Dr. Kelly Hurtz addressed the Council regarding a Grant opportunity for the City of McAlester. He stated that he wanted the City to be aware of a program that helped to educate citizens about ways to protect their homes from wildfires. He added that this was a 100% grant and would not cost the City any thing. He informed the Council that if they chose to participate in this program and completed the initial steps with the first grant then there was an 80-20 Wildfire Mitigation match grant.

6. Consider, and act upon, a Resolution establishing the City of McAlester's Policy and formula for discretionary bill adjustment for a customer water leak. (*Toni Ervin, Chief Financial Officer*)

Executive Summary

Staff recommends approval of a Resolution to establish a formal water leak adjustment policy.

A motion was made by Councilman Karr and seconded by Councilman Smith to approve a resolution establishing a formal water leak adjustment policy.

Before the vote, Ms. Ervin explained that this was to formally establish a policy that would fairly address below ground water line breaks. She then explained the formula that was being recommended for use in calculation of any adjustments.

City Attorney Ervin commented that in the past some of these matters had been brought before the Council and they had directed that the City staff address the matters with the City Manager having the final say on how each would be handled. The previous City Manager, Mark Roath had implemented this system but it had never been formally adopted by the Council.

There was discussion, among the Council regarding the number of adjustments a customer could have during a twelve month period, some of the claims could be decided at the City Manager's discretion, the average number of adjustments that came to the Utility Billing Office, the extensive research that was done before any adjustments were given, limiting this to only residential and commercial customers within the city limits of the City of McAlester, clarifying the high volume users within the city limits, and adding additional criteria to the qualifications.

Vice-Mayor Mason moved to table this item until the next meeting so the recommended changes could be made to the Resolution. The motion was seconded by Councilman Smith. There was no further discussion, and the vote was taken as follows:

7. Consider and act upon Final Plat for "Hickory Ridge III". (Peter J. Stasiak, City Manager) Executive Summary

A motion was made by Councilman Smith and seconded by Vice-Mayor Mason approving the Final Plat for the proposed subdivision "Hickory Ridge III" and authorizing the Mayor to sign the documents.

Before the vote, Manager Stasiak addressed the Council explaining that this had been addressed by the Planning Commission at their meeting on September 18, 2012 and they had unanimously voted to recommend approval of the Final Plat.

Mr. Ryan Hackett addressed the Council thanking them and the City staff for their work and aid in moving this development through the process. He explained that this was the third phase of development and would three (3) and possibly four (4) bedroom single family dwellings. He added that if a tenant were to rent a unit for fifteen (15) years they would have the ability to purchase the dwelling with some of the rent going toward the purchase.

There was discussion among the Council regarding how the rent would be established, if the drainage had been addressed, if a storm water study had been performed, the number of units that this development would have and if the dwellings in Phase I and II were occupied.

Before the vote, Manager Stasiak explained that the Fire Department were working with the Highway Patrol and these vests would add to the safety of the firefighters not only when they were on the highways but also help with visibility when responding to any calls at night. He added that the costs of the vests were approximately \$50.00 each and would be funded from the City's portion of the County quarter cent excise tax. Vice-Mayor Mason moved to award the bid to C.S. Day & Associates of Tahlequah, Oklahoma for the 2010 CDBG Water Improvements (REBID) and authorize the Mayor to enter a construction contract, after review and approval by the City Attorney's Office, in the amount of \$141,340.00. The motion was seconded by Councilman Karr.

Before the vote, David Medley addressed the Council explaining that this project was funded by the Department of Commerce in the amount of \$\$73,874.00 through the CDBG program. He stated that this project would construct approximately 735 feet of 6" diameter water main on Springer from "A" Street to Birch Street and approximately 1,170 feet of 6" diameter water main on Pine Street from Walker Avenue to Ridge Avenue. He added that the increase in pay to pipeline workers and backhoe operators had been the reason for the increase in the bids.

