CFO Ervin addressed the Council reviewing the City's current financial status. She explained the City and MPWA were not quite making the budget with expenditures but they were watching their expenses, which were under budget at this time. She also explained that the revenues and expenses for the MPWA were skewed because of the recent refinancing of the bonds. She then

reviewed the City's sales tax receipts, the three (3) year pattern that she had seen, the increase in the use tax receipts, police fines and water sales.

Mayor Harrison asked if there was any indication of what was causing the use tax to increase.

CFO Ervin commented that information could be tracked and be presented by code to the Council.

There was no vote on this item.






Oklahoma's Largest Water Balloon Fight & Cruise Night









CultureFest

SMARTPHONE METER READING (SPMR) SUBSCRIPTION AGREEMENT

This SPMR Subscription Agreement ("Agreement") is made by and between SPMR, L.L.C., a Texas limited liability corporation, located at 3600 K Avenue, Plano, Texas 75074 (hereinafter "SPMR"), and the <u>City of McAlester</u> doing business at <u>28 E. Washington, McAlester, OK 74502</u> ("Subscriber").

RECITALS

- A WHEREAS SPMR licenses, in object form only, proprietary computer software ("Software") as an application for smart phones, or similar devices, to record utility meter data and to communicate such data to its remote server ("Application");
- B. WHEREAS SPMR hosts the utility meter data on its remote server for retrieval by Subscriber ("Hosting") and collectively, the Application, Hosting and any other services such as training or set-up shall constitute "Services"; and
- C WHEREAS Subscriber desires to use the Services;

IN CONSIDERATION of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1 - GENERAL TERMS

- 1. ENTIRE AGREEMENT. It is agreed that this Agreement and any EXHIBIT(S) attached hereto and made a part hereby embody the entire agreement of the parties in relation to the subject matter hereunder, and that there is no other oral or written agreement or understanding between the parties at the time of execution pertaining to the subject matter of this Agreement. This Agreement shall not be modified except by the written agreement of all parties hereto.
- 2. GOVERNING LAW AND CHOICE OF VENUE. This agreement shall be construed, interpreted and enforced under the laws and statutes of the State of Texas without regard for any of said state's conflicts of law provisions. The initial payment of service fees shall be made within ten (10) business days of the Activation Date and if the Activation Date is not on the first day of the month, a prorated fee shall be included in the initial payment of service fees for Services provided from the Activation Date through the last day of that month. Subsequent payments shall be made according to the following payment interval options:
 - If the monthly pre-payment option is used, subsequent monthly payments shall be made on the first day of each calendar month thereafter until the Agreement is terminated.
 - ii If the annual pre-payment option is used, the subsequent annual payments shall be for an entire annual period and shall be made on the first day of the month following the month in which the Activation Date falls and on each subsequent anniversary of the start of the each annual year period invoiced until the Agreement is terminated.
 - B. Subscriber shall pay SPMR for any support or training at SPMR's quoted price thirty (30) days after the invoice date.

 - B. SPMR SHALL NOT BE LIABLE FOR ANY LOSS OR DAMAGE CAUSED BY DELAY IN FURNISHING SOFTWARE, SERVICES OR ANY OTHER PERFORMANCE UNDER OR PURSUANT TO THIS AGREEMENT.
 - SPMR DOES NOT WARRANT THE OPERATION OF SOFTWARE OR SERVICES INCLUDED IN THE SYSTEM TO BE ERROR FREE.
 - D. 

AGREEMENT FOR ADMINISTRATION OF THE SALES AND USE TAX ORDINANCES OF THE CITY/TOWN AND AN AGREEMENT TO ENGAGE IN COMPLIANCE ACTIVITIES BY THE CITY/TOWN OF

of the Municipality and to authorize Municipality to	engage in compliance activities as
hereinafter defined.

1. This Agreement is based upon the Ordinances for the collection of sales and uses taxes by the Municipality, certified copies of which are attached hereto and made a part hereof. The Municipality may, at any time and from time to time, amend or repeal the Ordinances and, to the extent that the Municipality amends or repeals the Ordinances, the Municipality shall promptly provide the Commission with a certified copy of the ordinance effecting such amendment or such repeal.

An increase or a decrease in the municipal sales or use tax rate shall become effective only on the first day of a calendar quarter. Provided, however, the sales and use tax rates levied by the Municipality if the Municipality levies both a sales and use tax, must be identical. The Municipality shall notify the Commission of an increase or a decrease at least seventy-five (75) days prior to the close of the current calendar quarter and shall provide the Commission with a certified copy of the ordinance affecting such increase or such decrease.

- 2. A. The Commission shall administer and shall enforce the Ordinances and shall collect the municipal sales and use tax, and the interest and penalties with respect thereto as provided in the Ordinances except as provided, in paragraph 16 below. It is recognized and acknowledged that:
 - (a) the Ordinances levy municipal sales tax upon all sales within the Municipality as authorized by Section 2701 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and
 - (b) the term "sale" as used in the Ordinances has the same meaning as the term "sale" has in the Oklahoma Sales Tax Code; and
 - (c) the Ordinances levy municipal use tax upon all transactions within or without the Municipality as authorized by Section 1411 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and
 - (d) the term "use" as used in the Ordinances have the same

meaning as the term "use" has in the Oklahoma Use Tax Code; and

(e) the permits for sales and use tax issued by the Commission shall be the sales and use tax permits used by the municipality for the enforcement and collection of sales and use taxes within and without the municipality and said permits, as issued by the Commission, shall include the zip code plus the four digit location code commonly called the zip plus 4, when available.

To facilitate such administration, such collection and such enforcement of local taxes, the Commission shall designate a Local Tax Coordinator of the Commission who shall be generally responsible for matters related to the collection of local taxes and, with respect to such matters, shall directly advise the Administrator of the Commission. The duties which may be performed by the Local Tax Coordinator and/or other employees of the Commission under his or her supervision, shall include, without limitation,

- B. (a) acting as liaison between the Commission and municipalities with respect to the administration, the collection and the enforcement of local taxes,
 - (b) addressing concerns of the Commission and/or taxpayers with respect to the administration, the collection and the enforcement of municipal taxes by municipalities,
 - (c) consulting with municipalities concerns and trends with respect to local taxes,
 - (d) coordinating collection and enforcement actions by the Commission and municipalities with respect to local taxes,
 - (e) coordinating the provision by the Commission to municipalities of information and
 - (f) providing educational and other support to municipalities in their collection and enforcement efforts.

In making decisions with respect to the administration of local taxes, the Commission will consider the view expressed by the Municipality.

The Municipality shall not request that the Local Tax Coordinator perform any duties which are the sole responsibility of the Municipality.

- 3. The method of computing sales tax to be used by vendors in collecting both state and municipal sales tax is prescribed in Section 1362 of the Oklahoma Sales Tax Code. The method of computing use tax to be used by vendors in collecting both state and municipal use tax is prescribed in Section 1401 of the Oklahoma Use Tax Code.
- 4. The discount (deduction) allowed to vendors in Section 1367.1 of the Oklahoma Sales Tax Code shall be applicable to both state and local sales tax remittances. Monetary allowances provided for in 68 O.S. § 1354.31 shall also be applicable to both state and local sales tax remittances. The discount (deduction) allowed to vendors in Section 1410.1 of the Oklahoma Use Tax Code shall be applicable to both state and local use tax remittances. Monetary allowances provided for in 68 O.S. § 1354.31 shall also be applicable to both state

and local use tax remittances.

- 5. The Commission shall retain, as its sole compensation for its services rendered hereunder, an amount not to exceed one-half of one percent (0.5%) of the municipal sales or use taxes collected for services rendered in connection with such collections and the interest and penalties with respect thereto, collected by the Commission hereunder. The applicable percentage is set forth in Exhibit A as incorporated herein.
- 6. Except as otherwise provided herein, the Commission shall give no preference in applying an amount received for state, municipal and county sales or use taxes owed by a taxpayer to the extent that such amount is less than the aggregate state, municipal and county sales or use tax liability of the taxpayer. Any such amount shall be applied pro rata to the satisfaction of the claims of the Commission, the claims of the Municipality and the claims of other municipalities and counties based on the portions of the aggregate state, municipal and county sales or use tax liability of the taxpayer represented by their respective claims.
- 7. The municipal sales or use tax received and collected by the Commission pursuant to this Agreement shall be deposited in the State Treasury as required by law. The Commission shall use its best efforts to cause to be paid to the Municipality no later than the tenth day of each calendar month all municipal sales and use tax, and the interest and the penalties with respect thereto, received and collected by the Commission during the immediately preceding calendar month, less any amount withheld by the Commission under Paragraph 5 and less any amounts deducted by the Commission in connection with refunds hereunder.
- The Commission shall require reports of municipal sales and use tax from 8. vendors, shall maintain records of reports, receipts and collections from vendors. Commission shall maintain the records in such a manner that the amount due the Municipality each month by a vendor can be determined by the Commission and can be provided to the Municipality. The requirement for the Commission to maintain its records in a verifiable form is intended to require the Commission to maintain its records in a form capable of producing reports that can be electronically downloaded into, at a minimum, an excel spreadsheet or its equivalent; the Commission will use a form which is capable of being understood by a person reviewing such records. The Commission shall make available to the Municipality a monthly statement of the municipal sales and use tax, and interest and penalties with respect thereto, received and collected by the Commission during the immediately preceding calendar month, the amounts, if any, refunded by the Commission to taxpayers during the immediately, preceding calendar month and the amount withheld by the Commission under Paragraph 5. The Commission shall allow an annual review of the Commission's expenditures associated with the collection and enforcement of municipal sales and use taxes.
- 9. In the event a vendor remits sales or use taxes due but fails to submit city attachments, or submits a report from which the sales or use tax due Municipality cannot be determined, the Commission will allocate to Municipality such sales or use tax received pro rata based on the vendor's percentage allocation for the most recent report filed or, if no report has been filed, according to the best information available to the Commission. Such amount, and any interest and penalty as provided in Section 217 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes with respect thereto, shall be paid to the Municipality in accordance with Paragraph 7. Interest will begin as of the date the vendor remittance is deposited to the State Treasury.
 - 10. The Municipality acknowledges that the Commission is responsible for making

refunds to taxpayers of municipal sales and use taxes previously collected by the Commission on behalf of the Municipality. The term "refunds" as used herein shall include payments made pursuant to filed claim for refund(s) or amended return(s) approved by the Commission. The Commission's determination of any taxpayer's liability for sales and use taxes shall be binding as between the Municipality and the taxpayer.

