Scheduled Business

Presentation of the annual Audited Financial Statement and Independent Auditor's 1. Report for Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2012. (Toni Ervin, CFO and Mike Gibson, Gibson, Cole & Reed)

Mike Gibson addressed the Council commenting that this was his firms second year to perform the audit, which made the second audit a little easier. He informed the Council that this year's audit consisted of two (2) parts. The City's financial statements and a compliance audit over the major federal programs. He commented that with the financial statements the firm had an unqualified opinion. He stated that with the Federal Program Audit had two (2) programs that were audited. Which were the Airport Improvement program and the FEMA Public Assistance program. He stated that there had been no material findings with the two (2) programs but they did note that on the Airport Improvement Program there had been some required quarterly reporting that had not been done in a timely manner. He explained that they had to issue a finding on that but, the City has corrected that finding by filing all of the reports prior to the issuance of the Audit opinion. He added that procedures had been put in place that should prevent that going forward. He then thanked Ms. Ervin and her staff for the cooperation they had received.

There was a brief discussion among the Council and Mr. Gibson regarding any changes in the City's procedures, the use of an outside firm to help prepare the financial statements, if a management letter had been included, and what would be considered as a reasonable completion date.

Mr. Gibson informed the Council the Audit would be on file with the State Auditor tomorrow if the Council accepted the Audit tonight.

Steve Foster, Chairman of the Audit & Finance Advisory Committee requested more detail of what the auditor's were looking at during the audit.

There was no vote on this item.

2. Presentation of the 5-Year Capital Improvements Plan for FY 2013/14-2017/18. (Peter J. Stasiak, City Manager)

Manager Stasiak informed the Council that they had been given the 5-Year Capital Improvements Plan for FY 2013/2014-2017/2018. He explained that staff had tried to give the top priorities by department and the proposed plan for the up coming year was a little over \$2.8 million. He then reviewed the top priorities for each department. He added that the City had been fortunate over the past three (3) years and had been able to replace equipment.

There was a brief discussion among the Council and Manager Stasiak regarding the Washington Street Bridge, the Street rehab/reconstruction program, if the funding included projected sales tax revenue from the coming election and how the City projected the funding for the Plan.

Citizen's Comments on Non-agenda Items

Stephanie Giacomo, Executive Director of Pride In McAlester addressed the Council informing them that Pride's Spring Cleanup would begin April 6th and continue the following dates 7, 13, 14, 20, 21 and 27, 2013. She then distributed the first round of flyers.

Dr. Larry Morgan with KEDDO informed the Council that the City of McAlester had moved from a class 4 ISO rating to a class 3 rating. He explained that he had been contacted by the State Insurance Offices last Friday. He added that this had been a lengthy process and would benefit the City's image, the businesses and schools. He commented that there would be an approximate 3% drop in insurance.

There was a brief discussion among the Council, Dr. Morgan and Chief Brewer concerning the number of class 3 fire departments in the state of Oklahoma, when this would go into effect, what this rating was based on, if the 911 Service had been updated, what it would take to improve the rating and the reception that had been scheduled for Wednesday, March 13, 2013.

Ginny Webb, Executive Director of McAlester Main Street Association addressed the Council informing them of the Chili's Fund Raiser, their work with Pride painting the lights and benches downtown and their plans to implement the downtown Streetscape funds with a grant from Modern Woodman in early April. Ms. Webb thanked the Parks Department for their advice and assistance in the planning process.

He added that they would follow the Council's lead.

There was discussion among the Council, Manager Stasiak and Mr. Keith regarding the funding of the brochure, the quality of the brochure and the map in the past, the current level of the Hotel/Motel tax and the apparent duplication of some activities in the City.

He commented on the amount of work that had gone into this matter and every citizen in the City would benefit from the rating. He reported that the Utilities Department had mobilized for the Residual Handling at the Water Plant. He then updated the Council on the City's financial status. He explained that currently the focus was to maintain services and Public safety. He informed the Council that he planned to bring them details at the March 26th Council meeting and in the next couple of days he would be realigning the personnel structure of some of the departments in the City.

