The Treehouse Play Café is a fine example of a business coming in to give our youth new opportunities for play and recreation. We are proud that so many new and growing businesses across the City want to call McHenry home!

I hope you join me in downtown McHenry on March 14-16, when ShamRocks the Fox returns to kick off 2025 right. ShamRocks the Fox offers Irish fun for everyone, with the Shamrock Shuffle 5k, river dyeing, a parade, live music, food, and fun activities for the kids. In 2024, the Rise Up Foundation raised \$300,000 for the construction of an inclusive, ADA accessible playground that will be installed this year at Veterans Park. Now rebranded as the McHenry Music Festival, this year's fundraising event takes place September 11-13 at Petersen Park. Headliners include Sam Hunt on Friday, September 12 and Slightly Stoopid on Saturday, September 13.The headliner for Thursday, September 11 will be announced shortly, so stay tuned!

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

Every property owner is required to maintain their properties and buildings. This is in the interest of the health, safety, and welfare for all who live and work in McHenry. The Community Development Department has the responsibility of enforcing codes and ordinances adopted by the City of McHenry. The department conducts inspections when complaints and property maintenance issues are reported. We work closely with all residents and businesses to bring into compliance any properties that do not meet the standards set in City ordinances.

Maintain Your Yard This Season

With winter weather behind us, it is important to remember to maintain your yard in accordance with City ordinances. The most common code violation complaint Community Development receives from residents in the summer months is regarding tall grass/weeds. City Code states grass/weeds shall not exceed 8 inches.

Exterior Maintenance

Property maintenance standards exist to ensure a minimum level of safety, welfare, and health in the community. Property maintenance codes protect against a variety of concerns including fire hazards, deteriorating structures, and unsanitary conditions. Left unaddressed, these types of concerns could lead to unsafe conditions and decreased property values.



DRAINAGE

With winter thaw and spring rain around the corner, be sure to pay attention to potential drainage improvements needed on or around your property.





- Make sure that grass and plantings are in healthy condition, and that soil
 is properly stabilized. Exposed soils not only erode quickly, they also
 can build up in underground piping, causing water to not flow properly.
- Never dump anything into storm sewers or drainage ditches.



BUILDING PERMITS

It is the time of year when many people start home improvement projects. Many projects require building permits. Permits and inspections ensure each project meets the minimum requirements of the adopted building, electric and plumbing codes. These processes provide the City with a way to protect the public from potential hazards and unsafe construction.

SWIMMING POOL SAFETY

Swimming pools are a great way to beat the summer heat. However, electricity and a body of water can be a recipe for disaster if not handled safely. Pools can also be dangerous for young children if certain barrier requirements are not met. This is why permits are required for ALL swimming pools and spas.

Façade Grant Program

Our Façade Grant Program continues to breathe new life into our city by enhancing the exterior appeal of non-residential buildings. This program funds improvements or repairs that are permanent and visually uplifting, helping to create a more vibrant and inviting community. The City provides \$0.50 in public funding for every \$1 of private investment toward eligible façade improvements. From older shopping centers to historic buildings and Riverwalk-facing properties, the Façade Grant Program is helping transform McHenry's visual landscape.

Program Goals:

- Support the rehabilitation and renovation of exterior facades on existing non-residential buildings.
- Foster job creation and business development in McHenry.
- Revitalize older and historic buildings across the community.
- Enhance the McHenry Riverwalk's charm with improved facades.
- · Modernize older shopping centers and public-facing facades.
- Empower small businesses to invest in upgrades that might otherwise be unattainable.

2022-2024 Impact:

- 19 façade grants approved by the McHenry City Council.
- \$241,742 in public investment.
- An impressive \$816,297 in private investment.

The transformations below were made possible by facade grants. Together, let's continue to build a more beautiful McHenry!





IL Route 31 Widening Update

The City is actively engaged in the IL Route 31 widening project with the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT). The project will expand Route 31 to four lanes (2 northbound and 2 southbound) from IL Route 176 in Crystal Lake to IL Route 120 in McHenry. Tree removal and right-of-way clearing began in January 2025. Utility relocation is anticipated in 2026 - 2027, and road construction is expected to occur 2028 - 2030.



