Citizen's Comments on Non-agenda Items

Pamela Smith-Jeffries and Jamie Padford-Gresham addressed the Council explaining the recent change in private ambulance services in the City of McAlester.

Regina Peoples, Executive Director Pride In McAlester addressed the Council updating them on the groups activities during October. Thanks to donated paint from H.I.S. Coatings and a supply stipend from Lowe's Home Improvement, the building on Carl Albert Parkway looks much better.



PIM continued to offer free cooking oil recycling at the Pride In McAlester Flea Market located at 319 E. Choctaw Avenue.






Eyeglasses Recycling

ORDINANCE NO. ____

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2501 WHICH ESTABLISHED THE BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2014-15; REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City Council heretofore adopted Ordinance No. 2501 setting forth the Budget for Fiscal Year 2014-2015 beginning July 1, 2014 and ending June 30, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the City Departments and Divisions routinely review their budget appropriations to determine if any changes are necessary; and

WHEREAS, based upon said review the City staff now recommends that certain amendments to the Budget be considered by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has the authority to make amendments to the City Budget under Article 5, Section 5.07 (b) of the new City Charter as well as State law; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the proposed amendment to the FY 2014-2015 Budget, with the revenues and expenditures therein contained, is in the best interest of the City; and therefore, desires to adopt the same by formal action.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1: The proposed amendment to the FY 2014-2015 Budget of the City of McAlester, Oklahoma, as heretofore adopted by Ordinance, as summarized in Exhibit A-1, which is attached hereto and fully incorporated herein by reference, be, and the same hereby are, completely adopted and approved as an amendment to the said FY 2014-2015 Budget.

SECTION 2: All portions of the existing FY 2014-2015 Budget, Ordinance No. 2501 except as specifically herein amended, shall remain in full force and effect, and not be otherwise affected by the adoption of the amendatory ordinance.

SECTION 3: That all other ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of any such conflict or inconsistency and all other ordinances not in conflict herewith shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4: Should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause, phrase, or section of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision thereof, other than the part or parts as declared to be invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional.

- 3. <u>Initial Term.</u> The initial term of this Lease shall be for a period of five (5) years, commencing on the day of the execution of this agreement.

- 4. Renewal Terms. Lessee shall have the right to extend this lease for an additional three (3) 5-year Renewal Terms ("Renewal Terms") for a possible total lease term of 20 years. The Renewal Terms shall be on the same terms and conditions as set forth in this Lease, unless agreed to in writing by both parties. This Lease shall be automatically renewed for the Renewal Terms unless either party notifies the other of its intention not to renew the Lease at least forty-five (45) days prior to the expiration of the Initial Term or the Renewal Term which is then in effect.
- 5.4. Consideration. During the Initial Term of this lease, and any Renewal Terms, Lessee shall provide to Lessor reliable data transport except in instances of power loss, equipment failure, or malfunction, to designated locations so long as the total number of locations does not to exceed forty (40) points of connectivity and an aggregate throughput of not to exceed 100mbps. Locations are subject to availability and must be coordinated with Lessee. Lessor may purchase connectivity at additional locations at standard service rates.
- 6-5. Water Tower Purpose. Lessee recognizes that the primary function of the water tower in to provide water storage for Lessor and its customers. Lessee understands that Lessor may find it necessary from time to time to interrupt or terminate Lessee's use of the Property for maintenance, preservation, or protection of the water tower or municipal water supply. Lessor shall provide Lessee with at least thirty (30) days prior written notice for non-emergency interruption/termination. Lessor reserves the right to terminate this lease at any time, to protect the health, welfare and safety of the public. Nothing contained in this agreement is intended to restrict or infringe upon the police powers of the Lessor, or otherwise interfere with Lessor's rights and protections under Oklahoma Law. maintenance, and Lessee agrees to coordinate with Lessor and Lessor's designated contractors for the extent the maintenance to minimize impact to Lesse's service. In the event the water tower owned by Lessor is damaged or destroyed and is not repaired or replaced by Lessor within 60 days of the date of said damage or destruction, all obligations of the Lessee under this agreement shall terminate as of the date of said damage or destruction.
- 7.6. <u>Indemnification/Hold Harmless.</u> Lessee agrees to indemnify, defend and hold Lessor harmless from any and all liability, suits, demands and claims for property damage or personal injury claimed or caused to any person, or any other claim arising directly or indirectly out of the placement, use and operation of transmitters or other equipment owned by Lessee on said water tower owned by Lessor. Lessor shall indemnify, defend and hold Lessee harmless against any and all claims, losses, damages and liabilities and expenses, including reasonable attorney fees, sustained by Lessee resulting from, arising out of, or connected with the use or misuse of the internet services provided by the Lessee for the use and benefit of Lessor.
- 8.7. Notices. Any notices required by this agreement shall be delivered to the Lessee at: P.O. Box 547, 615 Parkway Ave., Haileyville, OK 74546. Any notices required by this agreement shall be delivered to the Lessor at: P.O. Box 578, McAlester, OK 74502.
- 9.8. <u>Modifications</u>. Any modifications of this agreement must be in writing, and executed by both parties.

