1. Presentation of Oklahoma Municipal Assurance Group's OMAG Municipal Liability Protection Plan (MLPP) *Recognition Program.* (Cora Middleton, City Clerk) Executive Summary

Presentation.

Bill Tackett, Director of Risk Management Services with Oklahoma Municipal Assurance Group (OMAG) addressed the Council informing them of the Retention and Recognition programs that OMAG had started the first of July, 2017. He briefly reviewed the requirements for the Retention program in order for the City to receive approximately \$27,000.00 and explained how the City could earn \$10,000.00 by participating in the Recognition program. He then reviewed the steps that the Council would need to take to qualify for the award.

There was a brief discussion concerning how long the training session would take.

2. Acceptance of the MDSA Quarterly Report and introduction of the new Director. (Kevin Priddle, MDSA)

Executive Summary Presentation.

Kevin Priddle with MDSA addressed the Council introducing the new Executive Director of MDSS, Jessica Gregg. Mr. Priddle then reviewed the activities of the Association for the previous quarter which included the meeting with Senator Inhofe, working on a website to increase visibility, participating in calls with The Spectrum Group to plan the McAlester Stampede, implementing fundraising events and adopting a mission statement.

3. Consider and act upon, a request from the property owner for a 90 day extension of Special Remodel Permit No. 17065 for the condemned property at 629 N C Street. (George Estrada, Building Inspector, Jayme Clifton, Director)

Executive Summary

Motion to grant a 90 day extension of Special Remodel Permit No. 17065 for the condemned property at 629 N C Street.

Director Clifton addressed the Council explaining that the property owner of 629 N. "C" Street had requested a ninety (90) day extension of Special Remodel Permit No. 17065. She added that extensive work had been done to the property.

Councilman Read asked if the house was secured.

Mr. Priddle, 314 W. Jackson explained that the house was secured but they continued to have theft of supplies. He explained some of the obstacles that the renovation had come across and commented that he was confident that this would be finished on time.

Chief Wansick addressed the Council explaining that language in Section 22-126 of the City's Code of Ordinances could have some problems. He stated that he had discussed this with the City Attorney and the City Prosecutor.

There was a brief discussion concerning addressing the language as a safety matter, the Code prohibiting aggressive panhandling but not restricting some one's ability to ask for help and how businesses could address panhandling.

Executive Summary

Staff recommends acceptance of the bid recommendation by Infrastructure Solutions Group, LLC for the Emergency Canal Wall Repair at 1000 E. Miami Avenue.

Robert Vaughan, P.E. Branch Manager Infrastructure Solutions Group, LLC addressed the Council explaining that on April 10, 2018 the Council had passed an Emergency Declaration waiving the standard bidding requirements to address the potential collapse of the canal wall at 1000 E. Miami. He stated that four (4) contractors had submitted bids at the bid opening at 2:00 P.M. this afternoon and Built Right Construction, LLC had been the apparent low bidder.

After a brief discussion concerning previous experience with the contractor and the length of the warranty that would be furnished with this project, a motion to award the contract to Built Right Construction, LLC was made by Councilman Read. Robert Vaughan, P.E. Branch Manager Infrastructure Solutions Group, LLC addressed the Council explaining that this was a Stormwater project and bids had been opened on April 3, 2018 at 2:00 P.M. He stated that seven (7) contractors had submitted bids with MJM Construction, LLC being the apparent low bidder. He added that he had received good feedback when MJM's references had been checked.

He stated that six (6) contractors had submitted bids with Built Right Construction, LLC being the apparent low bidder.

9. Discussion and update on Financials. (Toni Ervin, Chief Financial Officer) Executive Summary Discussion.

CFO Ervin addressed the Council updating them on the City's financials as of March 31, 2018. During her update CFO Ervin explained that the City was seventy-five percent (75%) through the year and the General Fund Revenues were 1.1% over budget and Expenses were .3% under budget. She added that MPWA Revenues were 1.1% under budget but the expenses were 4% under budget. CFO Ervin reviewed the various reports that were furnished to the Council. CFO Ervin also explained that the variation in water sales was due to the heavy rains the City had experienced. She stated that some of the meters had to be estimated and some of the meters had been changed from measuring cubic inches to measuring gallons.