2025 Road Resurfacing Program

The City Council continues robust funding of the City of McHenry's Local Road Resurfacing Program, with the improvement of 6.1 miles of local neighborhood roads and a total investment of \$2.3 million scheduled for 2025. This program is targeted for an early Spring 2025 start. All streets are anticipated to be completed by July, weather permitting.

E-WASTE COLLECTION

March 17 - 21

Flood Brothers will remove e-waste at the curb on the resident's regular refuse pick-up day beginning March 17, 2025, and ending March 21, 2025.

Residents are limited to five (5) electronic items per pick-up. Out of those five (5) items, only one (1) may be a television or one (1) computer monitor.

Acceptable Electronic Items:

HYDRANT FLUSHING

April 7 - 25

The Public Works Department will begin its spring hydrant flushing operation throughout the City on April 7, 2025, for a three-week period ending April 25, 2025. Hydrant flushing is necessary to clean and maintain the water distribution system. During the flushing period, water can become discolored. If this occurs, run your cold water tap for a few minutes until the water clears. If this does not correct the problem, wait approximately one (1) hour and flush the cold water again. Do not run your hot water until the cold water tap has cleared. This discoloration is not hazardous for human consumption; however, clothing can become stained during laundering.



ARBOR DAY CEREMONY

April 25 at 3:00 p.m.

Planting trees is a wonderful way to help the environment and memorialize someone special. As part of the City's Arbor Day celebration (the last Friday in April), the Arbor Day Tree Donation Program has been established to allow residents to donate a tree at the Municipal Center or a City park. The cost is \$400.00 per tree, and a memorial brick will be installed in the ground near the tree. 

UNLIMITED YARD WASTE COLLECTION

April 7 - December 12





Flood Brothers Disposal's unlimited yard waste curbside collection program begins on April 7, 2025, and concludes on December 12, 2025. This program includes free weekly pickup of yard waste bags, properly sized bundles, or acceptable containers for every residential refuse account in the City on the resident's regular refuse pickup day.

Residents may use either 2-ply, 50-pound weight disposable kraft paper bags or plastic/metal containers with a tight cover which do not exceed 35 gallons in size and 50 pounds in weight. Two-wheeled yard waste carts distributed by Flood Brothers are also available for a monthly fee for those residents that are interested.

No plastic bags are allowed. Personal containers for yard waste must be marked with an X, Y, or YW. Branches must be bundled/tied together: each bundle cannot exceed five (5) feet in length, cannot exceed two (2) feet in diameter, cannot exceed more than 50 pounds, and cannot contain limbs greater than three (3) inches in diameter.

ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS:

Grass clippings, leaves, branches 3 inches in diameter or less and no more than 5 feet in length, brush, garden plants, flowers, weeds, bark pieces, pine cones, pumpkins, mums, hay bales and corn stalks. Food scraps are acceptable too!

MATERIALS NOT ALLOWED:

Tree trunks & stumps, branches larger than 3 inches in diameter and longer than 5 feet, fence posts, railroad ties, firewood, rocks, sod or dirt.

BRUSH PICK-UP

April 28 at 7:00 a.m.

The Public Works Department will begin its spring brush pick-up program on Monday, April 28, 2025, at 7:00 a.m. for the entire City. All residents must have their brush out to the curb by 7:00 a.m. on April 28th. Crews will visit each street once and continue until they have gone through the entire City. No callbacks will be made.

This program is for tree material only; yard waste belongs in the Yard Waste Collection Program provided by Flood Brothers. This program is intended for larger tree branches resulting from trimming or storm damage and is for residential properties only. No stumps or roots will be taken. Branches should be as long as possible and no more than 5 inches in diameter. Residents are advised to place brush on the parkway parallel to the street but not in the street.