Motion to award the bid received on September 27, 2012 by R & M Utilities, Inc. of Prague, Oklahoma for the Steven Taylor Industrial Park 8" Water Main Improvements and authorizing the Mayor to enter a construction contract, after review and approval by the City Attorney's Office, in the amount of \$150,130.00.

Vice-Mayor Mason moved to award the bid received on September 27, 2012 by R & M Utilities, Inc. of Prague, Oklahoma for the Steven Taylor Industrial Park 8" Water Main Improvements and authorizing the Mayor to enter a construction contract, after review and approval by the City Attorney's Office, in the amount of \$150,130.00. The motion was seconded by Councilman Karr.

Before the vote, David Medley addressed the Council explaining that this project would be funded by the Department of Commerce in the amount of \$140,000.00 through the CDBG-EDIF program and would construct approximately 2,210 feet of 8" diameter water main along the City

of McAlester's railroad spur at Taylor Industrial Park to serve Lot B-2 and also provide an additional water supply route to Berry Plastics.

Vice-Mayor Mason stepped out of the meeting momentarily.

Executive Summary

Motion to award the bid received on September 11, 2012 by C.S. Day & Associates of Tahlequah, Oklahoma for the 14th Street / U.S. 69 Sewer Extension and authorizing the Mayor to enter a construction contract, after review and approval by the City Attorney's Office, in the amount of \$410,488.00.

Councilman Smith moved to award the bid received on September 11, 2012 by C.S. Day & Associates of Tahlequah, Oklahoma for the 14th Street / U.S. 69 Sewer Extension and authorizing the Mayor to enter a construction contract, after review and approval by the City Attorney's Office, in the amount of \$410,488.00. The motion was seconded by Councilman Titsworth.

Before the vote, David Medley addressed the Council explaining that this project would construct approximately 694 feet of 8" diameter sewer main along Highway 69 from 14th Street to the Cinema 69 Theatre providing sewer service to new and existing businesses. He added that C.S. Day & Associates had agreed to a change order reduction in the amount of \$88,256.00 once the project was awarded and the remaining 694 feet of sewer main would be constructed by the City of McAlester Utility Maintenance personnel with the new business agreeing to construct the sewer in front of their property.

There was lengthy discussion among the Council including Mr. Medley, Manager Stasiak, City Attorney Ervin and Robert Vaughan, Project Manager regarding the legality of awarding the bid with an email negotiation, the time restraints of the project, the value of the work to be done by the City employees, following the rules set forth in Title 61 of the Oklahoma State Statutes, readdressing the previous budget amendment by raising the amount to compensate for the higher amount and tabling this item and addressing it at a Special Meeting the next week.

Attorney Ervin informed the Council that the Mayor could recess this item until further information could be gathered and addressing the following items.

Mayor Harrison stated that this item would be recessed until budget information could be gotten from the CFO to revise the amendment to cover the entire amount of the project.

12. Consider, and act upon, Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality (ODEQ) Consent Order, Case No.07-233, Addendum A for permit violations at the McAlester Water Treatment Plant for Disinfection By-products. (David Medley, PE, Utility Director)

Executive Summary

Motion to approve and authorizing the Mayor to sign ODEQ Consent Order, Case No. 07-233, Addendum A for the McAlester Water Treatment Plant Disinfection By-Products.

A motion was made by Councilman Smith and seconded by Councilman Garvin to approve and authorize the Mayor to sign ODEQ Consent Order, Case No. 07-233, Addendum A for the McAlester Water Treatment Plant Disinfection By-Products.

Before the vote, David Medley addressed the Council explaining that the McAlester Water Treatment Plant had been experiencing violations of the Disinfection By-Product Rule for several years and on September 7, 2007, the McAlester Public Works Authority agreed to Consent Order, Case No. 07-233 in order to address this issue. He stated that numerous improvements had been made to help reach compliance including the rehabilitation of all of the City's water storage tanks. Part of that rehabilitation had included the installation of mixers in each of the tanks to help keep water in the tanks circulating. ODEQ had no requirements or standards regarding the mixers and they felt that the mixers should have had a construction permit since they were new and not considered as a maintenance item. He added that during discussion with the consulting Engineers, it was decided that the installation of aerators at the water storage tanks would greatly help in obtaining compliance. Mr. Medley stated that ODEQ had issued this Addendum requiring an Engineering Report by July 1, 2013 if actions to achieve compliance were not obtained.