There was no vote on this item.

10. Consider and act upon, an Ordinance amending the general zoning ordinance and accompanying map thereto known as General Zoning Ordinance No. 1843 (1989), by changing the classification of the zoning districts for All that Part of NE ¼ NE ¼ of Section 19, Township 5 North, Range 15 East of the Indian Base and Meridian, lying South of Highway No. 69, in Pittsburg County, State of Oklahoma, from R-1B Single-family Residential District to C-5 Highway Commercial and Commercial Recreation District. (Jayme Clifton, Director)

Executive Summary

Motion to act upon and approve the above Ordinance changing the classification of the zoning districts for the property identified in the Ordinance from R-1B Single-family Residential District to C-5 Highway Commercial and Commercial Recreation District and authorizing the Mayor to sign the ordinance.

Director Clifton addressed the Council explaining that the 36.95 acre parcel was split between C-5 Highway Commercial and Commercial Recreation District and R-1B Single-family Residential. She stated that the applicant had requested that all of the 36.95 acre parcel be zoned as C-5 Highway Commercial and Commercial Recreation District. Director Clifton informed the Council that the Planning and Zoning Commission had met on April 9, 2018 and voted unanimously to recommend the applicant's request to the Council. She added that the Notice to Property Owners was sent to all owners within three hundred (300) feet as required and that three (3) of the owners had expressed their support of the change.

Ryan Wiley, 14 Crooked Oak Lane and Pam Nguyen, 43 Quail Court expressed their opposition to the rezoning.

There was a brief discussion concerning what type of screening would be constructed between the development and the private property.

Karla Taylor, 701 S. 13th Street expressed her support for the rezoning and added that she hoped the Council would be able to allay some of the property owners concerns.

There was another brief discussion concerning the possible extension of 14th Street and if there had been any plans to construct apartments in that area.

Interim Vice-Mayor Stevens asked if the improvements to the Expo Center were still in the Plan and if the changes that had been implemented to the Expo fees had seen any results. Manager Stasiak stated that what had been in the Capital Plan when presented was still included in the Plan. He added that there had not been enough time since the changes to the Expo fees to see any effect.

A motion to approve RESOLUTION NO. 18-09, adopting the Capital Improvement Program for 2018/2019-2022/2023 was made by Councilman Read. The motion was seconded by Councilman Smith, and the vote was taken as follows:

Manager Stasiak addressed the Council presenting the preliminary budget for Fiscal Year 2018/2019. During his presentation Manager Stasiak stated that the budget was a work in progress and he reviewed some of the changes that were being made to the City's Organizational Chart with the addition of an Assistant City Manager's position. He added that the Assistant City Manager would report the City Manager and oversee the operational side of the City. He stated that the City was required to have a balanced budget and maintain ten percent (10%) in an Emergency Fund. Manager Stasiak reviewed the changes to the General Funds revenue, and the projected increases in job opportunities in the coming year. He then the McAlester Public Works Authority's projected revenues and expenses for the coming year. He also reviewed the City's expenditures by department for both the General Fund and the Public Works Authority. Manager Stasiak covered the City's bond Debt and the benefits that the City would continue to offer employees. He explained that in addition to the Assistant City Manager the City would

change the part-time Benefits position to full-time giving the City 222 employees and 80 seasonal employees.

Manager Stasiak reviewed the Capital Improvements Fund, its' recurring payments, projected programs and equipment purchases. He reviewed City's infrastructure needs and funding.

There was a brief discussion concerning prioritizing the City's needs and making more progress in those areas rather than throwing a little money at everything, the City's old water lines and holding a workshop in a couple of weeks to address questions and recommendations.

Manager Stasiak also informed the Council that the City would be adding two (2) funds; one would be for the 1/8 % Education sales tax receipts and the other for the 1/8 % Hospital funding. He asked that any comments or questions be submitted to him.

There was no vote on this item.