- 10. 9. Governing Law. This agreement is entered into and shall be governed by the laws of the State of Oklahoma.
- 11. 10. Assignment. Any sublease or assignment of this Lease that is entered into by Lessor or Lessee shall be subject to the provisions of this Lease, and requires the <u>prior</u> written approval by the non-assigning party of both parties.
- 12. 11. Successors and Assigns. This Lease shall run with the Property described and shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties, their respective heirs, successors, personal representatives and assigns.
- 13. <u>Waiver of Lessor's Lien.</u> Lessor hereby waives any and all lien rights it may have, statutory or otherwise, in and to the equipment of Lessee.
- 14. 12. Miscellaneous. This Lease constitutes the entire agreement and understanding of Lessor and Lessee with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all offers, negotiations and other agreements. There are no representations or understandings of any kind not set forth herein. If any term of this Lease is found to be void or invalid, such validity shall not affect the remaining terms of this Lease, which shall continue in full force and effect. This Lease may be executed in two or more counterparts, all of which shall be considered one and the same agreement and shall become effective when one or more counterparts have been signed by each of the parties, it being understood that all parties need not sign the same counterpart.

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AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION "62-197, R-1B SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT" OF THE McALESTER CITY CODE REGARDING ZONING USES PERMITTED AFTER REVIEW; REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF McALESTER, OKLAHOMA, that

SECTION 1: SECTION 62-197, R-1B single-family residential district. of the McAlester City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 62-197. R-1B single-family residential district.

(a) General description. The R-IB single-family residential district is established as a district in which the use of land is for single-family dwellings, yet providing for a somewhat higher density with basic restrictions similar to the R-IA single family residential district. The development and continued use of this land for residential dwellings is encouraged and the encroachment of commercial and industrial use or any other use which would substantially interfere with the development of or continuation of this district as residential is prohibited. Any use which would generate traffic or create congestion on neighborhood streets other than normal traffic which serves the residences

on the street is discouraged. Encouraged are those uses, which, because of character or size would not create additional requirements and costs for public services, which are in excess of such requirements and costs if the district were developed solely for residential dwellings.

- (b) Uses permitted.
 - (1) Single-family dwellings.
 - (2) Public parks or playgrounds.

- (3) Accessory buildings, including private garages, and uses customarily incidental to the primary use.
- (4) Elementary, junior or senior high school; or other schools, provided they have major street frontage as shown on the major street plan.
 - (5) Home occupations, as defined and regulated by this article.
- (6) Church, provided it has major street frontage as shown on the major street plan, and meets the minimum lot area requirements found in subsection (d).
- (c) Uses permitted after review. The following uses may be permitted after review by the planning commission in accordance with provisions in this article:
- (1) Lodges or other service institutions, provided they are located on a lot of at least one acre, and have major street frontage, as shown on the major street plan.
- (2) Municipal uses; public buildings and public utilities, in conjunction with one of the other permitted uses, subject to screening provisions in section 62-290.
- (3) Plant nursery, provided no building or structure is maintained and no retailing is conducted in connection therewith.
 - (4) Golf course, provided it has major street frontage as shown on the major street plan.
 - (5) Library, provided it has major street frontage, as shown on the major street plan.
- (6) Group homes (as defined), provided they are licensed/controlled by the appropriate state, federal agency.
- (7) Bed and breakfast: For the purposes of these regulations on bed and breakfast[s, "bed and breakfast"] shall be defined as a use carried on in a structure designed for single-family occupancy which provides to the general public overnight accommodations and breakfast. Such use shall be permitted after review, subject to the following conditions:
 - a. Operator or host family must reside on the premises.
 - b. Bed and breakfast home may not have more than five units or host more than ten

overnight guests at one time.

