Before the vote, John Modzelewski addressed the Council commenting on the future plan to repair, rehab and reconstruct the City roads. He reviewed the map that had been developed for clearing streets after inclement weather explaining how this approach would be used for the street project. Mr. Modzelewski explained how various surveys had been used in preparing the plan and this plan was proposed at \$12 million. He added that the 2012 CIP streets plan stimated at over \$20 million and drainage would be addressed as the plan progressed.

There was discussion among the Council concerning the various streets, if the cost included replacement of water and sewer lines, any estimate of how long this plan would take, and how future surveys could affect the prioritization of the plan.

Ben Fletcher, Project Manager for Meshek and Associates PLC, commented that smaller projects could be completed with in four (4) months but multiple projects could take longer.

Manager Stasiak commented that \$625,000.00 had been budgeted this year for street reconstruction.

#### ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

### Sec. 62-1. Comprehensive plan adopted: purpose.

- (a) The Comprehensive Plan for the City of McAlester, Oklahoma, dated June 1978 as attached originally and on file in the city clerk's office and made a part of this chapter is hereby adopted.
- (b) The comprehensive plan is hereby stated to be adopted for the purpose of providing orderly development of the community. (Ord. No. 1871, § 1(21.1), 8-27-91)

#### Sec. 62-2. Filling and excavating of land.

- (a) Permit required. It shall be unlawful for any individual or organization to fill in land within the city unless a permit is issued by the city. An application for permit shall be filed with the city and shall specify the type of material, location, depth, compaction and cover material to be used in the fill.
- (b) Permissible fill material. Fill material shall consist of natural soil, earth, clay, gravel, loam, stones, bricks, brickbats, plaster, Portland cement, glass, cinders, metal chips and other noncombustible waste material as specified in section 106-301.
- (c) Exceptions. Exceptions to the above requirements of this section shall be:
  - (1) A fill less than one foot in depth, and placed on natural terrain, with a slope flatter than five horizontal to one vertical, or less than three feet in depth not intended to support structures, which does not exceed 50 cubic yards on any one lot and does not obstruct a drainage course.
  - (2) An excavation which is less than two feet in depth, or which does not create a cut of greater than five feet in height and steeper than 1½ to one vertical.

#### ARTICLE II. PLANNING COMMISSION\*

#### Sec. 62-26. Created; purpose.

In order to direct the future development of the city and to encourage social and economic improvements in accordance with modern city planning principles, and to ensure the orderly, efficient and economic arrangement and development of future public works projects, there is hereby created a planning commission for the city.

(Ord. No. 1871, § 1(21.6), 8-27-91)

State law reference—Authority to create planning commission, 11 O.S. § 45-101.

### Sec. 62-27. Composition; appointment, terms of members.

- (a) The planning commission shall consist of 11 members who shall be nominated by the mayor and confirmed by the city council for a term of three years; provided in 2008 three members nominated and confirmed shall serve for a period of three years; in 2009 four members nominated and confirmed shall serve for a period of three years; in 2010 four members nominated and confirmed shall serve for a period of three years; and upon the expiration of their terms, respectively, successor members shall be nominated by the mayor and confirmed by the city council for terms of three years each. Appointments to fill vacancies shall be made by the mayor and confirmed by the council for the unexpired term only.
- (b) In addition to the appointed members, the mayor and city engineer shall be ex-officio members of the planning commission.
- (c) During the term of membership, any member who is absent for more than 50 percent of the meetings within a one-year period or three consecutive meetings, without good cause determined by the planning commission, shall automatically cease to be a member and a replacement shall be appointed by the mayor upon confirmation by the city council.

#### Sec. 62-28. Qualifications of members.

The appointed members of the planning commission shall be residents of the city who are qualified by knowledge or experience to act upon matters pertaining to the physical, social and economic development of the city. (Ord. No. 1871, § 1(21.8), 8-27-91)

#### Sec. 62-29. Removal of members; members shall serve without compensation.

Any appointed member of the planning commission may be removed by the mayor and city council at any time for due cause shown. All members shall serve without compensation. (Ord. No. 1871, § 1(21.9), 8-27-91)

#### Sec. 62-30. Election of officers; adoption of rules.

The planning commission shall elect from among its appointed members its own chairman, vicechairman, secretary and treasurer, and may from time to time adopt such rules and regulations, not inconsistent with the laws of the state or with the charter or ordinances of the city, for its own organization and procedure as it may deem proper. (Ord. No. 1871, § 1(21.10), 8-27-91)

#### Sec. 62-31. General duties.

- (a) The duties of the planning commission shall be to prepare a comprehensive plan showing its ideas and recommendations for the physical development of the city; to provide programs, drawings, maps or plans covering the whole or any portion of the city and of any lands outside of the city, which, in the opinion of the commission, bears relation to the development or welfare of the city. Such plan shall show the commission's ideas and recommendation relative to:
  - The location, width and arrangement of streets, alleys, bridges, grade separations, parking, parkways, playgrounds, schools, public institutions or other public grounds or improvements.

- (2)The grouping of public buildings.
- The design and planning of any memorials or works of art.
- (4) Transportation facilities, such as railroads railway or motor.
- Street appurtenances, including lighting standards, street name signs, poles and wires, projecting signs, and the like; zoning plan and ordinance for the classification and regulation of land uses and open spaces about buildings; and other matters pertaining to the physical, social and economic improvement of the city, or any portion thereof.
- (b) The commission shall submit such plan to the mayor and city council. (Ord. No. 1871, § 1(21.11), 8-27-91)

#### Sec. 62-32. Recommendations as to subdivisions and closing of streets.

All plans and plats for the subdivision of land into streets or building lots, and all proposals for the closing of streets and alleys within the limits of the city or any additions thereto, shall be submitted to the planning commission for its recommendations before final acceptance or approval by the city. Such recommendations by the commission shall be made within 30 days of such submission and failure to do so shall constitute a waiver of its privilege to pass upon such plan, plat or closing.

#### Sec. 62-33. Duty with respect to public works program.

It shall be the duty of the planning commission to prepare and submit an annual public works program to the mayor and city council, on or before June 30 of each year. It shall be the duty of each city department or agency to furnish the commission, upon request, any data, plans, estimates or programs and to collaborate with the commission in the preparation of such public works program.

#### Sec. 62-34. Preparation and recommendation of proposed legislation.

It shall be the duty of the planning commission to prepare and recommend such municipal legislation as may be necessary to carry out the recommendations or suggestions of the commission

### Sec. 62-35. Employment of planners, engineers, etc.

The planning commission may employ such planners, engineers, architects, clerks and other persons as may be necessary in the performance of its duties, subject to the approval of the city council. The salaries and compensation of such persons shall be fixed by the city council and appropriations be made therefor, if deemed necessary by the city council.

#### ARTICLE III. CLOSING OF PUBLIC WAYS AND EASEMENTS\*

#### Sec. 62-56. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Close means an ordinance of the city council enacted in accordance with the requirements hereafter set forth, discontinuing the public use of a public way or easement without affecting title to real property.

Easement means rights in real property as defined in 60 O.S. § 49 as presently existing or as may be hereafter amended.

Public way means a street, avenue, boulevard, alley, lane or thoroughfare open or platted for public use.