Any refund of municipal sales and use tax previously paid by the Commission to the Municipality shall be paid from subsequent collections of the municipal sales and use tax. Such refund shall be deducted from the collections payable by the Commission to the Municipality, in the immediately following calendar month following the notice requirements set out in paragraph eleven (11).

11. The Commission shall provide notice to the Municipality via the OKTap user Account to municipalities so that a municipality may view all the requests for refunds that have been filed, processed and recommended approval. All claims for refund shall be documented as outlined in OAC 710:65-11-1 upon discovery of a remittance error by the vendor. Commission, through the Local Tax Coordinator, will notify Municipality at such time the Commission determines the final amount to be refunded pursuant to a claim or remittance error. The Commission shall make available to a municipality, upon request, copies of the claims processed and recommended for approval in the amount of two thousand dollars (\$2000.00) or more and related supporting documents prior to the claim being considered for approval by the Commission. The Commission shall post the requested claim documents on the municipality's OKTap user account to comply with this requirement. Municipality agrees that any amount contained in the notice given pursuant to this section will be considered as advisory only until such time as a final determination has been made by the Commission. Any municipal sales or use tax, and/or any interest and penalties with respect thereto, paid under protest by a taxpayer to the Commission during the immediately preceding calendar month shall be paid by the Commission to the Municipality as part of the payment being made by the Commission to the Municipality, If the protested municipal sales or use tax, interest or penalties are required to be refunded, such amount and any interest required to be paid thereon will be paid out of subsequent collections by the Commission.

The municipality may request by a blanket advisement to the Commission that it be notified of any hearing wherein the Commission hears a claim for refund of a protest of an assessment. If an affected municipality shall have requested such notice in writing, the Commission shall, at the same time the parties are notified of the scheduled hearing, provide written notice of the hearing date and time via electronic mail, e-mail, or mail through the United States Postal Service to the municipality affected.

- 12. In the event a municipality is notified as required and set out in paragraph 11, above, that it has been paid sales or use tax funds that should have been paid to another municipality, the Tax Commission shall adhere to repayment provisions of the provisions of paragraph 10.
- 13. The Commission shall provide to the Municipality a full and complete list of the names and the addresses of the persons and the entities which or who report doing business within the boundary of the Municipality during the preceding calendar year via the OKTap user Account. In addition the Commission shall via OKTap provide the following:
 - A. additions to, and deletions from, the full and complete list of the names and the addresses of persons and entities which or who report doing business during the

preceding calendar year within the boundary of the Municipality;

- B. a full and complete list of the persons and the entities specified in paragraph 12(a) which or who are more than sixty (60) days delinquent in filing and/or remitting municipal sales and use taxes pursuant to the Ordinances; and
- C. a full and complete, list of all persons and all entities paying municipal sales and use tax under the Ordinances, and/or interest and penalties with respect thereto, and the amount of such remittances.
- D. the number of audits completed and assessments determined by the Commission with respect to municipal sales and use taxes, and/or interest and penalties with respect thereto, under the Ordinances during the preceding calendar year; and

Commission also agrees to provide Municipality reports in addition to those outlined above under the following terms:

- A. The report is requested in writing or via e-mail, outlining the information required and regularity of the report.
- B. The report complies with all terms and statutes outlined within this agreement.
- C. The information requested is available to the Commission.
- D. Commission will be provided a minimum of thirty (30) days to compile new requests unless otherwise agreed.
- E. Commission shall provide the requested report(s) within ninety (90) days unless otherwise agreed.
- 14. The Commission shall monitor the administration, the collection and the enforcement of municipal sales and use taxes, and/or interest and penalties with respect thereto, under the Ordinances. The Commission shall provide the Municipality such information as may be requested by the Municipality with respect to any protest or any refund of municipal sales or use taxes levied by the Municipality. The Municipality shall also be entitled to consult with the Commission's legal staff about protests and refunds and, to the extent that a protest or a refund involves one or more hearings, the Municipality shall, through legal counsel or other designated staff employed by the Municipality, be entitled to be present and observe such hearing(s); provided, however, the administrative law judge or the Commission may limit the number of counsel or other designated staff, if any, who may be present to the extent necessary to permit the hearing to be conducted in an orderly fashion and without undue trepidation on the part of the taxpayer.

To the extent that such documents and/or such information relates to municipal sales or use taxes, and/or interest and penalties with respect thereto, and is requested, at any time and from time to time by the Municipality, the Commission shall promptly provide to the Municipality (a) copies of applications for sales tax permits, (b) copies of sales or use tax reports, (c) copies of installment or other payment plans, if any, with taxpayers and (d) other documents and other information.

The Commission shall promptly notify the Municipality of any conduct which the Commission believes might be the basis for a criminal prosecution by the Municipality under the Ordinances and shall provide to the Municipality all of the documents and the information in the possession of the Commission with respect thereto, including, without limitation, the names of employees of the Commission who might be witnesses with respect thereto.

The Municipality acknowledges that Section 205 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes, which makes the records and the files of the Commission confidential (subject to specified exceptions) and which prohibits disclosure of such records and such files (subject to specified exceptions), includes the Commission's records and files with respect to the receipt and the collection of municipal sales and use tax. Nothing contained herein is intended to require the Commission to disclose to the Municipality any information whose disclosure to the Municipality is prohibited by Section 205.

The Commission acknowledges that (a) Section 205(c)(7) of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes permits the Commission to furnish information disclosed by the records and the files of the Commission to an official person or body of this state who is concerned with the administration or the assessment of certain taxes, such as the Municipality, (b) Section 205(c)(22) of Title 68 permits the disclosure to the governing body or municipal attorney, if so designated by the governing body, of information directly involved in the resolution of issues arising out of the enforcement of a municipal sales and use tax ordinance, such as the Ordinances, pursuant to a municipal tax collection agreement, such as this Agreement, and (c) Section 22-107 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma Statutes and Section 205.1 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes permits the Commission to release specified information to municipalities.

The Municipality acknowledges that Section 205 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes may prevent the disclosure by the Municipality and persons associated with the Municipality of information which is provided by the Commission to the Municipality and that improper disclosure by the Municipality or any such person of such Information may result in civil and criminal liability. The Municipality shall comply with the restrictions imposed by Section 205.

- 15. The Commission has the authority to enter into an installment or other payment agreement with any taxpayer, including a taxpayer prosecuted under a municipal sales or use tax ordinance, for state and local taxes owed by the taxpayer. Commission will, through its use of a pay plan in order to keep a delinquent business open, collect the liability as quickly as possible by requiring a significant down payment and completion of the pay plan in as short a period as possible. The Municipality shall be entitled to consult with the Commission's legal staff about an installment or other payment agreement prior to negotiation of such an agreement. The installment or other payment agreement shall be void if the taxpayer becomes delinquent in future tax liability or payment under the agreement becomes delinquent. The Commission shall furnish a list of all sales and use taxpayers which have entered into agreements with the Commission on a monthly basis along with the terms, conditions and status of each such installment or payment agreement.
- 16. In the event of termination of this Agreement, the Commission will cause to be paid over to the Municipality, all municipal sales and use tax funds in its possession then due and payable under this Agreement. The Municipality shall thereafter be liable for and shall pay any refunds of municipal sales or use tax required by law to be made, including refunds of municipal sales or use tax, penalty and interest paid under protest that must be refunded and any interest required thereon. After such termination, the Commission's liability shall extend only to the amount of such funds being held by it. The Municipality agrees to pay any interest

required by law to be paid on such refunds.

17. The Commission shall have the authority to assess and to collect, on behalf of the Municipality, the municipal sales and use taxes levied by the Ordinances, and the interest and the penalties with respect thereto, including, without limitation, any municipal sales or use tax, interest and/or penalty existing on the date hereof except as provide in paragraph 18 below.

The Municipality agrees to refrain from contacting directly persons or entities doing business within the boundary of the Municipality subject to the requirements of paragraph 19. Municipality does have the inherent authority to contact vendors within and without the municipality concerning the vendor's alleged violation of municipal ordinances prior to the initiation of criminal prosecution.

The Municipality may inquire of the Commission into the compliance of persons and entities with the Ordinances and, to the extent that the Municipality determines that any person or any entity has not complied with the Ordinances, the Municipality may request the Commission to issue a proposed assessment against such person or such entity. To the extent that the Commission receives any such request, the Commission shall review such request within 45 days. If, after said review, Commission believes that-such request presents a basis for a proposed assessment, Commission shall issue a proposed assessment. Any such proposed assessment shall be resolved as provided in Sections 201 et seq. of Title 68 and the procedural rules promulgated by the Commission.