- c. Guests must be within principal structure. Detached buildings and/or garage apartments may not be converted to guest quarters.
- d. Provide one parking space per guest quarters plus two parking spaces per single-family dwelling unit. Parking requirements are not intended to destroy landscaping or damage the integrity of the dwelling, therefore, the planning commission may alter the parking space requirements if it is determined that sufficient parking can be provided to service the bed and breakfast.
- e. Signs: One non-illuminated freestanding or wall-mounted sign not more than six square feet may be located on the site. Sign design, color and location shall not detract from the neighborhood and be in harmony with the neighborhood. The word "hotel" or "motel" shall not be allowed on sign. Any lighting for sign must be general or indirect lighting.
- f. Guest may be provided breakfast by the host, but no other meal may be served. There will be no cooking in guest rooms.
- (8) Barbershop and/or beauty shop. For the purposes of these regulations "Barbershop and/or beauty shop" shall be defined as a use carried on in a structure designed for single-family occupancy. Such use shall be permitted after review, subject to the following conditions:

 a. Barbershop and/or beauty shop may not serve more than five customers at one time.

 c. Services must be provided solely within the principal structure.

 d. Provide one parking space per customer. Parking requirements are not intended to destroy landscaping or damage the integrity of the dwelling, therefore, the planning commission may after the parking space requirements if it is determined that sufficient parking can be

GENERAL DESCRIPTION:

An ordinance proposed by City Councilman Robert Karr to amend Section "62-197, R-1B Single Family Residential District" of the McAlester City Code to add Barbershop and/or Beauty Shop to the uses permitted after review in R-1B Single Family Residential Districts and providing certain definitions and restrictions.

Land Development Code-Section 62-107. Definitions

Home occupation means that occupation or profession which is carried on by the inhabitants residing at and inhabiting the dwelling; is clearly incidental and secondary to the primary use of the dwelling for dwelling purposes; does not change the character of the dwelling in any manner; and is conducted entirely within the main or preexisting accessory buildings, provided that the accessory building shall have existed for at least one year previously; and provided that such occupation or profession does not:

(5) Exceed 30 percent of the gross area of the main building. Tearooms, restaurants, resthomes, ceramic or upholstery shops, clinics, doctor's or dentist's offices, barbershops or beauty shops, child care centers, tourist homes, cabinet, metal, gunsmith, taxidermy, or auto repair shops or any kind of shop or store, are specifically excluded from this definition.

A non-exhaustive list of factors that should be considered in reviewing the proposed Zoning Ordinance Amendment:

Would the proposed zoning ordinance amendment to add Barbershop and/or Beauty Shop to the uses permitted after review in the R-1B Single Family Residential District be consistent with the identified purpose of the R-1B zoning district classification and the intent and purpose of the McAlester zoning regulations?

- 2. How does the potential development of Barbershop and/or Beauty Shop(s) compare or conflict with the current uses and character of the existing R-1B single-family residential district neighborhoods in the community. Can the proposed additional uses requested be good neighbors within the existing R-1B single-family residential district neighborhoods?
- 3. Is the existing property in McAlester that is zoned R-1B single-family residential district suitable for the uses to which the property has been restricted?
- 4. Is there a general amount of alternative suitable vacant land or buildings available at other locations within McAlester for the development of Barbershop and/or Beauty Shops that currently have the appropriate zoning district classification for such developments?

STAFF ANALYSIS:

Clearly, small businesses are of particular interest to a community because of their potential as a wellspring of economic activity. Residential structures are, in effect, do-it-yourself business incubators, which collectively provide start-ups with an easier entry point into the business world. Further, some critics contend that zoning is fundamentally unfair because it grants special privileges to some property owners (typically, current owner/occupants of single-family homes) at the expense of others, including principally those (usually non-resident) owners who wish to develop their property for non-residential purposes.

