing the water problem and expressed concern about some fire hydrants that seemed to be leaking.

Councilman Garvin announced that the North Town Festival would be held this Saturday from 9:00 A.M. until 6:00 P.M. and he expected it to be a fun day. He thanked the City for getting the North Town area ready and commented that the Dura Patcher did everything it was supposed to do. He added that he had been asking for five (5) years to have the North Gate area fixed. He suggested speaking with the residents in that area, if they would be willing to pay the cost of bringing the repairs to their expansion joints and make that area look better.

Mayor Priddle commented on getting to see the work paying off and problems getting solved. He added that the iWorQ was a good example. He stated that the City was not finished with improvements to the water system. He encouraged everyone to attend the North Town Festival, the Car Show and the Chili Cook Off and that this should be a great day. He reminded everyone that the recycling center would start next Monday.

RE: MPOWER THIRD QUARTER REPORT

Below is summary of MPOWER's activities from July to September.

ORGANIZATION

In June, MPOWER elected new officers: President, Daπyl Wright, Vice-President, Noble Miller, Secretary, Dr. Kenneth Miller, and Treasurer, John Titsworth.

Since taking over as President, Darryl Wright has put in place several working committees including a Building Committee, an Incentives Committee, and a 501C3 Non-Profit Status Committee.

CITY CONTRACT

Mid July, MPOWER finalized its contract with the City of McAlester. The new MPOWER budget for the year is \$184,673. The main goals for MPOWER, as defined by the contract, are as follows:

- Create a template to categorize and profile potential uses of industrial space and land.
- Partner with state, local agencies, realtors and private developers in marketing this information.

- Create and maintain a working relationship with existing businesses and develop a business registry and database.
- Partner with the Chamber of Commerce and Main Street Association to develop a business survey.
- · Identify areas for infill for future construction opportunities.

MPOWER is in the process of working on all of the goals above.

STAFFING ISSUES

On August 2nd 2010, MPower contracted with Express Employment Professional Services, a local temp agency. The agency sent Carlie David, who is now acting as our office Administrative Assistant. Carlie has been working on several projects including collecting Board Member biographies for our website.

We are still in need of an Economic Development Specialist, and I am trying to get our job description posted at the local universities in the area. I am also going to try to post the vacancy on a couple of national websites such as the American Planning Association website and Planetizen website. In addition, we will be posting to our own website as soon as it is launched.

OUTSIDE CONTRACTS

This month, John Titsworth took over our accounting. Walter Bethune is no longer contracting with MPOWER as our accountant. John will be producing all of our financial statements from September 2010 forward.

MARKETING MATERIALS AND WEBSITE

MPOWER's marketing firm, Staplegun - out of Oklahoma City, has developed and finalized our name and logo (in case you did not notice from our new letterhead). We now have a large sign on the front of our office, making our location more visible to the public.

Staplegun is now moving full steam ahead in developing the MPOWER website and marketing folder for McAlester. I have been working intensely trying to develop content for the website and folder, which includes statistics, photographs, write-ups on everything from the area's local history to current economic climate. This will be helpful and enlightening to businesses from afar as well as to the local population.

Since there is so much data, I am still in the process of gathering and organizing this information. I am also experiencing a big challenge when it comes to finding and cataloguing facts on available and developable properties in the area. We have not received much cooperation from area land owners who own property - especially around key areas such as Highway 69.

We need simple information such as acreage, zoning, parcel boundaries, and approximate asking price. I have been working with Pittsburg County's Assessor's office to determine a lot of this information so we can post to our website under the "available properties" section.



Additionally, we are looking for aerial photos and maps with infrastructure information, such as gas, water, and electricity. These are all basic points of information that site selection consultants and developers need before seriously considering McAlester as a place to do business.

In July, I held a couple of meetings in regard to the McAlester hotels and their desire to see an increase in tourism. The area hotels have stated that their business is slowing down and would like for someone to help promote tourism. We are doing just that by adding a "Tourism" section to the MPOWER website.

Finally, we have assisted in promoting some of our manufacturers in the area. OETA is shooting a special on manufacturing in Oklahoma and is highlighting McAAP and some of our local manufacturers around McAlester.

MEETINGS

In August, I traveled to Oklahoma City, where I attended a United States Senate
and Congressional Military Legislative Aid Delegation meeting. A Joint
Committee on Oklahoma Military Installation Support meeting directly followed.
Both meetings were hosted by Commerce Secretary, Natalie Shirley. In
summary, both of the meetings allowed each Oklahoma Installation Community
to report on recent activities and planning efforts. The Commerce Secretary
recognized McAlester and thanked us for being a now visible, and valuable
member of the group.

John Bonsell, who works as a military specialist consultant for many of the Oklahoma installations was there and was the main speaker for the group.

McAlester's McAlester Defense Support Association (MDSA) - through Mark Jordan - has been trying to contract with Mr. Bonsell for over a year now. He collaborated with the Southeast Workforce Investment Board (SEWIB) to obtain grant funds (\$250,000) to do planning for the area, which would include a section for McAAP and its business development efforts.

The funds are being administered through KEDDO. The RFP has just been released by the SEWIB their deadline to receive responses to this proposal will be late October.

