Before the vote, Ms. Ervin reviewed the amendment with the Council commenting that this was for upgrades to the Fire Station's radio base station.

There was discussion among the Council including Ms. Ervin and Manager Stasiak concerning the upgrades, the total amount of the upgrades, if this would be bid, where the funding was to come from and how it would improve communication among the rural stations and the City of McAlester. There was no further discussion, and the vote was taken as follows:

A motion was made by Vice-Mayor Mason and seconded by Councilman Smith to approve an Ordinance amending Sections 106.71 (a) and 106.71 (c) of the McAlester City Codes.

Before the vote, Ms. Ervin informed the Council that this had been done to allow the low volume discount to update automatically each year, with the CPI, and not have to be brought before Council each year.

There was discussion among the Council regarding the rate that had been inserted into the Ordinance, inserting a formula in place of a rate and having the rates available to the public, how many citizens actually took advantage of the discount, how the City notified its customers that did qualify for the discount of any changes, the wording of the Ordinance, applying the same CPI index to adjust amount of the discount and rates and directing the staff to make the suggested adjustments to the Ordinance and bring it back to the Council.

There was no vote on this item.

4. Consider and act upon awarding bid in the amount of \$27,171.00, for one new and unused One Ton Truck for the Waste Water Maintenance Department. (Peter J. Stasiak, City Manager)

Executive Summary

Motion to approve the award of bid to Nix Ford, McAlester, Oklahoma, for the purchase of one (1) New and Unused 2012 F-350 1 Ton Truck.

A motion was made by Councilman Read and seconded by Councilman Karr to award a bid in the amount of \$27,171.00, for one new and unused One Ton Truck for the Waste Water Maintenance Department, to Nix Ford, McAlester, Oklahoma.

Before the vote, Manager Stasiak informed the Council that the City Engineer had established a monitoring system to track maintenance costs for each of the City vehicles and equipment. He stated that this vehicle would replace a vehicle that had had several major repairs and it was not worth the money the City would need to put into it for the current needed repairs.

There was a brief discussion among the Council regarding the rear end ratio, if the bid included the Knapehide body, the number of bids received and how the specifications had been set for this vehicle.

Motion to accept the IAFF 2012-2013 Collective Bargaining Agreement; this includes a 2012-2013 Memorandum of Understanding.

A motion was made by Councilman Read and seconded by Councilman Garvin to accept and authorize the Mayor to sign the Collective Bargaining Agreement between the City of McAlester and the International Association of Fire Fighters (IAFF) Local No. 2284, effective July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013 and to include 2012-2013 Memorandum of Understanding.

Before the vote, Manager Stasiak read the letter from the Union which stated that the Union had voted on and approved the "City's Proposal to basically roll the agreement with some minor changes as proposed by the City and submitted to our Representative, Rick Beams, President of the PFFO just following the last negotiation session." He then reviewed the changes to the contract with the Council. He added that the Memorandum of Understanding added one firefighter for fiscal year 2012-2013.

There was a brief discussion among the Council regarding the inclusion of the MOU, clarification of who was authorized to sign the contract, the approval being contingent on the IAFF signing the contract and the hard work that had been put into negotiating this contract. There was no further discussion, and the vote was taken as follows:

6. Final review of Marketing Alliance Agreement with City Attorney changes and comments. (Peter J. Stasiak, City Manager)

Executive Summary

The agreement was approved on August 28, 2012, subject to City Attorney changes. This is a final review of Market Alliance Agreement with City Attorney recommended changes.

City Attorney Ervin reviewed the recommended changes to the contract with the Council. He also commented that if there were any other changes to the contract to let him know.





ORDINANCE NO. ____

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2425 WHICH ESTABLISHED THE BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2012-2013; REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City Council heretofore adopted Ordinance No. 2425 setting forth the Budget for Fiscal Year 2012-2013 beginning July 1, 2012 and ending June 30, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the City Departments and Divisions routinely review their budget appropriations to determine if any changes are necessary; and

WHEREAS, based upon said review the City staff now recommends that certain amendments to the Budget be considered by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has the authority to make amendments to the City Budget under Article 5, Section 5.07 (b) of the new City Charter as well as State law; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the proposed amendment to the FY 2012-2013 Budget, with the revenues and expenditures therein contained, is in the best interest of the City; and therefore, desires to adopt the same by formal action.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1: The proposed amendment to the FY 2012-2013 Budget of the City of McAlester, Oklahoma, as heretofore adopted by Ordinance, as summarized in Exhibit A-1, which is attached hereto and fully incorporated herein by reference, be, and the same hereby are, completely adopted and approved as an amendment to the said FY 2012-2013 Budget.