That being said, the main rationale behind prohibitive or restrictive zoning laws is to maintain the residential character of a neighborhood. Local jurisdictions enact zoning codes to separate land uses and maintain the distinctive character of each type of neighborhood. These laws maintain the very neighborhood in which a person lives - a neighborhood they presumably want to keep peaceful. Zoning laws are an excellent means of protecting individuals from the real and potential harm caused by the encroachment of occupations and businesses that are incompatible with the peace and safety of a residential neighborhood.

1. The proposed zoning ordinance amendment to add Barbershop and/or Beauty Shop to the uses permitted after review in the R-1B Single Family Residential District is not consistent with the identified purpose of the R-1B zoning district classification and the current intent and purpose of the McAlester zoning regulations. The R-1B single-family residential district was established as a district in which the use of land is for single-family dwellings, yet providing for a somewhat higher density with basic restrictions similar to the R-1A single family residential district. The development and continued use of this land for residential dwellings is encouraged and the encroachment of commercial and industrial use or any other use which would substantially interfere with the development of or continuation of this district as residential is prohibited. Any use which would generate traffic or create congestion on neighborhood streets other than normal traffic which serves the residences on the street is discouraged.

As a further protection of the residential character of the single-family residential districts in McAlester, the City's current zoning regulations do not allow tearooms, restaurants, resthomes, ceramic or upholstery shops, clinics, doctor's or dentist's offices, barbershops or beauty shops, child care centers, tourist homes, cabinet, metal, gunsmith, taxidermy, or auto repair shops or any kind of shop or store as home occupations. To disallow barbershops or beauty shops as home based businesses in the R-1B Single Family Residential District, then amend the zoning ordinance to add Barbershop and/or Beauty Shop to the uses permitted after review in the R-1B Single Family Residential District does not seem to provide consistency in policy making.

- 2. There seems to be adequate suitable vacant land or buildings available at other locations within McAlester for the development of Barbershop and/or Beauty Shops that currently have the appropriate zoning district classification for such developments.
- 3. The existing property in McAlester that is zoned R-1B single-family residential district seems suitability for the uses to which the property has been restricted.
- 4. If it was determined to approve the zoning ordinance amendment to add Barbershop and/or Beauty Shop to the uses permitted after review in the R-1B Single Family Residential District, one would have to ask what other type of service industries such as dog grooming, massage parlor, tattoo parlor, nail salon, accountants, etc. would be added to the list in the future that would further alter the single-family dwelling characteristics of these neighborhoods.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

City staff has not been presented with any compelling reason to support the proposed zoning ordinance amendment to add Barbershop and/or Beauty Shop to the uses permitted after review in the R-1B Single Family Residential District.

ADDITIONAL CLARIFICATION FOR FUTURE REFERENCE:

Sec. 62-209. H.l health facilities district.

- (c) Uses permitted after review. Supporting facilities, necessary in conjunction with the existing health facility, may be permitted only after review by the city planning commission, as follows:
- (3) Barbershop and beauty shop.

It should be noted for future reference that a stand-alone barbershop or beauty shop would not be a medical or health facility as defined by the City's zoning ordinance. Further, it would be difficult to propose that a stand-alone barbershop or beauty shop would be necessary in conjunction with the existing health facility.

Staff Analysis:

In the immediate vicinity of the subject property is the Belfair Senior Care Complex, Heritage Hills Living & Rehabilitation Center, commercial developments, correctional facilities, agricultural land and single family residences. This is a mixed use area.

The existing street network that serves the area can adequately serve a Multi-Family Development. Rezoning the subject property would not have a detrimental effect on nearby property.

The budget shall begin with a clear general summary of its contents, shall show in detail all estimated income, indicating the proposed property tax levy if any, and all proposed expenditures, including debt service for the ensuing fiscal year; and shall be so arranged as to show comparative figures for actual and estimated income and expenditures of the current fiscal year and actual income and expenditures of the preceding fiscal year. Current vear "actual" figures shall be authentic figures through the date they are available and estimated figures for the remaining portion of the fiscal year. It shall indicate in separate sections:

- The proposed goals and expenditures for current operations during the ensuing fiscal year, detailed for each fund by department and division or by other organization unit, activity, or objectives, or other means as state law permits, method of financing such expenditures, and methods to measure outcomes and performance related to the goals. An Emergency Fund will be included in the budget and every reasonable attempt shall be made to maintain this fund at a minimum of ten percent (10%) of the total operating budget including capital improvements. A separate account shall be maintained for the Emergency Fund and the City Council shall define by ordinance under what circumstances withdrawals may be made from the Emergency Fund account;
- (2) Proposed longer-term goals and capital expenditures during the ensuing fiscal year, detailed for each fund by department and division or by other organization unit when practicable, the proposed method of financing each such capital expenditure, and methods to measure outcomes and performance related to the goals; and
- (3) The proposed goals, anticipated income and expense for the ensuing year for each utility or other enterprise fund or internal service fund operated by the City, and

methods to measure outcomes and performance related to the goals. For any fund, the total of proposed expenditures shall not exceed the total of estimated income plus carried forward fund balance exclusive of reserves.

Nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent the use of "purpose-based" budgeting or any other budget format acceptable to the State of Oklahoma.

Sec. 5.05. City Council Action on Budget.

- (a) Notice and Hearing. Within one (1) week of receiving the proposed budget from the City Manager, the City Council shall publish in one or more newspapers of general circulation in the City the general summary of the budget and a notice stating:
 - (1) The times and places where copies of the message and the entire detailed budget are available for inspection by the public and purchase at a reasonable price set by the Council; and
 - (2) The time and place, not less than two weeks after such publication, for a public hearing(s) on the budget.

The entire budget shall also be available on a website or other means of publicly available electronic distribution.

- (b) Amendment before Adoption. After the public hearing(s), the City Council may adopt the budget with or without amendment. In amending the budget, it may add or increase programs or amounts and may delete or decrease any programs or amounts, except expenditures required by law or for debt service, provided that no amendment to the budget shall increase the authorized expenditures to an amount greater than total estimated income plus carried forward fund balance.
- (c) Adoption. The City Council shall adopt the budget no later than seven (7) days before the end of the current fiscal year or any other applicable deadline of State Law. If it fails to adopt the budget by this date, the budget for the amounts appropriated for operations in the current fiscal year will be deemed adopted.

ORDINANCE NO. 239/

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MCALESTER, OKLAHOMA, CREATING SECTION 2-258, EMERGENCY FUND, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

* * * * * * * * * *

SECTION 1. Sec. 2-258 Emergency Fund.

1. The purpose of the Emergency Fund, is to insulate General Fund programs and current service levels from large and unanticipated one-time emergency expenditure requirements, a revenue reduction due to a change in state or federal legislation, resulting from adverse litigation, or similar unforeseen action.

2. Definition.

- a. For purposes of this ordinance, an emergency is defined as an unplanned or unforeseen event that may, if not immediately corrected, cause death or injury to the public, or significantly disrupt essential city services, or result in damage to city property, or result in significant environmental damage.
- b. For fund identification purposes, the Emergency Fund, as defined in this ordinance, is the same fund currently identified as the Reserve Fund and will be hereafter referred to as the Emergency Fund.
- 3. This Emergency Fund will not be used because General Fund expenditure growth exceeds budgeted revenue growth. Revenue shortfalls may not be offset by a transfer of funds from the Emergency Fund.
- 4. The Emergency Fund is available to fund one-time emergency requirements. The Council may only authorize a fund transfer from the Emergency Fund after the General Fund's budgeted contingency, if any, is exhausted. The Emergency Fund will only be accessed when the result of emergency expenditures or an unexpected revenue reduction would be that the General Fund would likely end the fiscal year with a negative ending fund balance. Any proposed use of the Emergency Fund will be placed on the council agenda in the form of a budget amendment. Such amendment will be strictly limited to the proposed transfer amount from the Emergency Fund and the proposed fund and account(s) that will receive the transfer. As part of the agenda item, the City Manager shall, as a minimum, provide a written certification to the council identifying in substantial detail the nature of the emergency, the total anticipated cost of the emergency, the steps the city has taken to address the emergency and the reason(s) those steps have not eliminated the need for using a portion of the Emergency Fund.
- 5. An affirmative vote of at least five of the seven council members is required for funds to be transferred from the Emergency Fund.
- 6. Restoration of the Emergency Fund will begin the next fiscal year following their use.

SECTION 2. Emergency Clause

That an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, by reason whereof it is necessary that all acts take effect immediately and be in full force and effect from, and after the passage and approval.