On September 30th, I will join Mark Jordan, representatives from the City, and Senator Inhofe's aid, Ben Boyer at a meeting in Altus, OK. There we will meet with the economic developer for Vance Air Force Base, David Braddock, who has worked with Mr. Bonsell and he will share his experience and also explain how their town found the funding to engage Mr. Bonsell.

 The Oklahoma Southeast organization is planning already for The Shot Show held in January of 2011. MPOWER will take part in this exhibit and I have asked McAAP to join our team this year at The Shot Show.

In August, MPOWER hosted a luncheon at our local winery for the OKSE group. Not only did we promote our local winery to other members around SE Oklahoma, but we also firmed up plans with representatives from McAAP on our booth for this trade show. We also watched a presentation by Marketing Alliance who has now contracted with the Oklahoma Southeast group to do their website. As a member, McAlester will have more visibility through this website with our own webpage.

- I also met with April Murray (Kiamichi Techno logy Center) and Nikki Grosfield-Heath (Eastern Oklahoma State College) about teaming up together to explore business incubation ideas and agribusiness development for our area. The three of us will be working on an exploratory program for agribusiness and possible business incubation in the future. More to come on this topic over the next several months as the three of us coordinate the next steps.
- The McAlester Main Street Program hosted their annual "Big Cruzer" car show and chili cook-off last Saturday (September 18). MPOWER had a table and I cooked buffalo chili. I'd like to thank MPOWER Vice-President, Noble Miller who found us a table, set it up, and broke it down for the event. Noble acted on very short notice and I could not have participated were it not for his help. Carlie David also helped me staff the table for the morning hours so thanks to her for helping on a Saturday as well.

Many of you may not know, but we have a buffalo farm nearby! Its location is near Indianola and this is where I purchased the buffalo meat. If you would like the contact information for the farm, please email me. Although I received very good reviews, we did not place in the contest. However, MPOWER is proud to support a local farm and enjoyed helping out our Main Street program.

McAlester Main Street also has an "Economic Development Restructuring Committee," of which I am a member. This committee is working to help organize all of their properties in a database. The funds raised from the car show and chili cook-off will be used to pay for part of the software needed for this database. MPOWER will be collaborating with McAlester Main Street to help promote vacant buildings in the downtown area. I will also be part of the State Main Street Program Review on Sept 27th.

NEW BUSINESS RECRUITMENT

The following is an update on new business recruitment efforts for McAlester:

- The Department of Commerce included MPOWER on their RFP for Project CanMan, a Canadian construction building materials company looking for a 50,000 square foot facility. MPOWER responded to their proposal and await to see if we are shortlisted as a community who will be considered more closely.
- The Department of Commerce included MPOWER on their RFP for Project Fitz, a tissue paper manufacturer, who is looking for a 400,000 square foot facility (they will build) on a minimum 200 acre site. MPOWER responded to their proposal and await to see if we are shortlisted as a community who will be considered more closely.
- Back in April, we submitted a proposal to a defense contractor, Project Montag, who is considering relocating their entire operations to another state. They are a primary defense contractor and they are considering McAlester because of their relationship with an existing company as well as McAAP. The Oklahoma Department of Commerce communicated with me last week to let me know that the company is still showing interest in McAlester. They are leading this project and has informed me that the company plans on making a decision soon on whether or not they will make a site visit to McAlester.
- MPOWER is still in discussions with a bullet manufacturer, Project Southard,
 who is outgrowing their existing facility in another state. MPOWER connected
 this company to McAAP. The company is currently testing a product (which is
 currently in the development process). MPOWER hopes that the project will
 move forward with McAlester once the product is officially ready to produce.
- A few weeks ago, MPOWER gave a tour of McAlester to a real estate broker from OKC who is looking for a site for a distributing company. I gave the broker demographic information on our area and showed him land at our industrial park. His client prefers to remain anonymous at this point.
- MPOWER also connected a very well known Oil & Gas company out of Houston with representatives from FracTech, who owns a vacant building just outside of McAlester. The building has been vacant for some time now, and MPOWER plans to market that building as an "available site" on our website.
- A small business owner who operates a Kidney Dialysis office contacted us about setting up a small office in McAlester, until they found out that we had a hospital. Although parts of Pittsburg County is underserved for healthcare, the

business was not interested in locating to McAlester once he found out we had a hospital here. His explained that he felt hospitals would prefer to do the dialysis themselves and not refer patients to him. I also gave him the number to the Choctaw Health Center, as he said he had previously worked with tribal clinics who may have need for dialysis services.

- MPOWER has received several requests for the demand for a man's suit store in McAlester. I reached out to Bob's suit store in Henryetta, OK where many local men go to purchase their suits. I worked with McAlester Main Street in locating a downtown space for the business and the owner of the space offered an incentive to the business if they would expand here in McAlester. Unfortunately, the owner of the store is not interested in expanding as he is looking at retirement in a few years and has no plans to turn the business over to anyone. He also mentioned that the current economy made the idea impossible right now anyway.
- A Memphis real estate broker contacted MPOWER looking for a 3,000 SF building to be used for light distribution. We shared several properties with the broker and connected him to the real estate agents handling these properties.
- The USDA also shared a building RFP for 10,000 SF building needed for offices. MPOWER shared this RFP with the City, who owns the former FAA building at the airport. City Manager, Pete Stasiak will have city staff respond to the RFP since MPOWER does not have all of the details on the building, and cannot act as the City's contractual agent.
- Restaurant Recruitment: I reconnected with the national chain restaurant who I had previously contacted, in hopes of recruiting them to McAlester. I shared a few more available properties along Highway 69 near Walmart. The franchise owner (out of Oklahoma City) previously explained that his restaurant has an attached bar that has wall-to-wall big screen TVs for sports watching. A restaurant bar is a big part of revenue generation especially on Sunday sports game days. As with many restaurants, there is a large profit margin attached to alcohol sales, which greatly affects the business' bottom line. More on this below.

