Councilman Read stated that he didn't want the City to pick up the tab at the jail for a Campus Police arrest.

The motion was seconded by Councilman Smith, and the vote was taken as follows:

# **Scheduled Business**

1. Discussion and update on Financials. (Toni Ervin, Chief Financial Officer) Executive Summary Discussion.

CFO Ervin addressed the Council providing them with an in depth review of the City's Bond debt and payments. She reviewed the City Manager's salaries for the past twenty (20) years and highlighted the difference between the salaries and actual pay. She then reviewed the Defined Benefit Pension Plan that had been declared unaffordable in 2012. She added that even though the Defined Benefit Plan had been frozen, the City would have to continue to make payments into that plan for the next thirty (30) years. CFO Ervin continued with a comparison of past practices and how internal controls have been put in place to help improve the City's financial position and its' reputation with the citizens.

There was a brief discussion concerning the CFO's risk assessment of the City, the continued payment of the bonds, the refinancing of the bonds not increasing the debt, why a former City Manager had went to prison, getting the citizens involved and improving communication with the citizens.

The Council thanked CFO Ervin and staff for the presentation and the information that had been provided with it.

There was no vote on this item.

## City Manager's Report

• Report on activities for the past two weeks.

Manager Stasiak informed the Council that the City had been tracking service calls and distributed a list of the calls that had been received in fiscal year 2016/2017. He then explained the information contained in the list. He informed the Council that the City's Code Enforcement office was no longer with the City but Director Clifton and her administrative assistant had been working together and had sent out abatement letters to half of the community. He mentioned the introduced the new Expo/Tourism Manager.

Manager Stasiak informed the Council that through June 28<sup>th</sup> the new Street Sweeper had removed 324 yards of material off of the streets. He commented that it was his intent to bring proposals for the Sertoma Fields to the Council the first meeting in August. He updated the Council on the AMI system that was replacing 3400 meters in the City. He stated that a meeting to discuss and set strategies needed to be scheduled and he suggested a half-day session on a Saturday. He also brought up the two (2) sales tax issues that would be ending in 2018 and the importance of addressing them by the end of this year.

# Mayor's Comments and Committee Appointments

Mayor Browne commented on the two (2) local residents, Clyde and Claude Stokes that were to be named as "Chevaliers of the Legion of Honor" by the French Republic for their service during World War II. He added that this was similar to being knighted. He then informed the City Manager of a huge pothole on Springer Avenue close to the tennis courts.

#### PRISONERS PUBLIC WORKS PROJECT CONTRACT

This contractual agreement (hereinafter, **Contract**) is entered into by, and between, the Oklahoma Department of Corrections (hereinafter, Department) and the undersigned Oklahoma governmental agency or political subdivision, City of McAlester (Oakhill Cemetery) (hereinafter, **Public Agency**), upon written request by a majority of the board of county commissioners, the governing body of a municipality, an agency of the State of Oklahoma or of the United States, any subdivision thereof, or any community action agency for prisoners to be assigned to a Public Works Project. The written request is attached to this agreement and incorporated by reference.

This Contract is authorized by 57 O.S. § 215 et seq. entitled "The Prisoners Public Works Act."

For and in consideration of the following terms, conditions, and covenants, the parties herein agree as follows:

- 1. The Public Agency covenants that it is a public entity authorized under 57 O.S. § 216(2) to request a Public Works Project and the Public Works Project will meet the requirements of the Prisoners Public Works Act.
- 2. The term of this Contract will be for a period beginning on <u>July 1, 2017</u> and ending on <u>June 30, 2018</u>.
- 3. The prisoners assigned to the Public Works Project under this Contract will be prisoners from the following correctional center: Jackie Brannon Correctional Center.
- 4. The Public Agency has requested 3 (#) prisoners to be assigned to the Public Works Project and the Department will generally make said number of prisoners available to the Public Agency.
- The prisoners assigned to this Public Works Project will have the following responsibilities:

  Weed-eating the entire cemetery, using riding lawn mowers to mow around the cemetery, assisting with funeral set-up and covering of graves, pick up trash, prune shrubs and trees.
- 6. The Public Agency agrees to pay to the Department \$120.00 per month per prisoner (the number stated in paragraph 4). This amount includes the base cost and a ten percent administrative fee.
- 7. The Department will not provide the transportation to and from the work site of the prisoners assigned to the Public Works Project.
- 8. The Department will not provide supervision of prisoners assigned to the Public Works Project.

- 9. The Department will provide lunches to the prisoners, unless otherwise agreed.
- 10. The Public Agency will provide work orders, job duties/assignments, any training to the prisoners and will provide a safe working environment. The Public Agency will furnish all materials and tools necessary for the Public Works Project, unless otherwise agreed.
- 11. The Public Agency agrees to use prisoners assigned to the Public Works Project on public property only, except that prisoner labor may be used on private property for a public purpose. Labor conducted on private property must be approved by the Department prior to commencement of any work on private property. Public purpose is hereby defined as a purpose generally affecting the public good of the inhabitants of the state or political subdivision. The prisoners will be utilized as a group for this purpose and not as individuals.
- 12. The Public Agency will not use the prisoners to provide personal services for private benefit or to supervise other prisoners. The Public Agency will allow the Department to conduct unscheduled periodic visits to the Public Works Project work site to monitor the prisoners and contract compliance.
- 13. The Public Agency will, upon request, relinquish any assigned prisoner to the custody of the Department.
- 14. For community placement prisoners, the Public Agency agrees to cooperate and provide prisoner counts and close supervision of the prisoner's whereabouts. The supervisor will visually observe each prisoner at least every hour, and a formal count will be conducted and documented in a log book every two (2) hours.
- 15. For minimum security prisoners, the Public Agency agrees that the supervisor will visually observe each prisoner at least every half hour, and that a formal count will be conducted and documented in a log book every two (2) hours.
- 16. The Public Agency will immediately notify the Department and the local law enforcement agency of any missing or unaccounted for prisoner or if the Public Agency believes a prisoner has escaped.
- 17. The Public Agency will immediately report to the Department any guideline or rule violation, as provided for in Attachment F of OP-090106.
- 18. The Department shall invoice the Public Agency every month by electronic mail (e-mail) to the e-mail address provided in Paragraph 37, and the Public Agency shall pay such invoices within thirty (30) days from the date of the invoice. Any invoice not paid within sixty (60) days from the date of

- the invoice may result in the Public Agency not be permitted to receive prisoners under this contract until all outstanding invoices are paid in full.
- 19. No prisoner assigned to a Public Works Project will be considered an employee of the requesting Public Agency, the Department, or the State of Oklahoma.
- 20. The Department will have the ultimate responsibility for the security of the prisoners.
- 21. The director of the Department or his designee will, at all times during the term of this Contract, have full jurisdiction and authority, to include immediate access, over the discipline and control of the prisoners performing work on the Public Works Project. Unsatisfactory job performance will be documented and reported to the Department by a representative of the Public Agency.
- 22. The prisoners, while assigned to the Public Works Project, will, for the purpose of punishment for escape, be deemed to be on trusty status and will be under the custody and control of the Department. The limits of the place of confinement are extended under the special conditions of Public Works Project pursuant to 57 O.S. § 510.1 (A) (4).
- 23. The Department will select and assign eligible prisoners to work for the Public Agency. The prisoners, while assigned to the Public Works Project, will be exempt from the provisions of the Worker's Compensation Act, (85A O.S. § 1 et seq.).
- 24. The Department will be responsible for the cost of medical and dental health care needs of the prisoners while assigned to the Public Works Project, including emergencies while assigned to the public works project, unless otherwise provided for in this Contract.
- 25. The Public Agency will be responsible to reimburse the Department for the cost of any required outside medical and/or dental care (including emergency care), which will include the cost of emergency transportation, if a prisoner assigned to the Public Works Project is injured while performing work for the Public Agency and the injury occurred as a result of the intentional, reckless, or negligent conduct of an employee or agent of the Public Agency.
- 26. The Public Agency will not allow any prisoner to operate or use any type of equipment unless and until the Public Agency has fully trained the prisoner in the proper and safe use of the equipment, and has documented records to support said training. Training associated with the use of lawn equipment; power tools and hand tools must meet OSHA and Department of Labor standards, and this training can be conducted without the Departments review of the curriculum. Training associated

with the use of any heavy equipment e.g., backhoes, dozers, tractors and implements, frontend loaders, excavators, skid loaders etc. will require the Public Agency to provide the training curriculum to the Department for approval prior to the Public Agency training and allowing inmates to use this equipment. Under no circumstances will the Public Agency allow a prisoner to operate any equipment which has had the manufacturer's safety devices modified or removed, nor will the Public Agency allow any prisoner to operate any dangerous or unsafe equipment. The Public Agency will not allow a prisoner to operate any equipment without first providing and requiring the prisoner to wear protective equipment in accordance with Occupational Safety and Health Administration standards when operating any equipment. The Public Agency will also not allow a prisoner to operate any motor vehicle upon the public roadways at any time.