(Ord. No. 1871, § 1(21.21), 8-27-91)

#### Sec. 62-57. Petition generally.

- (a) A petition for the closing of any public way or easement within the city shall be filed with the planning commission by any owner of property abutting the way petitioned to be closed, or his duly authorized representative, on a standard form furnished by the planning commission. All petitions for closing of a public way or easement shall be accompanied by a sketch, plan or copy of a map of the area surrounding the street, way or easement to be closed, drawn to approximate scale, showing the land of all abutting property owners, their names and mailing addresses.
- (b) The applicant shall be also required to secure from a bonded abstractor, a plat of the area involved, the names and addresses of the owners of record, all within 300 feet of the proposed change. Upon receipt by the building official of

#### COMMUNITY SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF MCALESTER, OKLAHOMA, AND HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF MCALESTER, OKLAHOMA

WHEREAS, the City of McAlester, Oklahoma, (hereinafter called the "City") and the Housing Authority of the City of McAlester (hereinafter called the "Local Authority") recognize a responsibility to provide for the welfare of the community, an agreement is hereby made to benefit the community through the operation of a Community Center.

THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein between the parties:

 The City does hereby agree to assume the financial responsibility of operation of the Community Center and further agrees to provide (a) competent staff and supervision to carry out a program of recreational and social activities necessary to serve the Community Center; (b) to furnish sufficient materials and supplies as may be necessary to carry out the program and to be solely responsible for the care and maintenance of all equipment and furnishings of the Community Center; (c) utility expenses of community space unless otherwise provided for; (d) a minimum of Fifty Thousand and One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$50/100,000) Owner-Landlord and Tenant Public Liability Insurance to protect the City and Local Authority against claims for bodily injury or death; (e) janitor service and any other service necessary to the operation of the Community Center.

In the event the City shall fail, neglect or refuse to perform its obligation and breach the conditions herein provided to the extent that the tenants of the Project shall be deprived of the use, benefit and enjoyment of the services and facilities which they have agreed to furnish and operate, the City agrees that the Local Authority may operate the facility.

If the Local Authority under circumstances stated above, does incur expenses in operating the facility; and maintaining such services, it may deduct the amount of such expenses from payments in lieu of taxes due, or to become due to the City under the Cooperation Agreement between the City and the Local Authority.

- The Local Authority hereby agrees to provide (a) adequate physical facilities within its prescribed limitations to carry out all programs and projects to be planned and arranged for by the City as the sponsoring agency; (b) provide repair and maintenance of such facility not to exceed normal wear and tear; (c) to provide basic furniture and equipment as may be necessary for carrying out an effective program beneficial to the Local Authority and to the Community within prescribed limitations.
- The City hereby grees not to discriminate because of race, color, creed, or national origin in the operation of the Community Center and in the sponsorship and programming of activities and services to be offered therein.

This provision is included pursuant to the regulations of the Department of Housing and Urban Development, 24 CFR, Subtitle A, Part 1, Section 1.1 et seg. (see also Department Interim Order II, 31 F.R. 815) issued under title V) of the said Civil Rights Act of 1964, and the requirements of the said Department pursuant to said regulations; and the obligation of the City to comply therewith inures to the benefit of the United States, the said Department and the Local Authority, any of which shall be entitled to invoke any remedies available by law to redress any breach thereof or to compel compliance therewith by the City.

4. This Agreement shall remain in full force and effect for the duration of the Cooperation Agreement between the City and the Local Authority.

#### COOPERATION AGREEMENT

This Agreement entered into this 25th day of August 19	66
by and between Housing Authority of the City of McAlester, Okla. (herein	
called the "Local Authority") and The City of McAlester. Oklahoma (herein called the "Municipality"), Witnesseth:	-

In consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, the parties hereto do agree as follows:

- 1. Whenever used in this Agreement:
  - (a) The term "Project" shall mean any low-rent housing hereafter developed as an entity by the Local Authority with financial assistance of the Public Housing Administration (herein called the "PHA"); excluding, however, any low-rent housing project covered by any contract for loans and annual contributions entered into between the Local Authority and the PHA, or its predecessor agencies, prior to the date of this Agreement.
  - (b) The term "Taxing Body" shall mean the State or any political subdivision or taxing unit thereof in which a project is situated and which would have authority to assess or levy real or personal property taxes or to certify such taxes to a taxing body or public officer to be levied for its use and benefit with respect to a project if it were not exempt from taxation.
  - (c) The term "Shelter Rent" shall mean the total of all charges to all tenants of a project for dwelling rents and nondwelling rents (excluding all other income of such project), less the cost to the Local Authority of all dwelling and nondwelling utilities.
  - (d) The term "Slum" shall mean any area where dwellings predominate which, by reason of dilapidation, overcrowding, faulty arrangement or design, lack of ventilation, light or sanitation facilities, or any combination of these factors, are detrimental to safety, health, or morals.
- 2. The Local Authority shall endeavor (a) to secure a contract or contracts with the PHA for loans and annual contributions covering one or more projects comprising approximately 305 units of low-rent housing and (b) to develop and administer such project or projects, each of which shall be located within the corporate limits of the Municipality. The obligations of the parties hereto shall apply to each such project.
  - 3. (a) Under the constitution and statutes of the

of McAlester, Okla. , all projects are exempt from all real and personal property taxes and special assessments levied or imposed by any Taxing Body. With respect to any project, so long as either (i) such project is owned by a public body or governmental agency and is used for low-rent housing purposes, or (ii) any contract between the Local Authority and the PHA for loans or annual contributions, or both, in connection with such project remains in force and effect, or due to the PHA in connection with such project remain unpaid, whichever period is the longest, the Municipality agrees that it will not levy or impose any real or personal property taxes or special assessments upon such project or upon the Local Authority with respect thereto. During such period, the Local Authority shall make annual payments (herein called "Payments in Lieu of Taxes") in lieu of such taxes and special assessments and in payment for the public services and facilities furnished from time to time without other cost or charge for or with respect to such project.

- (b) Each such annual Payment in Lieu of Taxes shall be made after the end of the fiscal year established for such Project, and shall be in an amount equal to either (i) ten percent (10%) of the aggregate Shelter Rent charged by the Local Authority in respect to such project during such fiscal year, or (ii) the amount permitted to be paid by applicable state law in effect on the date such payment is made, whichever amount is the lower. For the purpose of computing the Federal Annual Contribution and Payment in Lieu of Taxes, all projects which are covered by the same contract with the PHA for annual contributions and which have cooperation agreements subject to limitation as expressed in clause (ii) above, shall be treated collectively as a single project.
- (c) The Local Authority shall make the Payments in Lieu of Taxes among the Taxing bodies to the municipality for distribution among taxing bodies as the municipality considers appropriate; Provided, however, that no payment for any year shall be made to any taxing body in excess of the amount of the real property taxes which would have been paid to such taxing body for such year if the project were not exempt from taxation.
- (d) Upon failure of the Local Authority to make any Payment in Lieu of Taxes, no lien against any project or assets of the Local Authority shall attach, nor shall any interest or penalties accrue or attach on account thereof.
- 4. The Municipality agrees that, subsequent to the date of initiation (as defined in the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended) of each project and within five years after the completion thereof, or such further period as may be approved by the PHA, there has been or will be elimination (as approved by the PHA) by demolition, condemnation, effective closing, or compulsory repair or improvement, of unsafe or insanitary dwelling units situated in the locality or metropolitan area in which such project is located, substantially equal in number to the number of newly constructed dwelling units provided by such project; Provided, that where more than one family is living in an unsafe or insanitary dwelling unit, the elimination of such unit shall count as the elimination of units equal to the number of families accommodated therein; and Provided, further, that this Paragraph 4 shall not apply in the case of (1) any project developed on the site of a slum cleared subsequent to July 15, 1949, and that the dwelling units eliminated by the clearance of the site of such project shall not be counted as elimination for any other Project or any other low-rent housing projet, or (11) any project located in a rural nonfarm area.
- 5. During the period commencing with the date of the acquisition of any part of the site or sites of any project and continuing so long as either (i) such project is owned by a public body or governmental agency and is used for low-rent housing purposes, or (ii) any contract between the Local Authority and the PHA for loans or annual contributions, or both, in connection with such project remains in force and effect, or (iii) any bonds issued in connection with such project or any monies due to the PHA in connection with such project remain unpaid, whichever period is the longest, the Municipality without cost or charge to the Local Authority or the tenants of such project (other than the Payments in Lieu of Taxes) shall:
  - (a) Furnish or cause to be furnished to the Local Authority and the tenants of such project public services and facilities of the same character and to the same extent as are furnished from time to time without cost or charge to other dwellings and inhabitants in the Municipality;
  - (b) Vacate such streets, roads, and alleys within the area of such project as may be necessary in the development thereof, and convey without charge to the Local Authority such interest as the Municipality may have in such vacated areas, and, insofar as it is lawfully able to do so without cost or expense to the Local Authority or to the Municipality, cause to be removed from such vacated areas, insofar as it may be necessary, all public or private utility lines and equipment;