LEGISLATIVE ISSUES

You may already know that Pittsburg County has a "Blue Law" which does not allow the sale of any alcohol beverage on Sunday (and most holidays) that is more than 3.2% by weight, or more than 4% by volume.

However, some counties – like our neighboring **McIntosh County** – allow businesses to sell alcohol on Sundays above these limits. To a restaurant/bar, whose profits heavily rely or are attached to alcohol sales, one day out of the week can make or break the business' bottom line. This can weigh heavily on the decision making process on whether (or not) to locate their restaurant in a given location. Consequently, having a "Blue Law" can have a tremendous economic impact on a town. LeFlore County changed their laws 2 years ago, and are already surpassing Pittsburg County in sales tax revenue generation.

On September 13, 2010, I presented a resolution, on behalf of MPOWER, to the Pittsburg County Commissioners. This resolution requested that the Commissioners place on the ballot language that would allow the county voters to decide whether or not alcohol could be sold on Sunday, provided that food be accompanied with the drink. Senator LerBlance, the McAlester Chamber, McAlester Main Street, Mayor Priddle and area businesses supported MPOWER's effort.

Now, the District Attorney must review the resolution and the commissioners will vote in the next few weeks whether or not to put on the December 14 ballot. If you have any questions about this topic, or wish to discuss, please do not hesitate to call me.

CONFERENCES

Since McAlester is a "defense community," I traveled to San Francisco in August and attended the **Association of Defense Communities' Annual Conference**. The focus of this conference centered around "renewable energy" and the Presidential Executive Order 13514: Federal Leadership in Environmental, Energy, and Economic Performance. This is an unfunded mandate ordered from the President of the United States to all of the military services. Our base must comply with this mandate as well and I will be working with the base to offer as much assistance and planning as I am able. MPOWER will do everything possible to ensure that McAlester Army Ammunitions plant does not suffer from the next round of BRAC - as a result of not meeting this mandate.

The **Heartland Energy Conference** was a one day conference held Rogers State College in Claremore, OK and covered a host of topics from Compressed Natural Gas to Wind and Solar Energy. The good news for Oklahoma is that CNG has a very promising future as a renewable energy source and will impact our area's local economy as well. Geothermal offers many opportunities for our area as well. In fact, the McAAP has installed several ground source heat pumps in several of their buildings already.

EXISTING BUSINESS RETENTION AND EXPANSION

MPOWER is working with two local businesses who are in expansion mode. One is a agribusiness and the other is in the construction materials industry.

MPOWER's progress with each depends on two things: 1) Our collaboration with other institutions such as the City of McAlester, EOSC, and KTC and 2) Our own progress made by our Building and Incentives Committees. Further, MPOWER may be able to find financial assistance from grants once our Non-Profit Committee establishes the 501c3 status for our organization.

On another note, we have some bittersweet news to share. Quality Finishing, a well renown metal finisher in our Taylor Industrial Park has chosen to sell his company and his facility. Mr. Bill Blankenship has provided finishing for metalwork all over the world. He is a global business and it is McAlester's loss that he has decided to sell.

However, MPOWER now has a 50,000 square foot building to market. This building is an incredible asset to local economic development pursuits, so MPOWER will be including this building in our list of available properties and marketing his site wherever possible. Thank you Mr. Blankenship and we wish you well in your retirement and future endeavors.

The McAlester Airport Advisory Board met in a regular session on September 20, 2010. Steve Otis called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m. Roll call was taken with the above members present and represented a quorum.

Motion was made by Bob Ettner, seconded by David Verner to approve the prior minutes as written.

The vote was 6-0 as follows:

AYE: Otis, Verner, Stasiak, Ettner, Hogan, Walters

NAY: None Motion carried.

The next item on the agenda was to consider and act upon approval of Hanger Construction by Wallace Management on Airport property. After discussion regarding location, airspace restrictions, size, drainage, and the lease terms, motion was made by David Verner, seconded by Mike Hogan to approve the Hanger Construction and corresponding lease agreement.

The vote was 6-0 as follows:

AYE: Otis, Verner, Stasiak, Ettner, Hogan, Walters

NAY: None Motion carried.

The Airport Manager's Report included a presentation and discussion on the Federal Grant that has been awarded to the airport for a two hundred foot dirt extension on the south end of the runway, which will enable McAlester Airport to get a GPS Precision Approach. Also discussed was the end of the FAA contract at the Flight Service building and a possibility of renting the building to the USDA.

The final item on the agenda was adjournment. Motion was made by Mike Hogan, seconded by Bob Ettner at 4:55 p.m..

The vote was 6-0 as follows:

NAY: None Motion carried.