- 27. In the event a prisoner is injured while operating equipment or motor vehicle in violation of this Contract, the Public Agency will be responsible to reimburse the Department for the cost of any and all required outside medical and/or dental care (to include emergency care), which will include the cost of emergency transportation to and from the outside medical provider, and the Public Agency will be liable for all other damages resulting from said violation.
- 28. The Department will provide the Public Agency with copies of relevant Department policies and operations procedures that are applicable, as well as the training and orientation required for proper implementation and security.
- 29. The Public Agency, unless otherwise agreed, will provide work shifts of no longer than eight (8) working hours and will utilize prisoners for no more than eight (8) hours per shift. The normal working hours will be between 0700 and 1800 hours each working day. Any additional or different work shifts required will necessitate approval by the warden or administrator of the prisoner's correctional facility and be documented and attached as an addendum to this Contract.
- 30. Either party may immediately terminate this Contract for the failure of the other party to perform or comply with the terms and conditions contained herein. Any damages will be authorized by law in a court of competent jurisdiction, except attorney's fees and related legal costs, which will be borne by each party separately. Both parties, in determining failure to perform under this Contract, will consider any mitigating circumstances.
- 31. In the event a bona fide dispute or a conflict of interest arises between the parties, which cannot be resolved through reasonable diligence, either party may request mediation under the Oklahoma Dispute Resolution Act, 12 O.S. § 1801 et seq., as amended. Such request will not be unreasonably refused by the other party. The parties agree that the cost of

this process will be borne separately by each party. Any dispute will not affect the performance requirements and duties of this Contract. The Contract will remain in full force and effect unless otherwise terminated or agreed to between the parties.

- 32. The Public Agency is required to retain records relative to the Contract for the duration of the Contract and for a period of seven (7) years following completion or termination of the Contract. If a claim, audit, litigation or other action involving such records is started before the end of the seven-year period, the records are required to be maintained for two (2) years from the date that all issues arising out of the action are resolved, or until the end of the seven (7) year retention period, whichever is later.
- 33. If any provision, clause, or paragraph of this Contract or any document incorporated by reference is determined to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such determination will not affect the other provisions, clauses, or paragraphs of this Contract. The provisions, clauses, or paragraphs, and any documents incorporated by reference are declared severable.
- 34. This Contract will be governed by the laws of the State of Oklahoma, with the venue for any action to be in Oklahoma County.
- Either party may terminate this Contract, in whole or in part, for convenience, if it is determined that termination is in its best interest. The terminating party shall deliver to the other party a written notice of termination for convenience specifying the terms and effective date of termination. The Contract termination date shall be a minimum of thirty (30) days from the date the notice of termination is issued by the terminating party.
- 36. The terms of this contract may only be amended by agreement of the parties and in writing.

- 39. This Contract may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which together shall constitute one and the same document. This Contract may be delivered by e-mail.
- 40. The representative executing this Contract on behalf of the Public Agency hereby warrants that said representative has the authority to execute and bind the Public Agency.
- 41. The representative executing this Contract on behalf of the Public Agency certifies that the prisoner labor shall not displace any employment opportunities for private citizens of the State of Oklahoma and that the Public Agency has insufficient funds available to perform the work set forth in this Contract.
- 42. The Public Agency will not allow an employee or agent of the Public Agency to direct, manage or supervise a prisoner assigned to work on behalf of the Public Agency until the employee or agent has completed all training required by the Department's Operating Procedure OP-090106.
- 43. The Public Agency agrees that prisoners shall not be permitted to work in or around any area in which minor children are located.

#### 44. INDEMNIFICATION

- a. Without waiving any defense or immunity, and subject to the Governmental Tort Claims Act, the Public Agency agrees to bear all expenses, fines, judgments, and cost(s), including its own attorney fees, which may arise from any and all acts of its officials, agents, and employees in relation to the performance or nonperformance of the Agreement.
- b. Without waiving any defense or immunity, and subject to the Governmental Tort Claims Act, the Department agrees to bear all expenses, fines, judgments, and cost(s), including its own attorney fees, which may arise from any and all acts of its officials, agents, and employees in relation to the performance or nonperformance of the Agreement.

### 45. PRISON RAPE ELIMINATION ACT (§115.17 and §115.77)

- a. Any sexual assault or sexual misconduct or attempted sexual assault or sexual misconduct between the Public Agency, its employees, agents, or representative and a prisoner is expressly forbidden.
- b. In addition, by entering into this Contract with Department, Public Agency attests that no employee, agent or representative of the

Public Agency who may have direct contact with the prisoners while performing the requirements of this contract has:

- i. Engaged in sexual abuse in a prison, jail, lockup, community confinement facility, juvenile facility, or other institution (as defined in 42 U.S.C. 1997);
- ii. Been convicted of engaging or attempting to engage in sexual activity in the community facilitated by force, overt or implied threats of force, or coercion, or if the victim did not consent or was unable to consent or refuse; or
- Been civilly or administratively adjudicated to have engaged in the activity described above. Any employee or agent of Public Agency who engages in sexual abuse will be prohibited from contact with prisoners and will be reported to law enforcement agencies and to relevant licensing bodies.
- c. Any violation of this provision will be reported to law enforcement agencies and to relevant licensing bodies and will result in the filing of criminal charges as warranted. The Department may also terminate the contract immediately when violations are found.

#### MUTUAL AID INTER-LOCAL AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered i	nto this	_ day of _		
2017, by and between the PITTSBURG COUNT	Y SHERIFF'S	OFFICE,	first party,	and the
CITY OF MCALESTER, second party.				

WHEREAS, both first and second parties recognize the need for a mutual Inter-Agency Agreement in that both parties through their respective law enforcement agencies being geographically located together, and their efforts being one in the same to promote and preserve the safety and welfare of the public and to maintain social order,

WHEREAS, both parties desire to combine and coordinate their resources for responses to calls for services when one or the other parties are responding to calls that require assistance of its neighboring jurisdiction for both officer safety and that of the public both parties serve,

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed upon by both parties the following:

- 1. That both parties will respond to one another's jurisdictions in time of need as dictated by dispatch or upper supervisory personnel from the parties' jurisdiction requesting such assistance. Such assistance includes, but is not limited to, back up personnel and equipment available.
- 2. It is understood by both parties that in the event of an injury to personnel or damage to property or equipment that the cost of such shall be borne to the entity providing such personnel and equipment.
- 3. GOOD FAITH. Each of the parties hereto agrees to attempt to furnish to the requesting party such assistance as the requesting party may deem reasonable and necessary. Provided, however, that the party to whom the request is made shall have sole discretion to refuse such request if sending such assistance may lead to an unreasonable reduction in the level of protection within its jurisdiction.
- 4. DISPATCHING. It is agreed by the parties hereto that mutual aid assistance, when to be sent, shall be dispatched promptly and that first response by the jurisdiction requesting assistance shall not be a prerequisite to a request for assistance under this agreement.
- 5. SUPERVISION. When personnel and equipment are furnished under this agreement, the party having jurisdiction shall have overall supervision of personnel and equipment during the period such response is still in progress. Provided, however, when officers from the requesting jurisdiction have not arrived at the scene of the incident, the senior officer of the jurisdiction arriving first shall have command until relieved. Further, "supervision" as used in this section refers to conduct of the call for service. Each officer participating on the call for service remains an employee of that officers employing agency and is subject to the personnel policies solely of that employing agency.

#### WAIVERS:

- 1. GENERAL WAIVERS. Each party to this agreement waives all claims against the other for compensation for any loss, damage, personal injury, or death occurring to personnel and/or equipment as a consequence of the performance of this agreement.
- 2. HOLD HARMLESS. A requesting party shall, to the extent permitted by any applicable constitutional or tort claims act limitation, save and hold harmless any responding party against any and all claims or actions brought against the responding party, arising out of the responding party's efforts, except to the extent that such claims or actions arise out of any willful misconduct or grossly negligent action on the part of the responding party.
- 3. WORKERS COMPENSATION. Each party agrees to provide workers compensation insurance coverage to each of its employees, and responding under this agreement recognizes that although overall supervision will usually be provided by the jurisdiction in which the call for service occurs; supervision of individual officers will be provided by their regular supervisors.
- 4. REFUSALS TO PERFORM. This is an Inter-Local/Mutual Agreement and it is assumed that all available assistance will generally be provided. Nothing, however, in this agreement shall be construed to prevent a party to whom a request for assistance is made from refusing to respond when that is appropriate in its sole determination. In addition, any responding party may refuse to perform any specific task when, in the sole determination of the responding party's supervisor, response would create an unreasonable risk of danger or liability to the responding party, it's employee's, equipment or any third party.
- 5. COMPENSATION. The parties agree that the personnel and equipment available under this agreement are roughly equivalent and agree that the availability and provision of such constitute consideration under this agreement.
- 6. TERMINATION. Either party may terminate this agreement at any time by giving thirty (30) days' notice of the intention to do so. Such notice shall be sent to the governing body of the other party and a copy thereof to the Sheriff.

