The McAlester City Council met in Rescheduled Regular session on Thursday, December 27, 2012, at 6:00 P.M. after proper notice was posted, December 11, 2012 and agenda was posted, December 20, 2012, at 2:27 P.M.

Call to Order

Mayor Harrison called the meeting to order.

Stephanie Swinnea, All-Saints Episcopal Church, gave the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Before the vote, Councilman Read commented that he did not have a problem with the Mayor attending the settlement conference but he did not feel that any one member of the Council should have authority to settle the case. It should be a decision made by the entire Council.

City Attorney Ervin explained that the Federal Judge had ordered that one member of the Council with full authority to settle the case be present. He informed the Council that there would be representation from OMAG and the case was filed during the time period that the City had a \$10,000.00 deductible.

Councilman Read moved to modify the motion to "authorize up to the \$10,000.00 deductible."

Councilman Titsworth commented that normally an insurance company has some authority to settle a claim. Mr. Ervin stated that the OMAG representative would be present to authorize any amount over the deductible if needed. He added that at this time the amount of the deductible was all that was being asked for.

Councilman Smith seconded the motion to modify the original motion.

There were no comments from the Public or the Council and Councilman Smith moved to close the Public Hearing. The motion was seconded by Councilman Karr and the vote was taken as follows:

Scheduled Business

1. TABLED - Discussion, and possible action, authorizing the mayor to sign a lease agreement between McAlester Regional Airport Authority and EagleMed, LLC for Corporate Hanger No. 30 located at the McAlester Regional Airport. (Joe Ervin, City Attorney)

Executive Summary

Motion to approve the lease agreement between McAlester Regional Airport Authority and EagleMed, LLC and authorize the Mayor to sign the said documents.

A motion was made by Councilman Titsworth and seconded by Councilman Smith to approve and authorize the mayor to sign a lease between the McAlester Regional Airport Authority and EagleMed, LLC for Corporate Hanger No. 30.

Before the vote, City Attorney Ervin informed the Council that the changes from the last meeting had been incorporated and some of the definitions in paragraph three (3) had been expanded.

There was a brief discussion among the Council and Attorney Ervin concerning insurance coverage, the length of the lease and the extension of the lease and reviewing the lease annually.

Patrick Barkley with EagleMed addressed the Council explaining the number of employees that would be employed for the service, the base salary totals and the number of patients that could be transported on the plane.

There was another brief discussion among the Council regarding the amount of the lease, the length of the lease, and possibly using a CPI adjustment for the lease.

Mayor Harrison moved to amend the lease by striking the language "and any Extension Terms, if exercised by the Lessee" from the Base Rent paragraph on Exhibit B. The motion was seconded by Councilman Smith.

There was no further discussion, and the vote was taken as follows:

Mayor Harrison declared the motion carried.

2. TABLED - Consider, and act upon, endorsing a Resolution of the remaining Trustees to dissolve the McAlester Parking Authority. (Joe Ervin, City Attorney)

Executive Summary

Staff recommends authorizing the Mayor to endorse a Resolution to dissolve the McAlester Parking Authority.

City Attorney Ervin commented that he had spoken with Manager Stasiak about this item not being ready to be brought back to the Council, but it appeared to have been tabled at the previous meeting. He stated that there was no action for the Council at this time and recommended that it be postponed indefinitely and brought back at an appropriate time after the other parties had signed off on the Resolution.

Vice-Mayor Mason inquired about the language of the item.

No action was taken.

3. Consider, and act upon, amending Section 54-48 to Article III Chapter 54 of the City of McAlester Code prohibiting the use of tobacco on City-owned premises and properties. (Pam Kirby, HR Manager and Grant Writer)

Executive Summary

Motion to approve amending Ordinance that will prohibit tobacco use on City-owned premises and properties, including buildings, facilities, City vehicles, Equipment, City Parks, Trails, Outdoor Facilities, Play Grounds, and Sports areas.

ORDINANCE NO. <u>2447</u>

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTIONS 54-48. TO ARTICLE III, CHAPTER 54, OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MCALESTER, OKLAHOMA BY PROHIBITING TOBACCO USE ON CITY-OWNED PREMISES AND PROPERTIES.

A motion was made by Councilman Smith and seconded by Councilman Titsworth to approve **ORDINANCE NO. 2447.**

Before the vote, Manager Stasiak explained that this had to with going to a tobacco free environment and promoting a certified healthy community for the future of McAlester. He added that this would be quite a change from no smoking to no tobacco. He informed the Council that he had worked with Tammy Randazzo and Charoletta Lott from the Health Department and this could be tied to grant opportunities in the future.

Ms. Randazzo and Ms. Lott addressed the Council regarding the tobacco policy throughout Pittsburg County, potential grant opportunities, the City's current Merit Level and what other entities were involved with this program.

Manager Stasiak stated that the Ordinance that was before the Council was all new language and needed to be underlined. He added that this would be a good thing for the community.

Councilman Read asked if this applied to facilities that the City leased and how this would be enforced.

City Attorney Ervin explained that this applied to all City owned property, not property that the City leased. It was a change in the law.

Manager Stasiak explained that as the City become aware of incidents it would respond and it would be enforced through the Codes Department and could be fined up to \$500.00 and \$48.00 Municipal Court Costs.

There was a brief discussion among the Council regarding the language of the Ordinance, when the Ordinance would go into effect, who would furnish the signage, when they would be ready, who had submitted the Ordinance, tabling or postponing the item, including the Hospital and how this document compared to other cities Ordinances.

Councilman Smith moved to make the Ordinance effective ninety (90) days from passage. The motion was seconded by Councilman Titsworth.

Vice-Mayor Mason moved to modify the language to "owned or operated by the City of McAlester". The motion was seconded by Councilman Read.

Mayor Harrison stated that the vote would be on the Ordinance as amended by both motions. There was no further discussion, and the vote was taken as follows:

AYE: Councilman Garvin, Mason, Smith, Titsworth, Read, Karr & Mayor Harrison

NAY: None

Mayor Harrison declared the motion carried.

4. Consider, and act upon, a lease agreement between the City of McAlester and the U. S. Government to occupy the common/receptionist area and two offices located in the FAA Building at the airport for a term to begin on January 3, 2013 and ending January 2, 2015. (Peter J. Stasiak, City Manager)

Executive Summary

Motion to approve lease between City of McAlester and the U.S. Government for a term beginning on January 3, 2013 and ending January 2, 2015.

Councilman Titsworth moved to approve a lease agreement between the City of McAlester and the U. S. Government to occupy the common/receptionist area and two offices located in the FAA Building at the airport for a term to begin on January 3, 2013 and ending January 2, 2015. The motion was seconded by Mayor Harrison.

Before the vote, Manager Stasiak explained that the City had been contacted by Mr. Mullin's staff regarding office space within the City. He explained that in discussion with Mr. Mullin's staff, he was informed that the Representatives budget had been cut and he could pay for staffing but not be able to rent office space. Manager Stasiak informed the Council of the changes that had been made to the lease and of an email from Ms. Vicki Brown.