LEASE

This agreement and indenture of lease made this 28th day of September, 2010, by and between the CITY OF McALESTER, a municipal corporation of the State of Oklahoma, hereinafter called "City", and the McALESTER AIRPORT AUTHORITY, hereinafter called "Authority", as LESSOR, and Wallace Air, L.L.C., a corporation, as LESSEE, hereinafter called "Developer",

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Developer is desirous of constructing a certain aircraft hanger for use by Developer, and Developer has agreed to construct, operate and maintain said aircraft hanger under the terms hereinafter set forth; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by City and Authority that the leasehold title to the property hereinafter described is not now nor will it, during the term of this lease, be needed by City and Authority for public purposes and that accordingly, said property may be used for the purpose aforesaid; and

WHEREAS, this agreement and indenture of lease was presented to and approved by the Airport Advisory Board of the City of McAlester and duly entered upon its minutes the 20th day of September, 2010 and approved by the City and Authority on the 28th day of September, 2010.

NOW, THEREFORE, this agreement and indenture of lease WITNESSETH: that for and in consideration of the demised premises and of the rents, covenants and conditions herein reserved, mentioned and contained on the part of the Developer, its successors and assigns to be paid, kept and performed, City and Authority have demised and leased and by these presents do hereby demise and lease unto the Developer, its successors and assigns, and Developer does hereby take upon and subject to the terms and conditions, covenants and agreements hereinafter expressed, the following described

property:

See Attached Exhibit "A" for "Initial" layout and size of site.

Together with an easement or right-of-way for use in common solely for the purposes and subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth over the taxiways and runways now existing at said airport.

To have and to hold the demised premises, being the project site, together with the right to use the entrance road right -of-way for the purposes and subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, unto Developer, its successors and assigns for the full term of twenty-five (25) years commencing from the date of the completion of the improvements to be constructed thereon as herein provided, which shall be considered as the commencement of the term hereof, unless this agreement and indenture of lease shall sooner terminate as hereinafter provided, in which case the term shall expire on the effective date of such termination.

As consideration for said lease, Developer shall pay to City and Authority the fixed yearly rent of One Dollar (\$1.00) payable in advance on the day of commencement of the term and payable thereafter on the same month and day of each year during the term.

This agreement and indenture of lease is made, granted and accepted upon the foregoing and the following covenants and conditions, all and each and every one of which City and Authority and Developer respectively covenant and agree to keep, perform and observe, each to the extent that the same are binding or expressed to be binding upon it.

All provisions of this lease shall be deemed and construed to be "conditions" as well as "covenants", as though the words specifically expressing or importing conditions and covenants were both used in each separate provision of this lease.

ARTICLE I

Construction of Building Project.

Section 1.1. Developer agrees to construct an aircraft hangar containing 6,400 square feet on the property hereinbefore described, in accordance with plans of the Developer dated September 8, 2010 which has heretofore been attached as Exhibit "B" in accordance with the building codes of the City of McAlester and all requirements of the Federal Aviation Authority, all final plans and specifications to be subject to the approval of the Airport Advisory Board.

Section 1.2. The airport hangar to be constructed, including appurtenances, to house and store privately owned aircraft.

Section 1.3. All work performed by Developer and under any subcontract shall be done and performed subject to the approval of the City Engineer of City. All work shall be completed and ready for occupancy not later than the expiration of 180 days after execution of this agreement provided, however, that Developer shall not be responsible for delays caused by fire, casualty, strikes, lockouts or labor disturbances, by acts of God or the public enemy, by order, direction or lawful interference by any municipal, state or federal government official or agency, or by injunction or other order beyond

Developer's control.

ARTICLE II

Payment of Rent and Taxes

Section 2.1. Developer will pay, without notice or demand, the basic rent herein reserved and all other sums which under any provisions of this lease may become additional rent hereunder at the times and in the manner in this lease provided at the office of the Chief Financial Officer of the City of McAlester.

Section 2.2. It is contemplated that by reason of the ownership of City, the demised premises shall be exempt from assessment for ordinary county and state real estate taxes during the entire term of this lease, but in the event the demised premises, or any part thereof, are at any time during the term of this lease assessed for county or state real estate taxes, either against City and Authority or against Developer, Developer shall pay and discharge the full amount of all taxes of whatsoever kind or character that may be assessed or imposed against either the City and Authority or the Developer accruing during the term of this lease arising from the construction, ownership, operation and maintenance of said building.

Section 2.3. If Developer shall at anytime fail to maintain any of the insurance policies provided for hereafter, shall fail to make any other payment on its part to be made as in this lease provided, or shall fail or refuse to do such work of maintenance and repair of the leased premises

as may be required by this agreement, then City and Authority, without demand on Developer, and without waiving or releasing Developer from any obligations in this agreement, may, but shall not be obligated to, effect any such insurance coverage and pay the premiums thereof, make such other payment on the part of the Developer to be made as in this agreement provided, or cause such work of maintenance and repair to be done and performed. All sums paid by City and Authority and all necessary and incidental costs and expenses in connection with the performance of any such act by City and Authority shall be deemed additional rent hereunder and shall be payable to City and Authority on demand or on the next annual rental payment date.