Councilman Read asked what Manager Stasiak attributed the fall in water sales to. He also stated that he did not support furloughs or layoffs in critical positions, anyone that had to report in emergency situations.

Councilman Titsworth asked if the number of water accounts was down and if the water sales for fracking were down.

Councilman Karr inquired about the number of apartments that had been built recently.

Manager Stasiak commented that the number was not down but the there was no usage in many of the accounts, Rural Water District #5 had previously had a leak for about ten (10) months and those figures had been used for budgeting and there had been a reduction in oil and gas related water sales. Manager Stasiak commented that ninety-five (95) new units had been built on West Street.

Remarks and Inquiries by City Council

Councilman Smith congratulated the people that had worked on the ISO rating and that it was a move in the right direction.

Councilmen Titsworth, Read, Karr and Vice-Mayor Mason did not have any comments for the evening.

Mayor's Comments and Committee Appointments

Mayor Harrison had no comments for the evening.

Mayor Harrison asked for a motion to recess the Regular Meeting to convene the Authorities. Councilman Smith moved to recess the Regular Meeting and convene the Authorities. The motion was seconded by Councilman Titsworth.



Background Information for McAlester Main Street Board Request

McAlester Main Street's contract with the City of McAlester reads:

"In support of McAlester Main Street Association's normal cost of operations, the City will pay to MMSA a minimum amount of \$28,000.00 during the term of this Contract in monthly payments of \$2,333.33 to assist MMSA in accomplishing its goals."

McAlester Main Street did not have a director from July through October 2012. The McAlester Main Street Board has calculated City Contributions from July through October 2012 to be in excess of expenses during the same period by \$4,500, as shown below:

2013 Pavement Management Program - Phase II Revised Proposal

Dear Mr. Modzelewski;

IMS Infrastructure Management Services is pleased to submit our proposal to perform the second phase of the pavement management program for the City of McAlester. IMS proposes to test the remaining portion of the City's street network not included in the 2012 testing, analyze data with PavePRO Manager software and develop a hard copy report.

For your review, we have also provided cost information on IMS's ROWMan asset inventory software which utilizes data collected during the RST pavement condition survey. The ROWMan software is integrated with the PavePRO Manager software to provide easy access to all asset data, both pavement and ROW features. Signs, signals, pavement striping, pavement markings, sidewalks, ADA ramps, curb & gutter, trees and more can be extracted as part of the current project. However, IMS can retain the GPS referenced digital video so that the City can have the option of extracting these ROW assets in the future without incurring the additional expense of re-driving the streets.

The proposed pavement management program will accurately reflect current conditions. This street information along with optional ROW data collected by IMS and/or City staff can be used to meet many of the reporting requirements of the GASB 34 "modified approach". IMS' automated data collection can provide a cost-effective approach to expand the pavement management software into a complete asset management program.

A brief description of the elements of the proposed program with corresponding fee schedule and cost summary is included on the following pages.

PROJECT APPROACH

Surface Condition Survey

Surveys are completed using the Road Surface Tester (RST). The City will receive a continuous, objective,



and accurate survey of the surface condition of the street network. These network-level surveys with intersection-to-intersection test sections will be linked to the City's GIS. The RST provides a great deal of flexibility and can easily adjust test section lengths to meet any previously established test sections or other City goals. Single-direction testing is usually performed on the two-lane streets. Two-direction testing is recommended for use on divided streets and arterials and collectors with four or more lanes of traffic. The

surface condition survey is conducted continuously over the entire length of the test section and is not based on sample sections. The information gathered in this survey includes inventory, roughness, rut depth, cracking, and texture. The effects of environmental conditions will be considered in conjunction with the surface condition survey.

To provide the City with a ROW asset data collection option, IMS will collect continuous digital video during the surface condition survey. The RST combines an inertial navigation guidance system with GPS to geolocate visible pavement and ROW features. The simultaneous pavement and ROW asset data collection capability of the RST is unique in the industry. It provides an efficient and cost-effective means to populate both pavement and asset management systems.