- (c) Insofar as the Municipality may lawfully do so, (i) grant such deviations from the building code of the Municipality as are reasonable and necessary to promote economy and efficiency in the development and administration of such Project, and at the same time safeguard health and safety, and (ii) make such changes in any zoning of the site and surrounding territory of such Project as are reasonable and necessary for the development and protection of such Project and the surrounding territory;
- (a) Accept grants of easements necessary for the development of such Project; and
- (e) Cooperate with the Local Authority by such other lawful action or ways as the Municipality and the Local Authority may find necessary in connection with the development and administration of such Project.
- 6. In respect to any Project the Municipality further agrees that within a reasonable time after receipt of a written request therefor from the Local Authority:
  - (a) It will accept the dedication of all interior streets, roads, alleys, and adjacent sidewalks within the area of such Project, together with all storm and sanitary sewer mains in such dedicated areas, after the Local Authority, at its own expense, has completed the grading, improvement, paving, and installation thereof in accordance with specifications acceptable to the Municipality;
  - (b) It will accept necessary dedications of land for, and will grade, improve, pave, and provide sidewalks for, all streets bounding such Project or necessary to provide adequate access thereto (in consideration whereof the Local Authority shall pay to the Municipality such amount as would be assessed against the Project site for such work if such site were privately owned); and
  - (c) It will provide, or cause to be provided, water mains, and storm and sanitary sever mains, leading to such Project and serving the bounding streets thereof (in consideration whereof the Local Authority shall pay to the Municipality such amount as would be assessed against the Project site for such work if such site were privately owned).
- 7. If by reason of the Municipality's failure or refusal to furnish or cause to be furnished any public services or facilities which it has agreed hereunder to furnish or to cause to be furnished to the Local Authority or to the tenants of any Project, the Local Authority incurs any expense to obtain such services or facilities then the Local Authority may deduct the amount of such expense from any Payments in Lieu of Taxes due or to become due to the Municipality in respect to any Project or any other low-rent housing projects owned or operated by the Local Authority.
- 8. No Cooperation Agreement heretofore entered into between the Municipality and the Local Authority shall be construed to apply to any Project covered by this Agreement.
- 9. So long as any contract between the Local Authority and the PHA for loans (including preliminary loans) or annual contributions, or both, in connection with any Project remains in force and effect, or so long as any bonds issued in connection with any Project or any monies due to the PHA in connection with any Project remain unpaid, this Agreement shall not be abrogated, changed, or modified without the consent of the PHA. The privileges and obligations of the Municipality hereunder shall remain in full force and effect with respect to each Project so long as the beneficial title to such Project is held by the Local Authority or by any other public body or governmental agency, including the PHA, authorized by law to engage in the development or administration of low-rent housing projects. If at any time the beneficial title to, or possession of, any Project is held by such other public body or governmental agency, including the PHA, the provisions hereof shall inure to the benefit of and may be enforced by, such other public body or governmental

WIEREAS, the City of McAlester, Oklahoma, (hereinafter called the "City") and the Housing Authority of the City of McAlester (hereinafter called the "Local Authority") recognize a responsibility to provide for the welfare of the community, an agreement is hereby made to benefit the community through the operation of a Community Center.

THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein between the parties:

1. The City does hereby agree to assume the financial responsibility of operation of the Community Center and further agrees to provide (a) competent staff and supervision to carry out a program of recreational and social activities necessary to serve the Community Center; (b) to furnish sufficient materials and supplies as may be necessary to carry out the program and to be solely responsible for the care and maintenance of all equipment and furnishings of the Community Center; (c) utility expenses of community space unless otherwise provided for; (d) a minimum of Fifty Thousand and One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$50/100,000) Owner-Landlord and Tenant Public Liability Insurance to protect the City and Local Authority against claims for bodily injury or death; (e) janitor service and any other service necessary to the operation of the Community Center.

In the event the City shall fail, neglect or refuse to perform its obligation and breach the conditions herein provided to the extent that the tenants of the Project shall be deprived of the use, benefit and enjoyment of the services and facilities which they have agreed to furnish and operate, the City agrees that the Local Authority may operate the facility.

If the Local Authority under circumstances stated above, does incur expenses in operating the facility; and maintaining such services, it may deduct the amount of such expenses from payments in lieu of taxes due, or to become due to the City under the Cooperation Agreement between the City and the Local Authority.

- 2. The Local Authority hereby agrees to provide (a) adequate physical facilities within its prescribed limitations to carry out all programs and projects to be planned and arranged for by the City as the sponsoring agency; (b) provide repair and maintenance of such facility not to exceed normal wear and tear; (c) to provide basic furniture and equipment as may be necessary for carrying out an effective program beneficial to the Local Authority and to the Community within prescribed limitations.
- 3. The City hereby grees not to discriminate because of race, color, creed, or national origin in the operation of the Community Center and in the sponsorship and programming of activities and services to be offered therein.

This provision is included pursuant to the regulations of the Department of Housing and Urban Development, 24 CFR, Subtitle A, Part 1, Section 1.1 et seq. (see also Department Interim Order II, 31 F.R. 815) issued under title V1 of the said Civil Rights Act of 1964, and the requirements of the said Department pursuant to said regulations; and the obligation of the City to comply therewith incres to the benefit of the United States, the said Department and the Local Authority, any of which shall be entitled to invoke any remedies available by law to redress any breach thereof or to compel compliance therewith by the City.

4. This Agreement shall remain in full force and effect for the duration of the Cooperation Agreement between the City and the Local Authority.

In consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, the parties hereto do agree as follows:

- 1. Whenever used in this Agreement:
  - (a) The term "Project" shall mean any low-rent housing hereafter developed as an entity by the Local Authority with financial assistance of the Public Housing Administration (herein called the "PHA"); excluding, however, any low-rent housing project covered by any contract for loans and annual contributions entered into between the Local Authority and the PHA, or its predecessor agencies, prior to the date of this Agreement.
  - (b) The term "Taxing Body" shall mean the State or any political subdivision or taxing unit thereof in which a project is situated and which would have authority to assess or levy real or personal property taxes or to certify such taxes to a taxing body or public officer to be levied for its use and benefit with respect to a project if it were not exempt from taxation.
  - (c) The term "Shelter Rent" shall mean the total of all charges to all tenants of a project for dwelling rents and nondwelling rents (excluding all other income of such project), less the cost to the Local Authority of all dwelling and nondwelling utilities.
  - (d) The term "Slum" shall mean any area where dwellings predominate which, by reason of dilapidation, overcrowding, faulty arrangement or design, lack of ventilation, light or sanitation facilities, or any combination of these factors, are detrimental to safety, health, or morals.
- 2. The Local Authority shall endeavor (a) to secure a contract or contracts with the PHA for loans and annual contributions covering one or more projects comprising approximately 305 units of low-rent housing and (b) to develop and administer such project or projects, each of which shall be located within the corporate limits of the Municipality. The obligations of the parties hereto shall apply to each such project.
  - 3. (a) Under the constitution and statutes of the

of McAlester, Okla. , all projects are exempt from all real and personal property taxes and special assessments levied or imposed by any Taxing Body. With respect to any project, so long as either (i) such project is owned by a public body or governmental agency and is used for low-rent housing purposes, or (ii) any contract between the Local Authority and the PHA for loans or annual contributions, or both, in connection with such project remains in force and effect, or due to the PHA in connection with such project remain unpaid, whichever period is the longest, the Municipality agrees that it will not levy or impose any real or personal property taxes or special assessments upon such project or upon the Local Authority with respect thereto. . During such period, the Local Authority shall make annual payments (herein called "Payments in Lieu of Taxes") in lieu of such taxes and special assessments and in payment for the public services and facilities furnished from time to time without other cost or charge for or with respect to such project.

- (b) Each such annual Payment in Lieu of Taxes shall be made after the end of the fiscal year established for such Project, and shall be in an amount equal to either (i) ten percent (10%) of the aggregate Shelter Rent charged by the Local Authority in respect to such project during such fiscal year, or (ii) the amount permitted to be raid by applicable state law in effect on the date such payment is made, whichever amount is the lower. For the purpose of computing the Federal Annual Contribution and Payment in Lieu of Taxes, all projects which are covered by the same contract with the PHA for annual contributions and which have cooperation agreements subject to limitation as expressed in clause (ii) above, shall be treated collectively as a single project.
- (c) The Local Authority shall make the Payments in Lieu of Taxes among the Taxing bodies to the municipality for distribution among taxing bodies as the municipality considers appropriate; Provided, however, that no payment for any year shall be made to any taxing body in excess of the amount of the real property taxes which would have been paid to such taxing body for such year if the project were not exempt from taxation.
- (d) Upon failure of the Local Authority to make any Payment in Lieu of Taxes, no lien against any project or assets of the Local Authority shall attach, nor shall any interest or penalties accrue or attach on account thereof.
- 4. The Municipality agrees that, subsequent to the date of initiation (as defined in the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended) of each project and within five years after the completion thereof, or such further period as may be approved by the PHA, there has been or will be elimination (as approved by the PHA) by demolition, condemnation, effective closing, or compulsory repair or improvement, of unsafe or insanitary dwelling units situated in the locality or metropolitan area in which such project is located, substantially equal in number to the number of newly constructed dwelling units provided by such project; Provided, that where more than one family is living in an unsafe or insanitary dwelling unit , the elimination of such unit shall count as the elimination of units equal to the number of families accommodated therein; and Provided, further, that this Paragraph 4 shall not apply in the case of (1) any project developed on the site of a slum cleared subsequent to July 15, 1949, and that the dwelling units eliminated by the clearance of the site of such project shall not be counted as elimination for any other Project or any other low-rent housing projet, or (ii) any project located in a rural nonfarm area.
- 5. During the period commencing with the date of the acquisition of any part of the site or sites of any project and continuing so long as either (1) such project is owned by a public body or governmental agency and is used for low-rent housing purposes, or (ii) any contract between the Local Authority and the PHA for loans or annual contributions, or both, in connection with such project remains in force and effect, or (iii) any bonds issued in connection with such project or any monies due to the PHA in connection with such project remain unepaid, whichever period is the longest, the Municipality without cost or charge to the Local Authority or the tenants of such project (other than the Payments in Lieu of Taxes) shall:
  - (a) Furnish or cause to be furnished to the Local Authority and the tenants of such project public services and facilities of the same character and to the same extent as are furnished from time to time without cost or charge to other dwellings and inhabitants in the Municipality;
  - (b) Vacate such streets, roads, and alleys within the area of such project as may be necessary in the development thereof, and convey without charge to the Local Authority such interest as the Municipality may have in such vacated areas, and, insofar as it is lawfully able to do so without cost or expense to the Local Authority or to the Municipality, cause to be removed from such vacated areas, insofar as it may be necessary, all public or private utility lines and equipment;

- (c) Insofar as the Municipality may lawfully do so, (i) grant such deviations from the building code of the Municipality as are reasonable and necessary to promote economy and efficiency in the development and administration of such Project, and at the same time safeguard health and safety, and (ii) make such changes in any zoning of the site and surrounding territory of such Project as are reasonable and necessary for the development and protection of such Project and the surrounding territory;
- (d) Accept grants of easements necessary for the development of such Project; and
- (e) Cooperate with the Local Authority by such other lawful action or ways as the Municipality and the Local Authority may find necessary in connection with the development and administration of such Project.
- 6. In respect to any Project the Municipality further agrees that within a reasonable time after receipt of a written request therefor from the Local Authority:
  - (a) It will accept the dedication of all interior streets, roads, alleys, and adjacent sidewalks within the area of such Project, together with all storm and sanitary sewer mains in such dedicated areas, after the local Authority, at its own expense, has completed the grading, improvement, paving, and installation thereof in accordance with specifications acceptable to the Municipality;
  - (b) It will accept necessary dedications of land for, and will grade, improve, pave, and provide sidewalks for, all streets bounding such Project or necessary to provide adequate access thereto (in consideration whereof the Local Authority shall pay to the Municipality such amount as would be assessed against the Project site for such work if such site were privately owned); and
  - (c) It will provide, or cause to be provided, water mains, and storm and sanitary sever mains, leading to such Project and serving the bounding streets thereof (in consideration whereof the Local Authority shall pay to the Municipality such amount as would be assessed against the Project site for such work if such site were privately owned).
- 7. If by reason of the Municipality's failure or refusal to furnish or cause to be furnished any public services or facilities which it has agreed hereunder to furnish or to cause to be furnished to the Local Authority or to the tenants of any Project, the Local Authority incurs any expense to obtain such services or facilities then the Local Authority may deduct the amount of such expense from any Payments in Lieu of Taxes due or to become due to the Municipality in respect to any Project or any other low-rent housing projects owned or operated by the Local Authority.
- 8. No Cooperation Agreement heretofore entered into between the Municipality and the Local Authority shall be construed to apply to any Project covered by this Agreement.
- 9. So long as any contract between the Local Authority and the PHA for loans (including preliminary loans) or annual contributions, or both, in connection with any Project remains in force and effect, or so long as any tonds issued in connection with any Project or any monies due to the PHA in connection with any Project remain unpaid, this Agreement shall not be aprogated, changed, or modified without the consent of the PHA. The privileges and obligations of the Municipality hereunder shall remain in full force and effect with respect to each Project so long as the beneficial title to such Project is held by the Local Authority or by any other public body or governmental agency, including the PHA, authorized by law to engage in the development or administration of low-rent housing projects. If at any time the beneficial title to, or possession of, any Project is held by such other public body or governmental agency, including the PHA, the provisions hereof shall inure to the benefit of and may be enforced by, such other public body or governmental agency including the PHA.

### COMMUNITY WILDFIRE PROTECTION PLAN – NATIONAL FIRE PLAN REIMBURSEMENT GRANT PROGRAM

#### **General Guidelines**

1. Eligible applicants are communities (cities, towns) and fire departments. County governments are not eligible

 Minimum requirements of a Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP): (Reference "Preparing a Community Wildfire Protection Plan, A Handbook for Wildland-Urban Interface Communities" available on the Internet at <a href="http://www.safnet.org/policyandpress/cwpphandbook.pdf">http://www.safnet.org/policyandpress/cwpphandbook.pdf</a> for a detailed description of minimum requirements.)

Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry/ Forestry Division shall supply CWPP template.

#### A. Convene Decisionmakers

- i. Form a core team made up of representatives from the appropriate local governments, local fire authority, and Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry/Forestry Division
- B. Involve Federal Agencies
  - i. Identify and engage local representatives of the USFS and BIA
  - ii. Contact and involve other land management agencies as appropriate
- C. Engage Interested Parties
  - i. Contact and encourage active involvement in plan development from a broad range of interested organizations and stakeholders.
- D. Establish a Community Base Map
  - i. Work with partners to establish a baseline map of the community that defines the community's WUI and displays inhabited areas at risk, forested area that contain critical human infrastructure and forested areas at risk for large-scale fire disturbance.
- E. Develop a Community Risk Assessment
  - Work with partners to develop a community risk assessment that considers fuel hazards; risk of wildfire occurrence; homes, businesses, and essential infrastructure at risk; other community values at risk; and local preparedness capability.
  - ii. Rate the level of risk for each factor and incorporate into the base map as appropriate.

- F. Establish Community Priorities and Recommendations
  - Use the base map and community risk assessment to facilitate a collaborative community discussion that leads to the identification of local priorities for fuel treatment, reducing structure ignitability, and other issues of interest, such as improving fire response capability.
  - ii. Clearly indicate whether priority projects are directly related to protection fo communities and essential infrastructure or to reducing wildfire risk to other community values.
- G. Develop an Action Plan and Assessment Strategy
  - Consider developing a detailed implementation strategy to accompany the CWPP, as well as a monitoring plan that will ensure long-term success.
- H. Finalize Community Wildfire Protection Plan
  - Finalize the CWPP and communicate the results to the community and key partners.
- I. Finalize Firewise Communities Application
  - Finalize the Firewise Communities Application and submit to Coordinator
- Major Categories of expenditures in the development of a Community Wildfire Protection Plan:
  - A. Contracting Services
  - B. Personnel Time
  - C. GIS Software and Hardware
- 4. Funding limits per application are:

\$3,000 for communities with a population of 1,000 or less,

\$4,000 for communities with a population of 1,001 to 2,000,

\$5,000 for communities with a population of 2,001 to 3,000,

\$6,000 for communities with a population of 3,001 to 4,000,

\$7,000 for communities with a population of 4,001 to 5.000.

\$8,000 for communities with a population greater than 5,001,

Expenses <u>prior</u> to the State Purchase Order date <u>will not</u> be eligible for this grant.
- D. Recipients must certify eligibility to receive federal funds and must comply with applicable federal regulations.

## General Certifications Required of All Recipients of Federal Funds

Legal Authority to Enter into the Agreement. The recipient organization possesses legal authority to enter into the agreement; that a resolution, motion or similar action has been duly adopted or passed as an official act of its governing body, authorizing the acceptance of the agreement including all understandings and assurances contained therein and directing and authorizing the person identified as the official representative of the recipient organization to act in connection with the agreement and to provide such additional information as may be required.

<u>Civil Rights Act.</u> The recipient organization shall comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 42 U.S.C. 2000d, and in accordance with Title VI of that Act, no person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity for which the recipient receives Federal financial assistance and will immediately tank any measures necessary to effectuate this agreement.

<u>Sex Discrimination</u>. The recipient organization shall comply with Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, 20 U.S.C. 1681, and following which prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex in Federally assisted education programs.

Handicap Discrimination. The recipient organization shall comply with section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended 29 U.S.C. 794. The recipient or other party and the Grantor agree to direct their program activities covered by this agreement toward managing and enhancing the environment for the widest range of beneficial uses without its degradation or risk to health or safety or other undesirable consequences. The recipient or other party further agrees to assist the Grantor in the preparation of environmental statements as required by section 012(2)(c) of Public Law 91-190 for all major Federal actions taken under this agreement which might significantly affect the quality of the human environment or be highly controversial in regard to unresolved conflicts concerning the use of resources.

<u>Clean Air Act.</u> The recipient organization shall comply with the Clean Air Act of 1970, 42 U.S.C. 7401 and following which requires Federally assisted activities to be in conformance with the State (Clean Air) Implementation Plan.

National Historic Preservation Act. The recipient organization shall assist the Grantor in its compliance with section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, 16 U.S.C. 470, Executive Order 11593, and the Archeologist and Historic Preservation Act of 1974, 16 U.S.C. 469a-1, et. seq., by (i) consulting with the State Historic Preservation Officer on the conduct of investigations, as necessary, to identify properties listed in or eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places that are subject to adverse effects (see 36 CFR, Part 800.8) by the activity, and notifying the Grantor of the existence of any such properties, and by (ii) complying with all requirements established by the awarding agency to avoid or mitigate adverse effects upon such properties.

#### ORDINANCE NO. \_\_\_\_

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2425 WHICH ESTABLISHED THE BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2012-2013; REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City Council heretofore adopted Ordinance No. 2425 setting forth the Budget for Fiscal Year 2012-2013 beginning July 1, 2012 and ending June 30, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the City Departments and Divisions routinely review their budget appropriations to determine if any changes are necessary; and

WHEREAS, based upon said review the City staff now recommends that certain amendments to the Budget be considered by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has the authority to make amendments to the City Budget under Article 5, Section 5.07 (b) of the new City Charter as well as State law; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the proposed amendment to the FY 2012-2013 Budget, with the revenues and expenditures therein contained, is in the best interest of the City; and therefore, desires to adopt the same by formal action.

# BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1: The proposed amendment to the FY 2012-2013 Budget of the City of McAlester, Oklahoma, as heretofore adopted by Ordinance, as summarized in Exhibit A-1 through A-3, which is attached hereto and fully incorporated herein by reference, be, and the same hereby are, completely adopted and approved as an amendment to the said FY 2012-2013 Budget.

SECTION 2: All portions of the existing FY 2012-2013 Budget, Ordinance No. 2425 except as specifically herein amended, shall remain in full force and effect, and not be otherwise affected by the adoption of the amendatory ordinance.

SECTION 3: That all other ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of any such conflict or inconsistency and all other ordinances not in conflict herewith shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4: Should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause, phrase, or section of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the

same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision thereof, other than the part or parts as declared to be invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional.

SECTION 5: That an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and for the provision of the public peace, health and safety, by reason whereof it is necessary that all acts take effect immediately and be in full force and effect from, and after the passage and approval.

#### RESOLUTION NO. \_\_\_

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE CITY OF MCALESTER POLICY FOR BILLING ADJUSTMENT IN THE EVENT OF CUSTOMER WATER LEAKS OR BREAKS.

WHEREAS, the McAlester City Council finds that it is appropriate, for purposes of equity and continuity, to adopt a formal policy to establish a criteria and method for adjusting water/sewer billing of its customers in the event of certain unforeseen circumstances, and,

WHEREAS, the McAlester City Council is empowered to designate an officer to administer this policy, and,

WHEREAS, the McAlester City Council has determined that adoption of the following is in the best interest of the public and its water and sewer customers, and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MCALESTER, OKLAHOMA:

Section 1. That appropriate adjustments to the Utility billing of customers of the City of McAlester/McAlester Public Works Authority is authorized under the following conditions:

- a) Adjustments will be made <u>only</u> for leaks or breaks in lines underground or under structures;
- b) Adjustments will be made only after the customer has provided written proof that the leak has been repaired (a repair bill from a plumber or invoice or receipt for materials);
- c) Any adjustment must include charges for water and/or sewer;
- d) No customer may receive more than two (2) adjustments in any twelve (12) month period;
- e) Past adjustments will be omitted from calculations of the six (6) month average required herein.