### COUNTY JAIL SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS JAIL SERVICES AGREEMENT is made and entered into on this day of	
, 2017 by and between the CITY OF MCALESTER, a charter city of the State of	f
Oklahoma, hereinafter referred to as "CITY", and the PITTSBURG COUNTY CRIMINAL	
JUSTICE CENTER, hereinafter referred to as "PCCJC", each party having been duly organized	
and existing under the laws of the State of Oklahoma.	

### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, PCCJC, on behalf of Pittsburg County, and CITY, are authorized by law and agreement to have charge and custody of the Pittsburg County Criminal Justice Center and the McAlester City Jail respectively; and the prisoners or inmates thereof; and,

WHEREAS, Pittsburg County has constructed a jail facility on West Street to be thereafter managed and operated by PCCJC and the Pittsburg County Sheriff; and,

WHEREAS, CITY will designate PCCJC as a place of confinement for the incarceration of one (1) or more but not to exceed ten (10) inmates lawfully committed to its custody (city inmates); and,

WHEREAS, PCCJC is desirous of accepting and keeping in its custody such prisoners or inmates in the Pittsburg County Criminal Justice Center for a rate of compensation mutually agreed upon by the parties hereto; and,

WHEREAS, the governing bodies of the City of McAlester, Pittsburg County and PCCJC have approved and confirmed this Agreement as authorized and provided for by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the above and foregoing recitals, the payments to be made hereunder, the mutual promises and covenants herein contained, and for other good and valuable consideration, the adequacy of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree a follows:

1. GOVERNING LAW: The parties hereto agree that, except where expressly otherwise provided, the laws and administrative rules and regulations of the State of Oklahoma shall govern in any matter relating to any prisoners or inmates confined pursuant to this Agreement.

### 2. DURATION:

A. The primary term of this Agreement shall be for a period of approximately one (1) year commencing when the Pittsburg County Sheriff notifies the McAlester Chief of Police and CITY, that he is prepared to accept city inmates, which estimated time is \_\_\_\_\_\_, 2017, and said term shall end June 30, 2018. The primary term shall end on June 30, 2018 without further notice or action, unless this Agreement is properly renewed as set forth herein.

- B. This Agreement is subject to annual appropriation by CITY, through its governing body each fiscal year. Before the beginning of the each fiscal year, CITY'S governing body shall determine whether to appropriate funds for these expenditures under this Agreement for the ensuing fiscal year, as is required under the City's Charter, and the Oklahoma Constitution and Statutes.
- C. This Agreement shall be renewable for successive one (1) year terms under such terms and conditions as the parties may determine. CITY shall notify PCCJC and the Sheriff not less than ninety (90) days prior to the end of any period or term of its desire to renew this Agreement. If no renewal agreement is entered into prior to the end of the preceding term, then no renewal shall occur and the existing operative agreement between the parties shall continue at the will of each party, terminable by either party upon ninety (90) days written notice of termination.

### 3. TERMINATION:

- A. This Agreement may be terminated by either part upon ninety (90) days written notice of termination delivered to either party. Prior to the termination date, any and all outstanding invoices shall be paid in full.
- B. In the event of termination of this Agreement for any reason, CITY shall continue to compensate PCCJC for any prisoner(s) or inmate(s) housed in the Pittsburg County Criminal Justice Center after such termination until CITY retakes its prisoner(s) or inmate(s), in the same manner and at the same rates as if this Agreement had not been terminated.

### 4. MAILING ADDRESSES – NOTICES:

A. All notices, reports and correspondence to the respective parties of this Agreement shall be sent, mailed or delivered to the following:

- B. Notices duly mailed shall be deemed given on the date mailed. The parties shall notify each other in writing of any change of address or contact persons.
- 5. DEFINITIONS: The parties hereby agree that the following terms shall have the specified meanings unless indicated otherwise herein:

- A. "year" or "service year" or "annual". Unless the context indicates otherwise, these terms shall be measured or understood on a fiscal year basis from July 1 of one year to June 30 of the following year.
- B. "inmate classifications" shall be made pursuant to the then current inmate classification system utilized by the Pittsburg County Sheriff pursuant to law for all prisoners in his charge. This includes minimum, medium, and maximum security classifications.
- C. "city prisoner" or "city inmate". These are the adult persons housed in the Pittsburg County Criminal Justice Center for whom CITY is primarily responsible. No juveniles can be kept or housed at the Pittsburg County Criminal Justice Center. This classification of inmate shall be determined as follows:
  - 1. Any adult person arrested or taken into custody on charges or warrants based on allegations of conduct or offense from within the limits of the City of McAlester, whether by warrant or not, is a possible city inmate. The arresting officer shall make the initial classification by indicating whether charges sought will be city charges or county charges (i.e. state charges) or both, or whether surrendering on a city warrant or state warrant. If the arrest or surrender involves only city charges or city warrants, the person is a city inmate until released, unless county charges subsequently take precedence and the city is substantially delayed in completing its proceedings. If an inmate remains incarcerated on county charges after the city charges have been completed, he or she shall become a county inmate at that time and no longer be a city inmate.
  - 2. If the arresting officer indicates both city and county charges will be sought, the tentative classification shall be as a county inmate and the county charges shall take priority. If the Pittsburg County District Attorney does in fact file state charges out of that incident and arrest, the person will remain classified as a county inmate until the proceedings are complete. Thereafter, such person shall be classified as a city inmate until the city proceedings are complete. If the Pittsburg County District Attorney declines to file any state charges out of that incident and arrest, the inmate shall be classified as a city inmate from initial appearance to release and Pittsburg County shall be financially responsible for the inmate until the occurrence of the initial appearance proceedings.
- D. "daily rate service payment" is the agreed daily payment from CITY to PCCJC for the housing of city inmates. This payment covers the daily costs of the housing, feeding, and routine, minor nursing medical services performed by Pittsburg County nursing staff of the city inmates only. All other medical or other needs of the city inmates, including prescription drugs, are the additional responsibility and expense of

CITY, unless expressly agreed otherwise herein. The daily service is payable in full, regardless of the average city inmate population history or other measure of utilization. PCCJC agrees to provide said bill monthly. CITY agrees to make payment to PCCJC within thirty (30) days of receipt of such bill.

### 6. COMPENSATION:

- A. PCCJC will provide CITY with ten (10) beds per day in the Pittsburg County Criminal Justice Center as the "McAlester City Jail", for three (3) consecutive calendar days per inmate. The ten (10) beds available to CITY shall be utilized under the same rules of classification and separation as county inmate beds. It is understood that this could mean maximum capacity is less than ten (10) persons. The Sheriff of Pittsburg County will notify the McAlester Chief of Police or his designee whenever the city inmate population is eighty percent (80%) of capacity or when only two (2) CITY beds remain available.
- B. For the service provided with the availability of ten (10) beds, CITY agrees to pay PCCJC a daily service payment of \$44.00 per day per inmate. PCCJC agrees to provide said bill monthly. CITY agrees to make payment to PCCJC within thirty (30) days of receipt of such bill.
- C. In the event the number of city inmates exceeds the capacity of the ten (10) bed city jail or length of incarceration exceeds the three (3) calendar day limit, CITY agrees to pay PCCJC for each such additional city inmate a daily rate per inmate of \$44.00 per day. PCCJC is not required to accept any city inmates above the capacity of the ten (10) beds. CITY must receive approval from PCCJC to accept and hold any city inmates over the capacity of ten (10) beds.
- D. PCCJC will provide CITY with an itemized bill for all additional services provided by PCCJC for a city inmate, including daily rate calculations. PCCJC agrees to provide said bill monthly. CITY agrees to make payment to PCCJC within thirty (30) days of receipt of such bill.
- E. The daily rate service payment shall be adjusted upward according to the same daily rate then charged by PCCJC to county/district inmates. Not less than ninety (90) days before the end of the current year, both parties shall notify the other of annual adjustment negotiations. Each party shall engage in good faith in such negotiations. The daily rate service payment shall be as mutually agreed, but in any event, any increase shall not exceed ten percent (10%) per year. The factors to be considered by the parties in determining the increase for the following year are as follows:
  - 1. Inflationary factors, including indexes, changes in the actual cost of goods, salary increases, etc.