New Business

Manager Stasiak commented that he would gather the information requested and meet with Councilman Read regarding his questions and concerns about the proposed budget.

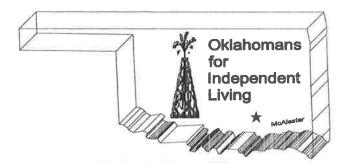

WHEREAS, The City and the Trust are required to comply with financial assurance requirements for the closure of its MSWLF and for post-closure care for thirty (30) years after closing the MSWLF pursuant to RCRA Subtitle D regulations and Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality rules and regulations, and

WHEREAS, The City and the Trust are in compliance with the aforementioned rules, regulations and laws by its participation as a member of the Association for Landfill Financial Assurance, an Oklahoma not for profit association (hereinafter "ALFA"), such entity being an approved mechanism under the laws of the state of Oklahoma for compliance with all financial assurance requirements, and

WHEREAS, The City and the Trust are required pursuant to the ALFA Participation Agreement to annually reaffirm its membership and pledge and guarantee to provide funding for the closure and post-closure care costs which are currently unfunded, where current estimated closure and post-closure care costs less the current Escrow Balance equals, and is hereinafter referred to as, "Unfunded Costs."

WHEREFORE, The City and the Trust hereby reaffirm and renew their membership in ALFA, (the City through the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019), pursuant to the terms and covenants as contained in said Participation Agreement dated July 25, 1995, an original copy of which is on file in the offices of the Trust.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF MCALESTER

AND

OKLAHOMANS FOR INDEPENDENT LIVING

This Agreement, made and entered into this _______, 2018 by and between the City of McAlester, Oklahoma hereinafter called the (the "City"), and Oklahomans for Independent Living, hereinafter called ("OIL").

It is the intent of the Agreement that OIL is to perform such services as outlined herein:

OIL agrees to provide services for people with disabilities such as transportation, assistive technology, recreation, volunteer programs, Americans with Disabilities Act and disability awareness training, employment assistance, information and referral, advocacy, peer counseling, Independent Living Skills training, nursing facility transition/diversion and youth transition from school to post-secondary life.

OIL and the City shall maintain an arrangement for professional contact. This will be in the form of informal discussion by and with the staff of both agencies in order to identify areas of need, gaps in service and to coordinate available resources of both agencies for the benefit of People with Disabilities. Confidentiality standards will be observed.

In performing this agreement Oklahomans for Independent Living acts as an independent contractor and nothing contained in this agreement shall be construed to establish a relationship of agency or employment between said entity and the City.

OIL will contract with the City in providing the following services to the City and the citizens of McAlester:

- Door-to-door transportation to be provided to individuals with disabilities and elderly persons
 with functional limitations to facilitate living; a minimum of twenty-four (24) hours is required;
 and
- 2) Back-up service to the Community Services Senior Citizens bus service; and
- 3) Disability information and referrals; and
- 4) Equipment loan program for items necessary for independence when equipment is available (items such as walkers, shower benches/chairs, crutches, wheelchairs, etc.); and
- 5) Social and recreational programs for McAlester citizens with disabilities; and
- 6) Pharmaceutical indigent service to help people obtain necessary medications at no cost from pharmaceutical companies; and

- 7) Employment assistance to people with disabilities; and
- 8) Peer counseling and support groups to promote independence for people with disabilities; and
- 9) Individual assistance to advocate and encourage independence; and
- 10) ADA information and assistance for individuals, business and the City to help improve access and compliance with the regulations.
- 11) Nursing facility transition back into the community or diversion from entering the nursing facility.
- 12) Youth transition from school and into the workforce and assistance in obtaining secondary education. Provide readiness skills such as resume building, dress for success, job etiquette, and application assistance.

OIL further agrees to make periodic reports on basic services provided as a benefit to the City and provide an accounting of funds expended for the services provided. OIL shall provide these reports on a quarterly basis.

Oklahomans for Independent Living hereby holds harmless and indemnifies the City of McAlester from any claims or actions arising from the performance of this agreement for acts of negligence or wanton conduct of its agents or employees and agrees to keep in force adequate general liability insurance during the term of this agreement to insure against such liability and to provide proof thereof when requested by the City.

