Millie Vance addressed the Council regarding the construction of the water line in Steven Taylor Industrial Park for Hampel Oil. She updated the Council on the status of the project, commenting that the estimated date of construction of the building was to start in the last quarter of 2013, but Mr. Hampel would probably begin moving equipment onto site and build a fence before that.

**Executive Summary** 

Staff recommends authorizing the Mayor to endorse a Resolution to dissolve the McAlester Parking Authority.

City Attorney Ervin addressed the Council explaining the steps that had been taken to this point, he added that the Parking Authority did not owe any thing but there was a conveyance of air space and parking adjacent to the Aldridge Hotel and the ownership was still with the Authority. He added that it had been leased on a long term lease to Aldridge Accommodated Living and until a transfer of that interest it would not be appropriate to dissolve the Authority. He stated that the Resolution had not been attached because he did not have the final changes wanted by the other entity that would be signing it. He commented that those issues should be ironed out by the next meeting and the Resolution to dissolve should be done.

Vice-Mayor Mason asked if the Authority owned it or was it a lease.

Mr. Ervin informed the Council that the property had been originally owned by First National Bank and transferred to the Authority. He stated that tabling this item until the next meeting would be fine.

Vice-Mayor Mason moved to table this item until the next meeting. The motion was seconded by Councilman Karr.

5. McAlester Regional Health Center Quarterly Presentation 2012. (David Keith, FACHE, President/Chief Executive Officer)

Executive Summary

David Keith, President and CEO of McAlester Regional Health Center (MRHC) addressed the Council explaining that he and some of his staff were here to present the McAlester Regional Health Center's Quarterly report. He briefly mentioned MRHC's Residency Program with Oklahoma State University for Internal Medicine and Family Practice and thanked Mayor Harrison for attending that celebration.

Melissa Walker, MRHC Chief Financial Officer addressed the Council reviewing the hospital's recent audit and the financial reports.

Danny Hardman, Vice-President of Patient Care Services, addressed the Council regarding the Hospital's accomplishments over the past months, mentioning the Primary Stroke Center, the move of the Urgent Care facilities to the Hospital's complex and the various accreditations that the Hospital had received.

Mr. Keith addressed the Council regarding the Hospital's 2012-2015 Strategic Plan reviewing the various steps which formed that Plan and the need for future expansion.

Councilman Garvin commented that he was impressed with the improvement of the Hospital.

There was no vote on this item.

3. 



To the McAlester Planning Commission and Whomever it Concerns:

My name is Damon Mascoto, and I am the property owner of Lot 1, Village Addition III. I share approximately 200' of the South property line of Tract 2 (Lot 93), which is currently zoned A-1.

My primary concern is that re-zoning Tract 1 and Tract 2 to C-5 commercial will take away from the residential feel of the area. Moreover, the increased construction, traffic, and lighting (just to name a few things) could pose several challenges to homeowners in this area including but not limited to: noise and lighting nuisances, traffic dangers, easier access to our properties for those involved in criminal activities, environmental concerns, and pushing out native wildlife. These changes are in direct opposition to the reason I, and many others, purchased property in this area.

I want to be close to town yet have some acreage to enjoy without excessive noise or city lights. I want to see deer off of my back porch. I want a safe place to raise my kids free of excess traffic. I want a place that is not easily accessed by those who don't have the best intentions. I want to invest in a place where I don't have to worry about decreasing property values.

I'm not totally against the proposed properties being re-zoned, but I would like certain conditions placed on the property owner(s) and/or developers that would preserve our property values, our safety, and our reasons for investing and living in The Village Addition area.

If this zoning change is approved, I would like to see a requirement that includes a buffer area between commercial properties and our residential areas. I think it would be reasonable for that plan to include a certain amount of distance adjacent to the residential property lines (preferably at least 100') that would not be used for roads, parking lots, or structures. I would also like to have a privacy wall placed at the edge of that buffer (where the commercial development begins). And it would certainly be nice to see a plan regarding the intentions of the property owner(s) / developer so that we could address specific changes before they are approved and made.

It is not my intention to stand in the way of progress. I simply want to ensure that our preferences are considered and that any change(s) will seek to preserve a way of life that many have worked very hard to attain. I'm afraid that if this passes as is, without conditions safeguarding the interest of neighboring residents, that way of life will degrade in step with the residential property values.

Pete Stasiak, City Manager, gave the staff report and stated the applicant was Karen Dahlgren Trust, 15008 Gaillardia Drive, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma and was requesting the rezone of two tracts of land - Tract 1 from R-3 (Multi-family Dwelling District) to C-5 (Highway Commercial District) and Tract 2 from A-1 (Agricultural District) to C-5 (Highway Commercial District). Mr. Stasiak stated that both tracts of land are adjacent to C-5 zoned property.