SECTION 2: All portions of the existing FY 2012-2013 Budget, Ordinance No. 2425 except as specifically herein amended, shall remain in full force and effect, and not be otherwise affected by the adoption of the amendatory ordinance.

SECTION 3: That all other ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of any such conflict or inconsistency and all other ordinances not in conflict herewith shall remain in full force and effect.

<u>SECTION 4</u>: Should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause, phrase, or section of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the

same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision thereof, other than the part or parts as declared to be invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional.

SECTION 5: That an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and for the provision of the public peace, health and safety, by reason whereof it is necessary that all acts take effect immediately and be in full force and effect from, and after the passage and approval.

PASSED and the EMERGENCY CLAUSE ruled on separately this 25th day of September, 2012.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 106.71(a), 106.71(b) AND 106.71(c) OF THE McALESTER CITY CODES FIXING WATER RATES AND REGARDING LOW INCOME GUIDELINES.

* * * * * * * * * * *

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA, that:

SECTION 1: Section 106.71(a) of the McAlester City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

(a) The rates to be charged for water furnished by the City Water System shall be as follows:

- (b) These rates shall be reviewed at the end of the current fiscal year, which is June 30, 2006. On January 1, 2007, and each January 1 thereafter, the above rates shall be adjusted after a review of the analysis of the Consumer Price Index (CPI).
- (b) These rates shall be reviewed at the end of the current fiscal year, which is June 30. Each January 1 thereafter, the above rates shall be adjusted to reflect increases in the Consumer Price Index (CPI). The City shall post and make available to the public a schedule of the adjusted rates to be charged.

SECTION 2: Section 106.71(c) of the McAlester City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

- (c) Low volume discount.
- 1) Single households with income of \$8,000 per year, or less, and married households with income of \$12,000 per year, or less, shall be granted an adjustment of \$11.00 on their monthly utility bill, but in no case shall the bill be adjusted below the basic minimum.

- 1) Using the official poverty guidelines published by the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services each year, households with proof of income less than this poverty level shall be granted an adjustment on their monthly utility bill, but in no case shall the bill be adjusted below the basic minimum. The current adjustment rate as of January 1, 2012 is \$11.00. Each January 1 thereafter, the above adjustment rate of \$11.00 shall be amended based on the analysis of the Consumer Price Index (CPI).
- 2) To qualify for the low income discount, the customer must provide a copy of his or her latest officially filed Federal Income Tax Return, or proof of income in lieu thereof. This form must be filed on the first of June of each year. Income shall mean total income, not adjusted income. The discount period shall expire on June 30th of each year and shall be renewed by the customer.
- 3) This discount provision shall not apply to landlords or commercial enterprises. Discounts shall apply to the low income individual's occupied residence.

LEASE AGREEMENT

This lease is made and entered into this 1st day of October, 2012 between MCALESTER REGIONAL AIRPORT AUTHORITY and CITY OF MCALESTER, McAlester, Oklahoma, hereinafter referred to as "Lessor" and EAGLEMED, LLC hereinafter referred to as "Lessee".

Lessor agrees to lease to lessee Corporate Hanger No. 30 located at the McAlester Regional Airport in McAlester, Oklahoma for a term of five (5) years beginning October 1, 2012 and ending on October 1, 2017.

Lessee agrees to lease Corporate Hanger No. 30 located at McAlester Regional Airport in McAlester, Oklahoma from Lessor for a term of five (5) years from October 1, 2012 until October 1, 2017.

The Lessee shall pay the Lessor as rent the sum of \$1,700 per month with the first payment due on October 1, 2012, and the same amount due on the first day of each month thereafter during the term of this lease.

Lessor shall furnish water to Lessee at Hanger No. 30 during the term of this lease.

Lessee shall pay for all electric service during the term of this lease and shall be responsible for any damages that Lessee causes to Hanger No. 30.

At the end of this lease Lessee shall deliver immediate possession of the property to Lessor.

It Shall be Lessee's responsibility to insure its airplane and any other personal property located in Hanger No. 30 against fire and casualty loss and Lessee shall sign a Hold Harmless Agreement in favor of Lessor.

This lease cannot be sublet by Lessee without the written consent of Lessor.