The presence of any failed or broken concrete slabs within a test section will be recorded for further detailed identification during the deflection survey. IMS crews will use the City-identified definition of failed/broken slabs as the basis for our rating. The number of failed slabs will be recorded during the deflection survey and used by PavePRO Manager Software to give the City an option to address individual slab removal and replacement as a maintenance/rehabilitation strategy for concrete pavements. If the City elects to use a surface only approach on all or some portion of the street network, the slab survey would be performed as a separate activity on identified concrete pavements.

Digital Images (Optional)

In conjunction with the surface condition survey, each test section is recorded on GPS referenced digital video with forward and rearward directed video cameras and used as part of IMS' Quality Control and

Quality Assurance procedures. Additional cameras can be used to expand the viewing area or include features of special interest to the City. IMS can provide jpeg images at City specified intervals (e.g. 10' or 25') for viewing in PavePRO Manager and/or through the City's GIS. Many agencies find these images valuable as a "point-in-time" record of their roads and as a source of information for a variety of engineering, legal/investigative, and administrative uses. They can also be beneficial in assessing damage from a natural disaster or unforeseen event.




IMS uses an automated image capture process that is cost effective and has developed an image module for the PavePRO Manager software. This enhancement allows for the attachment of digital images to each test section. The user can then access all the pavement management data from a selected block and view multiple digital images for the identified section on his/her computer monitor. The digital images can be captured directly from the continuous video performed as part of the RST survey, generated from a Cityowned digital cameras, and/or result from scanned photos or drawings.

Pavement Management Hard Copy Report

IMS will also provide the City with a hard copy pavement management report similar to the report prepared for the 2012 pavement survey. IMS will use the PavePRO Manager software to generate a series of pavement management reports individualized to the City needs. Field data and digital images will be provided in a database and delivered in a CD format with the hard copy report. The IMS pavement management report will permit the City of McAlester to investigate several different scenarios regarding traffic, budgets, rehabilitation strategies, etc. and their effect on pavement performance levels and budgets.

Right-of-Way Asset Management System (Optional)

Although the pavement management software provides for pavement inventory, IMS can provide ROW



asset management software for the acquisition of additional pavement and ROW features. Signs and supports, trees, sidewalks, ADA ramps, curbs and gutters, inlets, manholes, pavement markings, pavement and ROW hardware, trees, and more can be included to a level of detail determined by the City. Data collection for the expanded inventory can be performed simultaneously with the surface condition survey using IMS's Laser RST or through a variety of techniques using City and/or IMS staff. This software is integrated with the pavement management software and will meet the requirements of GASB Statement 34.

COST SUMMARY

The following cost summary includes evaluating 63 miles of streets not tested in the 2012 survey. It is based on a street network of 148 miles less the 85 miles invoiced in 2012. Digital images and digital video storage are based on the entire 148 mile network.

Budget estimates for ROW assets are more difficult to develop because of unlimited scenarios and unknown quantities. Having performed sign surveys for a number of different county, city, and state agencies, we find that the number of signs ranged from 30 to 109 per mile. Other assets (e.g. sidewalks, light poles, hydrants, inlets, etc.) vary dramatically from agency to agency and district to district within the City depending on age, terrain, etc. Since there are some advantages to extracting multiple assets during the extraction activity, IMS will try to assist the City in developing a budget by offering a cost per mile alternative, in addition to or in lieu of the cost per asset previously referenced. We will need the City to provide one or more scenarios that include the various assets or features that would be included in the extraction process. We will then provide the City with a cost per mile to extract the requested assets. We believe that this alternative can assist the City in the budget process and eliminate surprises. If the City has a good estimate of the quantity of some of their assets, the unit price referenced in the fee schedule offer may be the best approach.

Services are provided on a unit-price basis and the City will be charged only for the actual number of miles tested or assets extracted and included in the database. The fee schedule is submitted with the assumption that the City of McAlester will provide or assist IMS with the following information and services:

- Street list and GIS centerline file of roads to be surveyed complete with functional classifications.
- Pavement widths in GIS
- Notification and coordination with other departments or agencies, if necessary.

ORDINANCE NO.	

