There was no new business.

### City Manager's Report

Manager Stasiak reported that the pre-construction meeting for the 12" water line would be tomorrow at 10:00 A.M. He reported that there had been a predevelopment meeting last week with the Planning and Zoning Department for a forty-four (44) single family homes subdivision on Ninth and near the frontage road of 69 Bypass.

### Remarks and Inquiries by City Council

Councilmen Smith and Garvin did not have comments for the evening.

Councilman Read inquired about what was being done to fill the vacancies on the head count summary.

Manager Stasiak commented that the City was working aggressively to fill the positions. He informed the Council that interviews for the 911 positions had been done the past week, the Police Department was in the process of filling two (2) of those positions, and the Streets Department had lost a total of three (3) employees. He added that in the Police Department had been reduced by three (3) total personnel.

Councilman Read asked about the positions in the Fire Department.

Manager Stasiak stated that the City would fill those positions, that no positions would be held open.

Councilman Karr commented about the condition of the traffic lights at the intersections of Main and Electric and Main and Choctaw and asked if they could be repaired. He stated that he would like to see the Ordinance regarding mowing be put in the paper or in the water bill. He commented that the Pride clean up had looked very busy and asked how long it would continue.

Manager Stasiak answered that it would continue for three (3) more weekends opened on Saturdays from 9:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M. and Sundays from 12:00 until 3:00 P.M.

Vice-Mayor Mason commented on the grass in the streets and stated that when the Ordinance had been passed the City Attorney at the time opinion had been that the Police Department could legally issue citations.

There was a brief discussion among the Council regarding the grass problem and the Ordinance.

City Attorney Ervin stated that a violation of City Code could be enforced by either the Code Department or the Police Department. He also mentioned the team that had been created to address abatement issues could have this matter added to their task. 





#### ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2392 WHICH ESTABLISHED THE BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2011-2012; REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

**WHEREAS**, the City Council heretofore adopted Ordinance No. 2392 setting forth the Budget for Fiscal Year 2011-2012 beginning July 1, 2011 and ending June 30, 2012; and

WHEREAS, the City Departments and Divisions routinely review their budget appropriations to determine if any changes are necessary; and

WHEREAS, based upon said review the City staff now recommends that certain amendments to the Budget be considered by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has the authority to make amendments to the City Budget under Article 5, Section 5.07 (b) of the new City Charter as well as State law; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the proposed amendment to the FY 2011-2012 Budget, with the revenues and expenditures therein contained, is in the best interest of the City; and therefore, desires to adopt the same by formal action.

### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1: The proposed amendment to the FY 2011-2012 Budget of the City of McAlester, Oklahoma, as heretofore adopted by Ordinance, as summarized in Exhibit A-1, which is attached hereto and fully incorporated herein by reference, be, and the same hereby are, completely adopted and approved as an amendment to the said FY 2011-2012 Budget.

SECTION 2: All portions of the existing FY 2011-2012 Budget, Ordinance No. 2392 except as specifically herein amended, shall remain in full force and effect, and not be otherwise affected by the adoption of the amendatory ordinance.

SECTION 3: That all other ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of any such conflict or inconsistency and all other ordinances not in conflict herewith shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4: Should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause, phrase, or section of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the

same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision thereof, other than the part or parts as declared to be invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional.

SECTION 5: That an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and for the provision of the public peace, health and safety, by reason whereof it is necessary that all acts take effect immediately and be in full force and effect from, and after the passage and approval.

PASSED and the EMERGENCY CLAUSE ruled on separately this 8th day of May, 2012.

Buyer will furnish the minimum safety distance required per NFPA 1123. In no case shall Spectators be allowed closer than 70 feet per shells diameter. This contract is entered into this \_\_\_ day of <u>April</u>, <u>2012</u> by and between Rainbow Fireworks, Inc. and Stephen A. Showaiter, President, designated herein as the "SELLER" and <u>CITY OF McALESTER</u>, designated herein as the "PURCHASER" for One Class "B" Fireworks Production to be held on the 4th day of July, 2012.