Mayor Harrison informed the Council of his thoughts on the matter and commented that an occupied building stayed in better shape than an unoccupied building.

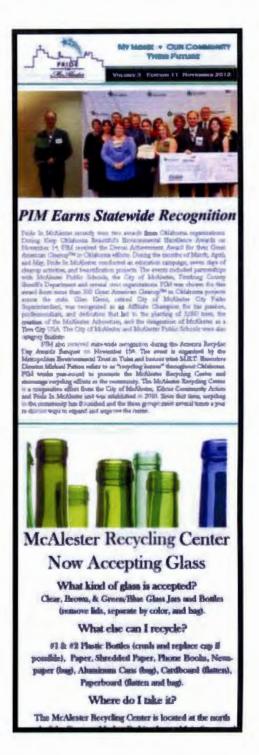




Monthly PIM Newsletters

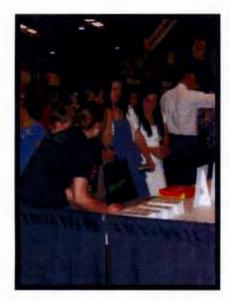

City Wide Litter Pickup October 6th

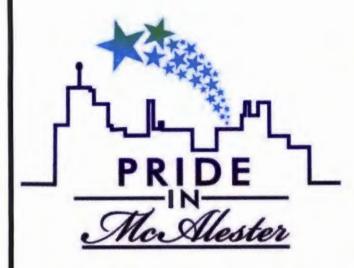

City-Wide Garage Sale

On August 10, 2012, Pride In McAlester President Justin Few and Executive Director Stephanie Giacomo sent a letter to the City Manager and City Council requesting support of a Community-wide Garage Sale to compliment PIM's Fall Cleanup. Such events bring visitors to the community, promote environmental responsibility through reuse of goods, and help residents clear out unneeded items resulting in a cleaner and safer McAlester. Holding the community garage sale prior to the Fall Cleanup served as an additional incentive for residents to begin cleaning up their property and encourage a second use of items. Thanks to the support and organization of city employees such as Pamela Kirby, the event was a great success and should continue as an annual event in the future.



Fall Cleanup

Pride In McAlester's Fall Cleanup yielded fantastic results in 2012. During four days of bulk trash disposal, along with metal, tire, and electronics recycling, McAlester residents were provided with free and responsible ways to clean up their properties. Partnering with the City of McAlester, Allied Waste, Green Country Shredding, E-Waste Services, Pittsburg County Sheriff's Department, Yaffee Metal, and Liberty Tire, the cleanup ran October 20th, 21st, 27th, and 28th at the Former National Guard Armory. Activities on October 20th also included free paper shredding and prescription drug disposal options for residents. Fifty-five onsite volunteers and in-kind employees spent 217 combined hours at the site helping 621 community volunteers who contributed 1,173 hours cleaning up in the city. More than 450 vehicles came through the cleanup and numerous more delivered brush and yard waste to the McAlester landfill, saving citizens approximately \$18,000.00 in tipping fees.

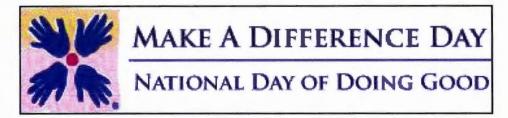

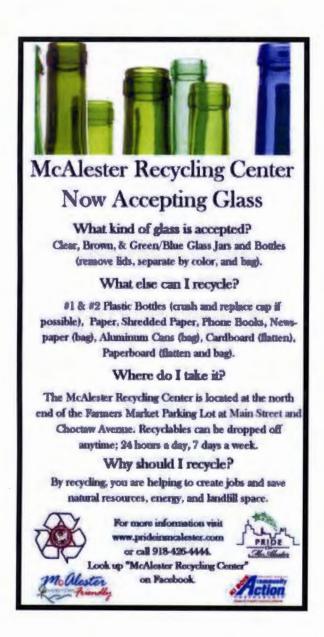

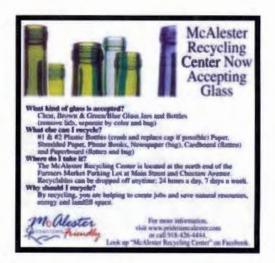

12 ways to go green for the holidays

While Santa and his sleigh bells, twinkling lights and shiny packages under the tree are some of the first things that come to mind when we think of Christmas, what's left over after the holiday season is a haze of extra consumption and waste.

In fact, Americans produce a million extra tons of garbage per week during the period between Thanksgiving and New Year's, according to the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery. The good news is that it doesn't have to be that way.

There are any number of small things you can do to lessen the season's carbon footprint.

By taking a more thoughtful and conscious approach to the holidays and striving to reduce waste and consumption, you may find that your celebration of the season becomes more meaningful while leaving a substantially smaller impact on the environment.

 Choose a real tree. While plastic. trees can be reused, the manufacturing process requires petroleum, and eventually the trees end up in the landfill since they aren't easily recy clable. Real trees, on the other hand. can be replanted if you choose a potted variety. They can also be recycled, mulched or composted. and real Christmas trees are typically grown specifically for the purpose, so deforestation bin't an issue. Another benefit is that live tree absorb carbon dioxide while they're growing. Look for a tree that's been locally and sustainably grown and is pesticide-free

2. Replace the lights on your tree with energy efficient mini-lights or strands of LED lights, which use up to 90 percent less energy than traditional Christmas lights. LEDs also last much longer and often provide brighter and more vibrant colors. For outdoor decorating, choose solar-powered lights, which are becoming more widely available.

3. Instead of electric lights, rely on candles to create a festive holiday mood, but make sure they're made from so; beeswax or a natural segetable-based wax, all of which are biodegradable and smoke-free. Paraffin candles contain petroleum residue, which isn't good for you or the environment, if you do use candles, don't forget to follow fire safety rules and keep them out of the reach of children and pets and away from flammable curtains and Christmas trees.

dar pictures, used cards, your children's artwork or cardstock packaging. Homemade cards are fun to make and are more meaningful to the recipient. If there's no time to make your own cards or you want to adopt a technological approach to the holidays, send e-cards instead. If you do purchase cards, look for those made from a high percentage of post-consumer waste.

5. Set a green table. Seek out local and organic meats and vegetables. Buying food that's been grown or raised locally reduces your carbon footprint greatly and helps support small family farms. To find local produce and other food items, check out local farmers markets or the Oklahoma Food Cooperative (oklahomafood.coop) Buy your holiday snacks and baking supplies in bulk to reduce packaging waste. Use real plates and glasses rather than disposable. After all, special occasions are the reason you have china and nice dishes in the first place, so take the opportunity to make this holiday special and use them.

 After the big meal, recycle your cooking oil and consider starting a compost bin or heap with your veretable peelings if you don't already have one.

Used cooking oil can be dropped off at the Pride in McAlester Flea Market at the corner of Third Screet and Wyandotte Avenue on Wednesdays, Fridays and Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

7. Rethink your gift-giving. Give experiences—like restaurant gift certificates, movie tickets, massage or pedicure gift certificates, music downloads or tickets to sporting events—rather than items that involve packaging and create waste. Better yet, sponsor an animal or an acre of rainforest in the name of your most eco-conscious friends and family members.