ARTICLE III

Insurance

Section 3.1. During the term of this lease, Developer shall, at its sale cost and expense, keep the building on the demised premises insured, on forms and with companies satisfactory to City and Authority, for the benefit of City and Authority and Developer, as their respective interests may appear, in an amount equal to not less than the full insurable value (a) against loss or damage by fire, and (b) against loss or damage from risks covered by standard board or extended coverage form of endorsement.

Section 3.2. During the term of this lease, Developer shall also, at its sale cost and expense, maintain public liability insurance, on forms and in companies satisfactory to City and Authority, against claims for personal injury, death or property damage occurring upon, in, or about the demised premises, and on, in, or about the adjoining streets and passageways, such insurance to afford protection to the limit of not less than One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) in respect to injury to or death of a single person, and not less than Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) in respect to anyone accident, and to the limit of not less than One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000,00) in respect to property damage for anyone accident. Policies for such insurance shall be for the mutual benefit of City and Authority and Developer; provided, however, that Developer shall have the option of having such policies written for the benefit of City and Authority, similar insurance in a similar amount under an owner's protection liability insurance policy.

Section 3.3. The City Treasurer of the City of McAlester shall act for City and Authority in approving insurance policies and companies pursuant to the provisions of this article. Certifications of all such policies of insurance (or of the renewals thereof) shall be furnished to and deposited with the Chief Financial Officer of the City of McAlester, accompanied by evidence satisfactory to the Chief Financial Officer of the City of McAlester that the premiums thereon have been paid, not less than 10 days prior to the expiration of any then current policy.

Section 3.4. The premiums on all insurance policies in force at the termination of this lease shall be apportioned between City and Authority, and Developer in such manner that City and Authority shall reimburse Developer for that portion of the aggregate premiums unearned on all such policies of insurance in force at the termination of this lease, and said policies shall thereupon be transferred to City and Authority and all future interest of Developer therein terminated.

Section 3.5. All policies of insurance issued pursuant to the provisions of this Article III shall contain an agreement by the insurer that such policies shall not be cancelled without at least 10 day's prior written notice to City and Authority.

Section 3.6. Nothing in this Article III shall prevent Developer from taking out insurance of the kind provided for under Section 3.1 of this lease under a blanket insurance policy or policies which can cover any properties owned, leased or operated by Developer, as well as the building on the demised premises, nor from including any insurance provided for in Section 3.2 of this lease under a blanket insurance policy or policies maintained by Developer with respect to this and other properties owned, leased or operated by it or by a Developer's subsidiary, provided, however, that any such policy or policies of blanket insurance of the kind provided for by Section 3.1 of this lease shall specify therein, or Developer shall furnish the Chief Financial Officer of the City of McAlester with a written statement from the insurer under such policy or policies specifying (a) the amount of the insurance allocated to the building on the demised premises, which amount shall be not less than the amount required by Section 3.1 of this lease, and (b) that any loss payable in respect of such building shall be adjusted and shall be paid as provided in Section 3.4 of this lease.

ARTICLE IV

Repairs and Maintenance of Demised Premises

Section 4.1. During the term of this lease, Developer will, at its sole cost and expense, keep and maintain the demised premises, appurtenances and utilities and each and every part thereof, including roofs and exterior walls, in good condition and repair, and will make all necessary repairs, both exterior and interior to the demised premises, and necessary replacement of machinery and equipment to the end that the property shall at all times be kept in good condition and repair for the purposes for which the said property is being used; all subject, however, to the provisions with respect to damage and destruction set forth in Article V of this lease.

Section 4.2. When used in this Article IV, the term "repairs" shall include replacement or renewals, when necessary, and all such repairs made by Developer shall be at least equal in quality and class to the original work.

ARTICLE V

Damage or Destruction

Section 5.1. In the event the building on the demised premises is destroyed by fire or other casualty, or is partially destroyed so as to render it unfit for occupancy, or in case it is so badly damaged that it cannot be reasonably repaired, then this lease shall, at the option of City and Authority or Developer, terminate, the premises shall be restored and the insurance proceeds applied to such restoration to the extent available; any excess cost to be borne by Developer. If developer elects to terminate this lease, it shall at once surrender the premises and all interest therein to the City and this lease shall be deemed to have terminated and the term thereof to have expired on the date of the damage or destruction. If Developer elects to restore the premises, it shall promptly repair, restore and rebuild the same as nearly as possible to the condition they were in immediately prior to such destruction, or with such changes or alterations as may be agreed upon by the parties hereto.

Section 5.2. In the event the building on the demised premises is damaged by fire or other casualty but can be repaired within one hundred twenty (120) working days after a contract

therefore is let, or in the event only the landscaping or exterior facilities or other exterior improvements to the demised premises are destroyed or damaged, then Developer shall promptly repair, restore, and rebuild the same as nearly as possible to the condition they were in immediately prior to such damage or destruction or with such changes or alterations as may be agreed upon by the parties hereto.

ARTICLE VI

Mechanics' Liens; Waste, etc,

Section 6.1. During the term of this lease, Developer shall not suffer or permit any mechanics' or materialmens' lien to be filed against the interest of the City and Authority in the demised premises or against Developer's leasehold interest in the demised premises.

Section 6.2. Developer will not do or suffer any waste to the building hereafter constructed on the demised premises.