- 2. Legal and regulatory changes, including increased staffing, structural changes, etc.
- 3. Experience, including unexpected situations, natural disasters, etc.
- 4. Actual utilization rates and comparisons to a daily rate method of payment, etc.
- 5. Any other relevant and material factors.

If the parties are unable to reach an agreement as to the amount of the increase, the matter shall be submitted to the Dispute Resolution Board, whose decision is final.

- 7. RIGHT OF INSPECTION: CITY shall have the right to inspect, at all reasonable times and upon notice, all of the Pittsburg County Criminal Justice Center facilities in which city inmates are confined in order to determine if such jail maintains standards of confinement acceptable to CITY and that such inmates therein are treated equally regardless of race, religion, color, creed or national origin; provided, however, that PCCJC shall be obligated to manage, maintain and operate its facilities consistent with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations.
- 8. FURLOUGHS, WORK RELEASE, ETC.: PCCJC agrees that no early releases or alternatives to incarceration, including furloughs, electronic home detention or work release shall be granted to any inmate housed pursuant to this Agreement without written authorization by the committing court. This shall not prevent the Sheriff of Pittsburg County from making a city inmate a trustee.
- 9. INMATE ACCOUNTS: McAlester city inmates shall be allowed to have an Inmate Trust Fund Checking Account. At the time of booking, any monies belonging to the inmates will be entered into the Inmate Trust Fund Checking Account, and the remaining balance will be released back to the inmate upon their release from PCCJC.
- 10. RESPONSIBILITY FOR OFFENDER'S CUSTODY: It shall be the responsibility of PCCJC to confine the city prisoner(s) or inmate(s); to provide treatment, including the furnishing of subsistence and all necessary minor medical services and supplies; to provide for the inmate's physical needs; to make available to them treatment consistent with the individual needs' to retain them in said custody; to supervise them; to maintain proper discipline and control; to make certain that they receive no special privileges and that the sentence and orders of the committing court are faithfully executed; provided that nothing herein contained shall be construed to require PCCJC, or any of its agents, to provide treatment, facilities or programs for any inmates confined pursuant to this Agreement. Nothing herein shall be construed as to require PCCJC to provide services, treatment, facilities or programs to city inmates above, beyond or in addition to that which is required by applicable law.

### 11. MEDICAL SERVICES:

A. Inmates deemed city inmates shall receive such medical, psychiatric, and dental treatment when emergent and necessary to safeguard their health while housed at the Pittsburg County Criminal Justice Center. The McAlester Chief of Police or his

designee shall provide for or arrange for the providing of such medical, psychiatric, and dental services. Except for routine, minor nursing medical services provided in the Pittsburg County Criminal Justice Center, the McAlester Chief of Police or his designee shall be notified of any treatment or care needed prior to an inmate receiving any care. In emergencies, the McAlester Chief of Police or his designee will be notified prior to treatment or transport for care. CITY shall be responsible as provided by law for such medical, psychiatric, and dental treatment provided outside the Pittsburg County Criminal Justice Center for the benefit of city inmates and such other like treatment outside the scope of routine, minor nursing medical services performed by Pittsburg County nursing staff.

In such circumstances where a city inmate is being treated at an emergency medical facility or admitted into a medical facility, it will be the sole responsibility of the McAlester Chief of Police or his designee to provide transportation (unless deemed necessary by the McAlester Chief of Police of his designee that an ambulance needs to be dispatched for transport) and security for said city inmate until said city inmate is released or discharged from medical facility.

- B. An adequate record of all such services shall be kept by PCCJC for CITY'S review at its request, to the extent consistent with confidentiality regulations.
- C. Should medical, psychiatric or dental services be required, the McAlester Chief of Police or his designee will authorize the services and CITY shall be billed and/or the inmate pursuant to 11 O.S. § 14-113, 74 O.S. § 192 or other similar authority.
- 12. DISCIPLINE: PCCJC shall have physical control over and power to execute disciplinary authority over all inmates of the City of McAlester. However, nothing contained herein shall be construed to authorize or permit the imposition of a type of discipline prohibited by the laws of the State of Oklahoma, the United States Constitution or applicable laws of the United States.
- 13. RECORDS AND REPORTS: PCCJC shall keep all necessary and pertinent records concerning such city inmates in the manner consistent with the maintenance of all other PCCJC inmate records. During a city inmate's confinement in the Pittsburg County Criminal Justice Center, the McAlester Chief of Police or his designee, and CITY, shall upon request be entitled to receive and be furnished with copies of any report or record associated with said inmate(s) incarceration, to the extent permitted by law.
- 14. REMOVAL FROM THE JAIL: An inmate of the city legally confined in the Pittsburg County Criminal Justice Center shall not be removed therefrom by any person without written or verbal order of any court having jurisdiction or the McAlester Chief of Police or his designee. PCCJC agrees that no early releases, furloughs, work release, or electronic home detention shall be granted to any inmate without authorization from the Chief of Police, his designee, or the Municipal Court. This paragraph shall not apply to an emergency necessitating the immediate removal of the inmate for medical, dental, psychiatric treatment or other catastrophic condition presenting an eminent danger to the

safety of the inmate or to inmates or personnel of PCCJC. In the event of any such emergency removal, PCCJC shall inform McAlester Chief of Police or his designee of the whereabouts of the inmate(s) so removed, at the earliest practicable time, and shall exercise all reasonable care for the safe keeping and custody of such inmate(s).

15. ESCAPES: In the event any city inmate shall escape from PCCJC custody, PCCJC will use all reasonable means to recapture the inmate. PCCJC shall have the primary authority to direct the pursuit and retaking of the inmate(s) within its own territory.

### 16. DEATH OF AN INMATE:

- A. In the event of the death of a city inmate, the Pittsburg County Medical Examiner shall be notified. The McAlester Chief of Police or his designee shall receive copies of any records made at or in connection with such notification.
- B. PCCJC shall immediately notify the McAlester Chief of Police or his designee and CITY of the death of a city inmate, furnish information as requested and follow the instructions of the McAlester Chief of Police or his designee with regard to the disposition of the body. McAlester Chief of Police or his designee will designate the official(s) authorized to request information from and provide instructions to PCCJC regarding deceased inmate. The body shall not be released except on written or verbal order of the appropriate officials of the State Medical Examiner's Office. Written notice shall be provided within three (3) weekdays of receipt of notice of such death. All expenses relative to any necessary preparation of the body and shipment charges shall be paid by CITY. With CITY'S consent, PCCJC may arrange for burial and all matters related or incidental thereto, and all such expenses shall be paid by CITY. The provisions of this paragraph shall govern only the relations between or among the parties hereto and shall not affect the liability of any relative or other person for the disposition of the deceased or for any expenses connected therewith.
- 17. DISPUTE RESOLUTION: In case of a dispute over the performance or meaning of the provisions of this Agreement, which has not been resolved through discussion between the parties, said dispute shall be submitted to a Dispute Resolution Board consisting of three individuals; one appointed by each party and the third selected by the two initial members. Said board shall decide matters by majority vote. If either party is not satisfied with the result, except where otherwise provided, it may utilize any other remedy to which it may be entitled at law or in equity.

### 18. MISCELLANEOUS:

A. PCCJC shall have the right to refuse to accept any individual from the city who, in the judgement of PCCJC, exercised by the Sheriff of Pittsburg County, has a current illness, disease or injury which may adversely affect the operations of the Pittsburg County Criminal Justice Center or has a history of serious medical problems. At the discretion of PCCJC, a clearance from an attending physician may be required

before the individual is booked into custody at the Pittsburg County Criminal Justice Center.

- B. City inmates incarcerated in the Pittsburg County Criminal Justice Center pursuant to this Agreement shall be transported to and from the jail by the McAlester Police Department. PCCJC is not responsible for transportation of city inmates under this Agreement and shall be reimbursed by CITY for any actual expenses incurred in transport of city inmates if in fact transportation of an inmate by PCCJC becomes necessary.
- C. In providing services under this contract, PCCJC is an independent contractor and neither it, nor its officers, agents or employees are employees of CITY for any purpose, including responsibility for any federal or state tax, industrial insurance or Social Security liability. Neither shall the provision of services under this Agreement give rise to any claim of career service or civil service rights, which may accrue to an employee of CITY under any applicable law, rule, or regulation.
- D. The Sheriff of Pittsburg County and the McAlester Chief of Police shall cooperate with one another and develop and prepare written rules to implement this Agreement and to insure its effective operation over time. The rules shall govern the details of the administration and operation consistent with this Agreement. Such rules shall govern issues and matters not expressly addressed by this Agreement and shall remain in full force until this Agreement is modified by the parties to the contrary. The initial rules will be submitted to both parties and the Board of County Commissioners of Pittsburg County for approval prior to becoming effective. Subsequent amendments or additions to the rules may be made by the written agreement of the Sheriff and Chief. Copies of any such changes shall be furnished to both parties and the Board of County Commissioners of Pittsburg County.