- YES I SELLER will secure, prepare, and deliver said fireworks as outlined, or will make necessary substitutions of equal or greater value.
- YES SELLER will include the services of a Pyrotechnic Operator (shooter) to take charge of, set up, and fire the display, along with such help as he deems necessary to perform the fireworks display safely, and in accordance with such Federal, State or Local laws that might be applied.
- YES SELLER agrees that the Operator and Assistant(s) are to check the display area after the presentation of the fireworks display for any "duds" or other material which might not have ignited. Any such material, found by any other person other than the Operator, should be left untouched, mark the location, and call the operator for proper disposal.
- SELLER will include a CERTIFICATE OF LIABILITY INSURANCE POLICY of \$2,000,000 aggregate coverage.
- YES M PURCHASER will furnish the secured minimum safety distances established by the SELLER after an on-site inspection of the proposed firing location.
- YES M PURCHASER will provide adequate police protection and/or other adequate security to maintain these distances.
- YES M PURCHASER also agrees to have a fire truck available on location during the display.

ONE (1) CLASS "B" FIREWORKS PRODUCTION has been agreed upon by PURCHASER AND SELLER in the sum of <u>Thirteen Thousand Nine Hundred Ninety-Five Dollars and no/100 cents</u> (\$ 13,995.00). It is agreed and understood that the PURCHASER will pay to the SELLER twenty-five percent (25%) of the show cost deposit in the sum of Three Thousand Four Hundred Ninety-Eight Dollars and Seventy-Five cents (\$ 3,498.75) to be paid with the submitting of the signed contract. #### AGREEMENT FOR FIREWORKS DISPLAY

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 13th day of February 2012, by and between Hance Pyrotechnics, whose principal place of business is Tahlequah, Oklahoma, sometimes hereinafter referred to as Seller, and City of McAlester, of PO Box 578 McAlester, OK 74502 sometimes hereinafter referred to as Purchaser,

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Hance Pyrotechnics, was the successful bidder for a pyrotechnic display (hereafter "fireworks display") to be performed and displayed on July 4th, 2012 with a rain date of July 5<sup>th</sup>, for Client, and

WHEREAS, Hance Pyrotechnics is to perform the fireworks display in a manner consistent with the highest degree of care with respect to the safety of viewers and improvements located in the area where the fireworks will be set off, and

WHEREAS, in exchange for signing this contract, Hance Pyrotechnics shall be entitled to a payment of the successfully bid amount of \$13,500.00, inclusive of tax, payable as hereafter provided.

#### NOW THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follow:

- 1. Seller's responsibilities with respect to fireworks display. Seller agrees to provide all necessary fireworks; fireworks display materials, and the personnel necessary to perform the fireworks display. Seller shall take all steps reasonably necessary to safeguard the improvements or other property in the area of the display other than the issues for which Purchaser is responsible. Seller shall provide qualified pyrotechnicians who will deliver, set up, execute and take down the fireworks display. The pyrotechnicians shall conduct a search of the grounds after the display in an effort to locate and dispose of any unexploded fireworks. The scope and extent of such search shall be dependent upon the weather conditions, time and the completion of the display, etc. Seller shall comply with all local, state, and federal guidelines pertaining to the storing and displaying of fireworks, and obtain all necessary permits and the Purchaser will be responsible for the cost thereof.
- 2. Purchaser's responsibilities with respect to fireworks display: Purchaser agrees to (a) provide a sufficient area for the display, (b) provide protection of the display area to prevent unrestricted access by unauthorized persons by a means it shall determine is adequately designed for that purpose, (c) arrange adequate police or other protection to prevent spectators from entering the display area, administer proper crowd control, parking supervision, etc., and (d) arrange fire protection and emergency medical care for the health and safety of spectators and the public, and provide cleanup for the display site.
- 3. <u>Compensation to Seller</u>: Purchaser shall pay to Seller the amount of \$13,500.00. The sum shall be paid to Seller with 50% down as a non refundable deposit upon signing the contract, and remaining amount due on or before the contracted date of the display.
- 4. Weather, election to postpone: The parties understand that weather may prevent the ability to perform the fireworks display. In the event inclement weather is present on the day the display is scheduled to occur, the event may be postponed by mutual agreement by the parties. The fireworks display shall not be performed in the event any government body or agency with authority in regard to the Fireworks display shall direct, in writing or otherwise, that the display should not occur. The event will