The City agrees to provide the following funding to ensure the delivery of public services to citizens with disabilities:

- 1) The City will provide funding in the amount of \$24,000 to assist in the transportation and associated services provided by OIL; and
- 2) The disbursement of said funds shall be in monthly payments that are determined by taking \$24,000 and dividing by 12 for monthly payments in the amount of \$2,000.

The term of this agreement shall be for the 2018-2019 fiscal year of the City of McAlester, and shall terminate at 12:00 A.M. on June 30, 2019, unless sooner mutually ratified by both parties hereto in which case this agreement shall continue for the ensuing fiscal year upon the same terms or upon such amended terms as the parties may agree.

This agreement is to be binding upon our administrators, successor, and assigns.

This contract is entered between Feed the Need Foundation for Rural Oklahoma, "FNF OK", and the <u>City of McAlester</u>, "Center Sponsor". The contract is effective for the one year period beginning the 1st day of July 2018 and ending the 30th day of June 2019.

In consideration of the mutual promises and covenants herein, FNF OK and the Center Sponsor agree as follows:

- I. FNF OK shall provide and be responsible for the following:
 - A. Reimburse the Center Sponsor on a regular basis to assist in defraying center staff salaries, travel, fringe benefits, and other budgeted center expenses as described in the annual budget.
 - 1. Funds are contingent upon continued federal and state funding.
 - 2. Funds dispersed to the Center Sponsor on a monthly basis cannot exceed one twelfth (1/12) of the budget unless an explanation of additional expense is detailed in writing on the monthly financial report.
 - 3. Expense reimbursement will not occur unless and until FNF OK receives reimbursement monies from its funding agency for the corresponding month.
- II. The Center Sponsor shall provide and be responsible for the following:
 - A. Provide and be responsible for the local nutrition center facility, bookkeeper and services pertinent to the operation of the center, agreed annual amount totaling \$\frac{\\$18,735.12}{\$}\$ to offset all operational expenses and any additional necessary monies. Grantee shall be apportioned **monthly** at a rate of \$\frac{\\$1,561.26}{\$}\$. Beginning July 1, 2018, quarterly and/or annual allotments are not accepted.
 - B. Responsible for the fire/safety and health standard of the facility and shall assure FNF OK that the facility meets the appropriate and required local and state ordinances, codes and regulations.
 - C. Cooperatively interview applicants for center staff employment and, where appropriate, follow recommendations for individual (s) to be employed, disciplined, and/or terminated. Withholding reimbursement funds, whole or in part, for failing to comply with policies and procedures by the Center Sponsor is at the discretion of FNF OK, Inc.
 - D. Include center staff on the Center Sponsor payroll. Center staff are employees of the Center Sponsor. The Center's budget allocates funding for 262 days per year. There are 250 serving days and 12 paid holidays. If funds are

- available, longevity payments will be made to eligible employees per the OK DHS Nutrition Longevity Payment Schedule.
- E. Provide all insurances necessary for the facility and its contents.
- F. Maintain necessary personnel records for center staff and make these records available to FNF OK for review.
- G. Provide necessary personnel for daily operation of the nutrition center and comply with monthly reporting requirements.
- H. Provide congregate services, home delivered services, and other appropriate program services on a regularly scheduled basis.
- I. Establish hours of operation to accommodate the greatest number of potential participants.
- J. Serve meals 250 days per year to congregate and home delivered participants.
- K. Provide FNF OK the supporting documents and required monthly financial report by the 3rd working day of each month.
- III. Duties and Regulation of the Nutrition Center Site Manager include but are not limited to the following:
 - A. Adhere to policies set forth in the program application and policies of the center sponsor.
 - B. Responsible to the center sponsor and FNF OK for the timely submission for all records, documents, monthly reports and other requirements all due to FNF OK no later than the 2nd working day of each month. Reports include but are not limited to: S-19 Report, S-38 Report, Contribution Check (if applicable), KF-1 (contribution sheet), OAA Intake and Update Forms, ADvantage Calendars, OAA Scan Sheets, and Nutrition Education Sign-In Sheets.
 - C. Where applicable, responsible for the banking and record-keeping of all project donations.
 - D. Maintain all records and make them available for review by FNF OK as necessary.
 - E. Responsible for the coordination of staff members, of social activities, of participant transportation to and from the center and any additional activities required by state and federal guidelines.
 - F. Conduct and complete Intake and Update forms on all congregate and home bound participants according to OAA policy.
 - G. Attend all site manager meetings and additional training as required by FNF OK.
- IV. At any such time FNF OK ceases to provide Title III nutrition services, the center sponsor agrees to dispose of equipment purchased with Title III funds in the manner mandated by the KEDDO Area Agency on Aging and federal regulation as promulgated by the Older Americans Act and the Special Unit on Aging, Aging Division, of the Oklahoma Department of Human Services.