B. When you do shop, buy local and always take along reusable shopping bags. Buying locally made items and shopping at local stores supports the local economy and reduces the carbon footprint created when items are transported long distances. 8. Get creative with your wrapping. Wrap presents with comics from the newspaper, old maps, clothes, blankets, dishtowels, pillow cases or pretty pieces of fabric that can be reused. If you do buy wrapping paper, choose paper that's easily recyclable (metallic paper often lan't) or paper that's made from hemp or recycled material.

10. Recycle, recycle, recycle. The holiday season presents lots of opportunities for recycling. With all the new items being given and received, the older items they replace can frequently be granted new life with just a little effort on your part. For example, old cell phones can be taken to Radio Shack AT&T or U.S. Cellular for recycling. Old computers and computer acces sories can be taken to Goodwill Industries, where they'll be reused or recycled. For all the packaging those new items come in, McAleste offers a 24/7 drop-off center across from the Farmers Market in the Chnetaw Parking Lot on Main Street, where you can recycle paper. cardboard, aluminum, #1 and #2 plastic, and glass

If you have used household batter ies (such as AA, AAA, C, or D batteries), they can be recycled at the Pride In McAlester Flea Market.

11. Donate items that you've received replacements for or no longer have room for — such as clothes, furniture, and toys — to a charity organization or thrift store instead of just throwing them away. The Pride in McAlester Fiea Markewill even pick up your donation if you live within the city Call 918-429-1111 for more information.

12. Make a list and check it twice to ensure you're making smart energy choices during the holiday season. A day spent in the kitchen with a hot oven is the perfect opportunity to lower the thermostat on your central heating system. If you're traveling to visit out of town relatives over the holidays, check with other family members to see if a carpool can be arranged.

If you're giving any battery operated toys or gadgets as gifts, include a set of rechargeable batteries. Pride In McAlester took the Holiday Recycling Drive to a new level this year with an entry in McAlester Main Street's Christmas Parade on December 6th. PIM's parade float encouraged recycling through display of a Christmas tree made of plastic bottles, a wreath of aluminum cans, presents wrapped in paper, and cardboard gingerbread people. Light displays shaped as recycling symbols adorned the trailer in three places. The PIM float won second place during the parade, earning a trophy and \$200.00 award. Justin Few, PIM President, was on-hand to accept the award from Main Street Director Ginny Webb. Fourteen volunteers spent fifty-eight and one half hours constructing the holiday float.

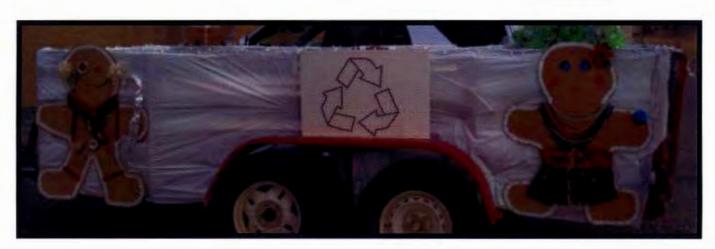

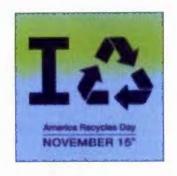

Pride In McAlester recently won two awards from Oklahoma organizations. During Keep Oklahoma Beautiful's Environmental Excellence Awards on November 1st, PIM received the Devon Achievement Award for their Great American CleanupTM in Oklahoma efforts. During the months of March, April, and May, Pride In McAlester conducted an education campaign, seven days of cleanup activities, and beautification projects. The events included partnerships with McAlester Public Schools, the City of McAlester, Pittsburg County Sheriff's Department and several civic organizations. PIM was chosen for this award from more than 300 Great American CleanupTM in Oklahoma projects across the state. Glen Kerns, retired City of McAlester City Parks Superintendent, was recognized as an Affiliate Champion for his passion, professionalism, and dedication that led to the planting of 3,000 trees, the creation of the McAlester Arboretum, and the designation of McAlester as a Tree City USA. The City of McAlester and McAlester Public Schools were also category finalists.

Pride in McAlester engaged the entire community and then some during their 2012 Great American CleanupTM effort and in so doing earned the attention of the GAC's statewide sponsor, Devon Energy. Here's what was accomplished:

In March: An awareness campaign promoted upcoming activities and volunteer recruitment. They presented at city council meetings, rotary club, the Pittsburgh County Bar Association and schools. They also held a Keep McAlester Beautiful poster competition; put public service announcements on McAlester Radio stations; the newspaper ran a number of stories and Mayor Steve Harrison proclaimed April and May as "Cleanup McAlester Months." More information was disseminated through social media, posters and brochures.

In April: Roll-offs placed in the armory parking lot were opened to the general public every Saturday and Sunday from April 7-28th for free disposal of bulk trash, tire & metal recycling, document shredding services, household hazardous waste collection, E-waste recycling and prescription drug disposal. 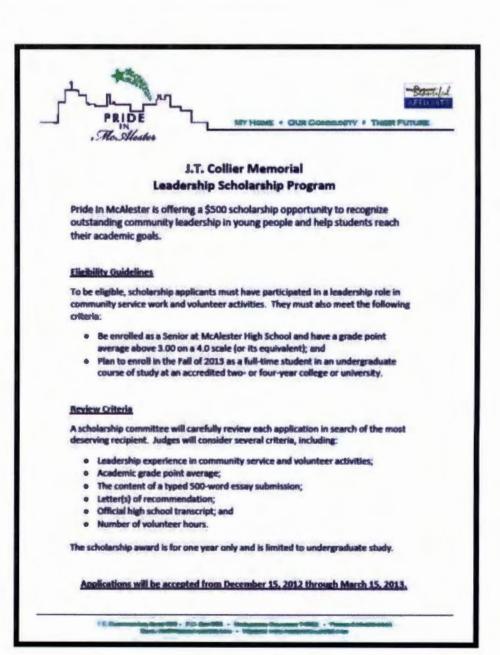

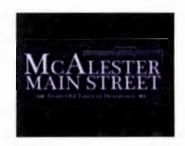

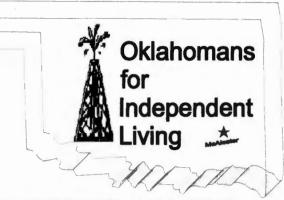

During the months of October, November and December, the Oklahomans for Independent Living provided transportation to 96 individuals. The individuals took a total of 1,309 trips. One hundred and thirty-four locations were visited including doctor's offices, pharmacies, McAlester Regional Hospital, Indian Clinic, DHS, Carl Albert Mental Health Center, DRS, grocery stores, Wal-Mart, restaurants, and a variety of other sites.

OIL has also provided its core services of information and referral, advocacy, peer counseling, and independent living skills training. OIL sends a monthly newsletter to 700 individuals each month. Information and referral on disability related issues was provided on 342 requests.

Advocacy both individual and systemic was provided on disability related issues that concern civil rights, housing, environmental modifications, the Americans with Disabilities Act, employment, and program access.