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO CENTERPOINT ENERGY RESOURCES CORP., D/B/A/ CENTERPOINT ENERGY OKLAHOMA GAS, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, FOR A PERIOD OF TWENTY-FIVE YEARS FROM APPROVAL AND ACCEPTANCE OF THIS ORDINANCE, A NON-EXCLUSIVE FRANCHISE AND RIGHT TO ENTER THE PUBLIC WAYS TO INSTALL, OPERATE AND MAINTAIN A DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM ALONG, ACROSS, OVER AND UNDER THE PUBLIC WAYS FOR THE TRANSPORTATION. DISTRIBUTION AND SALE OF GAS CONSUMERS AND THE PUBLIC GENERALLY IN THE CITY OF MCALESTER: DEFINING THE WORDS AND PHRASES THEREIN: PROVIDING FOR USE AND REPAIR OF THE PUBLIC WAYS; PROVIDING FOR REGULATION OF SERVICE; ESTABLISHING DEPTH OF PIPELINES; ESTABLISHING RIGHTS AND DUTIES IN THE MOVEMENT AND ALTERATION OF PIPELINES: PROVIDING FOR GRANTEE'S RULES AND REGULATIONS; REQUIRING GRANTEE TO PAY A FRANCHISE FEE of (2%) OF GROSS SALES; PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION OF THIS ORDINANCE TO AN ELECTION OF THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE CITY; PROVIDING FOR ACCEPTANCE OF FRANCHISE BY GRANTEE AND OPERATIVE DATE THEREOF: AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MCALESTER, OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS.

As used in this Ordinance, the following words and phrases shall have the following meanings:

- A. "Consumer" shall mean any individual person, corporation, company, partnership, firm, unincorporated association, trust, municipality or public corporation served by the Grantee in the City of McAlester, through any use of the public ways.
- B. "Distribution system" shall mean a system of works, pipes, pipelines, apparatus, machinery, structures, appliances and appurtenances as are reasonably necessary for the transportation, distribution or sale of gas to consumers.
- C. "Franchise" shall mean the rights and privileges granted by Grantor to Grantee under Section 2A of this Ordinance.
- D. "Grantee" shall mean CenterPoint Energy Resources Corp., d/b/a/ CenterPoint Energy Oklahoma Gas, a corporation, its successors and assigns.

- E. "Grantor" shall mean the City of McAlester, Oklahoma, a municipal corporation.
- F. "Gross receipts" shall mean cash, cash equivalents, or other considerations actually received by Grantee from a Consumer.
- G. "Install, operate and maintain" shall mean to acquire, erect, construct, install, extend, repair, remove, relocate, replace, or otherwise operate and maintain.
- H. "Public ways" shall mean any street, alley, avenue, boulevard, lane, park, parkway, sidewalk, driveway, utility easement, right of way, and any other public ways, places, areas, or grounds within the corporate limits of the City of McAlester as now constituted or as may be added or extended hereafter.

SECTION 2. GRANT OF FRANCHISE

- A. The Grantor hereby grants to Grantee for the term of twenty-five (25) years from the passage of this Ordinance and the filing of a written acceptance by the Grantee, the right to enter upon the public ways to install, operate and maintain a distribution system along, across, over and under the public ways for the privilege of transporting, distributing and selling gas to consumers and the public generally within the corporate limits of the City of McAlester.
- B. This Ordinance shall have the effect of and shall be a contract between Grantor and Grantee and shall be the measure of the rights and liabilities of Grantor as well as Grantee.
- C. The franchise granted by this Ordinance is not exclusive and nothing herein shall be construed to divest the Grantor of its control and regulation of the public ways.

SECTION 3. USE AND REPAIR OF THE PUBLIC WAYS

- A. Grantee's distribution system shall be erected, placed, laid or otherwise installed, operated and maintained in such a manner as will, consistent with reasonable necessity, least interfere with other public uses of the public ways.
- B. After any excavation in a public way by Grantee, Grantee shall with due diligence and dispatch place the public way in a condition in compliance with the Grantor's reasonable standards and specifications.
- C. Upon Grantee's failure to commence or complete any construction, maintenance or restoration work required by this Ordinance with due diligence and dispatch, the Grantor may cause such work to be done after written notice to Grantee, given so as to afford Grantee an opportunity to commence and complete such work within a reasonable time. The cost of such construction, maintenance or restoration incurred by Grantor upon Grantee's failure after notice shall then be charged and collected from the Grantee.
- D. Grantor reserves the right to make and enforce reasonable regulations concerning the construction, operation and maintenance of Grantee's distribution system located along,

across, over, or under the public ways and to reasonably designate where the distribution system's works and pipelines shall be placed within such public ways.