### 19. GENERAL PROVISIONS:

- A. Severability. In the event any of the provisions of this Agreement shall be determined to be unenforceable or otherwise invalid for any reason, such provisions shall be enforced and valid to the extent permitted by law. All provisions of this Agreement are severable and the unenforceability or invalidity of a single provision herein shall not affect the remaining provisions.
- B. Governing Law and Venue. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Oklahoma and venue for any lawsuit shall be in the District Court of Pittsburg County, State of Oklahoma.
- C. Waiver of Breach. The waiver by either party of the breach of any provision of this Agreement by the other party must be in writing and shall not operate nor be constructed as a waiver of any subsequent breach by such other party.

- D. Savings Clause. Nothing herein shall be construed so as to require the commission of any act contrary to law, and wherever there is any conflict between the provisions of this Agreement and any statute, law, public regulation or ordinance, the latter shall prevail., but in such event, the provisions of this Agreement affected shall be curtailed and limited only to the extent necessary to bring it within legal requirements.
- E. Interpretation. This Agreement has been submitted to the scrutiny of all parties and their counsel, if desired, and it shall be given a fair and reasonable interpretation in accordance with its words, without consideration or weight given to its being drafted by any party or its counsel. All words used in the singular shall include the plural; the present tense shall include the future; and the masculine gender shall include the feminine and neuter gender.
- F. Access to Records. The parties hereby agree that authorized representatives of the parties shall have access to any books, documents, paper and record of the other party, which are pertinent or relevant to this Agreement for the purposes of making audits, examinations, excerpts and transcriptions. All such records and all other records pertinent or relevant to this Agreement and work undertaken pursuant to this Agreement shall be retained by the parties for a period of three (3) years after the final expiration date of this Agreement or any amendments hereto, unless a longer period is required to resolve audit findings or litigation. In such cases, the parties may expressly agree by an amendment or separate agreement for such longer period for record retention.
- G. Amendment. This Agreement may be amended by mutual written agreement of the parties.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF MCALESTER, OKLAHOMA, DECLARING CERTAIN STRUCTURES AS DILAPIDATED AND DETRIMENTAL TO THE HEALTH, SAFETY, OR WELFARE OF THE GENERAL PUBLIC.
***********************
WHEREAS, the City of McAlester desires to remove buildings in the community that are dangerous by reason of being dilapidated and has become detrimental to the health, safety, or welfare of the general public and the community, or the property creates a fire hazard which is dangerous to other property; and
<b>WHEREAS</b> , the procedure for notification, as outlined in Section 18-531 of the McAlester Code of Ordinances has been complied with.
<b>NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED</b> by the City Council of the City of McAlester, Oklahoma that:
<b>SECTION 1</b> : Those structures listed in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as if fully set out herein are hereby determined to be dangerous buildings that constitute a detriment or hazard and that the general welfare of the community will be served by their demolition, clearance of the site, and leveling of the lot.
<b>SECTION 2</b> : The property owner is given thirty (30) days from this date to dismantle the structure(s), clear the site, and level the lot. The property owner is hereby granted fifteen (15) days from this date to remove all personal property from the identified structure(s).
<b>SECTION 3</b> : The City Manager and/or agents of the municipality are granted the right of entry on the property for the performance of the necessary duties as a governmental function of the municipality if the work is not performed by the property owner within the dates herein.
<b>PASSED AND APPROVED</b> by the Council of the City of McAlester, Oklahoma on this 22 <sup>nd</sup> day of August 2017.

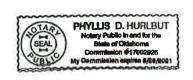

#### ARTICLE IX. DANGEROUS BUILDINGS\*

#### Sec. 18-531. Duties of code administrator.

The general duties to investigate and determine the present location and owner of those certain structures which are considered to be dilapidated or dangerous to the safety of inhabitants of the city is placed upon the code administrator of the city. Any determination that a building is classed as dilapidated or dangerous will be by any one or several reasons, regarding dilapidation, deterioration, age or obsolescence, inadequate provision of ventilation, light, air or sanitation, neglect, need of repair, or accumulation of debris, where the same constitutes a danger to the safety of the neighborhood. Utility companies shall be notified by the code department of the impending condemnation and location of the structure. Basis and procedure for enforcement is provided in 11 O.S. § 22.112.

# Sec. 18-532. Designation of administrative officer; appeals.

The city council designates the code administrator as the administrative officer responsible for carrying out the duties of the city council regarding dilapidated or dangerous structure determinations and removals. The property owner or mortgage holder shall have a right of appeal to the city council from any order of the administrative officer. Such appeal shall be taken by filing written notice of appeal with the city clerk within ten days after the administrative order is rendered. (Code 1974, § 17-29; Code 1993, § 18-377)

## Sec. 18-533. Condemnation proceedings.

(a) If a house or structure has been posted by the building inspector and subsequently condemned by the city council as being dangerous, unsafe, unsanitary or unfit for occupancy (as provided for in this article) and if the structure could be safely remodeled, the owner of the property must obtain a special remodeling permit. The permit shall specify that the structure has been previously condemned, but demolition proceedings have been stayed for 90 days. Prior to the special remodeling permit being issued, the permit applicant must post a \$2,500.00 cash deposit with the city. The structure must then be repaired to meet all current building, electrical, plumbing, and mechanical codes that could apply to new construction, and work must be completed within the 90-day special permit period. Existing plumbing or wir-

ing systems may be left in place with modifications at the inspector's discretion. If the code inspectors determine that the structure does not meet all applicable building, electrical, plumbing, and mechanical codes at the end of the 90-day special permit period, because in the code inspector's opinion that due to the weather conditions, the extensiveness of the repairs or other mitigating circumstances, if requested by the owner, the building code inspector may grant up to an additional 90-day extension of the original special permit period. Provided, if such request of the owner for such extension is denied, such request for a 90-day extension by the code inspector upon written request with demonstrable, justifiable and mitigating causes shown can be made on appeal to the city council. A majority decision of all of the elected councilmembers shall be controlling. Additional extensions of the special permit period may be granted only by a majority decision of the city council.

- (b) A final inspection shall be performed of the structure by the code inspector to determine if the structure meets all building codes for new construction. If it does, the \$2,500.00 deposit made by the owner shall be returned and the process of condemnation shall be withdrawn. If on the other hand, said final inspection determines said structure does not meet all such building codes, then the city shall retain the \$2,500.00 deposit made by the owner to be applied to the demolition and removal of the structure and the condemnation procedure shall continue without further action by the city council.
- (c) The provisions of this section shall apply notwithstanding any conflicting provisions of any other section of this code.

- A. A municipal governing body may cause dilapidated buildings within the municipal limits to be torn down and removed in accordance with the following procedures:
- 1. At least ten (10) days' notice that a building is to be torn down or removed shall be given to the owner of the property before the governing body holds a hearing. A copy of the notice shall be posted on the property to be affected. In addition, a copy of the notice shall be sent by mail to the property owner at the address shown by the current year's tax rolls in the office of the county treasurer. Written notice shall also be mailed to any mortgage holder as shown by the records in the office of the county clerk to the last-known address of the mortgagee. At the time of mailing of notice to any property owner or mortgage holder, the municipality shall obtain a receipt of mailing from the postal service, which receipt shall indicate the date of mailing and the name and address of the mailee. However, if neither the property owner nor mortgage holder can be located, notice may be given by posting a copy of the notice on the property, or by publication as defined in Section 1-102 of this title. The notice may be published once not less than ten (10) days prior to any hearing or action by the municipality pursuant to the provisions of this section;
- 2. A hearing shall be held by the governing body to determine if the property is dilapidated and has become detrimental to the health, safety, or welfare of the general public and the community, or if the property creates a fire hazard which is dangerous to other property;
- 3. Pursuant to a finding that the condition of the property constitutes a detriment or a hazard and that the property would be benefited by the removal of such conditions, the governing body may cause the dilapidated building to be torn down and removed. The governing body shall fix reasonable dates for the commencement and completion of the work. The municipal clerk shall immediately file a notice of dilapidation and lien with the county clerk describing the property, the findings of the municipality at the hearing, and stating that the municipality claims a lien on the property for the destruction and removal costs and that such costs are the personal obligation of the property owner from and after the date of filing of the notice. The agents of the municipality are granted the right of entry on the property for the performance of the necessary duties as a governmental function of the municipality if the work is not performed by the property owner within dates fixed by the governing body. Any action to challenge the order of the municipal governing body shall be filed within thirty (30) business days from the date of the order:
- 4. The governing body shall determine the actual cost of the dismantling and removal of dilapidated buildings and any other expenses that may be necessary in conjunction with the dismantling and removal of the buildings, including the cost of notice and mailing. The municipal clerk shall forward a statement of the actual cost attributable to the dismantling and removal of the buildings and a demand for payment of such costs, by mail to the property owner. In addition, a copy of the statement shall be mailed to any

mortgage holder at the address provided for in paragraph 1 of this subsection. At the time of mailing of the statement of costs to any property owner or mortgage holder, the municipality shall obtain a receipt of mailing from the postal service, which receipt shall indicate the date of mailing and the name and address of the mailee. If a municipality dismantles or removes any dilapidated buildings, the cost to the property owner shall not exceed the actual cost of the labor, maintenance, and equipment required for the dismantling and removal of the dilapidated buildings. If dismantling and removal of the dilapidated buildings is done on a private contract basis, the contract shall be awarded to the lowest and best bidder; and