then be rescheduled by mutual agreement by the parties to the rain date within the calendar year and The Purchaser agrees to pay an additional cost of not more than \$200.00 per day, but is limited to not more that 3 days, for security Seller will arrange for said security.

Should the event be moved to another date or a new location within the calendar year Purchaser agrees to pay Seller an additional fee equal to: 10% for a postponement notice of 6-10 days before contract date, 15% for a postponement notice of 1-5 days before contract date, and 20% of the contracted amount to cover the cost of display equipment, crews, and the dismantling of the fireworks display but only if postponed on the contracted date. Purchaser also agrees to pay all permit and insurance fees that have and will occur with the postponement.

5. <u>Insurance</u>: Seller is required to provide at its expense liability insurance coverage to cover liability in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 associated with the fireworks display. Such coverage shall name Purchaser as an additional insured.

#### 6. Liability:

- a. <u>Performance:</u> Seller shall not be liable for any faulty performance of equipment or products that could not reasonably have been discovered prior to the commencement of the fireworks display. Should conditions arise that the fireworks display is recommended by the Selfer to be rescheduled due to the above conditions, a reschedule date will be within the calendar year acceptable to both parties for the balance of the fireworks display. Selfer shall use its best efforts to ensure that the display will proceed as planned and Selfer will secure, prepare and deliver said fireworks and/or will make necessary substitutions of equal or greater value.
- b. <u>Harm to third parties or property:</u> Seller shall not be liable for harm to any Spectators, third parties, or improvements to property within the vicinity of the fireworks display area and that Purchaser will do everything possible to keep the fireworks display area clear of all Spectators, third parties, and improvements to property. Seller covenants that it will use its best efforts to avoid any such harm pursuant to the foregoing section.
- 7. Past due accounts: Purchaser shall be responsible for any balance that is not paid at the time it becomes due and shall bear interest at a rate of 1 3/4% per month compounded daily and for any and all collection cost, court cost, attorneys fees and all cost pertaining to the collection of payments, filings, processing, correspondence and fees for personnel and collection companies in the collection of payment.
- 8. <u>No partnership or joint venture</u>: The parties agree that Seller is a subcontractor and that there is no partnership or joint venture between the parties. The manner and means of providing the display is left to the sole discretion of Seller.
- 9. <u>Equipment</u>; Seller shall supply all necessary equipment and mortars for the fireworks display, and are the sole property of Hance Pyrotechnics.

#### Subject

Consider, and act upon, an Agreement for Engineering Services with Meshek & Associates, PLC for the analysis of the upper 640 acres of the Tributary C drainage basin of Sandy Creek.

#### Recommendation

Motion to approve authorizing the Mayor to sign an Agreement for Engineering Services with Meshek & Associates, PLC for the analysis of the upper 640 acres of the Tributary C drainage basin of Sandy Creek.