PROJECT GOAL: To reduce the number of KAB crashes in the City of McAlester by 15.5%, from 46 in 2010 to 39 in 2013.

PROBLEM IDENTIFICATION: The City of McAlester is located in SE Oklahoma, in Pittsburgh County. The City's jurisdiction includes major highways US69 and US270 as well as several state highways. According to 2010 data provided by the Oklahoma Highway Safety Office, the City of McAlester ranks 12th in the state for injury crashes, 20th for motorcyclist injuries, 23rd for unsafe speed KAB crashes, and 13th for total KAB crashes. All above the state rate for 100 million vehicle miles traveled. Funding for overtime traffic enforcement would allow the McAlester Police Department to focus on aggressive drivers, including impaired motorcyclists, and those violations that may cause or contribute to the severity of KAB crashes.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: McAlester Officers will work in an overtime capacity to increase enforcement of traffic violations. These overtime shifts will target high crash areas based on crash reports and citizen complaints. Officers will also participate in public information and education activities (PI&E), occasionally using overtime hours for safety presentations at schools, churches, and other community organizations, and CPS check up events. The McAlester Police Department will support NHTSA's national goals and participate in the National Click-It or Ticket and Drunk Driving, Over the Limit, Under Arrest Mobilizations.

The Project Director will submit monthly reports to the OHSO. These reports will contain a narrative summary and completed OHSO Budget and Activity Milestone pages. A claim requesting reimbursement will be included for expended project funds and necessary backup financial documentation including but not limited to participating officers' hourly wage and overtime hourly wage. The claim will include an officer activity log that denotes overtime hours worked, number and type of activities and written contacts along with a description of PI&E events conducted. Online pre and post reporting is required as participation in the Click-It or Ticket and Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over mobilizations.

EVALUATION: At the end of the project year and no later than November 1, 2013, the Project Director will submit a summary report detailing the results of project activities and address these results in relation to the projected goal.

Re-Codification Contract:

Term of Agreement. This Agreement shall begin upon execution by the City of McAlester, and will expire on June 30, 2013. Thereafter, on July 1 each year the Agreement will automatically renew, with credit for prior performance, each year for additional one year periods until three years after the publication date of the new code. Thereafter, the Supplement Service shall be automatically renewed from year to year provided that each party may cancel or change this agreement with sixty (60) days written notice.

Terms & Conditions of Shred-it Client Service Agreement

- 1. Sole Terms. All services provided by Shred-it to Client are subject solely to the terms contained herein and any addenda agreed to by the parties in writing and attached hereto. No term or condition on Client's purchase order or any other instrument, agreement or understanding shall be binding upon Shred-it unless agreed to by the parties in writing. All typographical and clerical errors are subject to correction.
- 2. Shred-it Services. Shred-it will provide the following services to Client:
 (a) Shred-it will provide all consoles and other related equipment on Client's premises for the collection and storage of all of Client's paper materials ("Materials"). The number of consoles will be determined by Shred-it after discussions with Client. Additional consoles may be added to this Agreement and shall automatically become a part of and subject to the terms hereof.
 (b) Shred-it will: (i) collect the Materials on a regularly scheduled and mutually agreed basis and (ii) destroy the Materials using a mechanical shredding device (the "Document Destruction Process").
- (c) Within a reasonable time following completion of the Document Destruction Process, Shred-it will provide Client with a Certificate of Destruction.
 (d) An authorized representative of Client may, at any time, inspect the Document Destruction Process
- (e) Shred-it will recycle or otherwise dispose of the Materials.
- 3. Mass Destruction Services. At any time during the term of this Agreement and during any Renewal Term, Client may request that Shred-it perform mass destruction services ("Purge") on a single transaction basis. Both Parties shall execute a Statement of Work setting out the fees for the Purge and the particulars of the service. Unless otherwise specified in the Statement of Work, the Purge services shall be provided in accordance with the terms and conditions set out in this Agreement. The Statement of Work will be an Addendum to this Agreement and will constitute a part of it.
- 4. Consoles & Equipment. Consoles and any other equipment provided to Client by Shred-it are the property of Shred-it. Client will not file any lien, nor allow to be filed any lien, against any such equipment and consoles. Client will keep all consoles and equipment in good working order, normal wear and tear excepted. For any consoles or equipment which are moved, damaged, stolen or lost while at Client's location, Client shall (a) pay the following replacement charge: \$100.00 per console; and (b) indemnify and hold harmless Shred-it and its affiliates and agents for any damages related to such consoles or equipment, and for any Materials which may have been located in such consoles and equipment.
- 5. Service Fee. Client will pay a "Service Fee" to Shred-it equal to the greater of (each as set forth on the cover page): (a) the Minimum Charge, or (b) the Billing Rate per minute or per container. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, Client shall pay (i) any amount required by Shred-it, at Shred-it's sole option, if Client requests that Shred-it come to Client's location, and Shred-it agrees to do so, for any reason other than the scheduled shredding or (ii) the Minimum Charge if after Shred-it has arrived at Client's location on the scheduled shredding date and time, Client's offices are closed or Client declines shredding services without prior notification to Shred-it. Shred-it will provide notice of any change in the Service Fee to Client, which notice may be in the form of an invoice. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Shred-it reserves the right to increase the Service Fce above 7% as a result of an adverse change in market conditions. Client may reject any changes to the Service Fee in excess of 7% within 30 days of receiving notice from Shred-it, provided, however, that upon such rejection