After a brief discussion among the Council, the vote was taken as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

Sec. 62-1. Comprehensive plan adopted: purpose.

- (a) The Comprehensive Plan for the City of McAlester, Oklahoma, dated June 1978 as attached originally and on file in the city clerk's office and made a part of this chapter is hereby adopted.
- (b) The comprehensive plan is hereby stated to be adopted for the purpose of providing orderly development of the community. (Ord. No. 1871, § 1(21.1), 8-27-91)

Sec. 62-2. Filling and excavating of land.

- (a) Permit required. It shall be unlawful for any individual or organization to fill in land within the city unless a permit is issued by the city. An application for permit shall be filed with the city and shall specify the type of material, location, depth, compaction and cover material to be used in the fill.
- (b) Permissible fill material. Fill material shall consist of natural soil, earth, clay, gravel, loam, stones, bricks, brickbats, plaster, Portland cement, glass, cinders, metal chips and other noncombustible waste material as specified in section 106-301.
- (c) Exceptions. Exceptions to the above requirements of this section shall be:
 - (1) A fill less than one foot in depth, and placed on natural terrain, with a slope flatter than five horizontal to one vertical, or less than three feet in depth not intended to support structures, which does not exceed 50 cubic yards on any one lot and does not obstruct a drainage course.
 - (2) An excavation which is less than two feet in depth, or which does not create a cut of greater than five feet in height and steeper than 1½ to one vertical.

ARTICLE II. PLANNING COMMISSION*

Sec. 62-26. Created; purpose.

In order to direct the future development of the city and to encourage social and economic improvements in accordance with modern city planning principles, and to ensure the orderly, efficient and economic arrangement and development of future public works projects, there is hereby created a planning commission for the city.

(Ord. No. 1871, § 1(21.6), 8-27-91)

State law reference—Authority to create planning commission, 11 O.S. § 45-101.

Sec. 62-27. Composition; appointment, terms of members.

- (a) The planning commission shall consist of 11 members who shall be nominated by the mayor and confirmed by the city council for a term of three years; provided in 2008 three members nominated and confirmed shall serve for a period of three years; in 2009 four members nominated and confirmed shall serve for a period of three years; in 2010 four members nominated and confirmed shall serve for a period of three years; and upon the expiration of their terms, respectively, successor members shall be nominated by the mayor and confirmed by the city council for terms of three years each. Appointments to fill vacancies shall be made by the mayor and confirmed by the council for the unexpired term only.
- (b) In addition to the appointed members, the mayor and city engineer shall be ex-officio members of the planning commission.
- (c) During the term of membership, any member who is absent for more than 50 percent of the meetings within a one-year period or three consecutive meetings, without good cause determined by the planning commission, shall automatically cease to be a member and a replacement shall be appointed by the mayor upon confirmation by the city council.

Sec. 62-28. Qualifications of members.

The appointed members of the planning commission shall be residents of the city who are qualified by knowledge or experience to act upon matters pertaining to the physical, social and economic development of the city.

Sec. 62-30. Election of officers; adoption of rules.

The planning commission shall elect from among its appointed members its own chairman, vice-chairman, secretary and treasurer, and may from time to time adopt such rules and regulations, not inconsistent with the laws of the state or with the charter or ordinances of the city, for its own organization and procedure as it may deem proper. (Ord. No. 1871, § 1(21.10), 8-27-91)

Sec. 62-31. General duties.

- (a) The duties of the planning commission shall be to prepare a comprehensive plan showing its ideas and recommendations for the physical development of the city; to provide programs, drawings, maps or plans covering the whole or any portion of the city and of any lands outside of the city, which, in the opinion of the commission, bears relation to the development or welfare of the city. Such plan shall show the commission's ideas and recommendation relative to:
 - The location, width and arrangement of streets, alleys, bridges, grade separations, parking, parkways, playgrounds, schools, public institutions or other public grounds or improvements.