Peer support activities included individual counseling and group activities. 570 individuals participated in 38 peer support and community integration activities. These

events also included the Fall Dance, Annual Thanksgiving Dinner for OIL Consumers and the 27th annual Children with Disabilities Christmas Party.

Independent living skills training was provided to 16 individuals in the forms of money management, reading, computer skills training and preparation to take the written portion of the driver's examination.

Usable equipment is donated to OIL and OIL passes the equipment on to individuals with disabilities. 12 individuals benefited from the used equipment exchange. This included items such as power wheelchairs, standard wheelchairs, hospital beds, shower benches, walkers, canes and numerous other items.

OIL provided case management services for 40 individuals at risk of nursing home placement. Case management services ensure community resources are developed and used to assist people to live in their homes versus nursing home placement.

OIL appreciates the City of McAlester support and its commitment to the community integration and involvement of people with disabilities.

Fiscal Year 2012-2013, Quarter Two

- In November, Ginny Webb served her first day as executive director, and Hope Bridges of Tedford Insurance joined the McAlester Main Street board of directors.
- McAlester Main Street thanks its volunteers for 232 volunteer hours in the second quarter.
- McAlester Main Street co-hosted the Wild Color Stampede, which raised \$2,300 for Main Street. On the same day, Old Town Association's Wild West Festival had more participants and higher attendance than ever before.
- McAlester Main Street co-hosted Trick or Treat Party in the Street, which raised \$754.26 for Main Street.
- McAlester Main Street hosted the annual Christmas parade with approximately 70 entries. Entry fees generated \$310 for Main Street after expenses.
- Modern Woodmen of America awarded \$2,500 to McAlester Main Street to match its \$2,700 raised for streetscape improvements to the downtown area.
- Thanks in part to a donation from Lowe's, Old Town will soon install new benches.
- McAlester Main Street and the City of McAlester agreed upon objectives for the remainder of the fiscal year as of December 11, 2012.
- McAlester Main Street launched its new website on December 31, 2012. It can be viewed at www.mcalestermainstreet.com.

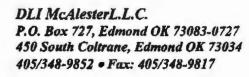

LEASE OF REAL PROPERTY

THIS LEASE OF REAL PROPERTY (the "Lease") is made and entered into effective as of the 23rd day of January 2001 (the "Effective Date") by and between the CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA, a municipal corporation of Oklahoma (the "City"), whose address for purposes of this Lease is P.O. Box 578, McAlester, Oklahoma 74501 and DLI McALESTER LLC, an Oklahoma limited liability company ("Lessee"), whose address is 450 South Coltrane Road, Edmond, Oklahoma 73034.

WHEREAS, at its meeting held January 23, 2001, the City Council of the City declared and resolved that the tract of land more particularly described herein shall be made available for the use of Lessee by lease for a term of ninety-nine (99) years commencing the Effective Date, such term to be extended by a number of days equal to the number of days elapsing between the Effective Date and the date of commencement of a lease between the General Services Administration ("GSA") for the Improvements to be constructed on the Site and a sublease of the Site (such lease and sublease are collectively referred to as the "GSA Lease", at an annual rental rate of One Dollar (\$1.00); and

WHEREAS, the parties agree that the leased premises shall be that tract of real Property described on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and made a part hereof, and;

WHEREAS, the parties agree and acknowledge that the Lessee will construct the Improvements on the Site for use as set forth in Section 3 below.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the promises of the City and Lessee, each to the other, and the undertakings of the City and Lessee as set forth in this Lease, and for other good and valuable consideration recited herein, the sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the City and Lessee do hereby agree to keep, perform and observe the following provisions of this Lease.

1. USAGE, ABBREVIATIONS AND DEFINITIONS

As used in this Lease, the following words have the meanings indicated:

- 1.1 The word" Site" shall mean the tract of real property described on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and made a part hereof, together with all and singular the rights and appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining, but not the Improvements described below.
- 1.2 The word "Improvements" shall mean the building constructed ("built", "installed", "placed" and other words of similar import being herein referred to as "constructed") under, upon or above the Site, after the date hereof,

including any and all alterations of and additions to the Improvements, whether or not any such alterations or additions are separated from or connected to the Improvements. The City and Lessee anticipate that the Improvements will consist of approximately 8,376 net usable square feet.

2. SITE LEASED

For and in consideration of the rent and of the terms and conditions of this Lease, the City does hereby let and lease, Site unto Lessee, and Lessee does hereby take and lease the Site from the City.

USE OF SITE

The Site shall be used by the United States, acting by and through the GSA for the operation of a United States Drug Enforcement Administration Field Office and for other governmental uses. In the event the GSA Lease terminates during the term of this Lease, Lessee shall have the right to enter into a lease with another tenant for another use so long as such use is primarily for general office purposes.

4. RENT

For and as rent for the real property consisting of the Site and the Improvements Lessee shall cause to be paid to the City at the address set forth in Section 18, in advance the sum of Ninety-nine and No/100 Dollars (\$99.00).

5. TERM

Unless sooner terminated, renewed or extended, this Lease shall be for a term of ninety-nine (99) years commencing on the Effective Date and expiring on the ninety-ninth anniversary thereof, such term to be extended by a number of days equal to the number of days elapsing between the Effective Date and the date of commencement of the GSA Lease.

6. RESPONSIBILITIES

The rights and privileges hereby granted to Lessee are to be used and enjoyed at the sole risk and responsibility of Lessee. In consideration of the benefits to be derived herefrom, Lessee hereby agrees and warrants that all uses of the Site and Improvements will be within the terms of the purpose of this Lease and that any and all expenses in any way related to or connected with the Site and Improvements or the rights and privileges herein conferred will be at no cost to the City or its officers, instrumentalities or

employees, and that no liens shall attach to the Site, except as specifically provided in Section 9 below.

7. CONSTRUCTION AND IMPROVEMENTS

- 7.1 Lessee may install and operate in and on the Site facilities, fixtures, trade fixtures, equipment, machinery and appliances and Lessee's installation of the same shall comply with applicable local, state and Federal laws, rules and regulations. Lessee may, from time to time in Lessee's sole discretion, alter, modify, remove, renovate, and/or replace any Improvements, subject to Lessee's compliance with applicable local, state, and Federal laws, rules, and regulations.
- 7.2 Title to and ownership of the Improvements shall be vested in Lessee or such subtenants as are designated by Lessee until the termination, expiration or surrender of this Lease at which time all title and ownership of said Improvements shall vest automatically and immediately in the City, free and clear of all claims to or against said Improvements by Lessee or third parties and without necessity of further action or instrument.
- 7.3 Nothing herein shall be construed as an agreement by the City to be responsible for paying for the Improvements; and neither the Site, nor the City's interest in said Site, shall be subjected to a mechanic's lien for any Improvements constructed by Lessee hereunder. Lessee shall be responsible for assuring that all of the Improvements, alterations, and additions to the Site are constructed in accordance with applicable local, State and Federal law. Lessee shall reimburse the City for all costs and expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees, the City incurs (a) as a result of the fact that the Improvements, additions, or alterations do not comply with local, State and Federal law; (b) in defending against, settling or satisfying any claims that the City is responsible for paying for Improvements commissioned by Lessee hereunder; or (c) in defending against, settling or satisfying any mechanics lien claims, asserted as a result of unpaid for Improvements commissioned by Lessee hereunder.