The Municipality may, at the option of the Municipality, request the Commission to initiate a show cause proceeding against a person or an entity which the Municipality believes, in good faith, not to be in compliance with the Ordinances or any provision thereof. To the extent that the Commission receives any such request, the Commission shall review such request within 45 days. If after said review, Commission believes that such request presents a basis for a show cause proceeding, Commission shall initiate a show cause proceeding. Such show cause proceeding shall be conducted as provided in the procedural rules promulgated by the Commission.

The Commission and the Municipality acknowledge the mutual interest of the Commission and the Municipality in maximizing compliance with the Ordinances and the collection of local taxes thereunder. The Municipality may, at any time and from time to time, either alone or in conjunction with other municipalities, submit a written proposal for collection and enforcement activities for consideration by the Commission; provided, however, it is expressly understood that any such written proposal must provide for coordination with the collection and enforcement activities of the Commission, provide for the use of the then applicable audit standards of the Commission and otherwise be in form and in substance to the Commission. In the event that Municipality's proposal is accepted by Commission, Municipality will be authorized to conduct the activities included in such proposal on behalf of Commission and no other action will be authorized by the Commission by a municipality or municipalities not included in the accepted proposal.

Provided further that upon the request of the municipality, either alone or in conjunction with other municipalities, the Commission shall enter into contractual agreements with the municipality or group of municipalities whereby the municipality or group of municipalities are authorized to implement or augment the Commission's enforcement through a contract with a private auditor(s) or audit firm(s) of the municipal tax. The auditor(s) or audit firm(s) shall first be approved by the Commission and once approved shall be appointed as an agent of the

Oklahoma Tax Commission for purposes of the audit. Contracts with a private auditor or audit firm are not subject to the limitations of Section 262 of title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and the parties, the municipality, private auditor or audit firm and the Commission, are authorized to exchange necessary information to effectively perform the contracted audit. The municipality, its officers and employees and the private auditors or audit firms may receive all information necessary to perform the audit and shall preserve the confidentiality of such information as required by Section 205, title 68, of the Oklahoma Statutes, including the penalties set out therein. The Commission shall be furnished the audit results and all relevant supporting documentation. The municipalities shall pay for the private auditor(s) or audit firm(s) by deduction from the tax assessment resulting from said audit unless another method of payment is set out in the contract with the private auditor or audit firm. Any municipal sales and use tax funds recovered as a result of the use by the municipality of a private auditor or audit firm shall not be subject to the retention calculated by the Commission as provided in Paragraph 5 of this agreement, in addition the Commission shall pay to the municipality any retainage that the Commission shall be entitled to for collection of county sales and use tax and shall pay to the municipality the state's pro rata share of the expenses of the auditor. Provided further the Commission shall have no obligation to any municipality that does not participate in an audit conducted under subsection D of Section 2702 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes or an audit conducted pursuant to this section.

Notice of a proposed independent audit shall be provided to the municipality and the municipality shall within 30 days provide acceptance or rejection of participation in the audit. Failure to act within the 30 day time period shall mean that the municipality shall not be included in the audit. Failure to act with respect to a particular independent audit within the 30 day time period shall relieve the Commission of its obligation to audit on behalf of the municipality with respect to that particular audit.

18. The Commission acknowledges the need for municipalities to have input into rulings made by the Commission regarding requests for waivers of penalties and interest assessed on municipal sales and use taxes. Therefore, the Commission agrees to provide municipalities with the opportunity to make recommendations regarding such waiver requests. Such notification shall not include waiver requests received by the Commission through its Voluntary Disclosure Agreement Program.

The Account Maintenance Division or the General Counsel's Office of the Commission will notify municipalities at least two weeks prior to submission of a waiver request to the Commission. The notification will apply to all waiver requests for penalties and interest that was assessed on state and local sales and use taxes in excess of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00). Any recommendation made by the municipality will be presented to the Commission at the time of consideration of the request. If the municipality fails to make a recommendation in the time allotted, the Division will present the request to the Commission without a municipal recommendation. The Division will notify the municipality of the Commission decision.

- 19. A City/town may commence compliance activities under the following conditions:
- A. The following words and terms, when used in this Agreement, shall have the following meaning, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
 - 1. "Agent" means an employee of the Municipality or person or entity acting under contract with the Municipality and certified by the Commission as an agent

for the purpose of compliance activities as set out in this agreement except for municipal criminal prosecution.

- 2. "Compliance activities" means all actions to assist or induce a delinquent seller to comply with applicable laws, rules and regulations, to accurately and timely collect, source, report and remit sales and use taxes within the municipality's jurisdiction and shall include:
 - a. The identification of and reporting to the Tax Commission any unregistered sellers making sales sourced to the municipality under the laws of this state. "Unregistered seller" shall mean any delinquent seller which has failed to apply for a sales or use tax permit with the Tax Commission. Provided, the term shall not include any out-of-state seller that does not have a legal requirement to register with the state;
 - b. The prosecution of any criminal violations of a municipal ordinance related to the payment of sales or use taxes. "Prosecution" shall mean the initiation of legal proceedings by the filing of a complaint in a municipal criminal court of record pursuant to Section 28-113 of Title 11 or by the filing of a complaint in a municipal court not of record pursuant to the provisions of Section 27-115 of Title 11; and
 - c. Any additional compliance activities that may be performed by the agent of the municipality on accounts of delinquent sellers that were assigned to the agent at the request of the municipality that do not result in a duplication of compliance activities.

Compliance activities **shall not include** the following activities, over which the Tax Commission shall have sole authority:

- a. Registering new taxpayer accounts,
- b. Issuing and administering taxpayer permits,
- c. Receiving returns,
- d. Receiving remittances of sales and use taxes,
- e. Issuing assessments,
- f. Conducting hearings under Section 212 of Title 68,
- g. Developing pay plans in consultation with the municipality as provided in the Agreement for Administration of the Sales and Use Tax Ordinances,
- h. Revoking permits,
- i. Taking legal action to close a business,
- j. Issuing refunds and credits,
- k. Managing audits, and
- I. Determination of taxability of sales transactions.
- 3. "Delinquent seller" means any person making sales of tangible personal property or services in this state, the gross receipts or gross proceeds from which are taxed by law and fails to obtain a permit, file a sales tax return as required by law, or is delinquent in whole or in part in the collection and remittance of sales or use taxes.

- 4. "Enhanced collections" means any remittance of past due or unpaid state sales or use taxes, including penalty and interest, obtained from a delinquent seller that was not registered, underreported, failed to report or remit, failed to comply with a payment plan, or arising from liens filed by the Tax Commission following documented compliance activity of a municipality or person or entity acting under contract with such municipality.
- B. Municipality elects to engage in the compliance activities designated by notice to the Commission; provided that Municipality may change its designation upon timely notice.
- C. This Agreement shall include appointment of persons or entities approved by the Commission conducting compliance activities on behalf of Municipality as agents of the Commission. No appointment shall be necessary or required for Municipality to engage in prosecution of any criminal violations of its ordinance related to the payment of sales or use taxes.

All persons, including municipal employees and employees of entities acting under contract with a municipality, that will be performing compliance activities for Municipality must meet minimum qualifications provided herein and undergo training provided by the Tax Commission. The minimum qualifications shall consist of a bachelor's degree; or an equivalent combination of education and experience, substituting one year of experience in business management, tax revenue, credit collections, or investigative work for each year of the required degree. Provided, the minimum qualifications provided herein shall not apply to employees of municipalities seeking appointment as an agent if the municipality has a population less than 25,000.

Contracts with a private auditor or audit firm are not subject to the limitations of Section 262 of title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and the parties, the municipality, private auditor or audit firm and the Commission, are authorized to exchange necessary information to effectively perform the contracted audit. The municipality, its officers and employees and the private auditors or audit firms may receive all information necessary to perform the audit and shall preserve the confidentiality of such information as required by Section 205, title 68, of the Oklahoma Statutes, including the penalties set out therein.

With the execution of this Agreement, Municipality shall provide the names of all persons, including employees of Municipality, who will be performing compliance activities on behalf of Municipality. The Commission shall issue letters of appointment for all persons who meet or are exempt from the minimum requirements.

Municipality agrees to notify the Commission when additional persons are added by Municipality to conduct compliance activities on behalf of Municipality. Municipality further agrees to immediately notify the Commission of the termination of employment or cancellation of contract of any person appointed as an agent for the purposes of conducting compliance activities.

D. The Commission shall provide to Municipality and agents appointed by the Commission to perform compliance activities all information necessary to perform compliance activities. Municipality and agent shall preserve the confidentiality of the information as required by Section 205 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Failure to comply with the statutory confidentiality requirements shall result in immediate

withdrawal of appointment of any person to perform compliance activities and may result in civil and criminal liability.

Nothing herein shall limit Municipality's use of information provided by the Commission in prosecution of violations of Municipality's tax ordinances.

- E. As provided in Section 2702(E)(3) of Title 68, the Tax Commission shall reimburse a municipality performing any of the compliance activities defined above as follows:
 - 1. The Tax Commission shall pay to the municipality an amount equal to three-fourths of one percent (3/4 of 1%) of enhanced collections from any unregistered seller identified and reported to the Commission by a municipality for any sales made during the period the seller was unregistered with the Tax Commission;
 - 2. The Tax Commission shall not retain any fee and refund any fee retained from the collection of city sales and use taxes remitted as a result of the prosecution of any criminal violations of a municipal ordinance; and
 - 3. The Tax Commission shall pay to the municipality an amount equal to three-fourths of one percent (¾ of 1%) of enhanced collections from any delinquent seller as a result of other compliance activities documented by the municipality or person acting under contract with such municipality.