In consideration of the promises and covenants stated herein, FNF OK agrees to provide to the center sponsor: administrative assistance, training, other assistance and supervision necessary to provide, through a congregate nutrition center, all program components required by state and federal laws, rules, and regulations for both a Title III nutrition program and ADvantage.

This contract is based on the availability of funds from the KEDDO Area Agency on Aging and may be expanded or reduced according to the availability of said funds. FNF OK shall not be liable for program objectives for which funds are not made available.

CONTRACT

This Contract is made between the City of McAlester, a municipal corporation ("City") and Pride In McAlester, Inc., a non-profit corporation ("PIM"). In this Contract, either the City or PIM may also be referred to individually as "Party" or jointly as the "Parties."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the City desires to assist PIM in its efforts to enhance the community with activities to beautify and clean up McAlester; and

WHEREAS, PIM possess the knowledge, skills, and ability to assist the City in achieving these desires,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, obligations, representations, and assurances in this Contract, the Parties agree to the following:

1. SCOPE OF SERVICES

- A. PIM will engage in clean up and beautification activities on behalf of the City in order to promote the general welfare of the community and its citizens.
- B. PIM will provide procedural assistance on behalf of the City to promote and accomplish its announced purpose to improve the overall appearance, cleanliness, and sustainability of the City.
- C. The City and PIM will jointly establish a set of measurable goals and objectives to provide accountability and assess the effectiveness of PIM's efforts. Goals shall be as specific as possible. They shall not include service on boards or commissions.
- D. In furtherance of the agreed-upon goals and objectives, PIM shall provide quarterly reports to the City that shall include the current measurements against the goals and objectives and financial statements. Said reports shall be presented to the city manager within thirty days following the end of the City's fiscal quarters.
- E. The City will independently monitor PIM's progress against its goals and objectives and may request written reports from the City's Audit and Finance Advisory Committee and other boards and committees. PIM will provide its full cooperation in the preparation of such reports and will attend board and Committee meetings upon the City's request.

- F. PIM will provide to the City a written quarterly and annual performance report on activities within thirty days following the end of the City's fiscal quarters and years.
- G. The City of McAlester will provide use of the Former National Guard Armory located at 301 E. Polk Avenue for cleanup activities during October and April and provide reasonable support of these efforts for waste removal and recycling services.
- H. The Pride In McAlester Board of Directors and staff shall comply with the Oklahoma Open Meetings Act (Title 25, Oklahoma Statutes §§ 301-304) and the Oklahoma Open Records Act (Title 51, Oklahoma Statutes §§ 24A.1-24A.30). Notice of meetings shall be sent to the City Clerk and publicly posted within the time specified by law.

2. PAYMENT FOR SERVICES

- A. In support of PIM's normal cost of operations, the City will pay to PIM the amount of \$60,000.00 during the term of this Contract in monthly payments as the Parties deem most appropriate to assist PIM in accomplishing its goals.
- B. PIM shall provide appropriate documentation to the City in support of a written request for payment. Requests for payment may be submitted at any time but are limited to no more than one request per calendar month.
- C. The City shall process requests for payments through its normal payment procedures.