ARTICLE VII

Title or Leasehold Estate

Section 7.1. At the conclusion of the lease term herein provided, title to the leasehold estate, including all improvements erected thereon under this agreement, or any other agreement, shall pass to the City of McAlester.

Section 7.2. All improvements constructed upon the demised premises by the Developer shall, immediately upon completion thereof, become the property of the City, and Developer shall, upon such completion, execute such conveyances as are required by the City to evidence such ownership, including covenants of warranty.

ARTICLE VIII

Non-exclusive Provisions

Section 8.1. It is understood and agreed that nothing herein contained shall be construed to grant or authorize the granting of an exclusive right within the meaning of Section 308(a) of the Federal Aviation Act of 1958.

Section 8.2. The lessor reserves the right to further develop or improve the landing area of the airport as it deems fit, regardless of the desires or views of the lessee, and without interference or hindrance.

Section 8.3. The lessor reserves the right, but shall not be obligated to the lessee, to maintain and keep in repair the landing area of the airport and all publicly-owned facilities of the airport, together with the right to direct and control all activities of the lessee in this regard.

Section 8.4. The lessor reserves the right to take any action it considers necessary to protect the aerial approaches of the airport against obstruction, together with the right to prevent the lessee from erecting, or permitting to be erected, any building or other structure on the airport which in the opinion of the lessor would limit the usefulness of the airport or constitute a hazard to aircraft, or conflict with the master plan.

Section 8.5. During time of war or national emergency the lessor shall have the right to lease the landing area or any part thereof to the United States Government for military or naval use, and, if any such lease is executed, the provisions of this instrument insofar as they are inconsistent with the provisions of the lease to the Government shall be suspended.

Section 8.6. This lease shall be subordinate to the provisions of any existing or future agreement between the lessor and the United States, relative to the operation and maintenance of the airport.

ARTICLE IX

Miscellaneous

Section 9.1. This lease contains the final and entire agreement between the parties hereto and contains all the terms and conditions agreed upon and no other agreement, oral or otherwise, regarding the subject matter of this lease shall be deemed to exist or to bind the parties hereto.

Section 9.2. This lease shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the Laws of the State of Oklahoma.

Section 9.3. The covenants and agreements herein contained shall bind and enure to the benefit of City and Authority, its successors and assigns, and Developer, its successors and assigns

This agreement executed in triplicate, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, pursuant to resolution of the City Council of the City of McAlester the day and year first above written.



THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into by and between the Department of Transportation acting for and on
behalf of the State of Oklahoma, hereinafter called the "State" and City of McAlester
ADDRESSP.O. Box 578, 28 E. Washington St., McAlester, OK 74501
hereinafter called the "Utility Owner".
WITNESS TO THAT
WHEREAS, the State proposed to improve US Highway No. 69 and such improvements will necessitate rearrangement of facilities by said Utility Owner (state scope and nature of work on reverse side), and
WHEREAS, it is understood that if said project is to be financed in part from funds appropriated by the United States and expended under its regulations, that acceptance of work and procedure in general are subject to Federal Laws, Rules, Regulations, Orders, and Approvals applying to it as a Federal Project, and that costs for items entering into the improvement are reimbursable to the State in such amounts and forms as are proper and eligible for payment from Federal Funds. Reference is made to U.S. Department of Transportation, Code of Federal Regulations, Title 23, Parts 645A and 645B, included in the Utilities Manual and
WHEREAS, it is understood that Title 69, O. S., § 1205 and 1403 each as amended, define the extent to which the State and the Utility Owner may be obligated in the costs of utility rearrangements, and the utility locations on all highways are governed by Regulations and Policies adopted by the State Transportation Commission for the protection and maintenance of the highways, and for the safety of the highway users, and
WHEREAS, the State reserves the right to cancel this Agreement at any time prior to the beginning of the adjustment or relocation of the facilities of this Utility Owner, and
WHEREAS, the State agrees to pay the Utility Owner for the proportionate share of the actual cost to prepare approved preliminary engineering plans and estimates at the State's request, if for any reason the State cancels this Agreement.
NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the Utility Owner agrees:

1. To prepare a detailed estimate of the cost of work to be performed in accordance with the Department's Utilities Manual and Accommodation Policy, and such estimate of cost must be attached and be a part of this Agreement. The estimate will include: (1) The accounting system to be used in computing the relocation costs; (2) Credit for Expired Service Life setting forth therein the conditions on which such credit was determined or complete justification if the credit is not applicable; and; (3) Whether equipment costs are developed from experience records.