Section 2. When all of the criteria listed above have been satisfied, the City Manager, in his sole discretion, may approve an adjustment of the customer's highest water/sewer bill, under the following method:

- a) An average of the past six (6) months billing will be calculated;
- b) The monthly average will be subtracted from the customer's highest bill;
- c) The remainder will be divided by two (2);
- d) The divided sum will be subtracted from the highest bill;
- e) The customer will pay the highest bill minus the divided sum.

# CITY OF MCALESTER BILL ADJUSTMENT POLICY CUSTOMER'S WATER LEAK

#### FOR LEAKS OR BREAKS IN LINES UNDERGROUND OR UNDER HOUSE ONLY:

**Proof of repair for leak must be provided** by Customer before any adjustment will be made. (Repair bill from plumber or receipt for materials invoice).

#### Only two adjustments will be made in any 12 month period.

When an average for six months is used any other past adjustment will not factor into the average.

Average past 6 months Subtract from highest bill Divide by 2 Subtract from total bill

#### Example:

High Bill \$4341.54

\$693.17=6 month average bills

\$4341.54

-693.17

\$3648.37 divide by 2 =\$1824.19 City Will Take

\$4341.54

\$2517.35=Customer Will Pay

\$1824.19

-2517.35

\$4341.54= Highest Bill

#### **Account Adjustments**

An account adjustment for high water usage caused by a plumbing leak may be available under certain conditions. A leak adjustment may be made on an account if the customer provides the Utility Office with proof that a leak in water piping existed underground and the leak has been repaired. A signed statement from a licensed plumber or the property owner along with a vendor receipt for supplies is acceptable as proof that the leak has been repaired.

The high water usage caused by leaks usually carries over to more than one billing, because of the timing of the meter reading/billing cycle. Customers should notify the Utility Office immediately when a bill for extremely high water usage is received. In calculating leak adjustments, only six (6) months of bills will be considered for adjustment. Leak adjustments are limited to two per calendar year per account. When an average for six months is used, any other past adjustments will not factor into the average.

If acceptable proof of repair of the leak has been submitted, the average bill is calculated from the account billings at that address for six (6) months immediately prior to the increase in usage caused by the leak. After the average billing for the account is determined, the amount of monthly billing that is over and above the average amount for the account is divided in half to determine the amount of credit payments. The City of McAlester and customer will split the excess usage. Any penalties associated with the high-usage billings due to the leak are also eligible for credit adjustment. A credit adjustment is applied to the account, resulting in one-half of the higher than average billings being removed from the balance due. The customer is responsible for payment of any unadjusted billing amounts.

