Councilman Karr moved to authorize the Mayor to sign a contract between Allied Waste Services of Alderson and the McAlester Public Works Authority for the City of McAlester's solid waste collection, removal and disposal. The motion was seconded by Councilman Harrison.

Before the vote, Manager Stasiak highlighted the changes that had been made to the previous contract. He commented that he believed that all of the questions or concerns of the Council had been addressed.

Vice-Mayor Browne moved to approve <u>ORDINANCE NO. 2410</u>, seconded by Councilman Harrison.

Before the vote, Manager Stasiak explained that this rezone had been requested by H.L. Jr. and Nina Johnson and Terry L. and Brenda Johnson and the Planning and Zoning Commission had unanimously voted to recommend the rezone to the Council.

There was no other discussion, and the vote was taken as follows:

Mayor Priddle declared the motion carried.

6. Discussion and possible action on open records request regarding MPower financial documents. (Mayor Kevin Priddle)

Executive Summary

Discussion and possible action on a citizen open records request for financial documents regarding the MPower Organization.

Vice-Mayor Browne moved to open the floor for discussion on an open records request regarding MPower financial documents. The motion was seconded by Councilman Karr.

Before the vote, Mayor Priddle stated that he had placed this item on the agenda but he did not want the City to become the keeper of MPower's records. He added that the City had received a request concerning MPower's records and the City Manager had responded that the City did not have the records requested. He added that the Council had received a letter from MPower's current president in response to the request. He commented that he would recommend that MPower make the records available at their office.

Vice-Mayor Browne stated that he would like the City Attorney to give the Council an opinion as to whether MPower was covered by the "Open Records Act".

Mr. Ervin commented that he would ask for that opinion. He stated that MPower was funded by public funds and that was one of the criteria and if the Council requested an opinion, he could have it to them by the first meeting in January.

Mayor Priddle moved to request an official opinion from the City Attorney as to whether MPower falls within the "Open Records Act". The motion was seconded by Vice-Mayor Browne.

Before the vote, Councilman Harrison made the following statement. "In accordance with Section 2-43(d) of the Code of Ordinances, I request that a verbatim transcript of my remarks be entered in the minutes.

This agenda item relates to an open records request made upon the City of McAlester in September. The relevant Oklahoma statutes under which the request was made are known as the "Oklahoma Open Records Act." The City of McAlester, as a public body, is subject to the provisions of the Open Records Act. It is my understanding that the City did a record search

based on this request and determined that the City had none of the records being requested. The requestor was so informed in Mr. Stasiak's letter of October 19.

Per my reading of the Act, the City has fully complied with all relevant provisions of the Act. I should specifically note that the Act does not impose a burden upon a public body to create a record that does not exist. Likewise, it places no requirement upon a public body to obtain a record it does not possess. As a strong believer in the Open Records Act and the Open Meeting Act, it is very important to me that the City always comply with both Acts and I will continue to do everything in my power to make sure that is the case. There can be no doubt that the City has complied with the law regarding this request.

Now an item is brought before Council to discuss possible further action on this request - a request that has already been legally satisfied. Apparently the intent is that the City Council involve themselves somehow in determining whether MPower should provide some or all of these requested records. Of course, MPower is a separate non-profit corporation.

The City and MPower have a contractual relationship that describes the duties and obligations of the two parties. Per the contract, the City is provided reasonable access to MPower's books and records. To my knowledge, that reasonable access has never been denied. However, allowing copies to be made and removed of potentially sensitive records would clearly go beyond the scope and intent of the contract. I find MPower's response letter to the Mayor to be perfectly reasonable and understandable. Especially when one considers that the apparent purpose of providing such records would be only to act as a conduit to a third party. Surely this is an extremely slippery slope that no city should consider.

Now in the interest of transparency and full disclosure, I will state that it is my unshakeable belief that no matter whose name was on the request letter the City received in September, this is just the latest effort in a scheme that is produced, directed, orchestrated and choreographed by Randy Stephen Green. For anyone needing their memory refreshed, Mr. Green was fired as McAlester's city manager after it was discovered that he had been systematically embezzling almost half a million dollars from the City over a period of five years. He eventually was convicted on five felony counts and served four years in a federal detention facility.