- 2. To include the costs for backfill and compaction of any trenches or holes within the right-of-way limits in the estimate of costs. The backfill will be placed and compacted to a density as directed by the Resident Engineer/Manager, but will not be compacted to less than that of the adjacent soil.
- 3. Any and all existing fencing that may require alteration during the utility relocation process shall be restored to its original condition during and after the time of utility relocation/rearrangement. It is the responsibility of the utility owner to insure that the integrity of the fencing is not compromised at any time to an extent in which it prevents the fencing from performing its intended purpose.
- 4. To prepare drawings showing the present, temporary and proposed location of its facilities with reference to the centerline of survey and/or the new or existing right-of-way lines using highway stationing in both plan and profile. Delineate details, including date of installation, class, and type of present facility. To comply with all applicable laws and regulations necessary to meet the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) requirements for pollution prevention, including discharges from storm water runoff on this project. Further, agrees to secure a Storm Water Permit from the DEQ, when required. It is agreed that the project plans and specifications, required schedules for accomplishing the temporary and permanent erosion control work, the storm water pollution prevention plans and the appropriate location map contained in the plans constitute the Storm Water Management Plan for the project previously described in the document. Agrees to have daily operational control of those activities, at the site, necessary to ensure compliance with plan requirements and permit conditions. Agrees to file the Notice of Intent (NOI), when required, for a general construction Oklahoma Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit with DEQ, which authorizes discharges of storm water associated with construction activity from the project site identified in this document. Such drawings will be attached to and become a part of this agreement.
- To begin the process of adjustment or relocation of the facilities as shown on the plans and covered by this Agreement within a reasonable time, depending on the availability of material and work forces, but the actual time must not exceed thirty (30) days after receipt of notice from the state to do so, and in no event proceed with any adjustment or relocation work until such notice is received. To inform the State's Resident Engineer/Manager of: (1) The proposed starting date, prior to commencing work, and continually maintaining liaison with his/her office for the duration of the physical relocation; (2) The materials to be disposed of by scrapping, or sale, and to inform him/her of a time and place for his/her inspection thereof; (3) The date work is completed.
- 6. a. That no contract with any individual will be entered into without meeting the requirements of the Department's Utilities Manual.
 - b. That contract work for technical services, professional services or other labor classifications involved in the rearrangement of the facility proposed under this Agreement will be supported by a statement to the effect that, "The Utility Company is not adequately staffed or equipped to perform such work with its own forces." Proper approval must be obtained in accordance with the Utilities Manual prior to executing a contract with any outside firm or continuing contractor.
- 7. To submit to the State, within six (6) months after satisfactory completion of rearrangement of their facilities under this Agreement, a claim using ODOT Claim Form 324A, with a certified statement of costs in accordance with the provisions of the aforementioned memorandums.

It is understood this Agreement does not change the rights or obligations of the Utility Owner as they exist in accordance with present State Law.

It is agreed that the project plans and specifications, required schedules for accomplishing the temporary and permanent erosion control work, the storm water pollution prevention plans and the appropriate location map contained in the plans constitute the Storm Water Management Plan for the project previously described in the document. Agrees to have daily operational control of those activities, at the site, necessary to ensure compliance with plan requirements and permit conditions. Agrees to file the Notice of Intent (NOI), when required, for a general construction Oklahoma Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit with DEQ, which authorizes discharges of storm water associated with construction activity from the project site identified in this document. Such drawings will be attached to and become a part of this agreement.
- To begin the process of adjustment or relocation of the facilities as shown on the plans and covered by this Agreement within a reasonable time, depending on the availability of material and work forces, but the actual time must not exceed thirty (30) days after receipt of notice from the state to do so, and in no event proceed with any adjustment or relocation work until such notice is received. To inform the State's Resident Engineer/Manager of: (1) The proposed starting date, prior to commencing work, and continually maintaining liaison with his/her office for the duration of the physical relocation; (2) The materials to be disposed of by scrapping, or sale, and to inform him/her of a time and place for his/her inspection thereof; (3) The date work is completed.
- 6. a. That no contract with any individual will be entered into without meeting the requirements of the Department's Utilities Manual.
 - b. That contract work for technical services, professional services or other labor classifications involved in the rearrangement of the facility proposed under this Agreement will be supported by a statement to the effect that, "The Utility Company is not adequately staffed or equipped to perform such work with its own forces." Proper approval must be obtained in accordance with the Utilities Manual prior to executing a contract with any outside firm or continuing contractor.
- 7. To submit to the State, within six (6) months after satisfactory completion of rearrangement of their facilities under this Agreement, a claim using ODOT Claim Form 324A, with a certified statement of costs in accordance with the provisions of the aforementioned memorandums.

It is understood this Agreement does not change the rights or obligations of the Utility Owner as they exist in accordance with present State Law.

ORDINANCE NO. __

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2361 WHICH ESTABLISHED THE BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2010-2011; REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City Council heretofore adopted Ordinance No. 2361 setting forth the Budget for Fiscal Year 2010-2011 beginning July 1, 2010 and ending June 30, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the City Departments and Divisions routinely review their budget appropriations to determine if any changes are necessary; and

WHEREAS, based upon said review the City staff now recommends that certain amendments to the Budget be considered by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has the authority to make amendments to the City Budget under Article 5, Section 5.07 (b) of the new City Charter as well as State law; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the proposed amendment to the FY 2010-2011 Budget, with the revenues and expenditures therein contained, is in the best interest of the City; and therefore, desires to adopt the same by formal action.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1: The proposed amendment to the FY 2010-2011 Budget of the City of McAlester, Oklahoma, as heretofore adopted by Ordinance, as summarized in Exhibits A1, which is attached hereto and fully incorporated herein by reference, be, and the same hereby are, completely adopted and approved as an amendment to the said FY 2010-2011 Budget.

SECTION 2: All portions of the existing FY 2010-2011 Budget, Ordinance No. 2361 except as specifically herein amended, shall remain in full force and effect, and not be otherwise affected by the adoption of the amendatory ordinance.