Unacceptable Items:

- Items weighing more than 50 pounds
- Items longer than 5 feet
- · Rocks and concrete
- Construction debris: lumber, drywall, roofing materials, old cabinets, glass windows, glass doors, etc.
- White goods (appliances): freezers, refrigerators, stoves, washing machines, dryers, etc., even if broken up, cut up, crushed or flattened
- Any type of metal post, pipe, swing set, antenna, etc.
- Electronic waste or e-waste: computer equipment, televisions, printers, etc.
- Household hazardous waste: gasoline, solvents, pesticides, motor oil, pool chemicals, paint, paint thinner, propane tanks, etc.
- No tires of any kind

UNLIMITED BULK ITEM CLEANUP

May 12 - 16

The contract with Flood Brothers Disposal includes one spring bulk cleanup event per year. This year's unlimited bulk item cleanup collection will occur Monday, May 12, 2025, through Friday, May 16, 2025, on the resident's regular refuse pickup day.

This curbside collection allows residents to dispose of unlimited bulk items. A bulk item is considered an item the resident would take with them if they moved out of the residence and manageable for one person to lift (not drag). Please call Flood Brothers at 630-261-0400 if you have any questions regarding the program.

Acceptable Items:

- Couch, small tables, mattresses, chairs, box springs weighing no more than 50 lbs. and no longer than 5 feet.
- Rolls of carpeting will be accepted, but must be rolled, taped, or tied, and weigh less than 50 pounds and be no more than 5 feet long, 2 feet in diameter.









Test Your Tank

Leaking toilet tanks are sometimes called the "sneaky leak". Unlike a dripping faucet, you cannot usually see or hear a leaking toilet tank. When the flapper valve in the bottom of your toilet tank begins to wear out and does not seal properly, water from the toilet tank can leak into the toilet bowl. Sometimes this is just a drip or trickle that cannot be seen without some help.

If you would like to test your toilet tank to see if you are flushing money down the drain, simply remove the cover on the toilet tank and put a few drops of dark food color in the toilet tank. Red, green, or blue food coloring work the best. Wait 25 minutes and DO NOT flush the toilet. If the water in the toilet bowl becomes colored, you are losing water and your flapper valve needs to be replaced.

Pick Up...Help Out

When the white blanket of snow melts each spring, it reveals a wondrous new year full of surprises. Unfortunately, some surprises are trash and it is doubtful the people who left it there are going to come back to get it. Before this trash is carried away into our streams and ponds by the spring rains, let's pick it up - pay it forward - pollution starts and stops with people. Picking up trash and debris helps protect our waterways and wildlife habitats and instantly makes the area look better. What you might not see are the benefits to the earth. Each time we pick up trash and put it in the right place, we take a step toward making the planet we live on happier and healthier.

Restoration Work

Restoration work to parkways damaged by snowplows and water main breaks will begin in the spring. Materials such as black dirt, sod, and blacktop need to be available before work can begin. Restoration of damaged sidewalks and curbs will start as soon as the weather permits. This is ongoing work for Public Works' personnel and will commence as soon as possible.

Experiencing A Sewer Backup?

If you are experiencing a sewer backup during the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., contact the Public Works Department at 815-363-2186 before calling a plumber. If after 3:30 p.m., call the non-emergency police phone number at 815-363-2200. Public Works personnel will be sent to your location to assess the problem. If the blockage is in the City's sewer main line, the City will take corrective action as quickly as possible. If the blockage is in your private sewer line (the portion from the building to the sewer main line), you will be requested to call a plumber to clear your building's service. In this instance. necessary repairs and restoration the responsibility homeowner.

Free Wood Chips

The City's spring and fall brush pickup programs result in free wood chips for City of McHenry residents. Wood chips are available only at the Public Works Facility, located at 1415 Industrial Drive. They are stored in a bin on the east side of the parking lot. You may take as much as you need, but you must bring and fill your own containers.

Storm Damage Pick-Up Criteria

The City may provide a storm damage pick-up following a major storm event that has **impacted large areas of the community**. This service is intended to assist in the clean-up of severe damage and not the result of tree trimming. The City uses the Weather Command Weather Service to help determine if weather events meet the criteria and are severe enough to warrant a storm damage pick-up.

Criteria

- Sustained wind speeds of 40mph or greater
- Wind gust speeds of 58mph or greater



If the need for a storm damage pickup has been determined by the City, notification of the storm damage pick-up will be communicated via Nixle, the City website, and the City Facebook page. Residents should place branches on the parkway parallel to the street but not in the street. making that sure branches are as long as possible and not more than 5 inches in diameter. No stumps, roots, or root balls will be taken.