8. INSPECTION AND OPERATION

- 8.1 The City represents that it holds clear and indefeasible title to the Site. The City warrants that it has full authority to enter into the Lease and that it has not otherwise encumbered the Site. The City shall reasonably cooperate with Lessee's or any sublessee's efforts to develop the Site or construct the Improvements, including, but not limited to, granting access to the Site, cooperating in obtaining title insurance, surveys, and easements, and related matters, but such cooperation shall be at no expense to the City.
- 8.2 Upon termination of this Lease, the Site and Improvements shall be returned to the City, normal wear and tear excepted. All costs and expenses necessary for

the repair, maintenance, and operation of the Site shall be the sole responsibility of Lessee or its designee.

- 8.3 In the event the Improvements shall be wholly or partially damaged or destroyed during the term of this Lease, Lessee shall, at its own sole cost and expense, clear the Site of all debris or remains of the damaged or destroyed Facilities and, at its sole option, repair, restore or remove the Improvements within a twelve (12) month period from the time of the damage. Destruction of or damage to the Improvements, or any part of them, shall in no way relieve Lessee from its duties and obligations to pay rent as provided herein.
- 8.4 During the term of this Lease, Lessee shall be responsible for providing, at its own expense, all utilities, including but not limited to lighting, heating, air conditioning, water, gas and electricity, required for the Site and any Improvements, alterations, or additions thereon. Lessee agrees to maintain all portions of the Site, and any Improvements, alterations, or additions thereon, in a safe and clean condition, and not permit any unsightly accumulation of wreckage, debris, or trash.

9. MORTGAGE OR ASSIGNMENT OF THE LEASEHOLD

- 9.1 Lessee shall have the right to encumber by mortgage, security deed, bond covenants, or any other means any of Lessee's rights and interest created by this Lease, but shall not have the right to encumber the City's fee estate. Any such mortgage, security deed, bond covenants, or other security interest shall be subordinate to this Lease. Subordination to this Lease shall be evidenced by a subordination, non-disturbance, and attornment agreement executed by any lender providing financing for construction of the Improvements ("Lender" or "Mortgagee") and the City.
- 9.2 The holder of a leasehold mortgage may enforce its rights under its leasehold mortgage and acquire title to or sell or cause the leasehold estate to be sold in any lawful way; subject however, to all terms, conditions and provisions of this Lease. During such time as a Lender or Mortgagee is the owner and holder of the leasehold estate and Lessee's interest hereunder, whether by foreclosure or otherwise, such interest acquired hereunder shall remain subject to all of the terms, conditions and provisions of this Lease.
- 9.3 Lessee or any Mortgagee succeeding to the rights of Lessee hereunder, or any successor of either thereof, shall have the right to assign its interest in this Lease, the Site, and the Improvements so long as the person or entity receiving such assignment assumes the obligations of Lessee hereunder.

10.

LESSOR'S PROPERTY UPON TERMINATION OF THIS LEASE

Upon termination of this Lease, all rights and interest of Lessee (and all persons whomsoever claiming by, under or through Lessee) in and to the Site shall wholly cease and terminate. The Improvements, including but not limited to, all facilities, gas and electric engines, machinery, generators, boilers, furnaces, elevators, appliances, lighting, radiators, heaters, air conditioning units, all fire escapes, pipes, faucets and other plumbing fixtures, and all carpeting, attached to, or located on or in the Improvements, shall henceforth constitute and belong to and be the absolute property of the City without further act or conveyance, and without liability to make compensation therefore to Lessee or to anyone whatsoever. Except as described above, Lessee or any sublessee of the Site or the Improvements may remove all furniture, personalty, equipment, computers, computer systems, and trade fixtures prior to the expiration date of this Lease.

11. ENVIRONMENTAL

- 11.1 Lessee shall not use, generate, manufacture, produce, temporarily or permanently store, release, discharge or dispose of on, in, about or under the Site or transport to or from the Site any hazardous substances, pollutants, contaminates of whatsoever description prohibited by Federal or Oklahoma law ("Hazardous Materials"), or knowingly allow any other person or entity to do so, other than in compliance with all applicable Federal, State, and local laws, regulations and guidance.
- 11.2 Each of the City and Lessee shall promptly notify the other party should it receive actual notice of, or otherwise become aware of, any (a) pending or threatened environmental regulatory action against the such party or the Site or either party's use or occupancy of the Site or any portion thereof, (b) claims made or threatened by any third party relating to any loss or injury resulting from any Hazardous Material used, generated, stored, disposed or released on, from or into the Site; or (c) the release or discharge, or threatened release or discharge, of any Hazardous Material in, on, under or about the Site.
- 11.3 To the extent required by either the City or Lessee to defend a claim or action brought against the other party or any of such party's officers, employees or agents, each party agrees with the other, to the extent permitted by applicable law, to provide the other party and such party's officers, employees and agents with access to the records and data maintained by the applicable party relevant to the receipt, processing, storage, use, transportation, generation, release and disposal of any Hazardous Materials which are the subject of, or are relevant to, the claim or action in question.
- 11.4 At the expiration or termination of the Lease, Lessee shall leave the Site as free of Hazardous Materials, as existed at the commencement of the Lease term.

12. TAXES AND ASSESSMENTS

Lessee shall pay all real property taxes on the Site and the improvements; all license fees; and any and all other taxes, charges, imports; levies of any nature, whether general or special which may, at any time be imposed by local, State or Federal authorities, or that become a lien upon this Lease or Lessee's activities in, or improvements upon, the Site pursuant to this Lease.

13.

DEFAULT AND REMEDIES

- 13.1 The following shall constitute defaults by Lessee:
 - (a) The failure to pay rent or any other monies owed hereunder when due; and
 - (b) Any other failure in the performance of any covenant or obligation required by this Lease.
- If Lessee defaults, Lessee shall have thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice from the City to cure monetary defaults as required by this Lease. Lessee shall have ninety (90) days after receipt of written notice from the City to cure all other defaults under this Lease, plus such additional time as may be reasonable and necessary under the particular circumstances involved. The City shall give to any Lender or Mortgagee which has executed a subordination agreement as provided in Section 9.1 of this Lease a copy of each notice of default by Lessee at the same time as and whenever such notice of default shall thereafter be given by the City to Lessee. Such notice to Lender or Mortgagee shall be made as provided in Section 19 herein, and it shall be Lessee's obligation and responsibility to provide the City with the proper name and address of its Lender or Mortgagee. Lessee's failure to provide the City with a current name and address for its Lender or Mortgagee shall relieve the City of its obligation to provide such notice in the event of default, each Lender or Mortgagee shall be permitted to remedy such default or cause the same to be remedied within the period of time provided for cure herein. The City shall accept performance by any Lender or Mortgagee of any covenant, condition, or agreement on Lessee's part to be performed hereunder with the same force and effect as though performed by Lessee. No event of default with respect to the performance of work required to be performed, or acts to be done, or conditions to be remedied, shall be deemed to exist so long as such Lender or Mortgagee shall, in good faith, have commenced to cure such matter and to prosecute same to completion with diligence and continuity within the applicable time period provided herein.