- (2) The grouping of public buildings.
- (3) The design and planning of any memorials or works of art.
- (4) Transportation facilities, such as railroads railway or motor.
- (5) Street appurtenances, including lighting standards, street name signs, poles and wires, projecting signs, and the like; zoning plan and ordinance for the classification and regulation of land uses and open spaces about buildings; and other matters pertaining to the physical, social and economic improvement of the city, or any portion thereof.
- (b) The commission shall submit such plan to the mayor and city council.

(Ord. No. 1871, § 1(21.11), 8-27-91)

Sec. 62-32. Recommendations as to subdivisions and closing of streets.

All plans and plats for the subdivision of land into streets or building lots, and all proposals for the closing of streets and alleys within the limits of the city or any additions thereto, shall be submitted to the planning commission for its recommendations before final acceptance or approval by the city. Such recommendations by the commission shall be made within 30 days of such submission and failure to do so shall constitute a waiver of its privilege to pass upon such plan, plat or closing.

Sec. 62-33. Duty with respect to public works program.

It shall be the duty of the planning commission to prepare and submit an annual public works program to the mayor and city council, on or before June 30 of each year. It shall be the duty of each city department or agency to furnish the commission, upon request, any data, plans, estimates or programs and to collaborate with the commis-

sion in the preparation of such public works program.

Sec. 62-34. Preparation and recommendation of proposed legislation.

It shall be the duty of the planning commission to prepare and recommend such municipal legislation as may be necessary to carry out the recommendations or suggestions of the commission.

Sec. 62-35. Employment of planners, engineers, etc.

The planning commission may employ such planners, engineers, architects, clerks and other persons as may be necessary in the performance of its duties, subject to the approval of the city council. The salaries and compensation of such persons shall be fixed by the city council and appropriations be made therefor, if deemed necessary by the city council.

ARTICLE III. CLOSING OF PUBLIC WAYS AND EASEMENTS*

Sec. 62-56. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Close means an ordinance of the city council enacted in accordance with the requirements hereafter set forth, discontinuing the public use of a public way or easement without affecting title to real property.

Easement means rights in real property as defined in 60 O.S. § 49 as presently existing or as may be hereafter amended.

Public way means a street, avenue, boulevard, alley, lane or thoroughfare open or platted for public use.

(Ord. No. 1871, § 1(21.21), 8-27-91)

Sec. 62-57. Petition generally.

- (a) A petition for the closing of any public way or easement within the city shall be filed with the planning commission by any owner of property abutting the way petitioned to be closed, or his duly authorized representative, on a standard form furnished by the planning commission. All petitions for closing of a public way or easement shall be accompanied by a sketch, plan or copy of a map of the area surrounding the street, way or easement to be closed, drawn to approximate scale, showing the land of all abutting property owners, their names and mailing addresses.
- (b) The applicant shall be also required to secure from a bonded abstractor, a plat of the area involved, the names and addresses of the owners of record, all within 300 feet of the proposed change. Upon receipt by the building official of

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City of McAlester Code of Conduct

1 - PURPOSE

The purpose of this Code is to establish guidelines for ethical conduct that govern all City employees, full or part time, Elected Officials, persons serving on City Boards or Commissions, and Volunteers in performing their duties. All the above are covered by this code and must subscribe to this Code, understand its meaning, and follow it.

Ethics inquiries are considered "personnel issues" and are protected from mandatory disclosure by the Oklahoma Open Records Act.

Nothing in this Code creates any right to employment with the City.

2 - DEFINITIONS

Personnel – Any person personnel of the City, full or part time. All Elected officials, persons serving on City boards or commissions, and volunteers are included in this definition.