City Manager Report to the Council

November 25, 2014

Business:

- The City has received final sales tax numbers for the period September 16, 2014 through October 15, 2014. The final sales tax number to be received from the Oklahoma Tax Commission is \$1.067M. The budgeted number for this period is \$1.129M or \$62K under budget. This is the first month that the City has experienced a significant decrease in monthly sales tax revenue. We are monitoring the situation closely to determine if a pattern is developing. Year to date sales tax revenue is \$5.630M compared to a budgeted amount of \$5.706M or \$76K under budget for the year.
- Water sales, district water sales, sewer and garbage sales for the month of October 2014 equaled \$680K. The budgeted sales for October is \$744K or \$64K under budget for the month. These numbers have been seasonally adjusted. Year to date sales are \$2.930M compared to a budgeted amount of \$3.149M or \$219K under budget for the year.
- The McAlester Regional Airport safety zone expansion is underway. The contractor, Bronze Oak LLC, Bixby, Oklahoma has mobilized and is rapidly moving dirt. This is a \$1.8 million airport project with a scheduled completion date of January 5, 2015.
 - <u>UPDATE:</u> The project continues to move forward rapidly. The contractor, Bronze Oak LLC is on schedule and anticipates completing the project on schedule. The safety zone at the south end of the runway is close to being at grade.
- The preliminary schedule for 17th. Street has been set for the next (6) weeks. The following is the anticipated schedule:
 - November 18 26, clean up (7days)
 - December 1 15, driveways (11days)
 - December 16 29, intersections (8 days)

The remaining schedule will be set at the first progress meeting in December and will be forwarded on to the Council.

- Toni Ervin and I attended a luncheon hosted by Public Service Company (PSO) to introduce the City of McAlester to a rebate/incentive program. This program rewards PSO customers who reduce their loads during peak demands that occur normally in the summer months. If we were to sign up for the program, we would be notified two (2) to four (4) hours in advance of the event occuring. The maximum length of the shutdown would be four (4) hours and would occur between the hours of 2:00pm to 6:00pm. The maximum amount of days that any organization would be asked to shut down would be twelve (12) in any calendar year. To give an idea of the incentive available, the Henrietta School District was shut down three (3) separate times and received over \$20K for their participation in the program. PSO will be working with us in the near future to identify possibilities.
- Pam Kirby, Grant Writer and Administrator has successfully applied for and received a Department of Justice (DOJ) grant for Police Officer Body Cams. The award is in the amount of \$9,730. The grant is awarded through the District Attorney's Council in Oklahoma City. We have applied for additional grant funds through OMAG and anticipate hearing their decision in the near future.

Kirk Ridenour, Economic Development Manager October 2014 Activity Report

Joint Tasks

- (1st) Leroy, Pete, John, and I met with Anthony Echelle from ODOT to discuss potential changes to the U.S. 69 Reconstruction Project. They wanted input about their new design before holding a meeting with City officials and stakeholders. Instead of a buried highway with an overpass at Peaceable, they proposed that the highway remain at grade with an overpass at Village Blvd. We agreed the plan was worth pursuing and a future meeting on the 21st was scheduled.
- (7th) Met with the industrial site consultants Tonya Crist and Rob Cornwell. We toured McAlester with them, showcasing our Industrial Park and industries. For their consideration, we also provided standard marketing material we present to industrial clients. Afterwards, we attended the PSO Economic Development Forum, featuring Tonya and Rob as the guest speakers. Many local development partners attended the meeting, including the Choctaw Nation, utility companies, educational/workforce organizations, and other public officials. After discussing the site selection process, Tonya and Rob discussed what McAlester could be doing better. Our number one recommendation was to pursue an alternate Industrial Park, as ours is limited in usability.
- (9th 10th) Leroy and I participated in the Oklahoma Economic Development Council's Annual Meeting. We attended break-out sessions over LinkedIn networking, community marketing, workforce development, and business retention and expansion strategies. Had discussions with Shawnee and Claremore over their marketing strategies at the ICSC Dallas retail event. Met with numerous members of the OKC Chamber of Commerce and discussed useful tools and strategies for economic developers.
- (14th) Leroy, Pete, and I met with Matt Petro from Retail Strategies. He spoke in detail about their retail package and what services they could offer us. He mentioned he would stay in contact as our contract with Retail Attractions came up for renewal.
- (17th) Following my phone conversation with Jason Lemle with WEDA, Leroy and I held a conference call to discuss the industrial prospect, Project Plane. We learned about the site and community requirements of their client and agreed to submit an RFI response. We are awaiting further information from Jason about their client's employment numbers, payroll, capital investments, and utility requirements.
- (21st) Follow-up meeting with ODOT, including City Councilmen, County Commissioners, and State Representatives. The new design was pitched and was well received. It would allow for better visibility, faster construction time, and more roadway completed. With everyone in support of the new design, ODOT decided to move forward and begin the preliminary drawings of the highway, estimated to be completed within three months.
- (27th) Leroy, Pete, and I met with Jeri Koehler and Brandon Irby with the City of Claremore to discuss our potential cooperation with retail development. We agreed it would be beneficial to share information and contacts with one another, as we are towns of similar size and do not compete with one another for sale tax revenue.