#### Discussion

This agreement will allow Meshek & Associates PLC to provide engineering services for the drainage study of the Sandy Creek Tributary C (Basin Wide) Drainage Study. This is commonly known as the 9<sup>th</sup> & Illinois study area. This Master Drainage Plan Study area includes approximately 640 acres upstream of South Avenue. This project will develop a hydrology model, detailed channel hydraulics with floodplain analysis and storm sewer analysis. The Professional Services Fee for this study will not exceed \$\$24,800. WHEREAS, CITY requires certain professional services in connection with the PROJECT, including the development of an updated hydrology model, detailed open channel hydraulics with floodplain analysis, and storm sewer analysis, hereinafter referred to as the SERVICES; and,

WHEREAS, ENGINEER, is prepared to provide such SERVICES;

WHEREAS, funding is available for the PROJECT through \_\_\_\_\_

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. PROJECT DESCRIPTION. The scope of the PROJECT is described in Attachment A, PROJECT DESCRIPTION, which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference as part of this AGREEMENT.
- 2. <u>SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED BY ENGINEER</u>. ENGINEER shall perform the SERVICES described in Attachment B, <u>SCOPE OF SERVICES</u>, which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference as part of this AGREEMENT.
- 3. <u>CITY'S RESPONSIBILITIES</u>. CITY shall be responsible for all matters described in Attachment C, <u>RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CITY</u>, which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference as part of this AGREEMENT.
- COMPENSATION. CITY shall pay ENGINEER in accordance with Attachment D, <u>COMPENSATION</u>, and further described in Attachment E, <u>BILLING RATE SHEET</u>, which are attached hereto and incorporated by reference as part of this AGREEMENT.
- SCHEDULE. ENGINEER shall perform the SERVICES described in Attachment B, SCOPE OF SERVICES, in accordance with the schedule set forth in Attachment F, SCHEDULE, attached hereto and incorporated by reference as part of this AGREEMENT.
- 6. STANDARD OF PERFORMANCE. ENGINEER shall perform the SERVICES undertaken in a manner consistent with the prevailing accepted standard for similar services with respect to projects of comparable function and complexity and with the applicable laws and regulations published and in effect at the time of performance of

the SERVICES. The PROJECT shall be designed and engineered in a good and workmanlike manner and in strict accordance with this AGREEMENT. All engineering work shall be performed by or under the supervision of Professional Engineers licensed in the State of Oklahoma, and properly qualified to perform such engineering services, which qualification shall be subject to review by CITY. Other than the obligation of the ENGINEER to perform in accordance with the foregoing standards, no warranty, either express or implied, shall apply to the SERVICES to be performed by the ENGINEER pursuant to this AGREEMENT or the suitability of ENGINEER'S work product.

#### 7. LIMITATION OF RESPONSIBILITY.

- 7.1. ENGINEER shall not be responsible for construction means, methods, techniques, sequences, procedures, or safety precautions and programs in connection with the PROJECT.
- 7.2. The presence of ENGINEER's personnel at a construction site is for the purpose of providing to the CITY a greater degree of confidence that the completed construction work will conform generally to the construction documents and that the integrity of the design concept as reflected in the construction documents has been implemented and preserved by the construction contractor(s).
- 7.3. In soils, foundation, groundwater, and other subsurface investigations, the actual characteristics may vary significantly between successive test points and sample intervals and at locations other than where observations, exploration, and investigations have been made. Because of the inherent uncertainties in subsurface evaluations, changed or unanticipated underground conditions may occur that could affect total PROJECT cost and/or execution. These conditions and cost/execution effects are not the responsibility of ENGINEER.
- 7.4. Record drawings will be prepared, in part, on the basis of information compiled and furnished by others, and may not always represent the exact location, type of various components, or exact manner in which the PROJECT was finally constructed. ENGINEER is not responsible for any errors or omissions in the information from others that is incorporated into the record drawings.
- 7.5. ENGINEER's deliverables, including record drawings, are limited to the sealed and signed hard copies. Computer-generated drawing files furnished by ENGINEER are for CITY or others' convenience. Any conclusions or information derived or obtained from these files will be at user's sole risk.

#### 8. OPINIONS OF COST AND SCHEDULE.

8.1. Since ENGINEER has no control over the cost of labor, materials, equipment, or services furnished by others, or over contractors', subcontractors', or vendors' methods of determining prices, or over competitive bidding or market conditions, ENGINEER's cost estimates shall be made on the basis of qualifications and experience as a Professional Engineer.