3. EFFECTIVE DATE AND TERMINATION

- A. The effective date of this Contract shall be July 1, 2018, and unless otherwise terminated or cancelled as provided below, it shall end on June 30, 2019, at which date this Contract expires without any further act or notice of either Party being required. The Parties are under no obligation to renew or extend this Contract.
- B. The City or PIM may terminate and/or cancel this Contract, or any part thereof, at any time during its term upon thirty days' notice, for any reason without incurring obligation or penalty of any kind. The effective date of notice for termination or cancellation shall be the date of council or PIM board action providing for said termination or cancellation.
- C. The City's sole obligation in the event of termination is for payment for services rendered by PIM before the effective date of termination and shall

be based on a proportionate share of the total amount provided in this contact, earned to date of termination, as determined by the City.

- D. Notices given under this Contract shall be in writing and shall either be personally delivered or sent by first class U.S. mail, postage prepaid.
- E. Any modifications, amendments, recessions, waivers, or releases to this Contract must be in writing and agreed to by both Parties.

If notice is sent to PIM, it shall be addressed to:

President of Board of Directors Pride In McAlester P.O. Box 583 McAlester, OK 74502

If notice is sent to the City, it shall be addressed to:

City Clerk City of McAlester City Hall First and Washington McAlester, OK 74501

4. ASSURANCES AND WARRANTIES

- A. PIM warrants that all services performed hereunder will be performed in a manner that complies will all applicable laws, statutes, regulations, ordinances, and professional standards.
- B. PIM shall be solely responsible for all costs and expenses incident to the performance of all services for the City.
- C. PIM shall solely control, direct and supervise all PIM employees with respect to all obligations under this Contract. PIM will be solely responsible for the conduct and supervision of any of its employees. Nothing in this Contract is intended to establish an employer-employee relationship between the City and either PIM or any PIM employee. All PIM employees assigned to provide services under this Contract by PIM shall, in all cases, be deemed employees of PIM and not employees, agents or subcontractors of the City.
- D. Nothing in this Contract is intended to authorize PIM to obligate the City regarding any commitment to a third party, including but not necessarily limited to, cash or non-cash incentives and the sale, lease or donation of

real or personal property, without the prior specific consent of the city council as evidenced by a recorded majority vote in open session.

5. INDEMNIFICATION

- A. PIM shall indemnify and hold the City harmless from any and all claims which are asserted against the City by any person or entity, alleged to have been caused or found to arise, from the acts, performances, errors, or omissions of PIM or its employees.
- B. PIM shall have no rights against the City for any indemnification (e.g., contractual, equitable, or by implication), contribution, subrogation, and/or any other right to be reimbursed by the City except as expressly provided herein.
- C. PIM waives and releases all actions, liabilities, loss and damages including any subrogated rights it may have against the City based upon any claim brought against the City do to the negligent acts or omission of a PIM employee.

6. GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- A. <u>Access and Records</u>. PIM will maintain accurate books and records in connection with the services provided under this Contract for 36 months after the end of this Contract, and provide the City with reasonable access to such books and records.
- B. <u>Captions</u>. The section and subsection numbers, captions, and any index to such sections and subsections contained in the Contract are intended for the convenience of the reader and are not intended to have any substantive meaning and shall not be interpreted to limit or modify any substantive provisions of this Contract. Any use of the singular or plural number, any reference to the male, female, or neuter genders, and any possessive or non-possessive use in this Contract shall be deemed the appropriate plurality, gender, or possession as the context requires.
- C. <u>City Right to Suspend Services.</u> Upon written notice, the City may suspend performance of this Contract if PIM has failed to comply with Federal, State, or Local laws, or any requirements contained in this Contract. The right to suspend services is in addition to the City's right to terminate and/or cancel this Contract. The City shall incur no penalty, expense, or liability to PIM if the city suspends services under this section.
- D. <u>Compliance with Laws.</u> PIM shall comply with all Federal, State, and Local laws, statutes, ordinances, regulations, insurance policy

requirements, and requirements applicable to its activities under this Contract.