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City Manager Report to the Council

September 25, 2012

Business

- The Engineering Department has completed the identification and prioritization of asphalt streets for overlay. The map is attached for your review. The Street Department finished the asphalt overlay on "H" Street from Harrison to Tyler. This street overlay is 415 feet long and 26 feet wide. The total cost of materials for the project was \$16,193. The crews have now moved over to "F" Street from Polk to Tyler and "F" Street from Tyler to Harrison. The milling of the asphalt is occurring this week with base preparation to be completed the week of September 24, 2012.
- The McAlester Recycling Center at Main and Choctaw is expanding. Beginning October 1, 2012 the Center will be accepting clear, brown, and blue/green glass. An area has been designated and they are asking all users to separate the glass containers by color, bag the glass and place it in the designated areas. The advertising campaign to the public for glass recycling will begin the week of September 24, 2012.
- EagleMed has been working with McAlester Airport Manager Butch Mellor to investigate the possibilities of acquiring a hangar at the Airport to house a helicopter and fixed wing aircraft for air ambulance service. Mr. Mellor has been in contact with Jim Powell who rents a hangar at the airport. Mr. Powell has agreed to give up his hangar so that it can be utilized by EagleMed for their operations. EagleMed will be expanding their operations to service a regional hub for Southeast Oklahoma. This expansion has the possibility of doubling their employment in the area. I have attached an e-mail from Mr. Barkley giving the breakdown of employment for the McAlester area.
- <u>UPDATE:</u> Demolitions: The City Council previously voted to demolish 7 structures in the City of McAlester. The bids have been received and Purchase Orders have been issued for the demolition of the properties. The contractors have begun removing the houses this week.

Labor Issues

- Fraternal Order of Police (FOP)
 - An Unfair Labor Practice (ULP) was charged against the City for the installation of GPS devices on Police cars. This ULP has been negotiated and settled between the City and the FOP. All charges have been dropped.
- International Association of Fire Fighters (IAFF)
 - The contracts for fiscal year 2012 2013 have been signed by both parties. Staff has issued a hiring request for one (1) additional Fire Fighter as called for in the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).

Miscellaneous

The Honda Goldwing Rally will be held at the EXPO Center on October 4 – 6,
 2012. The City is expecting 300 - 400 riders for the event. This is the second year in a row for the Goldwing Association to hold their event in McAlester.

Subject: EagleMed Information Good Afternoon Mr. Stasiak,

I appreciate the opportunity to meet you on Thursday morning. We are very excited to become a part of your community and will work hard to provide you a world-class air ambulance service.

As discussed, the staffing matrix for our helicopter or fixed wing bases are as follows:

- (4) Pilots
- (1) Full Time Mechanic
- (3) Full Time Registered Nurses (minimum)
- (3) Full Time Paramedics (minimum)
- (1-2) Part Time Registered Nurse
- (1-2) Part Time Paramedic

At some bases, in lieu of a Part Timer, we use the FTE of 2 part timers to have a 4th full time position on both the Registered Nurse & Paramedic side.

I pulled some numbers to determine average gross wages for our Medical Crews, Pilots, and maintenance staff. We pay out on average \$24,949 biweekly with a yearly total of around \$648, 674 per base. This annual number is just for one base, so if we are able to put in the fixed wing in as well, we will be spending approximately \$1,297,348 in salaries alone.

I hope this gives you a little more information about the economical impact both assets could provide.