To receive compensation, Municipality shall provide documentation of compliance activities which generated the enhanced collections. Documentation shall consist of reports, on forms prescribed by the Commission, listing the name of the delinquent seller, date of compliance activity, type of activity, and such other information as may be necessary to identify the delinquent seller, compliance activity, or enhanced collections.

The Commission shall provide reimbursements on a monthly basis and provide a monthly report to Municipality indicating, at a minimum, the name of the delinquent seller, amount of enhanced collections, and date of remittance by the delinquent seller in the previous month.

The Commission shall use its best efforts to cause reimbursements as a separate distribution to be paid to Municipality no later than the tenth day of each calendar month following the month of receipt of the report of enhanced collections filed with the Commission.

- 20. It is recognized and acknowledged that the <u>Municipal</u> Ordinances include criminal sanctions for violation of the Ordinances. Notwithstanding anything else contained herein, the Municipality shall have the exclusive authority to prosecute any criminal violations of the Ordinances and the Commission shall refrain from taking any such action. Nothing contained herein shall prevent the State of Oklahoma from prosecuting persons for crimes under state law, including, without limitation, embezzlement by a vendor of a municipal sales tax.
- 21. To the extent that the Municipality decides to prosecute criminally any action under this Agreement, the Commission and the Municipality shall cooperate, in good faith, to

maximize collections under the Ordinances and to minimize duplicative effort by the Commission and the Municipality.

- 22. Where the municipality takes the action recognized by paragraph 20 of this Agreement for prosecution to enforce its sales or use tax ordinance, all taxes shall be paid by the taxpayer directly to the Commission. Any resulting payment of municipal tax shall not be subject to the retention calculated by the Commission for the collection of city sales and use taxes as provided in Paragraph 5 of this agreement, subject to the implementation plan established in paragraph 2B of this agreement.
- 23. The Municipality agrees that, if there is a challenge to the constitutionality or the legality of the Ordinances or any provision thereof (other than a challenge based on the application by the Commission of the Ordinances or any provision thereof), the Municipality shall be responsible for the resolution of such challenge. If such a challenge is based on the application by the Commission of the Ordinances or any provision thereof, the Commission shall be responsible for the resolution of such challenge. The party responsible for the resolution of any challenge shall make all decisions with respect to the prosecution and the settlement of any litigation with respect to such challenge and the other party shall cooperate with the responsible party with respect to the resolution of such challenge. The Commission shall provide notice to the Municipality of any challenge. Notice will be provided within seven (7) business of the receipt of the challenge and the municipality shall be allowed to participate in any decision.
- 24. The change in the boundary of Municipality shall be effective for sales tax purposes only, on the first day of a calendar quarter following the enlargement of the municipal city limits. If a municipality should de-annex a territory the sales tax from business or firms located in the de-annexed area shall cease on the effective date of the de-annexation ordinance. Municipality shall give the Commission notice in writing of any annexation or de-annexation of territory to the municipality at least as required by Title 68 Oklahoma Statutes Section 2701. The notice shall include a verified copy of the boundaries of the newly annexed or de-annexed territory. In addition all Municipality limit lines shall be shown in map form, and certified to the Commission by the municipal clerk.
- 25. Neither Municipality nor Commission has entered into this Agreement with the intention of violating state law or the provisions of the Streamlined Sales Tax Agreement. If it is determined by either party that any provision violates either state law or the Streamlined Sales Tax Agreement, such provision of the Agreement shall be null and void. The remaining provision of the Agreement shall be in effect until the expiration or termination of the Agreement.
- 26. If a dispute arises from the application of paragraph nineteen (19) of this Agreement, and if the dispute cannot be settled through negotiation, the Commission and Municipality agree first to try in good faith to settle the dispute by mediation. Either party may request mediation before the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services in the manner the Director deems appropriate.

27. This Agreement shall be in effect from, until	,

Mr. Modzelewski,

The City of McAlester has taken several steps to improve the level of flood protection and floodplain management within its borders as part of its participation in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). Additionally, the City has been designated a Small MS4 by the ODEQ and is subject to permitting under Phase II of the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) program, which requires the proper management of storm water runoff. Compliance with NFIP and NPDES requirements often leads to the development of storm water utility fees as a source of revenues supporting infrastructure improvements and storm water related activities.

On July 14, 2015, an agreement between the City of McAlester and Meshek & Associates to develop and assist with the implementation of a Storm Water Utility Fee (SUF) was approved. Meshek has been working with the City on various projects since 2006. The need for a dedicated source of revenue to provide funding for water quality, drainage studies and drainage related capital improvement projects has been discussed many times. In 2007, Meshek performed an initial estimate of the potential for a SUF. In 2012, Meshek performed a drainage study for the upper portion of Tributary C of Sandy Creek. This study identified five problem areas within the 640 acre drainage basin. Recommendations totaling \$3.17M were identified. The recommended improvements at Mallard & Flamingo have been designed and constructed. Phase one of the recommended improvements at 9th & Illinois have been designed and construction is set to start this month.

The format for the proposed fee is the most common format used in SUF's in the region and includes two categories: Residential and Non-Residential. The average residential lot is generally estimated as having an average impervious area of 2,650 square feet. This is referred to as an Equivalent Service Unit (ESU). For non-residential customers, we have calculated the impervious area within the boundaries of each service address. The total impervious area is divided by 2,650 to determine how many ESU's a non-residential customer will pay.

Each community that uses this approach sets a fee for each ESU. This fee is paid monthly by all residential customers and non-residential customers and is often determined by defining the annual funding needs for the City and determining the fee. The following items have been identified by the City as items that could be funded in whole or part with this fee with a total annual need of over \$1.5M.

1. Drainage Related Capital Improvements

\$1,080,000/year

a. The Upper Tributary C study was approximately 20% of the total basin area within the City. We can project the \$3.17M to the rest of the City and estimate a total of \$65M in projects. Assuming a 30-year time horizon, this would result in

an annual need of \$2.17M/yr. From there, we can assume 50% are higher priority and reduce the annual need to \$1.08M.

2. Annual Maintenance to the Drainage System

\$350,000/year

- a. Several repairs have been made to the drainage system in the past few years. The canal system is aging and we anticipate a need of \$350,000 per year for maintenance and repair.
- 3. Storm Water Quality Program

\$50,000/year

- a. The historical cost for consultants to assist with the Storm Water Management Program have varied from \$30k to \$60k. ODEQ released a new permit on November 1, 2015 which will require more work than the last few years.
- 4. Drainage Related Equipment

\$50,000/year

a. Street sweepers, grade-alls and other equipment that are primarily used for storm water maintenance.

Based on our calculations, the table below shows the anticipated fee totals on a monthly and annual basis for three different rates. It would take more than a \$5 fee to generate the anticipate revenue required to fund the Storm Water needs.



Commissioner Bollinger opened the item for discussion at 6:45 P.M. Leroy Alsup, Director of the Community and Economic Development Department, presented the staff report to the Commission and it is hereby incorporated in the minutes by reference. Staff recommended that the property at 1401 Wade Watts Avenue (Lot 5, in Block 416) be rezoned from R-1B Single-Family Residential District to C-2 Neighborhood Convenience District based on the following reasoning:

- 1. The Wade Watts Corridor is a transition area that is becoming a commercial corridor. The neighborhood no longer lends itself to new residential development. The property to the west and southwest are zoned C-2 Neighborhood Convenience District. Even, the property to south is developed commercially under a Use Permitted After Review.
- 2. The rezoning of 1401 Wade Watts Avenue (Lot 5, in Block 416) would be an extension of the existing C-2 Neighborhood Convenience District directly to the West and Southwest, therefore the 50,000 sq. ft. minimum lot area for rezoning to C-2 would not be satisfied (precedent set by City Ordinance #2178 discussed in the staff report).
- 3. The property at 1401 Wade Watts Avenue (Lot 5, in Block 416) would remain within the Wade Watts Corridor Development therefore the Exterior standards/visual appeal guidelines set forth in Sec 62-213 (g) would remain applicable to the property even after it was rezoned.

Further, staff recommended that if the Planning Commission determined they were not favorable to rezoning the property at 1401 Wade Watts Avenue (Lot 5, in Block 416) from R-1B Single-Family Residential District to C-2 Neighborhood Convenience District, then staff would recommend granting a Use Permitted After Review at 1401 Wade Watts Avenue for a barbershop and beauty shop.

Commissioner Bollinger asked if anyone for or against the application wished to speak. No one came forward. Commissioner Bollinger closed the public hearing on the matter at 6:53 PM and called for a motion. BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The subject property at 1401 Wade Watts Avenue is within the Wade Watts Corridor Development. Even though the underlying zoning of this particular parcel remains R-1B Single-Family Residential District, under the Wade Watts Corridor regulations specific commercial uses delineated in Zoning Ordinance Section 62-213 (e) (*inserted below*) may be approved through the "Use Permitted After Review" process for those lots within the Corridor that remained zoned R-1B.

On September 21, 2010 the Planning Commission approved a "Use Permitted After Review" application from Ms. Renfro requesting to use the property at 1401 Wade Watts Avenue for the specific use as a "Real Estate Office" (*Professional Offices*).