- E. <u>Conflict of Interest.</u> To avoid any real or perceived conflict of interest, PIM shall refrain from hiring any person who is presently employed by the City, or relatives of any persons who are presently employed by the City. Further, the City shall be notified if any such person serves in any position or office of PIM.
- F. Entire Contract. This Contract represents the entire Contract and understanding between the Parties. This Contract supersedes all other prior oral or written understandings, communications, agreements or Contracts between the Parties. The language of this Contract shall be construed as a whole according to its fair meaning, and not construed strictly for or against any Party.
- G. Force Majeure. Notwithstanding any other term or provision of this Contract, neither Party shall be liable to the other for any failure of performance hereunder is such failure is due to any cause beyond the reasonable control of that Party and that Party cannot reasonably accommodate or mitigate the effects of any law, order, regulation, direction, action, or request of the United States government or of any other government, national emergencies, insurrections, riots, wars, strikes, lockouts, work stoppages, or other labor difficulties. Reasonable notice shall be given to the affected Party of any such event.
- H. No Implied Waiver. Absent a written waiver, no act, failure, or delay by a Party to pursue or enforce any right or remedy under this Contract shall constitute a waiver of those rights with regard to any existing or subsequent breach of this Contract. No waiver of any term, condition, or provision of this Contract, whether by conduct or otherwise, in one or more instances, shall be deemed or construed as a continuing waiver of any term, condition, or provision of this Contract. No waiver by either Party shall subsequently affects its right to require strict performance of this Contract.
- I. No Third Party Beneficiaries. Except as provided for the benefit of the Parties, this Contract does not and is not intended to create any obligation, duty, promise, contractual right or benefit, right to surrogate to the Parties' rights in the Contract, and/or any other right, in favor or immunity of the City.
- J. <u>Reservation of Rights.</u> This Contract does not, and is not intended to impair, divest, delegate, or contravene any constitutional, statutory, and/or other legal right, privilege, power, obligation, duty or immunity of the City.

- K. <u>Severability.</u> If a court of competent jurisdiction finds a term, condition, or provision of this Contract to be illegal or invalid, then the term, condition, or provision shall be deemed severed from this Contract. All other terms, conditions, and provisions of this Contract shall remain in full force and effect. Notwithstanding the above, if PIM's promise to indemnify or hold the City harmless is found illegal or invalid, PIM shall contribute the maximum it is permitted to pay by law toward the payment and satisfaction of any claims against the City.

ATTACHMENT # 1 CONTRACT FOR BUILDING DEMOLITION AND SITE CLEARANCE SERVICES

City of McAlester Community & Economic Development Department Municipal Building, 28 East Washington, McAlester, Oklahoma 74501

This Contract made this <u>22nd</u> day of <u>May</u>, 2018 by and between the City of McAlester, hereinafter referred to as the "City" and, <u>Henry Moss dba Moss Trucking</u>, hereinafter referred to as the "Contractor".

WITTNESSETH, that the City and the Contractor for the considerations stated herein mutually agree as follows:

SECTION 1 -Statement of Work

The Contractor shall furnish all supervision, equipment and labor to perform and complete all work required for the demolition and site clearance. Pursuant to the Building Demolition Specifications & Special Conditions (Attachment #3), Contractor will remove structure and resulting debris from the lot; will remove all slabs, foundations, fences, sidewalks, out-buildings and any other construction on the lot, will level lot to a smooth surface free from irregular surface changes; and leave lot in a mowable condition with all small trees and bushes removed; will plug and secure sewer line at a depth of not less than 24 inches from the ground surface; will dispose of all construction and other debris only in a landfill approved by the DEQ. The Contractor will comply with all applicable Federal, State and local laws, ordinances and regulations, and applicable industry standards. All real property shall be returned to its natural terrain at the following legally described property(s):

SECTION 2 -Contract Price

The city will pay the Contractor for the performance of said contract the sum of \$_\$5,985.00\$. In addition, all salvageable materials shall become the property of the Contractor; however, storage of these items or materials on-site is not permitted. This sum shall include all required permits and all landfill dumping fees.