The City of McAlester also has a current civil action against Mr. Green. My understanding is that the information being requested is identical to a previous request made by Mr. Green to MPower. I also understand that Mr. Green's previous request was not fulfilled. Therefore, it is certainly not surprising that he is trying to gain the same information by another avenue.

Some may ask why a disgraced former city manager would take such an interest in MPower's travel and phone records. My observation is that he appears to have made it his lot in life to do whatever he can to prevent McAlester from recovering from his misdeeds and progressing as a community. A key element of that seems to be a relentless attack on our economic development efforts. Perhaps he thinks that by obtaining phone and travel records, he can discover the potential businesses we are seeking to attract to McAlester in order to see what disruptions he can cause. Whatever his reasoning, his handiwork should be transparent to all.

As for MPower and its transparency, I commend Executive Director Shari Cooper and the MPower board for being more transparent than at any time in its history. For those who have any doubt, I encourage you to visit their internationally honored website where you will discover a wealth of information about their activities and progress on behalf of economic development. Ms. Cooper and MPower are pursuing the betterment of McAlester in a very professional, competent, and high-energy way. I will continue to help in any way I can and encourage everyone on the Council to do likewise.

Some say that. Mr. Green is, in effect, harassing his victim by his actions. I'm not an attorney and can't speak to that. I expect the City to continue to follow the law in fulfilling Mr. Green's requests as well as all others. However, concerning any suggestion that this City or this Council go beyond what is legally required in dealing with demands from Mr. Green and his few supporters, I will state categorically that I personally oppose any such effort. I will not lift a finger on behalf of an individual who has done such harm to this community and continues to try to inflict further damage."

After a lengthy discussion among the Council and the City Attorney concerning the requirements of the City's contract with MPower, the requirements of the "Open Records Act:, the City doing whatever it was required by law to do, MPower's funding from the City, if MPower had actually received this request and what action the Council would take if a opinion was requested from the City Attorney, the vote was taken as follows:

AYE: Councilman Browne, Karr & Mayor Priddle NAY: Councilman Harrison, Garvin & Mason

Mayor Priddle declared the motion failed for lack of a majority vote.

There was no vote on the original motion.

New Business

Manager Stasiak requested a Special Meeting for Thursday, December 29, 2011 concerning the proposed Special Election regarding the IAFF election ballot.

After a brief discussion by the Council, Mayor Priddle called a Special Meeting for Friday, December 30, 2011 at 4:30 P.M.

City Manager's Report

Manager Stasiak informed the Council that Mr. Bernhardt had asked that the construction on Elks Road wait until after the New Year. He added that the contractor would move into phase 3 which was inside the Southside Business Development Center. He reported that the City was at significant completion of the 2009 CDBG Grant and there will be an OML Budget Workshop on January 27, 2012 and if any of the Council was interested in attending to let him know so the requests could be submitted for Council approval.

Remarks and Inquiries by City Council

All of the Council wished the citizens a Happy and Safe New Year.

Councilman Harrison welcomed Councilman Garvin back and inquired about the disposal of the live Christmas trees.

Manager Stasiak stated that the information would be gotten out to the public.

Vice-Mayor Browne thanked the City for the cleanup in Third Ward.

Councilman Karr commented on how positive the improvements over the past year had been.

Councilman Garvin thanked everyone for their prayers and he was looking forward to the New Year. He also asked that any of the Fifth Ward residents that had contacted him with requests during the last few weeks to please call him again.

Councilman Mason commented that every year since he had been elected to the Council had gotten better.

Mayor Priddle stated that there was a lot to be thankful for. He commented that when the correct equipment was furnished to the employees they were able to do things the right way. He then thanked Manager Stasiak for his hard work.

Recess Council Meeting

Mayor Priddle asked for a motion to recess the Regular Meeting to convene the Authorities. Councilman Mason moved to recess the Regular Meeting and convene the Authorities. The motion was seconded by Vice-Mayor Browne and the vote was taken as follows:

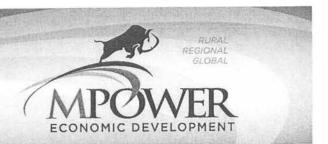

ORGANIZATIONAL NEWS

MPower experienced a change in board membership in July. Since some of the board members who left were officers, so presiding board members immediately acted to establish an Executive Committee. The following board members were elected to serve as interim officers for MPower:

- 1. Chris McAfee, Interim President
- 2. Brian Lott, Interim Vice President
- 3. Lisa Kirk, Interim Treasurer
- 4. Dr. Kenneth Miller, Interim Secretary

Mr. McAfee quickly established a board nominating committee to nominate people for board membership. MPower looks for people who bring a selfless spirit and community-oriented attitude to the organization. Many people from McAlester as well as outside of McAlester contacted MPower to see how they could support MPower and in economic development in the community. Other board members expressed a positive attitude going forward:

MPower is an organization dedicated to economic development and providing new jobs and improving the quality of life for McAlester and Pittsburg County and our trade area. Although we experience shift in officers and members periodically, the focus is always on our job and being accountable to the citizens, city council and city officers in our endeavors. We and the City of McAlester believe that a positive approach to development of our community is foremost and the accountability to our fellow citizens and city officers is of utmost importance. MPower represents all citizens of McAlester and will continue to work hard to achieve our goal of economic benefit for all.

In August, MPower delivered MPower's Annual Report to the City Council, which included a report on businesses recruited and an emphasis on what McAlester needs to work on to attract more industry.

NEW OFFICE LOCATION

In August, MPower found a new home for our office location right in the heart of Main Street. Our new location now makes us more visible and accessible than ever before!

The office has several large windows that offer great visibility for displaying information that is relative to the community --whether it be marketing events or available commercial or industrial properties.



The new location's visibility also provides greater access for prospects and the public at large, who wish to become more familiar with MPower or become involved with our organization.

Governor's Hunt

Due to a severe drought over the summer, the hunting venue for the Governor's Big Buck Invitational Hunt had to be changed from the remote location of Ty Valley (Antlers area) to a managed wildlife hunting ranch near Stonewall, OK.



MPower is happy to announce that the Oklahoma Southeast and Oklahoma Business Roundtable organizations have enthusiastically stepped up to generously fund and host the event, which will take place as scheduled November 18, 19, and 20th.

Meetings & Conferences

In July, MPower attended the Association of Defense Communities Annual Conference in Norfolk, Virginia. Among the topics covered at the conference was energy security. MPower learned that the military services is advocating energy security on all of its bases, particularly on bases where the possibility an enhanced use lease would be possible. Additionally, the military is advocating the use of alternative energy sources, such as natural gas, geothermal, as well as solar and wind.

Additionally, the conference focused on how communities can work more closely with their bases, and utilize social media for better community understanding and advocacy.



EXISTING BUSINESS RETENTION AND EXPANSION PROGRAM

This quarter, MPower called upon existing manufacturers including Simonton Windows, A-D Technologies, Webcoat, and Southeast Oklahoma Box Company, as part of its Business Retention and Expansion (BRE) program.

MPower invited other partners including the McAlester Workforce Center, US Senator Coburn and US Senator Inhofe's field representatives, and Narconon to attend and participate in these meetings with some of McAlester's major employers.

The meetings primarily revolved around topics that concerned Workforce - from Workman's Comp Insurance issues to high turnover rates and work ethic issues. The information was logged and entered into an online database, which is provided by and can be accessed by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce.

Plant Closure: Simonton Windows

Shortly after the visit with Simonton Windows in September, the company announced it would be closing its doors and laying off over 250 people.

The company has been in McAlester for 9 years, and there had been mention of high turnover rates in MPower's prior discussions with the HR Staff. However, the company reported that the lagging economy was the main reason for the



plant shutdown and that they would be consolidating the window assembly equipment into larger plants in other states.

MPower immediately responded by touching base with the plant, fielding questions from the media, and meeting with the Oklahoma Department of Commerce. Soon after, MPower began researching the history of the plant's inception and current status of the 200,000+ SF facility, upon 50 acres of property in Taylor Industrial Park.

MPower also participated in the "Rapid Response" process with the Oklahoma Employment Service Commission (local Workforce Center), and other workforce training partners such as Kiamichi Technology Center and Eastern Oklahoma State College (McAlester Campus). MPower and these workforce partners will be meeting periodically to plan for a job fair and resume skills workshop for the employees of Simonton Windows.



Berry Plastics

MPower called upon Berry Plastics, one of McAlester's major employers. We discovered that the company was having infrastructure issues and responded by inviting both the Mayor and members of city council to accompany us on a site visit with the plant manager.