SECTION 4. REGULATION OF SERVICE

The distribution system of the Grantee shall at all times be installed, operated and maintained in such condition as will enable the Grantee to furnish adequate and continuous service as required by the orders, rules and regulations of the Corporation Commission of Oklahoma or other regulatory authority having jurisdiction.

SECTION 5. DEPTH OF PIPELINE

After the operative date of this franchise, Grantee's main or lateral lines installed or replaced in public ways shall be installed or replaced at depths which comply with all applicable state and federal rules and regulations establishing minimum safety standards for the design, construction, maintenance and operation of pipelines. Depth shall be measured from the lower of existing grade or proposed future grade as set forth on plans or other specifications existing at the time such lines are installed or replaced.

SECTION 6. DUTY TO MOVE OR ALTER LINES

- A. Grantor reserves the right to lay or permit to be laid cables, electric conduits, water, sewer, gas or other pipelines and to do or permit to be, done any underground work deemed necessary and proper by the Grantor, along, across, over or under the public ways.
- B. Whenever by reason of establishing a grade or changes in the grade of any street or in the location or manner of construction of any public way, cables, electric conduits, water, sewer, gas or other underground structures, it shall be deemed necessary by the Grantor to alter, change, adapt or conform the distribution system of the Grantee, such alterations or changes shall be made within a reasonable time by the Grantee, as ordered in writing by the Grantor, without claim for reimbursement or compensation for damages against Grantor.
- C. If Grantor shall require the Grantee to adapt or conform its distribution system, or in any way to alter, relocate or change its property to enable any other person, firm corporation or entity (whether public or private), other than the Grantor, to use the public ways, the Grantee shall be reimbursed by the person, firm, corporation or entity desiring or occasioning such change for any and all loss, cost or expense occasioned thereby.
- D. "Person," "firm," "corporation," and "entity" as used in the preceding Paragraph shall not include regular departments of the Grantor, or any trust or authority formed by or for the benefit of Grantor for public utility purposes, but shall include any other agency or authority of the City of McAlester, whether acting in a governmental or non-governmental capacity, including, but not limited to, any urban renewal authority, or any other agency or authority, which as a part of its program clears whole tracts of land within the city limits and relocates citizens for the purpose of urban development or similar aims.

SECTION 7. GRANTEE'S RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Grantee shall have the right to make and enforce such reasonable rules and regulations as it may deem necessary for the extension of its facilities, the sale of its gas and the prudent conduct of its business, provided that such rules and regulations shall neither be in conflict with the laws of the State of Oklahoma, with the orders, rules or regulations of the Corporation Commission of Oklahoma or other regulatory authority having jurisdiction, nor with the ordinances and regulations of the Grantor insofar as they are consistent with the jurisdiction of the Corporation Commission of Oklahoma or such other regulatory authority.

SECTION 8. CONSIDERATION FOR FRANCHISE: FRANCHISE FEE

- A. In consideration for the rights and privileges enjoyed under the franchise, Grantee agrees to pay Grantor, as a franchise fee, a sum equal to two percent (2%) of Grantee's gross receipts from the sale of gas for consumption and use within the corporate limits of the City of McAlester. Such fee so levied shall be in lieu of all other franchise, license or occupation taxes or fees which may be levied or attempted to be levied by Grantor.
- B. Grantee's franchise fee shall be payable monthly on or before the 25th day of each month, on its gross receipts of the preceding calendar month.