The 2010 Use Permitted After Review" approval was <u>specific to "Real Estate Office"</u> (*Professional Offices*), therefore if Ms. Renfro wants to now use the property for another commercial use delineated in Zoning Ordinance Section 62-213 (e), a new "Use Permitted After Review" application would be required.

OPTIONS:

- 1. Consider rezoning property at 1401 Wade Watts Avenue from R-1B Single-Family Residential District to C-2 Neighborhood Convenience District
 - On August 24, 2004, by City Ordinance #2178, Lot 2 in Block 456 to the southwest of the subject property was rezoned from R-1B Single-Family Residential District to C-2 Neighborhood Convenience District (*Predates the creation of the Wade Watts Corridor*). In the staff report, it supports this rezoning by pointing out that the property to North was already zoned C-2 and that the lot did not lend itself to new residential development. Further, it states that the rezoning of Lot 2 in Block 456 was an extension of the C-2 directly to the North and therefore the 50,000 sq. ft. minimum lot area for rezoning to C-2 was not applicable (Sec. 62-202 (d) (1) b).
 - Advantage to Property Owner- If the property owner desires to use the property for another C-2 permitted use besides a "Barber and/or Beauty Shop" in the future they would not have to go through the "Use Permitted After Review" process each time the use of the property changed. However, on the flip side, any change of use in the future to another type of commercial development allowed as a C-2 permitted use would no longer be subject to Planning Commission review.

- Sec 62-213 (g) Exterior standards/visual appeal guidelines established for Wade Watts Corridor Development would still be applicable because even if the property is rezoned it would still be within the Wade Watts Corridor.
- The Uses Permitted After Review in the Wade Watts Corridor Development and the Uses Permitted in C-2 Neighborhood Convenience District are not identical.

#### **Staff Recommendation:**

Staff recommends that the property at 1401 Wade Watts Avenue (Lot 5, in Block 416) be rezoned from R-1B Single-Family Residential District to C-2 Neighborhood Convenience District.

- 1. The Wade Watts Corridor is a transition area that is becoming a commercial corridor. The neighborhood no longer lends itself to new residential development. The property to the west and southwest are zoned C-2 Neighborhood Convenience District. Even, the property to south is developed commercially under Uses Permitted After Review.
- 2. The rezoning of 1401 Wade Watts Avenue (Lot 5, in Block 416) an extension of the C-2 Neighborhood Convenience District directly to the West and Southwest, therefore the 50,000 sq. ft. minimum lot area for rezoning to C-2 would not applicable (Sec. 62-202 (d) (1) b) (precedent set by City Ordinance #2178 discussed early in report).







- 3. The property at 1401 Wade Watts Avenue (Lot 5, in Block 416) would remain within the Wade Watts Corridor Development therefore the Exterior standards/visual appeal guidelines set forth in Sec 62-213 (g) would remain applicable to the property even after it was rezoned.

Further, staff recommended that if the Planning Commission determined they were not favorable to rezoning the property at 1401 Wade Watts Avenue (Lot 5, in Block 416) from R-1B Single-Family Residential District to C-2 Neighborhood Convenience District, then staff would recommend granting a Use Permitted After Review at 1401 Wade Watts Avenue for a barbershop and beauty shop.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

The subject property at 1401 Wade Watts Avenue is within the Wade Watts Corridor Development. Even though the underlying zoning of this particular parcel remains R-1B Single-Family Residential District, under the Wade Watts Corridor regulations specific commercial uses delineated in Zoning Ordinance Section 62-213 (e) (*inserted below*) may be approved through the "Use Permitted After Review" process for those lots within the Corridor that remained zoned R-1B.

On September 21, 2010 the Planning Commission approved a "Use Permitted After Review" application from Ms. Renfro requesting to use the property at 1401 Wade Watts Avenue for the specific use as a "Real Estate Office" (*Professional Offices*).

The 2010 Use Permitted After Review" approval was <u>specific to "Real Estate Office"</u> (*Professional Offices*), therefore if Ms. Renfro wants to now use the property for another commercial use delineated in Zoning Ordinance Section 62-213 (e), a new "Use Permitted After Review" application would be required.

## **OPTIONS:**

- 1. Consider rezoning property at 1401 Wade Watts Avenue from R-1B Single-Family Residential District to C-2 Neighborhood Convenience District
  - On August 24, 2004, by City Ordinance #2178, Lot 2 in Block 456 to the southwest of the subject property was rezoned from R-1B Single-Family Residential District to C-2 Neighborhood Convenience District (*Predates the creation of the Wade Watts Corridor*). In the staff report, it supports this rezoning by pointing out that the property to North was already zoned C-2 and that the lot did not lend itself to new residential development. Further, it states that the rezoning of Lot 2 in Block 456 was an extension of the C-2 directly to the North and therefore the 50,000 sq. ft. minimum lot area for rezoning to C-2 was not applicable (Sec. 62-202 (d) (1) b).
  - Advantage to Property Owner- If the property owner desires to use the property for another C-2 permitted use besides a "Barber and/or Beauty Shop" in the future they would not have to go through the "Use Permitted After Review" process each time the use of the property changed. However, on the flip side, any change of use in the future to another type of commercial development allowed as a C-2 permitted use would no longer be subject to Planning Commission review.

- Sec 62-213 (g) Exterior standards/visual appeal guidelines established for Wade Watts Corridor Development would still be applicable because even if the property is rezoned it would still be within the Wade Watts Corridor.





AN ORDINANCE, AMENDING ARTICLE II DISCRIMINATION, SECTION 58-26 THROUGH 58-97 OF MCALESTER CITY CODES TO BRING ARTICLE II DISCRIMINATION INTO COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE STATE AND FEDERAL LAW, REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES, PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

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#### ARTICLE II. DISCRIMINATION

#### **DIVISION 1. GENERALLY**

Sec. 58-26. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Age means that period of time when a worker is at least 40 years old and less than 70 years old. *Commission* means the community relations commission.

Commissioner means a member of the commission.

Discriminatory practice means the practice designated as discriminatory under this article.

Employer means a person who has 15 or more employees for each working day in each of 20 or more calendar weeks in the current or preceding calendar year, or a person who as a contractor or subcontractor is furnishing the material or performing work for the state or a governmental entity or agency of the state and includes an agent of such a person but does not include an Indian tribe or a bona fide membership club not organized for profit.

Employment agency means a person regularly undertaking with or without compensation to procure employees for an employer or to procure for employees opportunities to work for an employer and includes an agent of such a person.

Handicapped person <u>Disabled person</u> means a person who has a physical or mental impairment which substantially limits one or more of such person's major life activities, has a record of such an impairment or is regarded as having such an impairment.

Labor organization includes:

- (1) An organization of any kind, an agency or employee representation committee, group, association, or plan in which employees participate and which exists for the purpose, in whole or in part, of dealing with employers concerning grievances, labor disputes, wages, rates of pay, hours, or other terms or conditions of employment.
- (2) A conference, general committee, joint or system board, or joint council so engaged which is subordinate to a national or international labor organization.
- (3) An agent of a labor organization.

National origin includes the national origin of an ancestor.

Owner means the owner, co-owner, lessee, sublessee, mortgagee, assignee, manager, agent, employee or any other person having the right of ownership or possession or the authority to sell, rent or lease any dwelling unit, or any person having an equitable or security interest in any dwelling unit, including the city and its departments, boards, commissions and authorities.

*Person* means an individual, association, corporation, joint apprenticeship, committee, joint stock company, labor union, legal representative, mutual company, partnership, receiver, trust, trustee, trustee in bankruptcy, unincorporated organization, any other legal or commercial entity, the state, or any governmental entity or agency, including the city.

Place of public accommodation means any place, store or other establishment, either licensed or unlicensed, which supplies goods or services to the general public or which solicits or accepts the patronage or trade of the general public or which is supported directly or indirectly by government funds; except, that a private club is not a place of public accommodation, if its policies are determined by its members and its facilities or services are available only to its members and their bona fide guests. However, a place of public accommodation shall not include barbershops or beauty shops or privately owned resort or amusement establishments or an establishment located within a building which contains not more than five rooms for rent or hire and which is actually occupied by the proprietor of the establishment as his residence.

Real estate broker means any person who for a fee or other valuable consideration manages, sells, purchases, exchanges or rents or negotiates, or offers or attempts to negotiate the sale, purchase, exchange or rental of, the real property of another, or holds itself out as engaged in the business of managing, selling, purchasing, exchanging or renting the real property of another, or collects rent for the use of the real property of another, and includes real estate salesmen or agents or any other person employed by a real estate broker to perform or to assist in the performance of his business.

#### DIVISION 2. COMMUNITY RELATIONS COMMISSION

Sec. 58-36. Established.

There is hereby established a community relations commission of the city, consisting of five members, to be appointed by the mayor and city council, for terms of two years; provided, however, that for the first appointment under the provisions of this article, three members shall be appointed for a period of two years and two members shall be appointed for a period of one year. All appointments thereafter shall be for a term of two years. The mayor, or his designee, shall serve as an ex officio member.

Sec. 58-37.

Duties.

The community relations commission shall have the following duties to:

- (1) Receive, investigate, and seek the satisfactory adjustment of complaints which charge discriminatory practices as set forth in this article.
- (2) Study and investigate by means of public hearings or otherwise any condition having an adverse effect on intergroup relations in the city and study the problems of prejudice and intolerance, bigotry and discrimination as they affect the public safety and general welfare of the city.