SECTION 3: That all other ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of any such conflict or inconsistency and all other ordinances not in conflict herewith shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4: Should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause, phrase, or section of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the

same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision thereof, other than the part or parts as declared to be invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional.

SECTION 5: That an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and for the provision of the public peace, health and safety, by reason whereof it is necessary that all acts take effect immediately and be in full force and effect from, and after the passage and approval.

Please find attached a letter of agreement dated August 18th, 1989 between the City of McAlester and the Oklahoma Prisons' Historical Association regarding the disposition of the electric chair formerly housed at the Oklahoma State Penitentiary.

In the agreement, you will see that the City of McAlester on August 18th, 1989 loaned the chair to the Association for display at their museum at the Oklahoma Department of Corrections.

Paragraph six and seven of the agreement specifically state:

- 6.) That it is expressly understood that the electric chair's ownership resides with the City of McAlester, and that the placement of the chair at the museum is at the request of the Association and the City has not relinquished ownership thereof.
- 7.) That should the Association no longer provide a museum for display of the electric chair, the City may immediately regain possession of the chair and this agreement will be null and void.

As the museum at OSP in no longer functioning, the City of McAlester is requesting and notifying you of our intent to retrieve and re-gain possession of the electric chair.

We will coordinate retrieval of the chair through Warden Workman's office and would like to have possession prior to October 1st, 2010.

LETTER OF AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, Oklahoma Prisons' Historical Association has established a museum at the Oklahoma State Penitentiary in McAlester, Oklahoma, for the collection and display of prison memorabilia and artifacts, and

WHEREAS, Oklahoma Prisons' Historical Association is desirous to acquire the electric chair formerly housed at Oklahoma State Penitentiary, and

WHEREAS, the City of McAlester has had possession of the electric chair since 1976 upon donation by the Department of Corrections for museum of penology which has not come into fruition, and

WHEREAS, the City of McAlester by virtue of council action on August 8, 1988, desires to enter into a formal agreement with Oklahoma Prisons Bistorical Association for the return of the electric chair to their museum at Oklahoma State Penitentiary,

NOW THEREPORE, KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: that the following Letter of Agreement between Oklahoma Prisons' Historical Association and the City of McAlester is entered in this Red day of August 1989.

The Oklahoma Prisons' Historical Association will agree to the following conditions upon which possession of the electric chair will be transferred to their control:

- 1. The electric chair will be immediately under the control of the Association and the Association will take possession of the earliest convenient time at the request of the prior keepers.
- 2. The electric chair will be displayed in a museum, open to the general public for such purposes, in which the safety of the general public and the chair are of paramount concern, and the chair displayed in a manner consistent with proper decorum of a historical museum.
- 3. That no inmates shall be permitted nor institutional business conducted within the museum unless through emergency order of the Department of Corrections and then only upon the general public's safety and removal from the premises.
- 4. That the electric chair not be removed from the museum location at Oklahoma State Penitentiary and should the Association desire such move, upon notice and permission by the McAlester City Council only.
- 5. That the Association provide adequate premise/liability insurance for the safety of the public and the chair and the

Association agree to hold harmless the City for any loss as a result or incidental to this Agreement.

- 6. That is is expressly understood that the electric chair's ownership resides with the City of McAlester, and that the placement of the chair at the museum is at the request of the Association and the City has not relinquished ownership thereof.
- 7. That should the Association no longer provide a museum for display of the electric chair, the City may immediately regain possession of the chair and this Agreement will be null and void.

Letter of Agreement

WHEREAS, James Earl Tannehill has established a museum for the collection and proper display of prison memorabilia and artifacts, and

WHEREAS, James Earl Tannehill is desirous to acquire the electric chair formerly housed at the Oklahoma State Penitentiary, and

WHEREAS, the City of McAlester has ownership of the chair since 1976 upon donation by the Department of Corrections, and

WHEREAS, the City of McAlester by virtue of council action on September 14th, 2010 desires to enter into a formal agreement with James Earl Tannehill for the storage and display of the electric chair.

NOW THEREFORE, KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That the following Letter of Agreement between James Earl Tannehill and the City of McAlester is entered into this 14th day of September, 2010.

James Earl Tannehill will agree to the following conditions upon which possession of the electric chair will be transferred to his control:

- 1.) The electric chair will be immediately under the control of Mr. Tannehill and he will take possession of the chair at the earliest convenient time.
- 2.) The electric chair will be displayed in a museum, which will be open to the public within thirty-six months of the date of this agreement, in which the safety of the general public and the chair are of paramount concern, and the chair displayed in a manner consistent with proper decorum of a historical museum.
- 3.) That the electric chair not be removed from the museum and should Mr. Tannehill desire such move, upon notice and permission by the McAlester City Council only.
- 4.) The Mr. Tannehill will provide adequate premise/liability insurance for the safety of the public and the chair and agree to hold harmless the City for any loss as a result or incidental to this Agreement.
- 5.) That it is expressly understood that the electric chair's ownership resides with the City of McAlester, and that the placement of the chair at the museum is at the request of Mr. Tannehill and the City has not relinquished ownership thereof.
- 6.) That should Mr. Tannehill no longer desire to display the chair, he unable to open a public museum within thirty-six months of the date of this agreement, or upon City Council request, the City may immediately regain possession of the chair and this Agreement will be null and void.