Code of Conduct Advisor – The person in each department, appointed by the Department Head who is the liaison with the City Clerk's Office regarding conduct issues. Responsibilities include:

- Facilitating the complaint process
- Answering questions regarding ethics and this Code
- Training employees on ethical guidelines

3 - THE CODE

The City of McAlester's Code of Conduct outlines expected behaviors for personnel. The City will conduct its business fairly, impartially, in an ethical manner, and in full compliance with all applicable laws, policies and regulations. Personnel will not engage in conduct that raises questions about the City's honesty, impartiality and reputation.

The following Code of Conduct standards are examples, not meant to cover all possible situations:

A. I am ethical in all activities.

- I put the public's interest above my own.
- I do not allow personal biases to dictate my job behavior.
- I make impartial decisions, free of bribes, unlawful gifts, and personal interests.
- I do not make work decisions based on any personal relationship.
- I admit when I am wrong and try to remedy the situation.
- I use my official title only when conducting City business.
- I avoid exceeding, or appearing to exceed, my authority.
- I do not improperly use or permit the improper use of confidential information.

B. I am financially responsible.

· I manage City resources entrusted to me in a

prudent and responsible manner.

- I do not misuse public funds for personal gain or for unintended purposes.
- I report any improper behavior regarding City resources as specified in this Code.

C. I use public property properly.

- I use City vehicles only for official City business, according to my department's guidelines.
- I do not use a City purchasing card for personal use.
- I do not show favoritism in allowing the use of public property.
- I do not grant the use of public property for political or commercial uses. (Non-profit charitable use must be approved by management at the Department Director or higher level.)
- I do not falsify, or inappropriately destroy, reports or records.

D. I follow appropriate practices regarding gifts.

- I do not use my official position to solicit gifts, donations, discounts or services for personal gain.
- If a gift, donation, discount or service is offered to me, I do not accept it if I believe, or it appears, that the item offered could influence my behavior in favor of the person or organization offering it.
- An occasional non-monetary item of norninal value is not considered a "gift," such as food at

a reception generally open to employees or the public, as long as it does not present any appearance of a conflict of interest. "Nominal value" means \$100 or less on any occasion or in total from one person or organization during a consecutive twelve-month period.

- If I receive a gift (such as food, seasonal decorations, etc.) from vendors or City business partners, I make it available to my work group.
- I do not accept travel, meals, or refreshments from persons doing business with the City, unless the refreshments or meals are furnished as an incidental part of my appearance at a public event in an official capacity, as hospitality extended for a purpose unrelated to the City's official business, or if travel, meals and lodging are provided in connection with teaching, a speaking engagement, participation on a professional or civic panel, or conference attendance in an official capacity.
- If my work group or I give a gift to a vendor in recognition of good service, the value will be less than \$25.

E. I set an example for ethical behavior.

- I inform my department's Ethics Advisor, or the Ethics Board, if I personally witness a violation of this Code.
- I do not pressure others to break this Code or any other rules, regulations or policies.
- I understand that if I have questions or concerns regarding this Code, I will ask my supervisor or my department's Code of Conduct Advisor.

4 - COMPLIANCE WITH THIS CODE

Personnel are responsible for understanding and following this Code, and are expected to perform their work with honesty and integrity in any areas not specifically addressed. A violation of this Code may result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination, upon completion of due process.

5 - DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

The Code of Conduct will be strictly enforced, and City employees found to be in violation will be promptly disciplined, in compliance with the City's Human Resources Policy or the appropriate bargaining unit memorandum of understanding.

6 - REPORTING SUSPECTED NON-COMPLIANCE Who May Report?

Any City employee, elected official, and/or Citizen of McAlester may file a complaint alleging unethical conduct.

Duty to Report

Personnel must promptly report any suspected violations of this Code. If an employee suspects a violation of applicable laws, rules or regulations by any employee, he/she will report it to any department's Code of Conduct Advisor or directly to the Ethics Board.

The City encourages employees to identify themselves when reporting suspected violations because this will better enable the City to investigate. However, the City recognizes that employees may want to remain anonymous. The employee must still include enough information so that an investigation can be conducted. Information must include the names of the individual(s) involved, and the action(s) believed to violate this Code,

along with verifiable documentation.