SECTION 9. ELECTION REQUIRED

This Ordinance shall not become effective until it shall be approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon residing within the corporate limits of the City of McAlester at an election called for that purpose, and a special election is hereby called for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors residing in said City of McAlester, the question of approval or disapproval of this Ordinance, which election shall be held on the __ day of ______, 2013, between the hours prescribed by law. The Mayor of the City of McAlester is hereby authorized and directed to issue a proper and lawful call and proclamation of such special election to be held on such date as aforesaid for said purpose, and the executive officers of said City are hereby directed to give due and lawful notice of such election and submission of said question to the electors of said City, prescribing in said proclamation and notice of the proposition to be voted upon, the time of opening and closing the polls, the number and location of the polling places and the names of the precinct election officers who shall conduct said election, and all other things prescribed by law, or the ordinances of the City of McAlester, Oklahoma.

SECTION 10. ACCEPTANCE AND EFFECTIVE DATE

In the event this Ordinance is approved by a majority vote of said electors voting thereon at said election, the Grantee shall file with the City Clerk of said City of McAlester, within ten (10) days after the official canvass of the votes and declaration by the City Council of the results thereof, a written acceptance. This Ordinance shall become operative on the date of filing of such acceptance.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2425 WHICH ESTABLISHED THE BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2012-2013; REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City Council heretofore adopted Ordinance No. 2425 setting forth the Budget for Fiscal Year 2012-2013 beginning July 1, 2012 and ending June 30, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the City Departments and Divisions routinely review their budget appropriations to determine if any changes are necessary; and

WHEREAS, based upon said review the City staff now recommends that certain amendments to the Budget be considered by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has the authority to make amendments to the City Budget under Article 5, Section 5.07 (b) of the new City Charter as well as State law; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the proposed amendment to the FY 2012-2013 Budget, with the revenues and expenditures therein contained, is in the best interest of the City; and therefore, desires to adopt the same by formal action.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1: The proposed amendment to the FY 2012-2013 Budget of the City of McAlester, Oklahoma, as heretofore adopted by Ordinance, as summarized in Exhibit A-1 thru A-4, which is attached hereto and fully incorporated herein by reference, be, and the same hereby are, completely adopted and approved as an amendment to the said FY 2012-2013 Budget.

SECTION 2: All portions of the existing FY 2012-2013 Budget, Ordinance No. 2425 except as specifically herein amended, shall remain in full force and effect, and not be otherwise affected by the adoption of the amendatory ordinance.

SECTION 3: That all other ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of any such conflict or inconsistency and all other ordinances not in conflict herewith shall remain in full force and effect.

<u>SECTION 4</u>: Should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause, phrase, or section of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the

same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision thereof, other than the part or parts as declared to be invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional.

SECTION 5: That an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and for the provision of the public peace, health and safety, by reason whereof it is necessary that all acts take effect immediately and be in full force and effect from, and after the passage and approval.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2.67, OF THE McALESTER CODE OF ORDINANCES; MORE PARTICULARLY BY AMENDING SECTION 1, "APPLICATION FOR USE OF SICK LEAVE BANK", ITEM "A" AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA, that:

SECTION 1: Section 2.67 of the Personnel Policies is hereby amended by adding the following language:

Application for use of Sick Leave Bank

a. Employees with eighteen (18) months, or more, of continuous service that have exhausted all of their sick, <u>vacation and comp</u> leave and are experiencing a serious, long-term illness or a serious, long-term illness of his spouse, child or parents may submit a request to the Personnel Department for time from the Sick Leave Bank. The request shall be made on the form provided and include a doctor's statement, explaining the nature of the illness and the anticipated date for return to work. The request shall be reviewed by a Division Directors Committee consisting of three members appointed by the City Manager to determine the validity of the request.

SECTION 2: Conflicting ordinances repealed.

All ordinances that are in conflict with the Personnel Policies as herein adopted are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3: Emergency Clause.