- 13.3 If Lessee defaults, the City may utilize anyone or more of the following remedies against Lessee. These remedies shall be considered cumulative and not in the alternative:
 - (a) The City may sue for specific performance.
- (b) The City may sue for all damages incurred by the City including incidental damages, consequential damages, and attorney's fees.
- (c) After the time to cure provided in Section 13.2 has expired, or Lessee has given notice that it does not intend to cure the default, the City may terminate this Lease. The termination of this Lease, however, shall only be effective upon sixty (60) days' prior written notice of same provided by the City to Lessee and to any Lender or Mortgagee which has executed a subordination agreement as provided in Section 9.1 of this Lease. In no event shall this Lease be construed to be terminated unless and until such notice is provided. If this Lease is terminated, Lessee shall continue to be liable for the performance of all terms and conditions and the payment of rents when due hereunder prior to the effective date of said termination in addition to all damages, including reasonable attorney's fees and other expenses of collection, incurred as a result of any default.
- (d) The City may utilize any other remedy provided by law or equity as a result of Lessee's default.
- 13.4 Notwithstanding anything contained herein to the contrary, including the occurrence of any default by Lessee, the City may not terminate this Lease for any reason so long as the term of the GSA Lease shall not have expired.

14. COMPLIANCE WITH RULES AND REGULATIONS

Lessee shall observe and obey applicable rules and regulations promulgated by the City and other appropriate local, State and Federal entities having jurisdiction over the Site. Any rules and regulations promulgated by the City shall be of general application to all property or activities within the jurisdiction of the City and shall not be applicable solely to the Site or the Improvements.

15. INSPECTION

The City may, upon reasonable prior notice to Lessee and any sublessee in possession, inspect the Site and any Improvements or alterations thereon during Lessee's or any sublessee's regular business hours.

16. QUIET ENJOYMENT

The City represents that upon payment of rents when due and upon performance of all other conditions herein, Lessee and any sublessee shall peaceably have, possess and enjoy the Site without hindrance or disturbance from the City.

17. WAIVER

Should Lessee breach any of its obligations hereunder, the City nevertheless may thereafter accept from Lessee any payment or payments due hereunder and continue this Lease in effect, without in any way waiving the City's right to exercise its default rights hereunder, or any other remedies provided by law, for said breach. In addition, any waiver by the City of any default, breach, or omission of Lessee under this Lease shall not be construed as a waiver of any subsequent or different default, breach, or omission.

18. NOTICES

All notices by either party to the other shall be made by depositing such notice in the registered or certified mail of the United States of America, postage prepaid, and such notice shall be deemed to have been served on the date of such depositing correctly addressed in the registered or certified mail.

All notices to the City shall be mailed to:

The parties from time to time may designate in writing changes in the addresses stated by giving notice as set forth herein.

19. SUCCESSORS

The provisions, covenants, and conditions of this Lease shall bind and inure to the benefit of the legal representatives, heirs, successors and assigns of each of the parties.

20. ATTORNEY'S FEES, COSTS AND EXPENSES OF LITIGATION

In the event of a breach of this Lease, the breaching party shall pay to the non-breaching party all reasonable attorney's fees, costs, and other expenses incurred by the non-breaching party in enforcing its rights as a result of said breach.

21. SURRENDER UPON TERMINATION

Upon the expiration or sooner termination of this Lease, for any reason whatsoever, Lessee shall peaceably surrender to the City possession of the Site, together with any Improvements, or fixtures located thereon, without any compensation whatsoever, and free and clear of any claims or interests of Lessee or of any mortgages or third party whose position was derived from or through Lessee.

22. GOVERNING LAW

This Lease shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Oklahoma, except to the extent that Federal law is expressly made applicable to this Lease.

23. HOLDING OVER

If Lessee remains in possession of the Premises after the expiration of this Lease without written renewal thereof, such holding over shall not be deemed as a renewal or extension of this Lease but shall create only a tenancy from month to month which may be terminated at any time by the City or Lessee upon thirty (30) days' written notice. Such holding over shall otherwise be upon the same terms and conditions as set forth in this Lease.

24. GENERAL PROVISIONS OF THIS LEASE

24.1 The captions or titles preceding each section herein are merely for purposes of section identification, convenience and ease of reference, and shall be completely disregarded in the interpretation of this Lease.

- 24.2 Each of the provisions of this Lease shall apply, extend to, be binding upon and inure to the benefit or detriment of the City and Lessee, and to their successors and assigns.
- 24.3 There shall be no renewal or extension of the term of this Lease by operation of law.
- 24.4 Nothing contained in this Lease shall make, or shall be construed to make the City and Lessee partners in, of or joint ventures with each other, nor shall anything contained in the Lease render, or shall be construed to render, either the City or Lessee liable to a third party for the debts or obligations of the other.
- 24.5 Since the Improvements are initially solely for Government use, no advertising matter shall be constructed on or over the Facility or Premises, unless authorized in writing by a GSA Contracting Officer. In the event the GSA Lease terminates, advertising and signage in keeping with the use of the Site and Improvements shall be allowed. During the period of construction of the Improvements the general contractor and any entity providing financing of the Improvements shall be allowed to place signs on the Site regarding their roles as contractor and lender.
- 24.6 This Lease is executed in three (3) counterparts which are separately numbered but each of which is deemed an original, but all of which shall constitute one agreement.
- 24.7 The City and Lessee shall execute a Memorandum of Lease in recordable form at the request of either party to this Lease.
- 24.8 There shall be no merger of this Lease or the leasehold estate in the Site or any part thereof by reason of the same person's acquiring or holding, directly or indirectly, this Lease and the leasehold estate created hereby or any interest in this Lease or in such leasehold estate as well as the fee estate in the Site.

25. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Lease supersedes all prior negotiations, discussions, statements and agreements between the City and Lessee with respect to the Site and Lessee's use and occupancy thereof; no member, officer, employee or agent of the City or Lessee has authority to make, or has made, any statement, agreement representation or contemporaneous agreement, oral or written, in connection herewith, amending, supplementing, modifying, adding to, deleting from or changing the terms and conditions of this Lease. No modification of or amendment to this Lease shall be binding on either party hereto unless such modification or amendment shall be property authorized, in writing, property signed by both parties.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2425 WHICH ESTABLISHED THE BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2012-2013; REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City Council heretofore adopted Ordinance No. 2425 setting forth the Budget for Fiscal Year 2012-2013 beginning July 1, 2012 and ending June 30, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the City Departments and Divisions routinely review their budget appropriations to determine if any changes are necessary; and

WHEREAS, based upon said review the City staff now recommends that certain amendments to the Budget be considered by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has the authority to make amendments to the City Budget under Article 5, Section 5.07 (b) of the new City Charter as well as State law; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the proposed amendment to the FY 2012-2013 Budget, with the revenues and expenditures therein contained, is in the best interest of the City; and therefore, desires to adopt the same by formal action.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1: The proposed amendment to the FY 2012-2013 Budget of the City of McAlester, Oklahoma, as heretofore adopted by Ordinance, as summarized in Exhibit A-1, which is attached hereto and fully incorporated herein by reference, be, and the same hereby are, completely adopted and approved as an amendment to the said FY 2012-2013 Budget.