8.2. Since ENGINEER has no control over the resources provided by others to meet construction contract schedules, ENGINEER's forecast schedules shall be made on the basis of qualifications and experience as a Professional Engineer.

#### 9. LIABILITY AND INDEMNIFICATION.

- 9.1. ENGINEER shall defend and indemnify CITY from and against legal liability for damages arising out of the performance of the SERVICES for CITY, including but not limited to any claims, costs, attorney fees, or other expenses of whatever nature where such liability is caused by the negligent act, error, or omission of ENGINEER, or any person or organization for whom ENGINEER is legally liable. Nothing in this paragraph shall make the ENGINEER liable for any damages caused by the CITY or any other contractor or consultant of the CITY.
- 9.2. ENGINEER shall not be liable to CITY for any special, indirect or consequential damages, such as, but not limited to, loss of revenue, or loss of anticipated profits.

#### 10. CONTRACTOR INDEMNIFICATION AND CLAIMS.

- 10.1. CITY agrees to include in all construction contracts the provisions of Articles 7.1, and 7.2, and provisions providing contractor indemnification of CITY and ENGINEER for contractor's negligence.
- 10.2. CITY shall require construction contractor(s) to name CITY and ENGINEER as additional insureds on the contractor's general liability insurance policy.
- 11. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS. In performance of the SERVICES, ENGINEER shall comply with applicable regulatory requirements including federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations, orders, codes, criteria and standards. ENGINEER shall procure the permits, certificates, and licenses necessary to allow ENGINEER to perform the SERVICES. ENGINEER shall not be responsible for procuring permits, certificates, and licenses required for any construction unless such responsibilities are specifically assigned to ENGINEER in Attachment B, SCOPE OF SERVICES.

#### 12. <u>INSURANCE</u>,

- 12.1. During the performance of the SERVICES under this AGREEMENT, ENGINEER shall maintain the following insurance:
  - 12.1.1. General Liability Insurance with bodily injury limits of not less than \$1,000,000 for each occurrence and not less than \$1,000,000 in the aggregate, and with property damage limits of not less than \$100,000 for each occurrence and not less than \$100,000 in the aggregate.
  - 12.1.2. Automobile Liability Insurance with bodily injury limits of not less than \$1,000,000 for each person and not less than \$1,000,000 for each accident and with property damage limits of not less than \$100,000 for each accident.

- 12.1.3. Worker's Compensation Insurance in accordance with statutory requirements and Employers' Liability Insurance with limits of not less than \$100.000 for each occurrence.
- 12.1.4. Errors and Omissions Insurance to remain in effect during the PROJECT and the term of any legal liability. Errors and Omissions coverage to be for a minimum of \$1,000,000, deductibles subject to approval.
- 12.2. ENGINEER shall furnish CITY certificates of insurance which shall include a provision that such insurance shall not be canceled without at least 30 days written notice to the CITY.

#### 13. OWNERSHIP AND REUSE OF DOCUMENTS.

- 13.1. All documents, including original drawings, estimates, specifications, field notes and data shall become and remain the property of the CITY.
- 13.2. CITY'S reuse of such documents without written verification or adaptation by ENGINEER for the specific purpose intended shall be at CITY's risk.

#### 14. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT.

- 14.1. The obligation to continue SERVICES under this AGREEMENT may be terminated by either party upon fifteen days written notice in the event of substantial failure by the other party to perform in accordance with the terms hereof through no fault of the terminating party.
- 14.2. CITY shall have the right to terminate this AGREEMENT, or suspend performance thereof, for CITY's convenience upon written notice to ENGINEER; and ENGINEER shall terminate or suspend performance of SERVICES on a schedule acceptable to CITY. In the event of termination or suspension for CITY'S convenience, CITY shall pay ENGINEER for all SERVICES performed to the date of termination in accordance with provisions of Attachment D, <u>COMPENSATION</u>. Upon restart of a suspended project, ENGINEER's contract price and schedule shall be equitably adjusted.