- (3) Institute and conduct educational and other programs to promote the equal rights and opportunities of all persons regardless of their race, color, religion, national origin, sex, political affiliation, age, marital status or handicap age, genetic information, disability, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law, and to promote understanding among persons, groups of different races, colors, religions, national origins, sex, political affiliations, ages, marital status or handicaps age, genetic information, disability, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law. In performance of this duty, the commission may cooperate with interested citizens, private agencies, and agencies of the federal, state and local government.
- (4) Hold hearings, make findings of fact, adopt such rules and policies as may be necessary within the limits of this article, and otherwise carry out the purposes and provisions of this article.

#### Sec. 58.38. Procedures and powers.

- (a) Any person aggrieved by discriminatory practices prohibited by this article may file with the community relations commission a complaint in writing, under oath. The complaint shall be signed by the person claiming to be aggrieved, and shall state the name and address of the person alleged to have violated the provisions of this article, and shall further set forth the particulars of the violation, and may include such other information as may be required by the commission. Complaints filed under this section shall be filed within 60 days after the alleged violation, and failure to file within such time shall be considered a waiver of the application of this article. The commission may issue a complaint on its own initiative, at any time it has knowledge that a person has violated any of the provisions of this article.
- (b) The commission shall investigate each complaint filed, and shall attempt an adjustment of the complaint by means of conference and conciliation. Sixty days shall be allowed for the purpose of investigation, conference and conciliation. Upon determination that a complaint is not well founded, the commission shall dismiss the complaint and notify the complainant and respondent in writing of such dismissal. If the commission takes no action within 90 days of the filing of the complaint, it shall be considered dismissed.
- (c) If conference or conciliation does not result in compliance with this article, the commission shall cause to be issued and served in the name of the city a written notice together with a copy of the complaint, requiring the person named in the complaint, hereinafter referred to as the respondent, to answer charges of the complaint at a hearing before the commission at a time and place to be specified in the notice.
- (d) At the hearing provided for in subsection (c) above, the complainant or person aggrieved may appear in person and/or by counsel, and the respondent may file a written answer to the complaint and may appear in person and/or by legal counsel. The commission, when conducting any hearing, pursuant to this section, may permit amendments to any complaint or answer, and the testimony taken at the hearing shall be under oath, and shall be transcribed at the request of either party, or at the direction of the commission. If the commission finds at the hearing that the respondent has engaged in any discriminatory practice or practices prohibited by this article, it shall state its findings of fact, and shall so certify the matter to the city attorney for appropriate

action. No prosecution shall be brought under this article except upon such certification. If the commission, upon hearing, finds that the respondent has not engaged in any discriminatory practice, it shall state its findings of fact, and shall issue and file an order dismissing the complaint. The commission shall establish rules and regulations to govern, expedite and effectuate the foregoing procedure, and shall maintain the files provided for herein.

Sec. 58-39. Service of notices.

All notices required under this article to be served upon any person may be served personally on such person, or by mailing a copy thereof by certified or registered mail, with return receipt requested, to the current business or residence address of such person.

#### **DIVISION 3. EMPLOYMENT**

Sec. 58-51. Employers.

- (a) It is a discriminatory practice for an employer to:
- (1) Failor refuse to hire, to discharge or otherwise to discriminate against an individual with respect to compensation or the terms, conditions, privileges or responsibilities of employment because of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, political affiliation, age, marital status or handicap age, genetic information, disability, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law.
- (2) Limit, segregate or classify an employee in a way which would deprive or tend to deprive him of employment opportunities or otherwise adversely affect his status because of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, political affiliation, age, marital status or handicap age, genetic information, disability, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law.
- (b) This section shall not apply to the employment of an individual by his parents, spouse or child, or to employment in the domestic service of the employer.

Sec. 58-52. Employment agencies.

It is a discriminatory practice for an employment agency to fail or refuse to refer for employment, or otherwise to discriminate against, an individual because of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, political affiliation, age, marital status or handicap age, genetic information, disability, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law, or to classify or refer to employment of an individual on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, political affiliation, age, marital status or handicap age, genetic information, disability, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law.

Sec. 58-53. Labor organizations.

It is a discriminatory practice for a labor organization to:

(1) Exclude or to expel from membership, or otherwise to discriminate against, a member or applicant for membership because of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, political affiliation, age, marital status or handicap age, genetic information, disability, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law.

- (2) Limit, segregate or classify membership, or to classify or to fail or refuse to refer for employment an individual in a way:
- a. Which would deprive or tend to deprive an individual of employment opportunities; or
- b. Which would limit employment opportunities or otherwise adversely affect the status of an employee or of an applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, political affiliation, age, marital status or handicap age, genetic information, disability, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law.
- (3) Cause or attempt to cause an employer to violate the provisions of this article.

#### Sec. 58.54. Training programs.

It is a discriminatory practice for an employer, labor organization, or joint labor-management committee controlling apprenticeship, on-the-job, or other training or retraining program, to discriminate against an individual because of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, political affiliation, age, marital status or handicap age, genetic information, disability, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law in admission to, or employment in, a program established to provide apprenticeship or other training.

#### Sec. 58-55. Other discriminatory practices.

It is a discriminatory practice for an employer, labor organization or employment agency to print or publish or cause to be printed or published a notice or advertisement relating to employment by the employer or membership in or a classification or referral for employment by the labor organization, or relating to a classification or referral for employment by the employment agency, indicating a preference, limitation, specification, or discrimination, based on race, color, religion, national origin, sex, political affiliation, age, marital status or handicap age, genetic information, disability, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law. However, a notice or advertisement may indicate a preference, limitation, specification or discrimination based on race, color, religion, national origin, sex, political affiliation, age, marital status or handicap when it is a bona fide occupational qualification for employment.

#### Sec. 58-56. Exceptions.

#### It is not a discriminatory practice:

- (1) For an employer to hire and employ an employee, or an employment agency to classify or refer for employment an individual, for a labor organization to classify its membership or to classify or refer for employment an individual, or for an employer, labor organization, or joint labor management committee controlling an apprenticeship or other training or retraining program to admit or employ an individual in the program, on the basis of his race, color, religion, national origin, sex, political affiliation, age, marital status or handicap.
- (2) For a school, college, university or other educational institution to hire and employ an employee of a particular religion if the school, college, university or other educational institution is, in whole or substantial part owned, supported, controlled or managed by a particular religion or by a particular religious corporation, association or society, or if the curriculum of the school,

college, university or other educational institution is directed toward the propagation of a particular religion.

- (3) For an employer to apply different standards of compensation or different terms, conditions, privileges or responsibilities of employment pursuant to a bona fide seniority or merit system, or a system which measures earnings by quantity or quality of production or to employees who work in different locations, if the differences are not the result of an intention to discriminate because of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, political affiliation, age, marital status or handicap age, genetic information, disability, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law.
- (4) For an employer to give and to act upon the results of a professionally developed ability test if the test, its administration, or action upon the results is not designed, intended, or used to discriminate because of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, political affiliation, age, marital status or handicap age, genetic information, disability, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law.

Sec. 58-57. Imbalance; number or percentage.

Nothing in this article requires an employer, employment agency, labor organization, or joint labor-management committee subject to this article to grant preferential treatment to an individual or group because of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, political affiliation, age, marital status or handicap age, genetic information, disability, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law of the individual or group on account of an imbalance which may exist with respect to the total number or percentage of persons of any race, color, religion, national origin, sex, political affiliation, age, marital status or handicap age, genetic information, disability, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law employed by an employer, referred or classified for employment by an employment agency or labor organization, admitted to membership or classified by a labor organization or admitted to, or employed in, an apprenticeship or other training or retraining program in comparison with the total number or percentage of persons of the race, color, religion, national origin, sex, political affiliation, age, marital status or handicap age, genetic information, disability, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law in the state or a community, section or other area. However, it is not a discriminatory practice for a person subject to this article to adopt and carry out a plan to eliminate or reduce imbalance with respect to race, color, religion, national origin, sex, political affiliation, age, marital status or handicap age, genetic information, disability, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law if the plan has been filed with the commission under regulations of the commission and the commission has not disapproved the plan.

Sec. 58-58. Application of federal or state law.

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this article, it shall not be an unlawful employment practice or discrimination if the act is not prohibited by state or federal laws in regard to discrimination.

**DIVISION 4. PUBLIC ACCOMMODATIONS** 

Sec. 58-71. Discriminatory practice.

It is a discriminatory practice for a person to deny an individual the full and equal enjoyment of the goods, services, facilities, privileges, advantages and accommodations of a place of public accommodation because of age, sex, race, color, religion, handicap or national origin, genetic information, disability, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law.

#### **DIVISION 5. FAIR HOUSING**

Sec. 58-83. Policy.

It is the policy of the city to provide, within constitutional limitations, for fair housing throughout the city.

Sec. 58-84. Definitions.

Discriminatory housing practice means an act that is unlawful under sections 58-86, 58-87 and 58-88.

Dwelling means any building structure or portion thereof which is occupied as or designed or intended for occupation as a residence by one or more families and any vacant land which is offered for sale or lease for the construction or location thereon of any such building, structure or portion thereof.

Family includes a single individual.

*Person* includes one or more individuals, corporations, partnerships, associations, labor organizations, legal representatives, mutual companies, joint-stock companies, trusts, unincorporated organizations, trustees in bankruptcy, receivers and fiduciaries.

To rent includes to lease, to sublease, to let or otherwise to grant for a consideration the right to occupy premises owned by the occupant.

Sec. 58-85. Unlawful practices.