SECTION 2: All portions of the existing FY 2012-2013 Budget, Ordinance No. 2425 except as specifically herein amended, shall remain in full force and effect, and not be otherwise affected by the adoption of the amendatory ordinance.

SECTION 3: That all other ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of any such conflict or inconsistency and all other ordinances not in conflict herewith shall remain in full force and effect.

<u>SECTION 4</u>: Should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause, phrase, or section of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the

same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision thereof, other than the part or parts as declared to be invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional.

SECTION 5: That an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and for the provision of the public peace, health and safety, by reason whereof it is necessary that all acts take effect immediately and be in full force and effect from, and after the passage and approval.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

In consideration of the mutual promises and benefits to each party this agreement is entered into by and between the MCALESTER PUBLIC WORKS AUTHORITY (hereinafter referred to as "MPWA"), 28 E. Washington, McAlester, Oklahoma 74501 and the Board of Education of Independent School District No. 80, Pittsburg County, Oklahoma (hereinafter referred to as "ISD80") 200 E. Adams Ave. McAlester, Oklahoma 74501. The parties agree to the following terms and understandings:

- The MPWA has been entrusted with the administration of sales tax proceeds derived from McAlester City Ordinance Number 2159. That McAlester City Ordinance Number 2159 generates proceeds to be used for the acquisition, construction or equipment of educational facilities.
- 2. That the MPWA agrees to convey to ISD80 the sum of \$ 350,000.00 from the sales tax proceeds derived from City Ordinance Number 2159, to be used as more specifically described below.
- That the sales tax proceeds conveyed by this agreement shall be used solely for the construction of roofs
 and roofing improvements on and to ISD80's existing educational facilities, within the corporate limits of
 the City of McAlester, Oklahoma.
- 4. That ISD80 agrees to provide quarterly financial reports to the MPWA, accounting for the specific uses of all funds conveyed, until such time as the total sum (\$350,000.00) has been exhausted.

ORDINANCE NO. 2159

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 6.16 OF THE "McALESTER SALES TAX ORDINANCE" BY PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY AND COLLECTION OF A ONE-HALF OF ONE PERCENT (1/2%) SALES TAX; PROVIDING FOR THE PURPOSE THEREOF; APPROVING THE INCURRING OF INDEBTEDNESS ON BEHALF OF THE CITY; PROVIDING FOR NON-REPEALER; PROVIDING THE EFFECTIVE DATE; PROVIDING THAT PROVISIONS ARE CUMULATIVE; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1: Section 6.16 of the "McAlester Sales Tax Ordinance", as amended, hereby is further amended to provide for the levy of an additional one-half of one percent (1/2%) excise tax authorized thereby until July 1, 2018.

SECTION 2: It hereby is declared to be the purpose of the revenues provided by the one-half of one percent (1/2%) excise tax not to exceed one-half thereof, to provide revenues for the purpose of financing the acquisition, construction and equipment of educational facilities on behalf of the City by The McAlester Public Works Authority (the "Authority"), and paying the principal of and interest on indebtedness incurred on behalf of said City for said purpose by the Authority and the balance to provide revenue for economic development by said Authority and paying the principal of and interest on indebtedness incurred by the Authority for said purpose. The incurring of said indebtedness in the principal amount of not to exceed \$16,000,000.000 by the Authority is hereby approved and competitive bidding thereon is waived. Said one-half of one percent (1/2%) sales tax shall cease to be collected on July 1, 2018. In the event of the incurring of any such indebtedness, this Ordinance shall not be subject to repeal until the said indebtedness shall have been paid.

SECTION 3: This Ordinance shall become and be effective on and after March 5, 2003, and only after approval by a majority of the qualified electors of the City of McAlester, Oklahoma, voting on separate propositions, one relating to a one-fourth of one percent (1/4%) excise tax for education and the other relating to a one-fourth of one percent (1/4%) excise tax for economic development, and approving either or both of the same in the manner prescribed by law. In the event only one proposition is approved, only a one-fourth of one percent (1/4%) excise tax shall be levied for the approved purpose.

SECTION 4: The provisions hereof shall be cumulative and in addition to any and all other taxing provisions of City ordinances.

SECTION 5: The provisions of this Ordinance are severable, and if any part or provision hereof shall be adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such adjudication shall not affect or impair any of the remaining parts or provisions hereof.

SECTION 6: The provisions hereof shall be cumulative and in addition to any and all other taxing provisions of ordinances of the City.

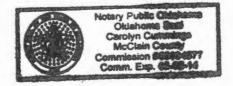

1. THIS LEASE is entered into by and between CITY OF MCALESTER, OKLAHOMA whose interest in the property hereinafter described is that of owner, hereby referred to as LESSOR, and the United States of America, hereinafter referred to as the GOVERNMENT or FAA:

WITNESSETH: The Parties hereto, and for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, covenant and agree as follows:

2. DESCRIPTION (10/96) - The LESSOR hereby leases to the GOVERNMENT the following described premises: Approximately 280 square feet of rentable space for installed Government-owned equipment in Room 113/Telco Room, as shown on Drawing MLC-AFSS-A-1, hereinafter referred to as Exhibit "A", in the building located at 102 Airport Rd. McAlester, OK 74501, at McAlester Municipal Airport, McAlester, Oklahoma.

LESSOR also grants to the GOVERNMENT a cable easement extending from Room 113 under the raised floor to a connection bulkhead under the floor in the Room 114/Automation Room, and continuing under the floor to antennas located on Tower No. 2, as identified on Drawing MLC-D-AFSSBL-350, hereinafter referred to as Exhibit "B".

LESSOR also grants to the GOVERNMENT the right to access Room 122/Mechanical Room at all times to ensure the proper operation of the equipment in the Telco Room.

The Government's use of the leased premises and the easements granted herein shall be related to the FAA's activities in support of Air Traffic operations.