Individual Tasks

- (2nd) As part of workforce development, I attended the 8th Grade Career Fair to learn more about organizing and running a career fair. I was invited by Janet Wansick and Anne Brooks to sit on their design committee next year, which I agreed to. Will speak more with the Choctaw's about their career fair to see how we can better link the two events.
- (3rd) Spoke with Jason Lemle with the World Economic Development Alliance about a potential industrial project, codenamed Project Plane. After providing standard marketing material about McAlester to him, he wanted to set up a conference call to discuss the project in detail.

- (15th) Met with High School principal, Paula Meadows and High School counselor, Mia Smith. We discussed how we could incorporate workforce development at the High School. We agreed the first step was connecting businesses, teachers, and students together. To do this, we would like to start organizing industrial tours for teachers to become aware of what opportunities are available in McAlester.
- (20th) Meeting with Butch Mellor to discuss Project Plane and learn more about developing additional hanger space, what available acreage there is, how we could access the runway, and what utility capacity was on site.
- (21st) Attended the Oklahoma State University Institute of Technology facility tour of Choctaw Defense. They spoke to students about careers in manufacturing. They specifically addressed what opportunities are available and what educational requirements are needed. I'm planning on incorporating their services with other local businesses in McAlester. In addition, I met with the OSU-IT events staff. They invited Leroy and me up to their campus to see their facilities.
- (23rd) Toured McAlester with Michael Davis and Jeremy Stoner with the Oklahoma Industrial Finance Authority. We visited Choctaw Defense to tour their facility and they spoke about financing options available to the Nation. They are interested in joint financing opportunities with the Finance Authority.
- (24th) Met with Wallace Management to discuss their property along U.S. 69. I spoke with them about the Dallas retail event and explained our strategy for generating commercial interest in McAlester.
- (28th) Met with Sandy Bahre to discuss the property she represents along U.S. 69. She showed me each of the available locations and I explained our strategy at the Dallas retail event.
- (29th 31st) Attended the Oklahoma Southeast: Broken Bow Event. Met with various site and retail consultants. Spoke in depth with the Choctaw Nation about their retail and industrial development strategies. We agreed to hold a meeting before ICSC event in November. Met a consultant that will be attending the ICSC event also. I agreed to stop by his booth and have him introduce a few retailers to us. I submitted our vacant industrial building to a distribution prospect.



Dear John:

Attached is the monthly report for October 2014.

One of the big items covered this month was the filter evaluation by All Service. I am attaching a copy of their report for your review. I suggest we sit down and discuss this report together as there are many items that need attention.

We have several capital items lined out as well. We have a chemical metering system outlined to go along with the ACH trial from OMNI water consultants. We also have several day tanks lined out to go along with this project and the phosphate program that we would like to implement, pending DEQ approval. We have also sought out a new tank for the permanganate system at the lake pump house. The old tank is cramped and does not have containment in the event of a leak. We will be constructing a holding basin around the new tank soon.

The JH100 from OMNI did receive certification from UL for use in drinking water. With this, we can now move forward with the ACH trial.

We are working diligently on getting HSP #4 back up and running. All the electrical components have been tested and in good working order. We are waiting on the rotating assembly to come back from the machine shop. This should be back in the next few weeks and the contractor can resume their work.