Subject to the provisions of subsection (2) and section 58-89, the prohibitions against discrimination in the sale or rental of housing set forth in section 58-85 shall apply to:

- (1) All dwellings except as exempted by subsection (2).
- (2) Nothing in section 58-86 shall apply to:
- a. Any single-family house sold or rented by an owner, provided that such private individual owner does not own more than three single-family houses at any one time; provided further that, in the case of the sale of any such single-family house by a private individual owner not residing in such house at the time of such sale or who was not the most recent resident of such house prior to such sale, the exemption granted by this subsection shall apply only with respect to one such

sale within any 24-month period; provided further that such bona fide private individual owners does not own any interest in, for is there owned or reserved on his behalf, under any express or voluntary agreement, title to or any right to all or a portion of the proceeds from the sale or rental of more than three such single-family houses at any one time; provided further that the sale or rental of any such single-family house shall be excepted from the application of this title only if such house is sold or rented:

- 1. Without the use in any manner of the sales or rental facilities or the sales or rental services of any real estate broker, agent or salesman or of such facilities or services on any person in the business of selling or renting dwellings or of any employee or agent of any such facilities or services of any person in the business of selling or renting dwellings or of any employee or agent of any such broker, agent, salesman or person; and
- 2. Without the publication, posting or mailing, after notice, of any advertisement or written notice in violation of section 58-86(3). However, nothing in this provision shall prohibit the use of attorneys, escrow agents, abstractors, title companies and other such professional assistance as is necessary to perfect or transfer the title; or b. Rooms or units in dwellings containing living quarters occupied or intended to be occupied by no more than four families living independently of each other, if the owner actually maintains and occupies one of such living quarters as his residence.
- (3) For the purposes of subsection (2), a person shall be deemed to be in the business of selling or renting dwellings if:
- a. He has, within the preceding 12 months, participated as principal in three or more transactions involving the sale or rental of any dwelling or any interest therein;
- b. He has, within the preceding 12 months, participated as an agent, other than in the sale of his own personal residence, in providing sales or rental facilities or sales or rental services in two or more transactions involving the sale or rental of any dwelling or any interest therein; or
- c. He is the owner of any dwelling designed or intended for occupancy by, or occupied by, five or more families.

Sec. 58-86. Discrimination in the sale or rental of housing.

As made applicable by section 58-85 and except as exempted by sections 58-85(2) and 58-89, it shall be unlawful to:

- (1) Refuse to sell or rent after the making of a bona fide offer or to refuse to negotiate for the sale or rental of or otherwise make unavailable or deny an dwelling to any person because of race, sex, color, religion, national origin, disability, age, genetic information, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law.
- (2) Discriminate against any person in the terms, conditions, or privileges of sale or rental of a dwelling or in the provision of services or facilities in connection therewith because of race, sex,

color, religion, national origin, disability or familial status. , age, genetic information, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law.

- (3) Make, print or publish or cause to be made, printed or published any notice, statement or advertisement with respect to the sale or rental of a dwelling that indicates any preference, imitation or discrimination based on race, sex, color, religion, national origin, disability or familial status, age, genetic information, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law or an intention to make any such preference, limitation or discrimination.
- (4) Represent to any person because of race, sex, color, religion, national origin, disability of familial status, age, genetic information, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law that any dwelling is not available for inspection, sale or rental when such dwelling is, in fact, so available.
- (5) Induce or attempt to induce any person to sell or rent any dwelling, for profit, by representations regarding the entry or prospective entry into the neighborhood of a person or persons of a particular race, sex, color, religion, national origin, disability or familial status., age, genetic information, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law.

Sec. 58-87. Discrimination in financing or housing.

It shall be unlawful for any bank, building and loan association, insurance company or other corporation, association, firm or enterprise whose business consists in whole or in part in the making of commercial real estate loans to deny a loan or other financial assistance to a person applying therefor for the purpose of purchasing, constructing, improving, repairing or maintaining a dwelling or to discriminate against him in the fixing of the amount, interest rate, duration or other terms or conditions of such loan or other financial assistance because of race, sex, color, religion, national origin, disability or familial status, age, genetic information, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law of such person or of any person associated with him in connection with such loan or other financial assistance or the purposes of such loan or other financial assistance or of the present or prospective owners, lessees, tenants or occupants of the dwelling or dwellings in the relation to which such loan or other financial assistance is to be made or given, provided that nothing contained in this section shall impair the scope or effectiveness of the exception contained in section

Sec. 58-88. Discrimination in the provision of brokerage services.

It shall be unlawful to deny any person access to or membership or participation in any multiple listing service, rental or facility relating to the business of selling or renting dwellings or to discriminate against him in the terms or conditions of such access, membership or participation on account of race, sex, color, religion, national origin, disability or familial status. , age, genetic information, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law.

Sec. 58-89. Exemption.

Nothing in this division shall prohibit a religious organization, association or society or any non-profit institution or organization operated, supervised or controlled by or in conjunction with a religious organization, association or society from limiting the sale, rental or occupancy of dwellings which it owns or operates for other than a commercial purpose to persons of the same religion or from giving preference to such persons, unless membership in such religion is restricted on account of race, sex, color, national origin, disability or familial status. age, genetic information, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law. Nor shall anything in this division prohibit a private club not, in fact, open to the public which, as an incident to its primary purpose or purposes, provides lodgings which it owns or operates for other than a commercial purpose, from limiting the rental or occupancy of such lodgings to its members or from giving preference to its members.

Sec. 58-90. Administration.

- (a) The authority and responsibility for administering the division shall be in the chief executive officer of the city.
- (b) The chief executive officer may delegate any of these functions, duties and powers to employees of the city or to boards of such employees, including functions, duties and powers, with respect to investigating, conciliating, hearing, determining, ordering, certifying, reporting or otherwise acting as to any work, business or matter under this division. The chief executive officer shall, by rule, prescribe such rights of appeal from the decisions of his hearing examiners to other hearing examiners or to other officers in the city, to boards of officers or to himself, as shall be appropriate and in accordance with law.
- (c) All executive departments and agencies shall administer their programs and activities relating to housing and urban development in a manner to affirmatively further the purposes of this division and shall cooperate with the chief executive officer to further such purposes.

Sec. 58-91. Education and conciliation.

Immediately after the enactment of this division, the chief executive officer shall commence such educational and conciliatory activities as will further the purposes of this division. He shall call conferences of persons in the housing industry and other interested parties to acquaint them with the provisions of this division and his suggested means of implementing it and shall endeavor, with their advice, to work out programs of voluntary compliance and of enforcement.

Sec. 58-92. Enforcement.

(a) Any person who claims to have been injured by a discriminatory housing practice or who believes that he will be irrevocably injured by a discriminatory housing practice that is about to occur (hereafter "person aggrieved") may file a complaint with the chief executive officer. Complaints shall be in writing and shall contain such information and be in such form, as the chief executive officer requires. Upon receipt of such a complaint, the chief executive officer shall furnish a copy of the same to the person or persons who allegedly committed or are about to commit the alleged discriminatory housing practice. Within 30 days after receiving a complaint

or within 30 days after the expiration of any period of reference under subsection (c), the chief executive officer shall investigate the complaint and give notice in writing to the person aggrieved whether he intends to resolve it. If the chief executive officer decides to try to eliminate or correct the alleged discriminatory housing practice by informal methods of conference, conciliation and persuasion, nothing said or done in the course of such informal endeavors may be made public or used as evidence in a subsequent proceeding under this division without the written consent of the persons concerned.

- (b) A complaint under subsection (a) shall be filed within 180 days after the alleged discriminatory housing practice occurred. Complaints shall be in writing and shall state the facts upon which the allegations of a discriminatory housing practice are based. Complaints may be reasonably and fairly amended at any time. A respondent may file and answer to the complaint against him and, with the leave of the chief executive officer which shall be granted whenever it would be reasonable and fair to do so, may amend his answer at any time. Both complaints and answers shall be verified.
- (c) If, within 30 days after a complaint is filed with the chief executive officer, the chief executive officer has been unable to obtain voluntary compliance with this division, the person aggrieved may, within 30 days thereafter, file a complaint with the secretary of the department of housing and urban development. The chief executive officer will assist in this filing.
- (d) If the chief executive officer has been unable to obtain voluntary compliance within 30 days of the complaint, the person aggrieved may, within 30 days thereafter, commence a civil action in any appropriate court against the respondent named in the complaint to enforce the rights granted or protected by this division insofar as such rights relate to the subject of the complaint. If the court finds that a discriminatory housing practice has occurred or is about to occur, the court may enjoin the respondent from engaging in such practice or order such affirmative action as may be appropriate.
- (e) In any proceedings brought pursuant to this section, the burden of proof shall be on the complainant.
- (f) Whenever an action by an individual shall come to trial, the chief executive officer shall immediately terminate all efforts to obtain voluntary compliance.
- Sec. 58-93. Investigations, subpoenas, giving of evidence.
- (a) In conducting an investigation, the chief executive officer shall have access at all reasonable time to premises, records, documents, individuals and other evidence or possible sources of evidence and may examine, record and copy such materials and take and record the testimony or statement of such persons as are reasonably necessary for the furtherance of the investigation; provided, however, that the chief executive officer first complies with the provisions of the Fourth Amendment relating to unreasonable searches and seizures. The chief executive officer may issue subpoenas to compel his access to or the production of such materials or the appearance of such persons and may issue interrogatories to a respondent to the same extent and subject to the same limitations as would apply if the subpoenas or interrogatories were issued or

served in aid of a civil action in the United States District Court for the district in which the investigation is taking place. The chief executive officer may administer oaths.

