Starting or expanding your business means you most likely need access to capital. In addition to traditional lending and financing, below are some lending resources available to businesses in Vernon County and Wisconsin.

Vernon County Economic Development Loan Program

The Vernon County Economic Development Loan program is a flexible source of financing for businesses expanding or relocating to Vernon County. Learn more at vernoncountywi.gov under the Community Development Department.



CARES Act Revolving Loan Fund

This revolving loan fund provides gap financing. This program will help businesses in Buffalo, Crawford, Jackson, La Crosse, Monroe, Pepin, Pierce, Trempealeau and Vernon Counties. Loan payback terms are flexible and the interest rates will be 4%-6% on average. Learn more at mrrpc.com/loans-grants.



CMV Growth Revolving Loan Fund

Amber Grants for Women

National granting program supporting entrepreneurial women, The Amber Grant offers three \$10,000 grants to women-owned businesses each month.



Value Added Producers Grant

The Value-Added Producer Grant (VAPG) program helps agricultural producers enter value-added activities to generate new products, create and expand marketing opportunities, and increase producer income.



Entrepreneurial Micro-Grants

EMG supports business planning and strategy for entrepreneurs and small business owners in Wisconsin that are early-stage technology-based companies with services and funding to support their efforts in obtaining significant federal grant funding.



Compeer Rural Investment Grants

Compeer provides a variety of rural investment grants for beginning farmers, rural business owners, and organizations that help enrich agriculture and rural America.