- 5. When payment is made to the municipality for costs incurred, the municipal clerk shall file a release of lien, but if payment attributable to the actual cost of the dismantling and removal of the buildings is not made within six (6) months from the date of the mailing of the statement to the owner of such property, the municipal clerk shall forward a certified statement of the amount of the cost to the county treasurer of the county in which the property is located. Once certified to the county treasurer, payment may only be made to the county treasurer except as otherwise provided for in this section. The costs shall be levied on the property and collected by the county treasurer as are other taxes authorized by law. Until finally paid, the costs and the interest thereon shall be the personal obligation of the property owner from and after the date of the notice of dilapidation and lien is filed with the county clerk. In addition the cost and the interest thereon shall be a lien against the property from the date the notice of the lien is filed with the county clerk. The lien shall be coequal with the lien of ad valorem taxes and all other taxes and special assessments and shall be prior and superior to all other titles and liens against the property. The lien shall continue until the cost is fully paid. At the time of collection, the county treasurer shall collect a fee of Five Dollars (\$5.00) for each parcel of property. The fee shall be deposited to the credit of the general fund of the county. If the county treasurer and the municipality agree that the county treasurer is unable to collect the assessment, the municipality may pursue a civil remedy for collection of the amount owing and interest thereon including an action in personam against the property owner and an action in rem to foreclose its lien against the property. A mineral interest, if severed from the surface interest and not owned by the surface owner, shall not be subject to any tax or judgment lien created pursuant to this section. Upon receiving payment, the municipal clerk shall forward to the county treasurer a notice of such payment and shall direct discharge of the lien.
- B. The municipality may designate, by ordinance, an administrative officer or administrative body to carry out the duties of the governing body specified in this section. The property owner shall have the right of appeal to the municipal governing body from any order of the administrative officer or administrative body. Such appeal shall be taken by filing written notice of appeal with the municipal clerk within ten (10) days after the administrative order is rendered.
- C. For the purposes of this section:
- 1. "Dilapidated building" means:
- a. a structure which through neglect or injury lacks necessary repairs or otherwise is in a state of decay or partial ruin to such an extent that the structure is a hazard to the health, safety, or welfare of the general public,
- b. a structure which is unfit for human occupancy due to the lack of necessary repairs and is considered uninhabitable or is a hazard to the health, safety, and welfare of the general public,
- c. a structure which is determined by the municipal governing body or administrative officer of the municipal governing body to be an unsecured building, as defined by Section 22-112.1 of this title, more than three times within any twelve-month period,

- d. a structure which has been boarded and secured, as defined by Section 22-112.1 of this title, for more than eighteen (18) consecutive months, or
- e. a structure declared by the municipal governing body to constitute a public nuisance; and
- 2. "Owner" means the owner of record as shown by the most current tax rolls of the county treasurer.
- D. Nothing in the provisions of this section shall prevent the municipality from abating a dilapidated building as a nuisance or otherwise exercising its police power to protect the health, safety, or welfare of the general public.
- E. The officers, employees or agents of the municipality shall not be liable for any damages or loss of property due to the removal of dilapidated buildings performed pursuant to the provisions of this section or as otherwise prescribed by law.
- F. The provisions of this section shall not apply to any property zoned and used for agricultural purposes.

Section 22-112.1 - Tearing and Removal of Dilapidated Buildings - Cleaning, Boarding and Securing of Unsecured Building

Cite as: O.S. §, \_\_\_\_

A. After a building has been declared dilapidated, as provided in Section <u>22-112</u> of this title, and before the commencement of the tearing and removal of a dilapidated building, the governing body of any municipality may authorize that such a building be boarded and secured. However, if the dilapidated

building is vacant and unfit for human occupancy, the governing body of any municipality may authorize the structure to be demolished pursuant to Section <u>22-112</u> of this title.

- B. A governing body of any municipality may cause the premises on which an unsecured building is located to be cleaned of trash and weeds in accordance with the provisions of Section <u>22-111</u> of this title.
- C. A governing body of any municipality may cause an unsecured building to be boarded and secured in accordance with the following procedures:
- 1. Before the governing body orders such action, at least ten (10) days' notice that such unsecured building is to be boarded and secured shall be given by mail to any property owners and mortgage holders as provided in Section 22-112 of this title. At the time of mailing of notice to any property owner or mortgage holder, the municipality shall obtain a receipt of mailing from the postal service, which receipt shall indicate the date of mailing and the name and address of the mailee. A copy of the notice shall also be posted on the property to be affected. However, if neither the property owner nor mortgage holder can be located, notice may be given by posting a copy of the notice on the property or by publication as defined in Section 1-102 of this title. Such notice shall be published one time, not less than ten (10) days prior to any hearing or action by the municipality pursuant to the provisions of this section. If a municipal governing body anticipates summary abatement of a nuisance in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 9 of this subsection, the notice shall state: that any subsequent need for boarding and securing the building within a six-month period after the initial boarding and securing of the building pursuant to such notice may be summarily boarded and secured by the municipal governing body; that the costs of such boarding and securing shall be assessed against the owner; and that a lien may be imposed on the property to secure such payment, all without further prior notice to the property owner or mortgage holder;
- 2. The owner of the property may give written consent to the municipality authorizing the boarding and securing of such unsecured building and to the payment of any costs incurred thereby. By giving written consent, the owner waives any right the owner has to a hearing by the municipal governing body;
- 3. If the property owner does not give written consent to such actions, a hearing may be held by the municipal governing body to determine whether the boarding and securing of such unsecured building would promote and benefit the public health, safety or welfare. Such hearing may be held in conjunction with a hearing on the accumulation of trash or the growth of weeds or grass on the premises of such unsecured building held pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 3 of subsection A of Section 22-111 of this title. In making such determination, the governing body shall apply the following standard: the governing body may order the boarding and securing of the unsecured building when the boarding and securing thereof would make such building less available for transient occupation, decrease a fire hazard created by such building, or decrease the hazard that such building would constitute an attractive nuisance to children.

Upon making the required determination, the municipal governing body may order the boarding and securing of the unsecured building;

4. After the governing body orders the boarding and securing of such unsecured building, the municipal clerk shall immediately file a notice of unsecured building and lien with the county clerk describing the property, stating the findings of the municipality at the hearing at which such building was determined to be unsecured, and stating that the municipality claims a lien on the property for the costs of boarding and securing such building and that such costs are the personal obligation of the property owner from and after the date of filing the notice;

- 5. Pursuant to the order of the governing body, the agents of the municipality are granted the right of entry on the property for the performance of the boarding and securing of such building and for the performance of all necessary duties as a governmental function of the municipality;
- 6. After an unsecured building has been boarded and secured, the governing body shall determine the actual costs of such actions and any other expenses that may be necessary in conjunction therewith including the cost of the notice and mailing. The municipal clerk shall forward a statement of the actual costs attributable to the boarding and securing of the unsecured building and a demand for payment of such costs, by mail to any property owners and mortgage holders as provided in Section 22-112 of this title. At the time of mailing of the statement of costs to any property owner or mortgage holder, the municipality shall obtain a receipt of mailing from the postal service, which receipt shall indicate the date of mailing and the name and address of the mailee.