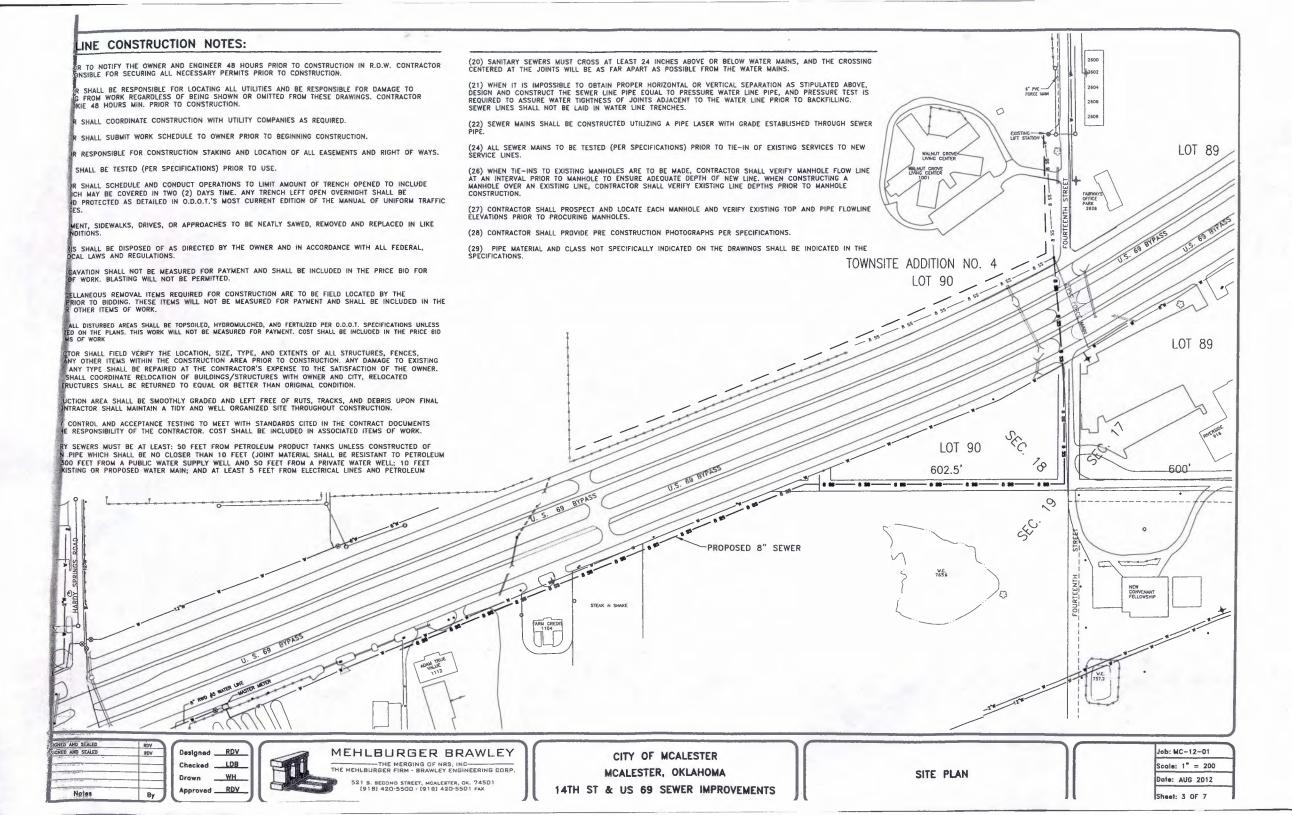

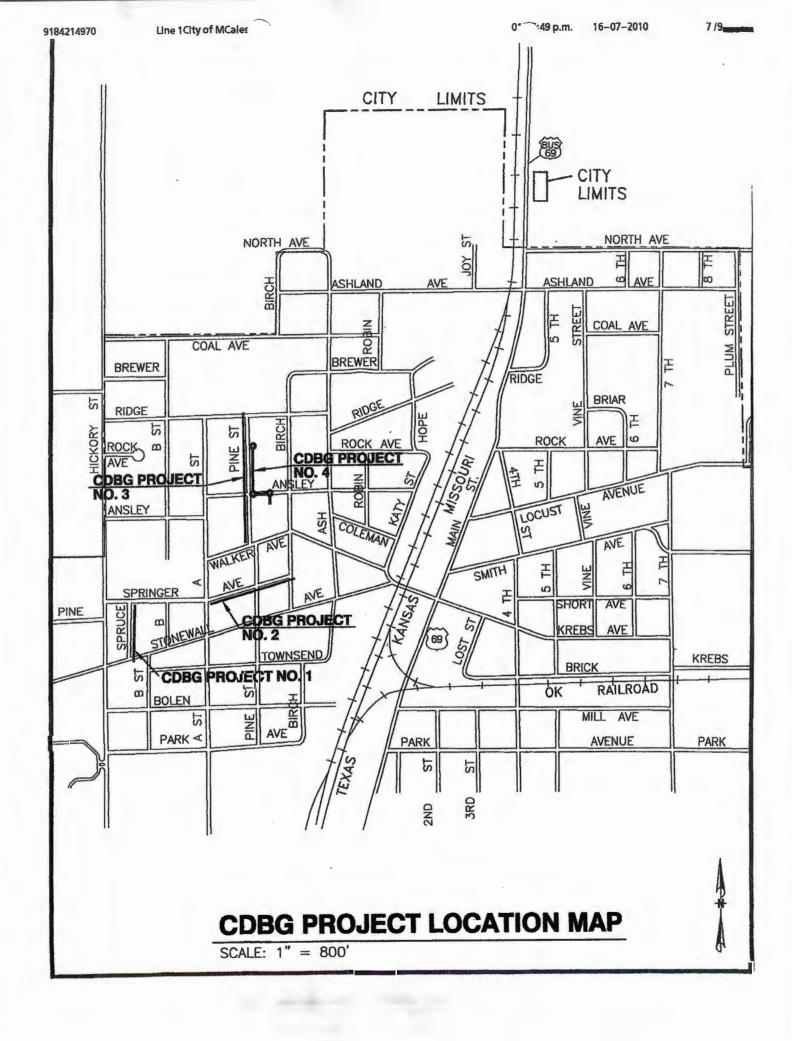

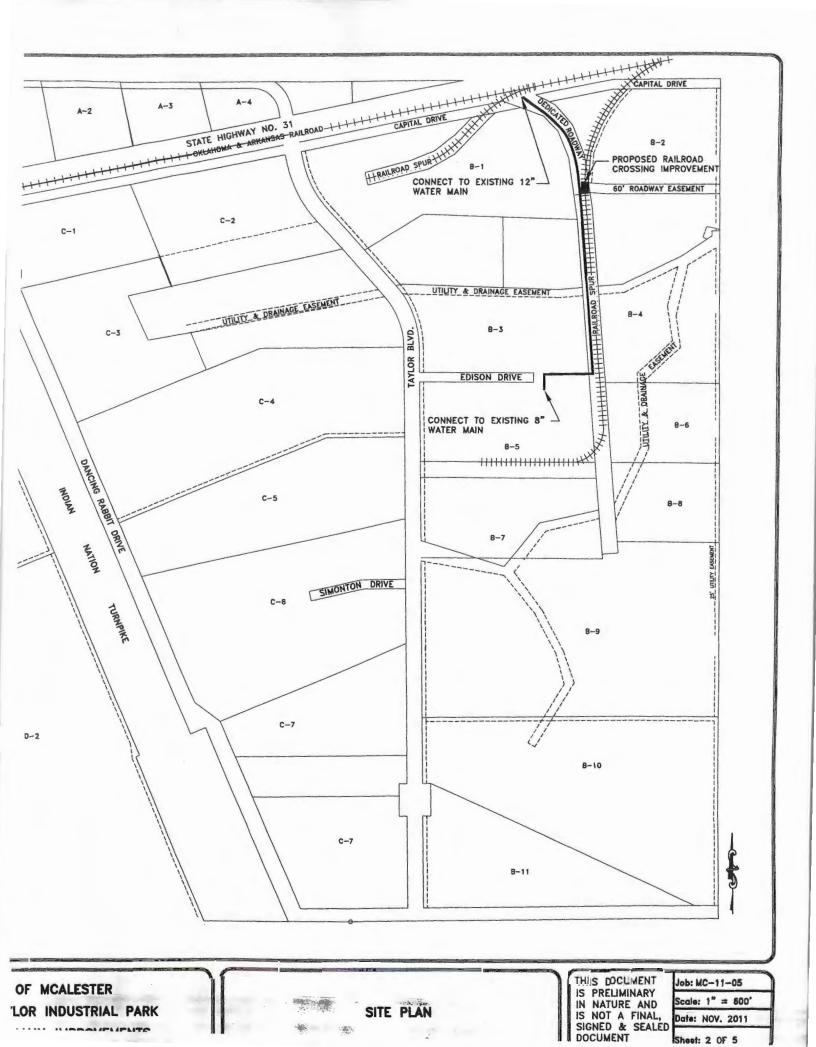

#### Recommendation

Motion to approve and authorizing the Mayor to sign ODEQ Consent Order, Case No. 07-233, Addendum A for the McAlester Water Treatment Plant Disinfection By-products.

#### Discussion

The McAlester Water Treatment Plant has been experiencing violations of the Disinfection By-Product Rule for several years. On September 7, 2007, the McAlester Public Works Authority agreed to Consent Order, Case No. 07-233 in order to address this issue. Numerous improvements have been constructed to help reach compliance but as of date compliance has not been achieved. All rapid sand filters have been rehabilitated, all clarifiers have been rehabilitated, all water storage tanks were rehabilitated and mixers installed. ODEQ has no requirement or standards for mixers in water storage tanks although it is widely recognized in the water industry as beneficiary in keeping the water from stratifying and having old aged water with higher levels of Disinfection By-Products. They feel that the mixers should have had a construction permit since it is new and not considered by them as a maintenance item.

In discussions with our Engineers, Mehlburger Brawley, they feel that since the City's water has much of the Disinfection By-Products formed by chloroform that installation of aerators at the water storage tanks would assist greatly in obtaining compliance. ODEQ has issued this Addendum requiring an Engineering Report by July 1, 2013 if actions to achieve compliance are not obtained. Once the Engineering Report determines the corrective actions and is approved by ODEQ, the City will be required to implement the improvements on an agreed upon schedule.

#### ADDENDUM A

On September 7, 2007, the Department of Environmental Quality ("DEQ") and McAlester Public Works Authority ("Respondent") agreed to Consent Order, Case No. 07-223, in order to address Respondent's violations of the maximum contaminant level ("MCL") for disinfection byproducts ("DBP") and for not meeting total organic carbon ("TOC") treatment technique requirements. Task D of the Order required Respondent to submit an approvable engineering report by January 1, 2010, if compliance had not been achieved. The engineering report was to include a schedule of dates for all proposed construction.

At the end of the first quarter of 2010, Respondent had returned to compliance with the DBP and TOC treatment technique requirements. However, DBP samples for the second quarter of 2010 resulted in Respondent no longer being in compliance with DBP and TOC treatment technique requirements.

On April 7, 2011, DEQ and Respondent met at Respondent's water treatment plant. The project of rehabilitating the water storage tanks was discussed. During the meeting, DEQ personnel advised Respondent that the addition of internal mixing equipment within the water storage tanks required a construction permit.

On September 13, 2011, DEQ received a letter from Respondent which advised DEQ that rehabilitation of the water storage tanks had been completed. The internal mixing equipment had been installed without a permit.

At the end of the first quarter of 2012, Respondent had attained compliance with HAA5 rule requirements, but remained out of compliance with the MCL for total trihalomethanes and the TOC treatment technique requirements.

This Addendum is necessary to allow additional time to for Respondent to submit as-built plans for the internal mixing equipment and to try to attain compliance with TOC and DBP requirements. DEQ is assessing a penalty for construction of the internal mixing equipment without a permit.

Pursuant to Paragraph 29 of the Consent Order, both parties agree to amend Paragraphs 18, 19, and 33 of the Consent Order and add Paragraphs 9a, 9b, 15J, 15K, and 18a as follows:

<sup>9</sup>a. On April 7, 2011, DEQ personnel advised Respondent that installation of internal mixing equipment would require a construction permit issued by DEQ.