Valuable information was gained from the visit, and the city responded in a prompt manner as a result of this meeting. MPower will continue to work with the plant manager and human resources staff to ensure that this existing business continues to flourish in McAlester.



Inside Berry Plastics

Winery Expansion

MPower also continues work on helping the local winery develop a business plan for growth. McAlester is fortunate to have one of Oklahoma's Top producing vintners here in McAlester and MPower is working to assist the winery by helping them with their business plan. Meanwhile, the Stobaugh family launched a new label ("Urban Wineworks") and will be opening a new store in Oklahoma City very soon.



McAlester's Whispering Meadows Winery

MPower helped the winery cut through some of the red tape by connecting this local business to Senator Inhofe's staff, who was extremely helpful in expediting the labeling permitting process for this local business. Later this year, MPower plans to continue to assist this expanding business in its efforts to find a suitable site for development in our area.

Connecting Business to Real Estate

As the natural gas business continues to steadily grow again in our area, MPower has been a source for both new and existing companies who are in the drilling services industry inside and outside of the state. Over the past several months, we assisted several brokers who requested property information for several natural gas drilling services companies - some who are already here and looking for more space, and some who are moving into the area. Drilling in our area seems is picking up again.



MANUFACTURING PROSPECTS AND PROJECTS

Project Wire - Tucker Energy

Back in the summer, MPower reported that we met with, and gave a site tour of Taylor Industrial Park, to an energy company looking at our area. Although the company did not site at the industrial park, they did site just east of McAlester - in an existing facility that the industrial park could not offer.



Since then, the company, Tucker Energy Services has formally announced they will be creating up to 100 jobs and investing approximately \$75 Million in our area.

To help existing employees find housing, MPower organized a "meet and greet" between Tucker Energy's Office Manager, Diane LeFever and the Southeast Oklahoma Board of Realtors. Ms. LeFever noted that she had been looking for housing but had experienced great difficulty in finding appropriate rental properties. The SE Board of Realtors responded that they would do whatever was within their power to do to help the relocated employees find this temporary housing.

Tucker Energy also reached out to Kiamichi Technology, who sponsored a job fair for the company. KTC also agreed to provide free space for the company's industrial training classes. MPower also connected this company to our local job training center, local banks, and the McAlester Foundation, which offered the company a significant incentive amount for the new job creation. Additionally, MPower worked to find other smaller incentives such as a discount from the McAlester Country Club, the McAlester Regional Wellness Center.

Project Patriot

Discussions between the CEO of a major defense contractor are ongoing and have progressed significantly. Project Patriot was developed through contact made at the SHOT Show, in Las Vegas. Discussions concerning facilities, company growth, partnerships with McAAP, and other efforts are ongoing.



Community Food Bank Warehouse

The Community Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma is looking to open a branch in McAlester to service their programs in the McAlester area. Their facility criteria required a space that would accommodate warehouse space of 20,000 -40,000 SF. MPower provided the organization with all the existing facility information available, connected them to the real estate community, and gave them a tour of a building in the downtown area. Unfortunately how



them a tour of a building in the downtown area. Unfortunately however, the organization did not find a facility that met their expectations in our area.



RETAIL PROSPECTS & PROJECTS

Regional Shopping Center Project

After much analysis, MPower has rested on a few possible sites along Highway 69 that can be developed into a regional shopping center. We are now in the process of looking for cooperation between land owners, utility needs, and developers who are willing to invest in a multimillion dollar project.

In order to see this accomplished, the City has responded with a resolution supporting the proposal. Work will continue over the next several months in order to advance this proposal.

McAlester Downtown Sales Tax Rebate Program

Recognizing that the downtown business district is an important part of the community and that a high vacancy rate exists in the downtown business district, MPower initiated the creation of a downtown sales tax rebate program. Because there was no existing information on downtown vacancies, MPower walked and mapped every property along Choctaw Avenue to start the analysis process. MPower then researched sales tax rebates nationwide and issued a formal Memo to the City with recommendations.

The creation of a sales tax rebate program would apply to and benefit new, relocating, and existing businesses in the Main Street district along Choctaw Avenue. Such a program aims to entice new businesses to consider locating in vacant buildings downtown.