If a municipality boards and secures any unsecured building, the cost to the property owner shall not exceed the actual cost of the labor, materials and equipment required for the performance of such actions. If such actions are done on a private contract basis, the contract shall be awarded to the lowest and best bidder;

- 7. When payment is made to the municipality for costs incurred, the municipal clerk shall file a release of lien, but if payment attributable to the actual costs of the boarding and securing of the unsecured building is not made within thirty (30) days from the date of the mailing of the statement to the owner of such property, the municipal clerk shall forward a certified statement of the amount of the costs to the county treasurer of the county in which the property is located. Once certified to the county treasurer, payment may only be made to the county treasurer except as otherwise provided for in this section. At the time of collection the county treasurer shall collect a fee of Five Dollars (\$5.00) for each parcel of property and such fee shall be deposited to the general fund of the county. The costs shall be levied on the property and collected by the county treasurer as are other taxes authorized by law. Until fully paid, the costs and the interest thereon shall be the personal obligation of the property owner from and after the date the notice of unsecured building and lien is filed with the county clerk. In addition the costs and the interest thereon shall be a lien against the property from the date the notice of the lien is filed with the county clerk. The lien shall be coequal with the lien of ad valorem taxes and all other taxes and special assessments and shall be prior and superior to all other titles and liens against the property. The lien shall continue until the costs and interest are fully paid. If the county treasurer and the municipality agree that the county treasurer is unable to collect the assessment, the municipality may pursue a civil remedy for collection of the amount owing and interest thereon by an action in personam against the property owner and an action in rem to foreclose its lien against the property. A mineral interest if severed from the surface owner, shall not be subject to any tax or judgment lien created pursuant to this section. Upon receiving payment, the municipal clerk shall forward to the county treasurer a notice of such payment and shall direct discharge of the lien;
- 8. The municipality may designate by ordinance an administrative officer or administrative body to carry out the duties of the governing body specified in subsection C of this section. The property owner or mortgage holder shall have a right of appeal to the municipal governing body from any order of the administrative officer or administrative body. Such appeal shall be taken by filing written notice of appeal with the municipal clerk within ten (10) days after the administrative order is rendered;
- 9. If a municipal governing body causes a structure within the municipal limits to be boarded and secured, any subsequent need for boarding and securing within a six-month period constitutes a public nuisance and may be summarily boarded and secured without further prior notice to the property owner or mortgage holder. At the time of each such summary boarding and securing, the municipality shall notify the property owner and mortgage holder of the boarding and securing and the costs thereof. The notice

shall state that the property owner may request an appeal with the municipal clerk within ten (10) days after the mailing of the notice. The notice and hearing shall be as provided for in paragraph 1 of this subsection. Unless otherwise determined at the hearing the cost of such boarding and securing shall be determined and collected as provided for in paragraphs 6 and 7 of this subsection;

- 10. A governing body of any municipality may determine that a building is unsecured and order that such building be boarded and secured in the manner provided for in this subsection even though such building has not been declared, by the governing body, to be dilapidated; and
- 11. For the purposes of this subsection:
- a. "boarding and securing" or "boarded and secured" means the closing, boarding or locking of any or all exterior openings so as to prevent entry into the structure,
- b. "unsecured building" shall mean any structure which is not occupied by a legal or equitable owner thereof, or by a lessee of a legal or equitable owner, and into which there are one or more unsecured openings such as broken windows, unlocked windows, broken doors, unlocked doors, holes in exterior walls, holes in the roof, broken basement or cellar hatchways, unlocked basement or cellar hatchways or other similar unsecured openings which would facilitate an unauthorized entry into the structure, and
- c. "unfit for human occupancy" means a structure that due to lack of necessary repairs is considered uninhabitable and is a hazard to the health, safety, and welfare of the general public.
- D. The provisions of this section shall not apply to any property zoned and used for agricultural purposes.

## **Background Information:**

The property is zoned R-1B single family residential and located in the Wade Watts Corridor Development overlay. The applicant property owner plans to construct a tunnel car wash that will be staffed by two to three employees and open seven days a week from 7 a.m. until 9 p.m..

## Sec. 62-256. R-1B single-family residential district.

(a) General description. The R-IB single-family residential district is established as a district in which the use of land is for single-family dwellings, yet providing for a somewhat higher density with basic restrictions similar to the R-IA single family residential district. The development and continued use of this land for residential dwellings is encouraged and the encroachment of commercial and industrial use or any other use which would substantially interfere with the development of or continuation of this district as residential is prohibited. Any use which would generate traffic or create congestion on neighborhood streets other than normal traffic which serves the residences on the street is discouraged. Encouraged are those uses, which, because of character or size would not create additional requirements and costs for public services, which are in excess of such requirements and costs if the district were developed solely for residential dwellings.

#### Sec. 62-272. Wade Watts Corridor Development.

- (a) Creation. There is hereby created the Wade Watts Avenue Corridor Development ("WW district").
- (b) *Purpose*. The planning commission and city council find conditions and purposes within the Wade Watts Avenue corridor that merit special consideration in order to protect the health, safety, and general welfare of the city. It shall be the purpose of these regulations to provide guidelines for the application of a special regulation created to ensure conformity with objectives of good plan-ning and zoning practices. Further, by adoption of these regulations the city council makes specific findings that special regulations are necessary to secure safety from fire, panic, traffic and other dangers and for the protection of the public from overcrowding of land, to avoid undue concentration of population, to promote a more homogeneous relationship and transition between land uses, to protect property values and to regulate the use of land in accordance with the comprehensive plan. The provisions of the Wade Watts Avenue corridor development district are further intended to protect and stabilize adjacent areas, provide safe and efficient traffic flows, and promote the efficient use of urban land and previous public investments.
- (c) General provisions and descriptions. The WW district and its regulations may be applied to property located within one block north of Wade Watts Avenue and one block south of Wade Watts Avenue between Strong Boulevard and George Nigh Expressway (Highway 69) except that lots south of the east/west alley in Blocks 454, 455 and 456 are excluded. More particularly, this area as described in the following platted blocks of the original plat of the city: all of Blocks 412, 413, 414, 415, 416, 417, 418, 419, 457, 458, 459, 460 and 461; and lots north of the east/west alley in Blocks 454, 455 and 456. The WW district and its regulations may be applied to the described properties even though, and at the same time, the property is under the regulations of the R-1B (single-family residential) district, C-2 (neighborhood convenience commercial) district and C-5 (highway commercial and commercial recreation) district.

- (e) Uses permitted after review:
- (1) n. Car wash;
- (f) Area regulations. The following requirement shall apply to all uses permitted. All lots shall comply with the specific lot definition and yard definition found in section 62-1.
  - (1) Minimum lot area and use intensity. The minimum lot area for this district shall not be less than 12,000 square feet. (The 50,000 square foot requirement does not apply to this WW District)
  - (2) Minimum lot frontage. The minimum lot frontage shall be not less than 75 feet.
  - (3) Maximum percentage of coverage. Main and accessory buildings shall not cover more than 75 percent of the lot
  - (4) Maximum height. The maximum height shall be 2.5 stories.
  - (5) Front yard setback. The following requirements shall apply:
    - a. All buildings shall set back from the street right-of-way lines not less than 25 feet.
    - b. When motor fuel is sold in this district, fuel pumps shall be no closer than 11 feet to any property line, nor closer than 15 feet to any building.
  - (6) Side yard. The following requirements shall apply:
  - (7) *Rear yard.* When building will be serviced from the rear, a minimum of 20-foot setback shall be provided. Where there is no rear service, there will be no rear setback required.
- (g) Exterior Standards/visual appeal. This development area has as its goal to promote a visual appealing environment. To accomplish this goal the following objectives are established and shall apply to all structures:
  - (1) To implement quality building design and construction throughout this district. Various exterior wall finishes will be considered by the planning commission and city council (brick, vinyl, stucco, stone, wood and cosmetically equivalent exterior siding, etc) except that no metal exterior walls may be visible from any street.)
  - (2) To correct deteriorating areas and structures through their revitalization, redevelopment and/or screening.
  - (3) To develop signage that compliments to visual appeal of this district.
- (h) Access allowance.
  - (2) Land having frontage on Wade Watts Avenue. In accordance with the purpose of the Wade Watts Avenue district, provisions are made for access to lots and land having frontage onto Wade Watts Avenue, as follows: The entrance and exit shall be so designed to discourage cross traffic on Wade Watts Avenue.
- (i) Landscaping and screening.
  - (1) *Purpose*. To provide a visually appealing and ecologically sound district and assure the purpose of the "WW" corridor is accomplished.
  - (2) *Plan.* A landscape plan shall accompany any applications within this district. The plan shall show the location, size, spacing and quality of all existing and proposed materials.
  - (3) *Buffer*. A landscape buffer will be provided between Wade Watts Avenue and all parking. The buffer shall be a minimum off our feet wide and grass and/or shrubs. All corner lots will maintain a 30-foot site triangle with no plant material over two feet in height.