That an emergency is hereby declared to exist for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety by reason whereof it is necessary that this Act take effect immediately and be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

PASSED and the EMERGENCY CLAUSE ruled on separately this 26th day of March 2013.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2.67 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES; MORE PARTICULARLY PERSONNEL POLICIES SECTION 3.01, "VACATION LEAVE"; AND SECTION 3.02, "SICK LEAVE"; WHICH IS INCORPORATED INTO SECTION 2.67 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA, that:

City Manager Report to the Council

March 26, 2013

Business

- The City continues to experience a downward trend in sales tax receipts for the current year. March's reimbursement which covers the period from January 15th thru February 15th were down approximately 16%. Toni Ervin has analyzed the top 200 reimbursements from OTC and compared these current numbers to past collections. There is no clear trend as to what area of sales tax is being effected. The decline appears to be occurring in all areas of the City.
- The first Southeast Hunting and Fishing EXPO was held March 8th, 9th, and 10th. The promoter of the event was very pleased with the staff, facility and attendance at the event. He has verbally committed to returning in 2014. A total of 2,085 citizens attended the event over the three day period.
- AquaTerra Inc. has completed the methane gas remediation plan for the McAlester Landfill. The plan has been forwarded to the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality for approval.
- The Engineer for the Royal Oaks Subdivision has submitted the final plat to Engineering for review. Upon Engineering review and approval, the plat will be forwarded on to the Planning and Zoning Committee in April for review and recommendation to the City Council. This subdivision is located at 9th and Highway 69 and will incorporate 36 single family building lots.
- The Mallard and Flamingo drainage reconstruction bidding documents have been issued. The bid opening is scheduled for April 9, 2013.
- A walk through of the Armory building was completed with ODEQ to determine
 that all areas of remediation is being addressed in the bid proposal. ODEQ
 anticipates awarding the contract for cleanup in early April 2013 with work to
 begin in late April. ODEQ anticipates all work to be completed within 45 to 60
 days from the time that a Notice to Proceed is given.

- Previously, the Council condemned the City owned property located on Springer.
 The Fire Department has been utilizing this house for training before it is demolished. The house is being utilized for interior fire tactics along with Fire Fighter rescue training. The City recently purchased a smoke machine and this machine is proving to be very valuable in simulating interior fire rescue. Training is expected to be completed this week and then the house will be removed.
- The McAlester Police Department, Pittsburg County Sheriff Department, Choctaw Nation Tribal Police, Krebs Police Department and the Kiowa Police Department have teamed up to create the first ever True Grit 5K Run. This run is a timed obstacle course that is developed on the land between the EXPO and Soft Ball fields. The proceeds from the event will benefit the McAlester Special Response Team (SRT), Pittsburg County Special Operations Team (SOT), Main Street Association and the Old Town Association. In addition to the 5K run, a car show will be associated with the event with cars from law enforcement across the state. The event is scheduled for 10:00am on April 27th. 2013.

Labor Issues:

- Fraternal Order of Police (FOP)
 - The arbitration hearing on Officer Munholland's reprimand was heard on January 9, 2013. A decision will be rendered in the near future.
 - Grievance 11-15-12: New Evaluation System. This relates to measuring the activity or work of our Police Officers.
 - The City and the FOP have met to begin negotiations for the upcoming fiscal year. At this time the FOP is finalizing their request to the City for consideration.
 - No new grievances received since the last report.
- International Association of Fire Fighters (IAFF)

The following grievances are scheduled for arbitration or will be scheduled in the near future:

- Grievance with Arbitration Requested 11-26-12: Facial Hair. This relates to the SCBA face mask being tightly sealed to the face. **The IAFF and the**
- City will be working on verbage to the Rules and Regulations for implementation.

- Grievance with Arbitration Requested 11-26-12: Hours Worked per Pay Period. This relates to the 27 day work cycle for Firefighter.
- Grievance with Arbitration Requested 11-26-12: Duty Exchange. This relates to Fire Recruits being allowed Duty Exchange during the probationary period.
- Grievance submitted for Minimum Complement. This relates to the equipment and clothing issued to new Fire Fighters. This grievance was not settled during Mediation in February.
- Mandatory Respirator Evaluation & Fit Test for SCBA mask. The IAFF and the City will be working on verbage to the CBA for implementation. No new update.
- No new grievances received since the last report.
- The IAFF and City met for negotiations for the 2013 2014 fiscal year on March 15, 2013. A brief discussion was completed on the financial condition of the City. The IAFF and the City agreed to set another date in the near future and to bring each sides proposal in writing. A list of dates has been provided to the IAFF and a second meeting will be scheduled for negotiations.