Months later - in July, Councilman Harrison, Councilman Browne, the City Manager, the Mayor, and Carol Ervin, Executive Director for the Main Street program formed a committee that vetted





the information that MPower assembled. The committee worked to tailor a program that would work for McAlester. That same month, the entire City Council voted unanimously to approve the program. This is the first formal incentive program in McAlester and McAlester is one of the first communities in Oklahoma to codify a sales tax rebate program for a downtown business district, without the assistance of a Business Improvements District (BID).



OTHER PLANS AND PROJECTS

RIG Grant Follow up

MPower attended a workshop - then spent time in another meeting - covering multiple topics with the consultant, Logistics Specialties Inc. LSI is the planning consultant that the SEWIB hired to produce the defense portion of the RIG Grant report.

Within our discussion, the consultant wanted to know what incentives existed to attract defense contractors to the area. The answer was simple. The only formalized incentive besides the HUBZone status was the one mentioned above.

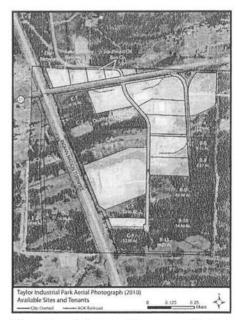
MPower has continually stressed the need for formal incentives if any are to be given. A formal incentive package would be fair and equal to all as long as application thresholds were met. Information on incentives could also be easily shared and such information would not only be obvious to the potential applicant, but it could also be transparent to the public, the generator of the sales tax which typically funds an incentive.

Taylor Industrial Park

In August, MPower started coordinating a huge volunteer effort at Taylor Industrial Park as part of promise to leverage private investment for McAlester.

Past President Darryl Wright recruited several colleagues in the energy and construction business to volunteer their time, equipment, and labor to start clearing parcels at Taylor. So far, much needed clearing work has been occurring upon parcels C7 and B9 (see photo to the right).

For the past several months, MPower has conducted analysis and identified several issues that are standing in the way of economic success for our city. In terms of industrial recruitment, MPower has identified that the site readiness of



the Taylor Industrial Park should be a priority for the City. At minimum, the vacant lots need to be cleared and graded.

Further, in order for the park to be strongly competitive, MPower recommends that the park be certified "site ready" by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce. MPower will be following through to coordinate this effort between the City and the State.



MARKETING

International Awards

In September, the International Economic Development Council recognized MPower for our work on **NOT ONE BUT TWO** projects - the MPower website, and our tourism brochure entitled "Step Into the Great American Story in McAlester Oklahoma."



The International Economic Development Council (IEDC) (https://www.iedconline.org) is the premier membership organization - with over 4,500 worldwide members - dedicated to helping economic development professionals create high-quality jobs, develop vibrant communities and improve the quality of life in their regions. 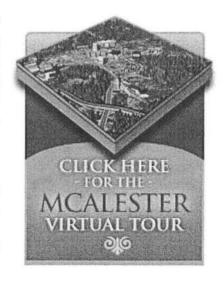

We expect to print a large quantity, so we can place these not only in McAlester hotels and attractions, but also in the state tourist information centers. We look forward to tracking the effectiveness of the brochure, using the QR codes and couponing system we've employed.

We also would like to thank the City of McAlester for supporting MPower on this project - particularly the gracious support of City Manager Pete Stasiak and Councilman Steve Harrison.

On behalf of Allied Waste/Republic Services, I would like to thank you for the opportunity of managing the City of McAlester's municipal solid waste needs. We take pride in the quality of service that we offer to our valued customers. It was our intention to process a rate adjustment on July 1, 2011 as agreed to in the Addendum sent in March 2011; however, this adjustment was delayed anticipating the execution of the new Addendum. We can no longer delay this process and now seek a rate adjustment under the current agreement.

Per page 10 of the current agreement, Section 5.03.01 Effective January 1, 2012, the new service rate is calculated using the CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers "All Items Index" Midwest Region, Size Class D (< 50,000) which as of June 2011 equals 4.4% and the U.S City Average, Other Motor Fuels as of June 2011 was 33.6% (See enclosed CPI forms). The adjustment of 3.5% should be retroactive to July 1, 2011. Invoices will be audited from July 1, 2011 through November 30, 2011 and a lump sum adjustment will be included in the next billing cycle.