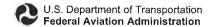

#### City Manager Report to the Council

#### August 22, 2017

#### **Business:**

- The City has received final sales tax numbers for the period June 16, 2017 through July 15, 2017. The final sales tax number to be received from the Oklahoma Tax Commission is \$1.168M. The budgeted number for this period is \$1.140M or \$28K over budget. The receipt of \$1.168M is \$26K higher than the amount received for the period last year. For the first two (2) months of the year, sales tax revenue is over budget \$44K. The Use Tax received for the period is \$82K as compared to \$69K budgeted, or \$13K over budget. For the first two (2) months of the year use tax is \$44K over budget. The sales and use tax has now exceeded the budget two consecutive months.
- Water sales, district water sales, sewer and garbage sales for the month July 2017 equaled \$744K. The budgeted sales for July is \$765K or \$21K under budget for the month. These numbers have been seasonally adjusted.
- I had the opportunity to attend an Economic Forum presented by the Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City, Oklahoma City Branch on August 10 in Hugo. The Southeast Oklahoma economy makes up 14% of the state's labor force with agriculture, energy and government making up the major components. Rural energy jobs are recovering slowly, while government jobs are down and agriculture remains weak. In the energy sector there are currently nine (9) gas drilling rigs and one (1) oil drilling rig in Southeast Oklahoma. In summary, unemployment has come down and sales tax has risen in the Southeast region of Oklahoma.

While he will provide some services to the secondary levels, he will largely be attending to the elementary and middle school students.

### **Ford Explorer Police Vehicles**

You may be aware of media reports concerning Ford Explorer Police Vehicles and carbon monoxide (CO2) exposure. Our Officers safety being of the utmost importance, we have contacted several departments that have been dealing with the issue along with our local Ford dealership service representatives and City of McAlester Safety Officer Doug Bassinger.

The Safety Officer provided our Officers with a CO2 monitor which each officer used to monitor his patrol vehicle. Readings we received were documented and compared with regulations from OHSA.

While the results did not exceed the OHSA standards for long term work exposure, we were still concerned. We have developed a protocol that reduces any CO2 readings to minimal levels.

We have also been informed that Ford is aggressively investigating the issue and has offered to inspect each vehicle in our fleet, repairing as needed.

Our thanks to Safety Officer Doug Bassinger and the local Ford Service Department for the effort and concern they have exhibited concerning the issue.

EQUIPMENT: I ordered a large amount of supplies this month, mainly for the hot weather.

TRAINING: Twenty-three classes were completed online this month by ten employees. There was a Preventing Accidents in the Workplace class this month at Kiamichi Tech with 40 employees attending.

ACCIDENT: Two accidents/damage this month. A window was broken in a Cemetery unit when a chain towing a vehicle came loose. A vehicle assigned to the Softball complex was damaged when back into by a piece of equipment. No damage estimate as this happened today.

INJURIES: Two minor injuries this month. A Dispatcher claims cumulative trauma to the arms, possible carpal tunnel. A Firefighter injured his back lifting a patient and so far has only missed ½ shift. A Firefighter remains off due to a back injury and is scheduled for back surgery. A Police officer and a Parks employee remain on restricted duty.

DAMAGE: Two damage claims this month. A phone drop was cut but believed to be dead. The crew was operating within the guidelines and the drop was pulled up by tree roots.

INSPECTIONS: All employees have been doing a good job wearing the required PPE. All employees have been working safely. All employees have access to hydration supplies.

WORKERS COMPENSATION: No new claims this month. We settled two claims this month. One was a huge savings to the City over what was expected. The other settlement will be recovered through third party subrogation.

The August Safety newsletter has been printed and distributed to all departments.

We are at 13 injuries reported for the calendar year, which is three more than this time last year. Four of the injuries resulted in days off. We had two this month compared to three in July of last year. For the fiscal year, we have had 26 injuries compared to 31 for the same time during the last fiscal year.

# City of McAlester

## Summary

The City is continuing to removing the solids from the sludge lagoons. This will allow the sludge to be moved into the drying beds. The sludge lagoons are filled with solids from the treatment process. They have completed the little pond and awaiting start on the large pond. We are happy to report that the Iron, Manganese, Aluminum and TSS was with in permit.

There is a consent order and the DEQ folks seemed quite pleased with the progress on the smaller pond. The city has dedicated a permanent employee here to operate the sludge boxes to keep from refilling the ponds so fast. He is a wastewater operator and did start operating the boxes June 1<sup>st</sup>.

The High Service Pumps are operating as well as can be expected, with their condition. There was no movement on MCC controls replacement for the High Service Pumps since May 25<sup>th</sup> 2017 when contractor disconnect HSP #3 and 4 from their power to prep their replacement. That does leave us with only 2 HSP available. The electrical panels are to be delivered by August 25<sup>th</sup> 2017. The contractor will run the electrical conduit here in the next couple of weeks.

The City's engineer George Marcangeli had also requested to check the level indication in this tower, this was completed by Worth Hydrochem. The level indication reads only what the bowl of the tower is, does not take into account the water that is in the stem (95.9 ft.) to the bowl. We would like to recommend the entire system at summit ridge to be evaluated by an engineer for a permanent fix to provide sufficient water volume and pressure for fire suppression needs.

There are still many issues with the filter controls and the valves. We are working on developing a cost estimate on the control portion of the filters at this time.

Control Head for the raw water flow meter failed, this controls the dosing for the chemical feed pumps. This happened over the weekend of June 10<sup>th</sup> 2017 and was replaced and is operational.

City Engineer George Marcangeli met with our Worth Hydrochem representative and accomplished reprogramming the Water Plant SCADA system to see incoming raw water flow and finished water flow and tower levels.

The Variable Speed Drive on raw water pump #2 was shorted out on Monday the June 26<sup>th</sup> 2017 in the Lake McAlester raw water pump station due to a lightning strike. This event left us with 2 of the 4 raw water pumps working. The cost to replace this VSD is \$6,238.46 and this price will include surge protection which was non-existent. The replacement of the VSD will be scheduled when the part arrives.

On Sunday the August 6<sup>th</sup> 2017 at approx. 0530 the power to the Lake McAlester raw water pump station was knock out by lightning. The city was notified and the power was restored at approx. 0830 but when the raw water pumps were restarted pump #3 started smoking and shut down immediately but the damage was done and the pump was burned out leaving us with 1 raw water pump to feed the plant. At this time we repaired the check valve on raw water pump #4 which was leaking and put it back into service providing us with the raw water needed to run the plant and full capacity.

## **Noteworthy Events**

New Project Manager Richard Herring (Walt) was hired and will start the 10<sup>th</sup> of July. We had the city engineers out to the plant on Friday the August 4<sup>th</sup> 2017 to discuss repairing one or both of the secondary raw water pump stations. Proposals for these projects will be ready for review in 90 days.

## **Operations**

There was 1 violations/excursion on the discharge from the ponds in June for the monthly minimum pH. The limit is 6.5 and we reported 6.2. All other samples were in compliance.

# Jayme Clifton, Community Development Director July 2017 Activity Report

#### Comprehensive Plan Update

- City Council was presented with the Planning Commission recommendation at the June 16<sup>th</sup> meeting. Based on public comments received at the meeting, a Town Hall meeting was recommended and the agenda item was tabled until the July 11<sup>th</sup> meeting.
- A Town Hall meeting was held on July 6<sup>th</sup> with a considerable amount of citizens present. Provided a brief presentation as to the Comprehensive Plan process. Ken Senour, Paula Hofford, Darran Scott and Karl Stickley with Guernsey attended the Town Hall meeting as well and answered numerous questions from the public and council.
- At the City Council meeting on July 11<sup>th</sup>, the Council approved the selection of Guernsey. A draft of Guernsey's Master Agreement and Task Orders were submitted to City Manager and City Attorney on July 17<sup>th</sup> for review. By request, forwarded the same to paralegal and copied City Attorney on July 19<sup>th</sup>. On July 31<sup>st</sup> requested Guernsey to provide a finalized Task Order.
- Agenda report documents were submitted on August 2<sup>nd</sup>, in anticipation an approved Task Order would be provided by Guernsey. The finalized draft of the Master Agreement and Task Order for consideration was received from Guernsey on August 4th and submitted to the City Manager and City Attorney on August 4th for review.

#### **Belmont Trail Project**

• Final reimbursement of \$28,180.77 was received on June 29, 2017. Staff will begin preparing the project documents for storage.

#### Condemnation of Dilapidated Structures for 2015-2016 Budget Year Demolition

• An initial special remodeling permit was issued to Michelle Hazen for 1516 Park on May 11, 2016, extended a number of times with the last extension granted on May 9, 2017. The special remodeling permit is valid until August 7<sup>th</sup>.