7 - FALSE REPORTS

The City recognizes that false accusations can have serious effects on innocent individuals. False accusations occur when an individual fabricates an incident. An employee who deliberately makes false accusations will be subject to the same disciplinary actions noted in Section 5... "No-cause" or "questionable-cause" findings do not constitute false accusations.

8 - DECLARING A POSSIBLE CONFLICT OF INTEREST

City personnel are subject to requirements of the State of Oklahoma and the City Code provisions regarding conflict of interest. These cover situations in which personnel and/or personnel's spouse have a "substantial interest" (as defined by the Act) in a "business" (as defined by the Act), and the personnel and/or spouse are in a position to exercise power or authority or perform a duty that affects that business.

Personnel must be sensitive to any relationship that has or may have a connection to City business. This includes influencing others to make decisions that could have direct financial impact on themselves, a family member, personal relationship, or business entity with which the employee, a family member or person affiliated in some other way is involved.

Personnel, who believe they may have a conflict of interest based on this guideline, will inform their Ethics Advisor or the Ethics Board, who will review the situation and make a determination regarding the presence of a conflict. If a conflict of interest exists, the personnel will file the Personnel Conflict of Interest Statement with his/her department, the Human Resources department, and the City Clerk, as re-

quired by statute.

9 - INVESTIGATION PROCEDURES

The City will investigate all reports of suspected violations of this Code, including anonymous reports, to the extent possible. Personnel will cooperate in these investigations.

Procedure for Resolving Ethics Complaints

The complainant must complete and submit a complaint form to the City Ethics Board within three months of the alleged occurrence.

The Ethics Board will, within a reasonable amount of time, begin a confidential investigation.

At the end of the investigation, the Ethics Board will notify the complainant (if known) that the matter has been addressed. If the complainant is anonymous the city manager will be notified. The Ethics Board will notify the accused personnel and his/her Department Director (if applicable) of the decision and recommendations.

Investigation and prosecution of potential criminal activity will proceed independently and be conducted by the appropriate officials.

10 - CONFIDENTIALITY AND WHISTLE-BLOWER PROTECTION

Confidentiality

No City employee will disclose the identity of anyone who reports a suspected violation or who participates in a related investigation, unless such disclosure is required by law, regulation or legal process.

Records regarding complaints will be filed in the City Clerk's Office and remain confidential. All records will be kept in a locked file cabinet. Only the Ethics Board will have access.

Protection Against Retaliation

It is a violation of this Code to retaliate in any form against an individual who, in good faith, reports a violation of this Code, or assists in the investigation of a reported violation. An employee who retaliates will be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including termination.

11 - COMMUNICATION OF THIS CODE

This Code will be reviewed with new employees during orientation in Human Resources. A signed acknowledgement of the review and receipt of the Code will be retained in each employee's file.

12 - RECOMMENDATIONS

The Ethics Board may make recommendations to amend this Code with the final approval being the City Council.

APPENDIX A

Warning Signs of an Ethical Problem

Below is a sample of phrases that may signal an ethical problem:

"No one will ever know."

"I can still be objective."

"I deserve it."

"They owe it to me."

"Let's keep this under our hats."

"Oh, don't be such a prude."

"They'll never miss it."

"They had it coming."

"I'm just fighting fire with fire."

"I'll return it when I'm finished."

"Don't tell me. I don't want to know."

"It's OK if I don't gain personally."

"I'm just doing what I'm told."

"Technically, it's legal."

"Everybody does it."

"It's our department's way of doing business."

"This won't affect my work."

SECTION TWO:

Codification

This ordinance shall be codified in the McAlester Code of Ordinances as Chapter 2, Article III, Section 2-70

SECTION THREE: <u>Emergency Clause</u>

That an emergency is hereby declared to exist for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, by reason whereof it is necessary that this act take effect and be in full force from and after passage and approval.

ARTICLE 7. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 7.01. Conflicts of Interest, Board of Ethics, and Code of Conduct.