- 3. TERM (1/01) To have and to hold, for the term commencing on February 1, 2013, and continuing through September 30, 2022, inclusive, PROVIDED that adequate appropriations are available from year to year for the payment of rentals.
- 4. CANCELLATION (8/02) -The GOVERNMENT may terminate this lease at any time, in whole or in part, if the Real Estate Contracting Officer (RECO) determines that a termination is in the best interest of the Government, by giving at least ninety (90) days' notice in writing to the LESSOR. No rental will accrue after the effective date of termination. Said notice will be computed commencing with the day after the date of mailing.
- 5. 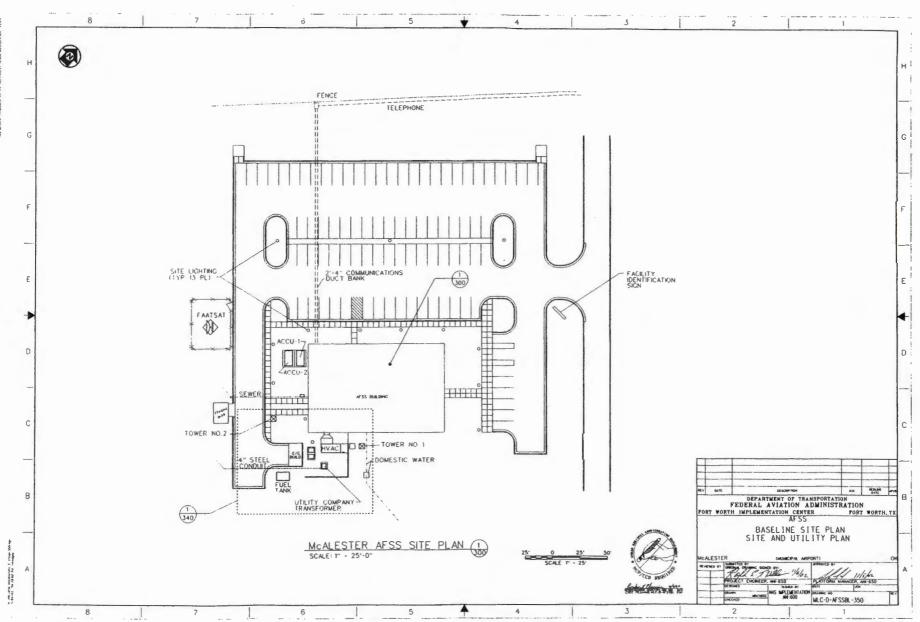

City Manager Report to the Council

January 22, 2013

Business

- City Council Workshop on the Master Drainage Plan, 9th. and Illinois is scheduled for Tuesday, January 29, 2013 for 5:30pm. at Kiamichi Vocational Center.
- City Council Workshop on Tourism is tentatively scheduled for February 5, 2012 at 5:30pm. in the Council Chambers at City Hall.
- Sales Tax revenue for the month was down \$172,041 compared to the same time period last year. This is a substantial decrease when one takes into account that this reflects the Christmas shopping season. Since the tax commission sent the figures to the Cities, they have discovered a glitch in the system and anticipate new figures to be sent out this week. We will not know until later in the week if this glitch affects our revenues. The Tax Commission has updated the numbers for the reporting period. An additional deposit will be sent in the amount of \$38,369 and additional Use Tax in the amount of \$7,246. This remains \$133,672 under budget as compared to last year's information.
- The Mayor and Council requested an update on the Dura-Patcher at the Council meeting held on January 8, 2013. As I had previously reported the machine was parked for routine preventive maintenance and cleaning during November. During this time staff determined that it was in the best interest of the City to have the Street Department assist the Utility Maintenance Department in repairing street cuts due to water and sewer line breaks. The Street Department will be assisting Utility Maintenance until January 28, 2013. Weather permitting the Dura Patcher will be back on the streets full-time January 28, 2013. The work sheets that are generated for the Dura-Patcher on a daily basis have been received and we will have a mapping handout for the Council at the meeting on January 22.
- Pride In McAlester has scheduled a meeting on January 25, 2013 with City staff and Allied Waste to determine if curb side recycling is feasible. Allied Waste is familiar with curb side recycling and we are anxious to see if this model can be adapted to our City.

- The Recycling Center continues to grow in popularity. During the Christmas season the community was encouraged to recycle at the Center which they did with enthusiasm. Due to the inclement weather, the bailer breaking down and the Christmas season, the Center was quickly overrun with recyclables. Kibois has responded with a separate crew focusing entirely on the bailing of cardboard. In addition, several new crew members have been added to clean the site up.
- There is a growing interest in the City to establish a dog park. The City Staff is working with the McAlester Public Schools for a location and have identified land at "B" and Seneca as a possibility. Due to the cost of establishing a dog park, Pam Kirby is investigating to see if any grants are available. The biggest cost associated with establishing a dog park is the 5 foot fencing that would be required.
- Community gardens are becoming increasingly popular across the country. The City Staff is working again with McAlester Public Schools for a location and have identified Eugene Fields as a possibility. David Cantrell from the OSU Extension office has volunteered his time to test the soil conditions at the location. This will assist in determining if this is a viable option for a community garden.
- The 8" water line for the Steven Taylor Industrial Park that provides service to Hampel Oil has been installed. Final inspection will be completed in the very near future and any remaining action items will be documented and completed.
- The design of the Mallard and Flamigo drainage crossing is 60% complete. Staff
 anticipates having the design completed in the next 30 days. Meshak & Associates
 are assisting the City in the design and engineering.
- Merrill Lynch, the company that handles the Cities 457B account has announced that they will no longer manage retail accounts for public entities. 457B accounts are a personal option for employees to contribute tax deferred monies directly from their paychecks. The City does not match any contribution to these accounts. We are investigating our options as to who can manage these accounts in the future.
- I am attending the City Managers Association scheduled Winter Conference for January 16th. 18th. in Stillwater.
- The Pavement Management report is currently being reviewed and staff anticipates having the summary available to the Council at the meeting on January 22, 2013.

- The Fire Department has been working with Larry Morgan, KEDDO, to research used fire fighting equipment that would be useful for the City. The Department of Forestry has given the City a Dodge 1 ton 4x4 pickup with 21,000 miles in very good condition. This vehicle is setup and ideal for off road fire suppression.
- Fire Chief Brewer and Police Captain Wansick traveled to Jenks on January 14, 2013 to discuss their Emergency Management Procedures in responding to school related emergencies. Chief Brewer and Captain Wansick will be sharing this information with our SWAT team and McAlester Public Schools to develop a similar plan for McAlester. This plan will identify how Fire and Police respond to school emergencies.

Labor Issues:

- Fraternal Order of Police (FOP)
 - The arbitration hearing on Officer Munholland's reprimand was heard on January 9, 2013. A decision will be rendered in approximately 45 days.
 - The arbitration hearing on Officer Morris's safety vest violation has been heard by the arbitrator and both the FOP and City have submitted their briefs. A decision will be rendered in approximately 21 days.
 - Grievance 11-15-12: New Evaluation System. This relates to measuring the activity or work of our Police Officers.
 - No new grievances received since the last report.

- International Association of Fire Fighters (IAFF)
 - Federal Mediation has been scheduled for February 12, 2013 to hear the grievances between the IAFF and the City. Both parties will present their information to the mediator who will make a determination on the grievance. Neither party is held to the determination and can accept or decline the decision. All information obtained in the mediation cannot be used in the grievance procedure if the grievance proceeds forward.
 - Grievance with Arbitration Requested 11-26-12: Facial Hair. This relates to the SCBA face mask being tightly sealed to the face.
 - Grievance with Arbitration Requested 11-26-12: Hours Worked per Pay Period. This relates to the 27 day work cycle for Firefighters.
 - Grievance with Arbitration Requested 11-26-12: Duty Exchange. This relates to Fire Recruits being allowed Duty Exchange during the probationary period.
 - No new grievances received since the last report.