The First amendment to the contract was signed and approved by both parties. This eliminates the Electricity cap completely.

Also attached are the monthly Maintenance and Chemical Cap sheets.

Executive Summary

Mike O'Malley has spent some more time at the plant looking into various processes. His expertise is valuable to us getting a handle on operations and improvements.

The old lime silo is being looked into as an option to feed powdered activated carbon. The manufacturer of the silo, CHEMCO, also makes PAC systems. Chemco believes they can retrofit a PAC system in the existing lime silo space.

Steve and I were up on the roof of the Lake Pump house and noticed the roof is in bad shape. Several tiles are broke and the material under the tiles is damaged in many spots. This is causing the roof to leak. It is not dripping on any electrical components, yet.

After the filter evaluation by All Service, the filter operation needs to be looked into. I do not believe they are operating correctly. This is due to both mechanical and electrical problems. Some of the valves are not operating correctly along with the PLC controlling the filters. In the coming weeks I will be evaluating the auto backwash cycle along with other filter operations. This should help us determine how to proceed with the filters.

Critical Issues

HSP #4 is still out of service. The electrical components have been tested and are working correctly. The rotating assembly is at the machine shop and should be back by the 18th. Once #4 is back online, Garrow will be back out to finish their work.

A new location has been found for the Raw flowmeter. The UTM crew has helped us identify the location for the flowmeter. Tim Murray will be making the tap for the installation of the meter. After the installation, Worth Hydrochem will be back out to complete the electrical installation and its connection to SCADA.

Noteworthy Events

The electrical components for the High Service Pumps have returned and are in good working order. We anticipate HSP#4 to be back in operation by the 18th.

City of McAlester Safety Office Monthly Report October 2014

Date: 10-31-2014

EQUIPMENT: I purchased some more gloves, safety vests, hearing protection and binders for SDS sheets this month. All employees are utilizing the fact that we have equipment available for them to be safe. This is one of the major parts to keeping them safe. The other is changing attitudes which I am working on.

TRAINING: We had respirator fit testing for the Fire Department and others that missed in September. I completed my OSHA 30 hour online course well ahead of schedule. I am almost ready to deliver a course to employees that will hopefully change attitudes and have them look closer at why they are getting hurt and the high cost to the City of McAlester.

ACCIDENT: 2 accidents this month. One was a citizen hit a Streets Department trailer causing no damage to City equipment and minor damage to his own vehicle. It was no fault of the Streets employees. I talked to Glen and he is making progress towards placing brackets on all the vehicles that need chock blocks and cones. Most vehicles can carry them inside the vehicle, in the trunk, or in the bed of a truck. These need to be placed at the street side corners of vehicles when parked on City streets. The other accident involved a Utility Billing vehicle. James Klembara had a buzzard strike his mirror and broke it off causing \$85.87 in damages. I did a thorough investigation and determined the buzzard to be at fault. There was clear evidence a buzzard hit the mirror and broke it.

INJURIES: Two injuries this month. A Streets employee stepped down from a dump truck injuring his knee. He remains off work and goes to the doctor November 5th for an MRI on his knee. It appears that this employee may be off for some time. I will know more later next week. We had a landfill employee cut his hand while picking up trash. He has been taken off restricted duty. A UTM employee has started therapy on his neck for the vehicle accident he was involved in. The insurance company representing the trucking company that hit him is claiming only 50% responsibility as they say the lead car contributed to it, although the lead car was never found. This was turned over to the City Clerk.

DAMAGE: No damage this week.

INSPECTIONS: I have completed several site inspections this month and all employees have been wearing the required PPE and working safely. This has actually been a great month with the exception of one employee that was hurt due to not wearing PPE. I believe the word is out that we will not be putting up with violating policies. I have received a lot of positive feedback about what to do when employees do not wear PPE. I found all employees that I talked to in favor of using discipline as a means to correct it. They all agreed they have been and are continuing to be educated on the correct way to

do their job and if that is not working we have no alternative but to use discipline to correct the bad behavior.

WORKERS COMPENSATION: We had a judgment this month for \$50k plus. The City paid a lump sum of \$32k and will pay out the rest. We had no hearings this month as one was cancelled due to the employee receiving new treatment. There are several past claims we are trying to get settled.