#### 15. NOTICE.

Any notice, demand, or request required by or made pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall be deemed properly made if personally delivered in writing or deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid, to the address specified below.

- 15.1. Nothing contained in this Article shall be construed to restrict the transmission of routine communications between representatives of ENGINEER and CITY.
- 16. <u>UNCONTROLLABLE FORCES</u>. Neither CITY nor ENGINEER shall be considered to be in default of this AGREEMENT if delays in or failure of performance shall be due to forces which are beyond the control of the parties; including, but not limited to: fire, flood, earthquakes, storms, lightning, epidemic, war, riot, civil disturbance, sabotage; inability to procure permits, licenses, or authorizations from any state, local, or federal agency or person for any of the supplies, materials, accesses, or services required to be provided by either CITY or ENGINEER under this AGREEMENT; strikes, work slowdowns or other labor disturbances, and judicial restraint.
- 17. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>. If any portion of this AGREEMENT shall be construed by a court of competent jurisdiction as unenforceable, such portion shall be severed herefrom, and the balance of this AGREEMENT shall remain in full force and effect.
- 18. <u>INTEGRATION AND MODIFICATION</u>. This AGREEMENT includes Attachments A, B, C, D, E and F, and represents the entire and integrated AGREEMENT between the parties; and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, or agreements pertaining to the SCOPE OF SERVICES herein, either written or oral. CITY may make or approve changes within the general SCOPE OF SERVICES in this AGREEMENT. If such changes affect ENGINEER's cost of or time required for performance of the services, an equitable adjustment will be made through an amendment to this AGREEMENT. This AGREEMENT may be amended only by written instrument signed by each of the Parties.
- 19. <u>DISPUTE RESOLUTION PROCEDURE</u>. In the event of a dispute between the ENGINEER and the CITY over the interpretation or application of the terms of this AGREEMENT, the matter shall be referred to the City's Director of Public Works for resolution. If the Director of Public Works is unable to resolve the dispute, the matter shall be referred to the City Manager for resolution. Regardless of these procedures, neither party shall be precluded from exercising any rights, privileges or opportunities permitted by law to resolve any dispute.
- 20. <u>ASSIGNMENT</u>. ENGINEER shall not assign its obligations undertaken pursuant to this AGREEMENT, provided that nothing contained in this paragraph shall prevent ENGINEER from employing such independent consultants, associates, and subcontractors as ENGINEER may deem appropriate to assist ENGINEER in the performance of the SERVICES hereunder.
- 21. <u>APPROVAL</u>. It is understood and agreed that all work performed under this AGREEMENT shall be subject to inspection and approval by the Public Works Department of the City of McAlester, and any plans or specifications not meeting the terms set forth in this AGREEMENT will be replaced or corrected at the sole expense of the ENGINEER. The ENGINEER will meet with the City staff initially and monthly thereafter and will be available for public meetings and/or City of McAlester presentations.

22. <u>KEY PERSONNEL</u>. In performance of the SERVICES hereunder, ENGINEER has designated Brandon Claborn as Project Manager for the PROJECT. ENGINEER agrees that no change will be made in the assignment of this position without prior approval of CITY.



<u>COMPENSATION</u>. The CITY agrees to pay, as compensation for services set forth in Attachment B, the following fees, payable monthly as each Phase of the work progresses; and within 30 calendar days of receipt of invoice. ENGINEER shall submit monthly invoices based upon actual hours or work, invoiced according the Rate Schedule provided in Attachment E, completed at the time of billing. Invoices shall be accompanied by such documentation as the CITY may require in substantiation of the amount billed.

#### D.1 Total Compensation.

- D.1.1 For the work under this project, Attachment B, the total maximum billing including direct costs and subconsultant services is <a href="Twenty-four Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars and No Cents">Twenty-four Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars and No Cents</a> (\$24,800.00), which total amount shall not be exceeded without further written authorization by the CITY.