Roger Dahlgren, representative for the trust, stated they have owned this property since 1985 and had been in touch with Mr. Stasiak and the Mayor several times in regards with the best way to develop the property. Mr. Dahlgren stated the best opportunity for this property is commercial development and re-zoning to C-5 would give the most flexibility. Mr. Dahlgren let the Planning Commission know there is not a solid plan or developer at this time and he showed a proposed plan that had been created for these tracts. (This plan can also be viewed at willowcreekdevelopment.com) Any future development of this property could provide another point of entry for residents in Kinkead Hills.

Commission Member Lewis asked Mr. Dahlgren what type of buffer would be put between the property and the adjacent residential properties if it is re-zoned. Mr. Dahlgren stated since Tract 1 is so narrow he couldn't envision much of a buffer but putting a buffer zone on Tract 2 would be more feasible. Mr. Stasiak reminded the Commission that Tract 1 is currently zoned R-3 and the property owner could come in with a high rise apartment complex, but no matter what the zoning is there are still requirements that have to be met (set-backs, screening, etc.). Commission Member Bollinger stated that although these tracts are similar, Tract 1 does propose different issues than Tract 2 and was wondering if it would be better to re-zone Tract 1 to a lesser commercial zoning. Mr. Stasiak stated that there would need to be a recommendation made on both tracts of land.

Hal Johnson, Lot 4 Village Addition 3, addressed the Commission with his concerns. He also stated that he was speaking for his neighbors in Lot 3 as well. Mr. Johnson doesn't have an objection to the property being re-zoned commercially, but would like to see a buffer zone between the proposed development and the residential area to help with noise and have visual separation. He also stated that if C-5 zoning allowed for certain businesses (Casino, night club, etc.) he would like for it be re-zoned a lesser commercial zoning.

Damon Mascoto, Lot 1 Village Addition 3, addressed the Commission with his concerns. Mr. Mascoto stated he does not have a deep lot and would like to see some sort of separation between the proposed development and his property. Mr. Mascoto isn't against the re-zone but thinks there should be stricter requirements for a buffer zone than just a 5-foot privacy fence.

Kory Moss, Lot 7 Colonial Circle, addressed the Commission and suggested before any decision is made the applicant should be required to show what type of development is going to be built. Mr. Stasiak stated that before commercial developers or manufacturers invest any time or money into a project they would want the proposed site to be zoned properly from the start. Commission Member Bollinger stated that no matter what someone proposes on a property that when the zoning is changed the property owner can change those plans and develop the property any way that fits into that zoning classification. Therefore it should be taken into consideration what is the best proper use for the property to fit in with the existing/surrounding properties.

Mr. Dahlgren stated again that he has owned this property since 1985 and it is not his intention to bring in a big commercial developer and move in quickly and develop this property. He stated that he plans on being here a long time and getting along with "neighbors".

Commission Member Bollinger asked Mr. Dahlgren if he had a copy of the C-4 and C-5 zoning regulations. Mr. Dahlgren stated he did not so Commission Member Bollinger read aloud the allowable uses for both zoning classifications.

A motion made by Commission Member Bollinger was seconded by Commission Member Scifres to change the zoning of Tract 2 from A-1 (Agricultural District) to C-5 (Highway Commercial District) and be forwarded to the City Council for approval.

The vote was 8-0 as follows:

AYE: Lewis, Kanard, Scifres, Moore, Bollinger, Way, Few, Emmons

NAY: None

Motion carried.

Commission Emmons asked if there was any discussion before a motion was made on Tract 1. He stated that since the majority of this tract was in a flood plain it was going to limit what would be able to be developed there.

A motion made by Commission Member Bollinger was seconded by Commission Member Scifres to change the zoning of Tract 1 from R-3 (Multi-family Dwelling District) to C-4 (Restricted Commercial District) and be forwarded to the City Council for approval.

Commission Member Scifres asked Mr. Dahlgren if this would prohibit him from moving forward with his plans. Mr. Dahlgren stated that getting money to come to this area is very difficult and if restrictions are put on this tract it will make it much harder to get developers to look at it. Commissioner Emmons asked Mr. Dahlgren that if it was re-zoned to C-5 if he would be willing to put in a tree line at his expense. Mr. Dahlgren state that he would be willing to do that, but on the adjacent homeowners' property since this tract of land is so narrow.

Commission Member Scifres withdrew his seconding of the motion. Commission Member Lewis seconded the motion put out by Commission Member Bollinger.