<sup>9</sup>b. On or about September 13, 2011, Respondent installed internal mixing equipment without a construction permit.

- 15. The facts stated above constitute a violation of the following public water supply rules:
  - Director."

    By failing to obtain a public water supply construction permit from DEQ prior to beginning construction of a public water supply, Respondent is in violation of 27A O.S. § 2-6-304(A)(1), which states, "No person shall supply water, or do any construction work of any nature for supplying water, to the public from or by a public water supply system by means of any waterworks without a written permit issued by the Executive Director."
  - K) By failing to obtain a public water supply construction permit from DEQ prior to beginning construction of a public water supply, Respondent is in violation of OAC 252:626-3-1(a), which states, "This subchapter implements the Uniform Permitting Act, Title 27A § 2-14-101 et. seq. and rules promulgated thereunder. A permit is required for construction or modification of a Public Water Supply (PWS) system or an extension of the distribution system, except: (1) when the municipal permitting alternative is utilized under OAC 252:626-3-4; (2) a construction permit exemption is issued by DEQ under OAC 252:626-3-5; or (3) minor water systems constructed according to OAC 252:624 and approved by the Environmental Complaints and Local Services (ECLS) office of DEQ are exempt from the permitting process, contained in this chapter."

18. Based on the above paragraphs, Respondent and DEQ agree, and it is ordered by the Executive Director, Respondent will complete the following tasks by the dates specified below:

## **TASK DUE DATE** Respondent will continue to monitor for Ongoing disinfection byproducts and/or TOC as required. Respondent will continue to provide public B. Ongoing notification concerning disinfection byproduct and/or TOC violations as required. Respondent will submit to DEO, and Completed implement, an approvable operational corrective action plan with a schedule designed to achieve compliance with the disinfection by-product and TOC treatment technique requirements. C1. Respondent will submit to DEO approvable December 1, 2012 as-built plans and specifications, along with an application for a construction permit for the addition of the water storage tank(s) internal mixing equipment. If compliance with disinfection byproduct July 1, 2013 requirements is not achieved by the date listed in this task, Respondent will provide by this date an approvable engineering report addressing the correction applicable disinfection byproduct violations, including a schedule of dates if construction is required.

18a. The Oklahoma Environmental Quality Code, 27A O.S. §§ 2-3-502(B) and (K), authorizes DEQ to seek penalties of up to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) per day for each violation of the Code and the associated rules. Based on the facts and circumstances of this case, DEQ assesses a total penalty of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00). Respondent agrees to pay a

# City Manager Report to the Council

## October 9, 2012

#### **Business**

- I attended a Town Hall meeting with MDSA President Gene Walker in regards to the Defense Ammunition Center (DAC) at the McAlester Army Ammunition Depot. The DAC employees were introduced to Colonel Edward M. Daly, Commandant U.S. Army Ordinance School. The employees were also addressed by Bill Moore, Deputy to the Commanding General for US Army Combined Arms Support Command (CASCOM). DAC employees will be moving under the direction of CASCOM effective October 1, 2012. The DAC employees will see a seamless transition to CASCOM and they are anticipating no personnel changes for the future.
- The Engineering Department has been working with local builder Dave Grantham on the Royal Oaks Subdivision. This subdivision will be located on Hardy Springs Rd. in close proximity to Highway 69. The subdivision will be platted for 39 single family homes with pricing in the \$200K and up range. The Preliminary Plat has been received by Engineering and the review committee will meet with the Builder and his Engineer next week. This is the first phase in the submittal process in moving the subdivision forward.
- IMS Infrastructure Management Services will be in McAlester the week of October 21, 2012 field testing our designated roadways. Weather permitting, IMS should have their work completed in one week. They are estimating having the full report to the City in mid December.
- The Utilities Department is currently replacing an old water line behind Tandy Town. The City has experienced 3 water line breaks in 3 days behind the shopping center. There have been a total of 6 breaks in the last month. City crews are laying 1300 feet of 6 inch water line adjacent to the existing water line. These water line breaks have put an undue hardship on the business owners in Tandy Town and to eliminate any future outages, the crews will be making the taps to the new line during the night. The project is anticipated to be completed the week of October 8, 2012.

Pam Kirby and I participated in a conference call with City Manager Association of Oklahoma (CMAO) President, Larry Stevens and CMAO Executive Director Claudia Deakins. This conference call was a discussion with Midwest Public Risk of Arkansas to look at pooling health care premiums in Oklahoma. Ms. Kirby and Ms. Deakins have surveyed the municipalities in the State for their interest in pooling health care costs. A total of 58 communities responded that they would be interested in some form of pooling and these communities represent 2800 municipal employees. Midwest Public Risk will be coming to Oklahoma in the future with their Board Presidents to present the model for pooling health care in Oklahoma. The City of Edmond will be hosting the presentation with all communities in the State invited to participate. This pooling has a definite possibility for our 2013-2014 budget year.

These were classes that had been attended more than once and are therefore refreshers. The CBA effective July 1, 2006, changed language to allow up to five refreshers to count toward training sticker incentive pay. The City failed to calculate a number of fire fighters pay properly that reflected this change, including, but not limited, to Rick Beams and Robert Patton. On August 5<sup>th</sup>. Rick Beams received a letter with his payroll stating that the City included one full year of retroactive pay to correct their mistake. The change in pay form submitted July 16<sup>th</sup>. reflected that the mistake went back to July 1, 2006. On August 10, 2012 Robert Patton was advised that he would not receive retro pay at all but would have all future pay corrected.

#### Miscellaneous:

- The Honda Goldwing Rally will be held at the EXPO Center on October 4-6, 2012. The City is expecting 300 400 riders for the event. This is the second year in a row for the Goldwing Association to hold their event in McAlester.
- North Town Wild West Festival is scheduled for October 13, 2012.
- The City Council meeting video is now available on the City of McAlester web site. Because of the size of the files, we will only have two months of videos available at any given time.
- The City Landfill is open and accepting tree limbs and yard debris generated from the recent storm. The Landfill is open Monday through Saturday from 8:00am. to 3:00pm and will close on October 13, 2012.

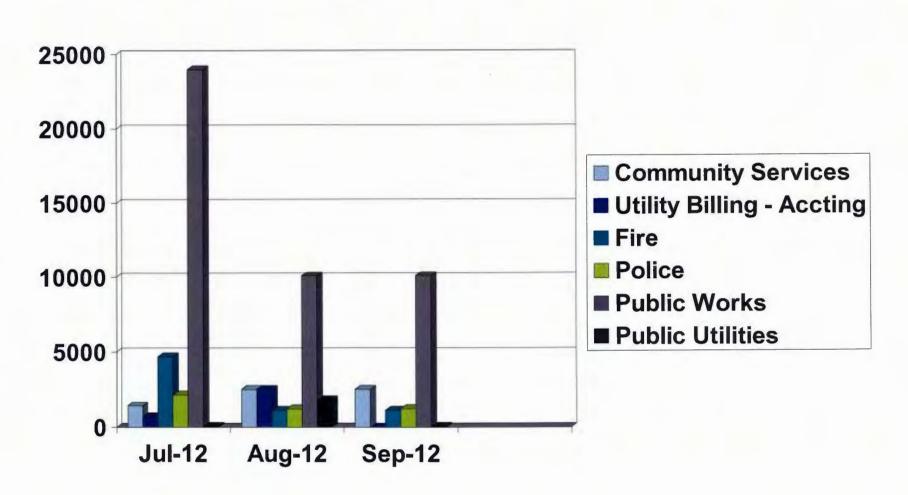