- (b) Upon written application to the chief executive officer, a respondent shall be entitled to the issuance of a reasonable number of subpoenas by and in the name of the chief executive officer to the same extent and subject to the same limitations as subpoenas issued by the chief executive officer himself. Subpoenas issued at the request of a respondent shall show on their face the name and address of such respondent and shall state that they were issued at his request.
- (c) Witnesses summoned by subpoena of the chief executive officer shall be entitled to the same witness and mileage fees as are witnesses in proceedings in United States District Courts. Fees payable to a witness summoned by a subpoena issued at the request of a respondent shall be paid by him. Within five days after service of a subpoena upon any person, such person may petition the chief executive officer to revoke or modify the subpoena. The chief executive officer shall grant the petition if he finds that the subpoena requires appearance or attendance at an unreasonable time or place, that it requires production of evidence which does not relate to any matter under investigation, that it does not describe with sufficient particularity the evidence to be produced, that compliance would be unduly onerous or for other good reason.
- (d) In case of contumacy or refusal to obey a subpoena, the chief executive officer or other person at whose request it was issued may petition for its enforcement in the municipal or state court for the district in which the person to whom the subpoena was addressed resides, was served or transacts business.
- (e) Any person who willfully fails or neglects to attend and testify or to answer any lawful inquiry or to produce records, documents or other evidence, if in his power to do so, in obedience to the subpoena or lawful order of the chief executive officer shall be fined not more than \$200.00. Any person who, with intent to mislead the chief executive officer, shall make or cause to be made any false entry or statement of fact in any report, account, record or other document submitted to the chief executive officer pursuant to his subpoena or other order or shall willfully neglect or fail to make or cause to be made full, true and correct entries in such reports, accounts, records or other documents or shall willfully mutilate, alter or by any other means falsify any documentary evidence shall be fined not more than \$200.00.
- (f) The city attorney shall conduct all litigation in which the chief executive officer participates as a party or as amicus pursuant to this division.

Sec. 58-94. Enforcement by private persons.

(a) The rights granted herein by sections 58-85, 58-86, 58-87 and 58-88 may be enforced by civil actions in state or local courts of general jurisdiction. A civil action shall be commenced within 180 days after the alleged discriminatory housing practice occurred; provided, however, that the court shall continue such civil case brought pursuant to this section or section 58-92(d) from time to time before bringing it to trial if the court believes that the conciliation efforts of the chief executive officer are likely to result in satisfactory settlement of the discriminatory housing practice complained of in the complaint made to the chief executive officer and which practice

forms the basis for the action in court; and provided, however, that any sale, encumbrance or rental consummated prior to the issuance of any court order issued under the authority of this division and involving a bona fide purchaser, encumbrance or tenant, without actual notice of the existence of the filing of a complaint or civil action under the provisions of this division, shall not be affected.

(b) The court may grant as relief, as it deems appropriate, any permanent or temporary injunction, temporary restraining order or other order and may award to the plaintiff actual damages and not more than \$1,000.00 punitive damages, together with court costs and reasonable attorney's fees in the case of a prevailing plaintiff, provided that the said plaintiff, in the opinion of the court, is not financially able to assume said attorney's fees.

Sec. 58-95. Interference, coercion or intimidation.

It shall be unlawful to coerce, intimidate, threaten or interfere with any person in the exercise or enjoyment of or on account of his having exercised or enjoyed or on account of his having aided or encouraged any other person in the exercise or enjoyment of any right granted or protected by sections 58-85, 58-86, 58-87 or 58-93. This section may be enforced by appropriate civil action.

Sec. 58-96. Separability of provisions.

If any provision of this division or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the division and the application of the provision to other persons not similarly situated or to other circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

Sec. 58-97. Prevention of intimidation in fair housing cases.

Whoever, whether or not acting under color of law, by force or threat of force, willfully injures, intimidates or interferes with or attempts to injure, intimidate or interfere with:

- (1) Any person because of his race, sex, color, religion, national origin, disability or familial status, age, genetic information, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law and because he is or has been selling, purchasing, renting, financing, occupying or contracting or negotiating for the sale, purchase, rental, financing or occupation of any dwelling or applying for or participating in any service, organization or facility relating to the business of selling or renting dwellings; or
- (2) Any person because he is or has been or in order to intimidate such person or any other person or class of persons from:
- a. Participating without discrimination on account of race, sex, color, religion, national origin, disability or familial status, age, genetic information, or any other characteristic protected by applic able law in any of the activities, services, organizations or facilities described in subsection 58-97(1); or
- b. Affording another person or class of persons opportunity or protection so to participate.

(3) Any citizen because he is or has been or in order to discourage such citizen or any other citizen from lawfully aiding or encouraging other persons to participate, without discrimination on account of race, sex, color, religion, national origin, disability or familial status, age, genetic information, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law, in any of the activities, services, organizations or facilities described in subsection 58-97(1) or from participating lawfully in speech or peaceful assembly opposing any denial of the opportunity to so participate shall be fined not more than \$200.00, and if bodily injury results, shall be fined not more than \$200.00; and if death results, shall be subject to imprisonment for any term of years or for life.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF MCALESTER, OKLAHOMA, GRANTING THE CITY MANAGER LIMITED AUTHORITY TO APPROVE CONSTRUCTION PROJECT CHANGE ORDERS, AND PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN RESTRICTIONS, CONDITIONS, AND LIMITATIONS THEREON.

WHEREAS, the McAlester City Council finds that it is appropriate, for purposes of efficiency, flexibility and economy, to provide limited authority the McAlester City Manager to approve certain construction contract change orders, subject to specific restrictions and conditions, and,

WHEREAS, the McAlester City Council is empowered to authorize certain additional duties and functions of the City Manager, and to prescribe the circumstances under which those duties or functions shall be performed, and,

WHEREAS, the McAlester City Council has determined that adoption of the following is in the best interests of the City, and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MCALESTER, OKLAHOMA:

Section 1. That the City Manager of the City of McAlester, Oklahoma should be and is hereby authorized and empowered to approve necessary and appropriate change orders to existing authorized construction projects, when, and only when, <u>ALL</u> the following conditions have been met:

- a) The time required for calling a special meeting of the McAlester City Council would result in one or more of the following; (1) a stoppage of the work, or (2) an immediate risk to the health, welfare or safety of the citizens of McAlester, Oklahoma, or (3) an immediate financial loss to the City.
- b) The City Manager has examined and verified the necessity of the proposed change order, together with all documentary support required under the subject contract.
- c) The City Manager has received the recommendations of the City staff, and any consultants providing professional services on said construction contract, including recommendations regarding more cost effective alternatives.
- d) The total amount of the proposed change order is less than \$25,000.00.
- e) The total sum of all previously approved change orders, together with the proposed change order, does not exceed 15% of the total contract price, or such other amount prescribed by state law.
- f) The total amount of all change orders approved by the City Manager on all projects, which are subject to Council notice and/or pending ratification does not exceed \$25,000.00.

- Section 2. When all of the criteria listed above have been satisfied, the City Manager, in his sole discretion, may approve and execute a written change order, subject to and in compliance with all other terms and conditions of the applicable construction contract.
- Section 3. The City Manager will report and provide all approved change orders made under this resolution, together with any documentary support, at the first meeting following such approval for ratification by the City Council.
- Section 4. Upon Council ratification of any change order approved pursuant to this resolution, the amount of said change order shall be removed from the total amount calculated under Section 1(f) above.

#### Potential city manager goals for fiscal 2015-2016

The McAlester Charter requires the council to establish policies, goals, and performance monitoring for the city and thus, the city manager. The following goals are proposed for FY 2015-2016. Council-approved goals will provide the city manager with guidelines and the council with the basis for his evaluation toward the end of the fiscal year.

#### 1. Achieve and maintain fiscal sustainability and resiliency

- a. Achievement measure: the city is able to maintain quality essential services to the public while insuring that city spending is effectively adjusted in response to changes in city income so that both the general fund and the MPWS fund each maintain a balance of at least \$1 million. (This standard may be relaxed to \$500,000 for each fund if the council votes that an emergency related to the health or safety of the community is involved.)
- b. Achievement measure: Monthly financial reporting commensurate with that of top financial reporting cities in the state is achieved by 1 February 2016.

## 2. Implement a system of performance measurement for department heads and employees in all departments by 1 April 2016

- a. Achievement measure: Each city department has developed at least three meaningful performance measures intended to track and improve its city services and documentation of these measures has begun. (The aim is to identify key services in each department, track and analyze their performance, and develop strategies to improve performance. Periodic reviews at least once per year will update or change these meaningful performance measures as deemed desirable.)
- b. Achievement measure: The city manager submits a performance measurement report to the council each year by 1 May.

## 3. <u>Instill and maintain a culture of customer friendliness, effectiveness, and continuous improvement in city government</u>

- a. Achievement measure: Each citizen inquiry with the city is logged and forwarded to the appropriate department for action. A response is made back to the citizen within two working days. Action taken on an inquiry is logged.
- b. Achievement measure: The city manager submits a report on citizen inquiry action to the council each year by 1 May.
- c. Achievement measure: The city has instituted an effective method of sampling public opinion of city services and analyzed and reported on the results of such surveys each year by 1 May. In addition, the city website makes it easy for citizens to report or make inquiries to the city by 1 May.

## 4. <u>Determine the steps and timeline for building a comprehensive/strategic plan for the community by April 2016.</u>

a. The steps and timeline for the comprehensive/strategic community plan is developed on time.