- (a) Conflicts of Interest. The use of public office for private gain is prohibited. The City Council shall implement this prohibition by ordinance, the terms of which shall include, but not be limited to: acting in an official capacity on matters in which the official has a private financial interest clearly separate from that of the general public; the acceptance of gifts and other things of value; acting in a private capacity on matters dealt with as a public official; the unethical or illegal use of confidential information; and appearances by City officials before other City agencies on behalf of private interests. This ordinance shall include a statement of purpose and shall provide for reasonable public disclosure of finances by City officials with major decision-making authority over monetary expenditures and contractual and regulatory matters and, insofar as permissible under state law, shall provide for fines and imprisonment for violations.
- (b) Board of Ethics. The City Council shall, by ordinance, establish an independent Board of Ethics to administer and enforce the conflict of interest and financial disclosure ordinances. No member of the Board may hold elective or appointed office under the City or any other government or hold any political party office. Insofar as possible under state law, the City Council shall authorize the Board to issue binding advisory opinions, conduct investigations on its own initiative and on referral or complaint from officials or citizens, subpoena witnesses and documents, refer cases for prosecution, impose administrative fines, and to hire independent counsel, subject to notification to the City Council. The City Council shall appropriate sufficient funds to the Board of Ethics to enable it to perform the duties assigned to it and to provide annual training and education of City officials and employees, including candidates for public office, regarding the Code of Ethics. All City

boards and committees shall promptly report in writing any findings of unethical activity by an elected or appointed official to the Board of Ethics.

(c) Code of Conduct.

- (1) The City Council shall create and approve a written Code of Conduct for the City of McAlester. This Code shall describe, in general terms, ethical and unethical behavior and shall give examples of specific acts or failures to act that shall be considered violations of this policy, while not precluding non-specified items. This Code shall be reviewed at least annually, amended as necessary, and reapproved by the Council.
- (2) All City Council members, City officers, and employees shall be supplied with a copy of the Code of Conduct upon taking office or being employed by the City and at least annually thereafter. After each receipt of the Code, they shall certify in writing that they have read and understand the Code, have adhered to the Code, and are not aware of any violation of the Code by any Council member or City employee. Any exceptions shall be noted in writing. These certifications will be maintained in the City's administrative and personnel files.
- (3) City officers and employees who violate any provision of the Code of Conduct shall be subject to disciplinary action up to and including dismissal. Persons who violate the Code may also be subject to prosecution under State or Federal Law.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2425 WHICH ESTABLISHED THE BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2012-2013; REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City Council heretofore adopted Ordinance No. 2425 setting forth the Budget for Fiscal Year 2012-2013 beginning July 1, 2012 and ending June 30, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the City Departments and Divisions routinely review their budget appropriations to determine if any changes are necessary; and

WHEREAS, based upon said review the City staff now recommends that certain amendments to the Budget be considered by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has the authority to make amendments to the City Budget under Article 5, Section 5.07 (b) of the new City Charter as well as State law; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the proposed amendment to the FY 2012-2013 Budget, with the revenues and expenditures therein contained, is in the best interest of the City; and therefore, desires to adopt the same by formal action.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1: The proposed amendment to the FY 2012-2013 Budget of the City of McAlester, Oklahoma, as heretofore adopted by Ordinance, as summarized in Exhibit A-1, which is attached hereto and fully incorporated herein by reference, be, and the same hereby are, completely adopted and approved as an amendment to the said FY 2012-2013 Budget.

SECTION 2: All portions of the existing FY 2012-2013 Budget, Ordinance No. 2425 except as specifically herein amended, shall remain in full force and effect, and not be otherwise affected by the adoption of the amendatory ordinance.

SECTION 3: That all other ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of any such conflict or inconsistency and all other ordinances not in conflict herewith shall remain in full force and effect.

<u>SECTION 4</u>: Should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause, phrase, or section of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the

same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision thereof, other than the part or parts as declared to be invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional.