Commissioner Emmons stated he was afraid that by giving the tract a lesser zoning Mr. Dahlgren's chances for development would be hindered. Commission Member Lewis stated that C-4 is not too restrictive and it gives plenty of options for development. Commission Member Way asked what the staff's recommendation was on this tract. Mr. Stasiak stated that staff recommends Tract 1 being zoned C-5. Commission Member Bollinger stated that he is opposed to C-5 in this area because it would allow for certain development near the residential area that a C-4 wouldn't allow.

The vote was 7-1 as follows:





# ORDINANCE NO. \_\_\_\_

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2425 WHICH ESTABLISHED THE BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2012-2013; REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City Council heretofore adopted Ordinance No. 2425 setting forth the Budget for Fiscal Year 2012-2013 beginning July 1, 2012 and ending June 30, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the City Departments and Divisions routinely review their budget appropriations to determine if any changes are necessary; and

WHEREAS, based upon said review the City staff now recommends that certain amendments to the Budget be considered by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has the authority to make amendments to the City Budget under Article 5, Section 5.07 (b) of the new City Charter as well as State law; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the proposed amendment to the FY 2012-2013 Budget, with the revenues and expenditures therein contained, is in the best interest of the City; and therefore, desires to adopt the same by formal action.

# BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA:

<u>SECTION 1</u>: The proposed amendment to the FY 2012-2013 Budget of the City of McAlester, Oklahoma, as heretofore adopted by Ordinance, as summarized in Exhibit A-1 through A-5, which is attached hereto and fully incorporated herein by reference, be, and the same hereby are, completely adopted and approved as an amendment to the said FY 2012-2013 Budget.

SECTION 2: All portions of the existing FY 2012-2013 Budget, Ordinance No. 2425 except as specifically herein amended, shall remain in full force and effect, and not be otherwise affected by the adoption of the amendatory ordinance.

SECTION 3: That all other ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of any such conflict or inconsistency and all other ordinances not in conflict herewith shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4: Should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause, phrase, or section of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the

same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision thereof, other than the part or parts as declared to be invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional.

SECTION 5: That an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and for the provision of the public peace, health and safety, by reason whereof it is necessary that all acts take effect immediately and be in full force and effect from, and after the passage and approval.



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### City Manager Report to the Council

### January 8, 2013

#### **Business**

- On December 19, 2012, Mayor Harrison, City Clerk Middleton and Nate Ellis signed all the necessary documents related to the refinancing of the closing date for the refinancing was set for December 28, 2012 and this was achieved.
- A City Council Workshop has been re-scheduled for Tuesday, January 29, 2013 for 5:30pm. at the Kiamichi Vocational Center to introduce and discuss the Master Drainage Plan Tributary "C" of the Sandy Creek Basin prepared by Meshak & Associates, PLC. Prior to the workshop, all residents within the basin will be notified of the meeting to hear the findings associated with the study and the potential costs associated with providing a solution to the drainage area.
- Effective January 1, 2013 all temporary or part-time employees working for the
  City of McAlester have had their hours reduced from 32 hours per week to 29
  hours per week. Temporary or part-time employees who average 30 hours or more
  per week will be afforded health insurance coverage under the new Health Care
  Reform Act. We have adjusted the schedule of those affected to reflect this change.
- Mayor Harrison, City Attorney Ervin and I will be attending the Cox Mediation Hearing in Muskogee on Tuesday, January 8, 2013.
- The City Managers Association has scheduled the Winter Conference for January  $16^{th}$ .  $18^{th}$ . in Stillwater. I plan on attending the conference.

#### • Street Overlay Projects Completed:

 No new overlay projects are scheduled due to the asphalt plant being idled for the winter months. Staff anticipates the plant re-opening in April 2013.

#### Labor Issues:

- Fraternal Order of Police (FOP)
  - Grievance 11-15-12: New Evaluation System. This relates to measuring the activity or work of our Police Officers.
- International Association of Fire Fighters (IAFF)
  - A meeting was held with the IAFF negotiating team to attempt to mediate the pending grievances. After much discussion and no solutions in sight, the IAFF and the City agreed to mediation by the Federal Mediation (FMCS) to hear the grievances. Both parties will present their information to the mediator who will make a determination on the grievance. Neither party is held to the determination and can accept or decline the decision. All information obtained in the mediation cannot be used in the grievance procedure if the grievance proceeds forward.
  - Grievance with Arbitration Requested 11-26-12: Facial Hair. This relates to the SCBA face mask being tightly sealed to the face.
  - Grievance with Arbitration Requested 11-26-12: Hours Worked per Pay Period. This relates to the 27 day work cycle for Firefighters.
  - Grievance with Arbitration Requested 11-26-12: Duty Exchange. This relates to Fire Recruits being allowed Duty Exchange during the probationary period.