SECTION 3 - Contract Documents

The Contract Documents which comprise this Contract for Building Demolition and Site Clearance Services consists of the following documents attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as if fully set out herein:

- Instructions to bidders (Bid Package)
- This Building Demolition & Site Clearance Services Contract (Attachment #1)
- Bid Form (Attachment #2)
- Building Demolition Specifications & Special Conditions (Attachment #3)

SECTION 4 -Insurance

The contractor agrees to provide a Public or Contractor's Liability Insurance Certificate in the amount specified below and to indemnify and hold the City harmless from any acts of negligence on the part of said Contractor.

The Contractor shall maintain in force, between the time that the Contractor commences the Building Demolition and Site Clearance Work provided for in this Contract and the time that such work is completed, comprehensive public liability insurance protecting the City for not less than \$100,000/\$300,000 in the event of bodily injury, including death, and \$100,000 in the event of property damage arising out of the Contractor's operations under this Contract, whether such operations be by the Contractor, any subcontractors or suppliers engaged by the Contractor in connection with such operations, or anyone directly or indirectly employed by either the Contractor or such subcontractors or suppliers, and such insurance or other coverage as is required by Oklahoma law governing Workman's Compensation. Before commencing the Building Demolition and Site Clearance Work provided for in this Contract, the Contractor shall furnish the City with certificates showing that the required insurance is in force and shall be endorsed to provide that the policies will not expire or be cancelled or changed until ten (10) days after written notice of expiration, cancellation or change has been delivered to the City.

SECTION 5 - Worker's Compensation Insurance

It is understood and agreed to by the parties hereto that the Contractor is an independent contractor and not the employee of the City and the Contractor shall provide the City with a Certificate of Worker's Compensation Insurance Coverage as required by Oklahoma law governing Workman's Compensation; or

- 1. If the Contractor is a sole proprietor without any employees, the Contractor may an execute and provide an "Affidavit of Exempt Status Under the Worker's Compensation Act- Form Edition 21014" in lieu of providing a Certificate of Worker's Compensation Insurance; or
- 2. If the Contractor has employees, but by definition they are not classified as employees pursuant to 85A O.S. § 2 (OSCN 2015) 18 b 'the term employee shall not include" for Worker's Compensation Insurance purposes, the Contractor may provide documentation to show their employees fall under one of the exemptions provided by 85A O.S. § 2 (OSCN 2015) 18 b and execute and provide an "Affidavit of Exempt Status Under the Worker's Compensation Act- Form Edition 21014" for themselves in lieu of providing a Certificate of Worker's Compensation Insurance.

SECTION 6 - Accident Prevention

The Contractor shall exercise proper precaution at all times for the protection of persons and property and shall be responsible for damages to person or property, either on or off the site, which occur as a result of his execution of the work under this Contract. The safety provisions of applicable laws and building and construction codes shall be observed and the Contractor shall take or cause to be taken such additional safety and health measures as the City may determine to be reasonable and necessary.

SECTION 7- Care of Work

The Contractor shall keep the premises clean and orderly during the course of the Building Demolition and Site Clearance Work, conducting operations to ensure minimum interference with roads, streets, walkways and adjacent occupied facilities. The Contractor shall take necessary steps to protect buildings and facilities on adjacent properties and the existing utilities serving adjacent structures.

SECTION 8- Contract Changes

No modifications of this Contract shall be made after its execution by the Contractor and the City except by written instrument signed by the Contractor, accepted by the City.

SECTION 9- Inspection

The Contractor shall permit inspection by the City and other appropriate officials in order to confirm that work is conducted in accordance with the terms and conditions of this contract, and that work is satisfactorily completed.

SECTION 10-Completion and Liquidated Damages

The Contractor agrees to commence work on the date to be specified in a written "Notice to Proceed" and fully complete the project within the agreed upon consecutive calendar days thereafter. Contractor agrees to pay as liquidated damages, the sum of \$50 for each consecutive calendar day thereafter as provided by this bid package and Contract until the project is completed in full.