SECTION 5: That an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and for the provision of the public peace, health and safety, by reason whereof it is necessary that all acts take effect immediately and be in full force and effect from, and after the passage and approval.

RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE CITY OF MCALESTER POLICY FOR BILLING ADJUSTMENT IN THE EVENT OF CUSTOMER WATER LEAKS OR BREAKS.

WHEREAS, the McAlester City Council finds that it is appropriate, for purposes of equity and continuity, to adopt a formal policy to establish a criteria and method for adjusting water/sewer billing of its customers in the event of certain unforeseen circumstances, and,

WHEREAS, the McAlester City Council is empowered to designate an officer to administer this policy, and,

WHEREAS, the McAlester City Council has determined that adoption of the following is in the best interest of the public and its water and sewer customers, and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MCALESTER, OKLAHOMA:

Section 1. That appropriate adjustments to the water/sewer billing of customers of the City of McAlester/McAlester Public Works Authority are authorized under the following conditions and criteria:

- a) Adjustments will be made <u>only</u> for leaks or breaks in lines underground or under structures;
- Adjustments will be made only after the customer has provided written proof that the leak has been repaired (a repair bill from a plumber or invoice or receipt for materials);
- c) Any adjustment must include charges for both water and sewer;
- d) No adjustments will be made, under this resolution, to water resellers or to rural water districts:
- e) No customer may receive more than two (2) adjustments in any twelve (12) month period;
- f) Past adjustments will be omitted from calculations of the six (6) month average required herein.

Section 2. When all of the criteria listed above have been satisfied, the City Manager, in his sole discretion, may approve an adjustment of the customer's highest water/sewer bill, under the following method:

- a) An average of the past six (6) months billing will be calculated;
- b) The monthly average will be subtracted from the customer's highest bill;
- c) The remainder will be divided by two (2);
- d) The divided sum will be subtracted from the highest bill;
- e) The customer will pay the highest bill minus the divided sum.

Section 3. The City Manager will report all billing adjustments made under this resolution, in the same manner waivers of fees are reported.

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING PASSAGE OF STATE QUESTION 764 TO ADDRESS OKLAHOMA'S WATER INFRASTRUCTURE NEEDS

WHEREAS, providing infrastructure for reliable drinking water and wastewater needs is essential for the economic development and growth of our great state; and

WHEREAS, State Question 764 creates a funding mechanism to leverage available funding for water resource and sewage treatment financial assistance programs for municipalities, rural water districts and other public entities in Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, THE Oklahoma Water Resources Board has prudently and successfully managed in excess of 2.5 billion dollars in drinking water and wastewater loans since 1985 saving Oklahoma communities over 900 million dollars; and

WHEREAS, Oklahomans have made significant investments based on the principle that Oklahoma's water resources are to be beneficially developed, used and enjoyed;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, The City of McAlester strongly supports the passage of State Question 764, which creates the Water Infrastructure Credit Enhancement Reserve Fund, enhancing and increasing the Oklahoma Water Resources Board's ability to fund drinking water and wastewater infrastructure.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA:

<u>Section 1.</u> The City of McAlester encourages all citizens of McAlester to vote "YES" on State Question 764 on November 6, 2012 and to actively work to pass this proposal.

Business

- Mayor Harrison and I attended a McAlester Defense Support Association (MDSA) strategic planning session at Choctaw Defense. The steering committee continues to identify and work on strategic planning initiatives for MCAPP.
- <u>UPDATE:</u> IMS Infrastructure Management Services will be in McAlester the week of October 21, 2012 field testing our designated roadways. Weather permitting, IMS should have their work completed in one week. They are estimating having the full report to the City in mid December. IMS is scheduled to arrive in McAlester this Friday, October 19, 2012.
- The Utilities Department has completed the installation of the new 6 inch water line behind Tandy Town. City crews installed the 1300 feet of pipe and are currently waiting on the water sample test results. Once the test results are received our crews will schedule the water taps to the new line during the night so as not to interfere with the businesses located at Tandy Town.
