### Executive Summary

In the last 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 10,251 (753,068) total new cases, 27 (6,092) ICU admissions, 94 (9,462) deaths, and 365 (40,469) hospitalizations.

The next PPE push, which will consist of gloves and three-ply surgical masks is scheduled for January 11 and 13<sup>th</sup>, 2021.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19.

While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.

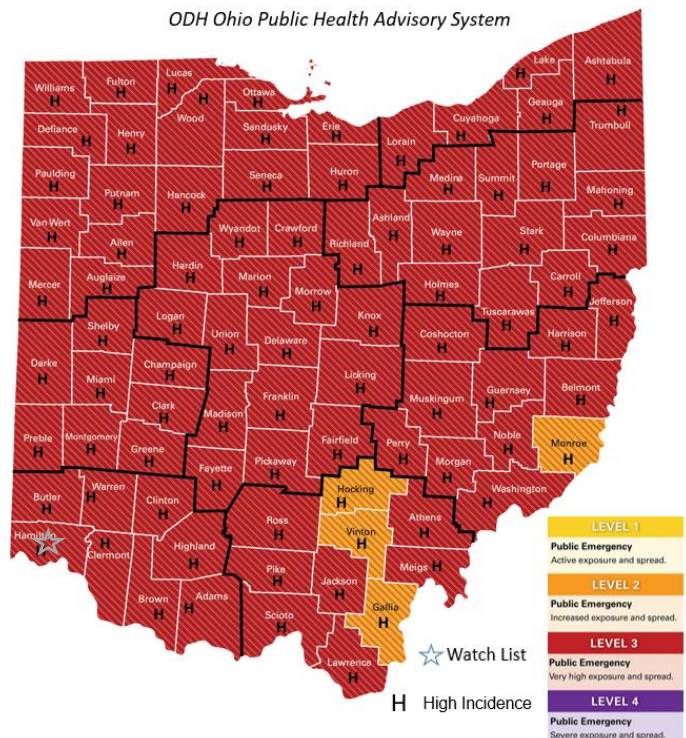

## State Community Lifeline Status

In-state Response | Ongoing External Support | Assistance Needed

### Primary Lifeline



- ODH reports an increase of key metrics (cases, hospitalizations, deaths)
- Three active RRF remain in-progress; 14 addressed and are no longer active
  - OHNG Title 32 support is scheduled to cease on March 31, 2021 with a last day of operational support scheduled for March 17, 2021.
  - Eight million nitrile gloves have been requested
  - Battelle CCDS funding is approved through February 28, 2021
- Medical Care:
  - OHA reports multiple hospitals nearing capacity
  - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supplementing Long-Term Care facility staffing as needed
- Public Health:
  - Available COVID-19 vaccinations are being administered per the state's [Vaccination Program](#)
  - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting sample collection and ODH labs
- Medical Supply Chain: Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting the RSS and Adelaide Warehouses
- Fatality Management: ODH assets are deployed and pre-staged to support County EMA needs



- Food: Title 32 OHNG personnel are providing support to Ohio-based food banks
- Shelter: Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues
  - [\(Potential quarantine locations\)](#) have been identified
  - Homelessness workgroup continues to collaborate on response



- Law Enforcement/Safety:
  - ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across statewide facilities
  - State Active Duty OHNG members are providing staffing support to select ODRC facilities
  - ESF-13 is providing site security at select ODRC facilities, county jails and ODH facilities

## FEMA Community Lifeline Component Updates

### Public Health (Primary Lifeline)

- Medical Care (ESF-8):
  - Allocations of the COVID-19 therapeutics have been determined for distribution cycle eight (8). Ohio received 4,130 doses of the Eli Lilly drug (Bamlanivimab) and 350 doses of the Regeneron drug (Casirivimab and Imdevimab Antibody Cocktail). Facility allocations were sent to AmerisourceBergen yesterday.
  - Participated in an Ohio Medical Directors Association call today. Purpose was to provide additional awareness on the different pathways to acquire COVID-19 monoclonal antibodies in Ohio.
  - The product locator tool for therapeutics is now live on the HHS Protect Public Data Hub for states that have “opted in” which includes Ohio. The site can be accessed by anyone looking to find the closest facility near them that has received allocations. See attached Healthcare Resources Situation Reports for 6 and 7 Jan 21.

  - The Ohio Receipt, Stage, Store (RSS) warehouse will be completing the first 1st push of specimen collection kits (non-refrigerated) to hospitals, based upon on the results of the survey completed for storage capacity and specimen collection kit needs. 255,740 specimen collection kits will be shipped to sixty (60) hospitals.
  - The 35th PPE Push of 4 million surgical masks and 4 million gloves to 87 primary county drop sites is happening next week in a couple of iterations.

- ODRC has 524 active positives staff COVID-19 and 8 deaths for staff members.
- ODRC has 281 incarcerated adults COVID-19 active positives and 118 deaths Ohio National Guard, 300 soldiers activated for security missions at Allen Correctional Institution, Correction Reception Center, Dayton Correctional Institution, Franklin Medical Center, Grafton Correctional Institution, Lebanon Correctional Institution, Lorain Correctional Institution, Ohio State Penitentiary, and Southern Ohio correctional Facility.
- 72 soldiers activated at 16 institutions to assist with symptom screening missions.
- ODRC has activated 50 soldiers to the Cuyahoga County Corrections Center in Cleveland, Ohio Ohio State Highway Patrol is assisting ODRC with perimeter assistance at North Central Correctional Institution and Southern Ohio Correctional Institution- both missions will be closed by the end of this week.

## 14 | Recovery

## 15 | Public Information

- Joint Information Center

*Actions Taken:*

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January 8, 2021

- Gov. DeWine noted that 221,208 Ohioans have received their first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. Over the next couple of weeks, people in the Phase 1A group will be able to receive their second dose. The Governor noted when vaccines should come in and when they should be distributed.
- Gov. DeWine noted that every county in Ohio has high COVID-19 incidence.
- Ohio COVID-19 numbers for January 7: ODH reports 10,251 new COVID cases. Total cases: 753,068. There were 94 COVID-related deaths reported. Total number of COVID-related deaths: 9,462. ODH also reports 365 new hospitalizations, including 27 new ICU patients.
- Information on Phase 1B of Ohio's Vaccination Plan:
  - Starting Tuesday, Jan. 19, vaccinations will be available to Ohioans who are 80 years of age and older. The state expects to receive 100,000 doses that first week.
  - On Jan. 20 and 21, the state is asking local EMAs to hold press conferences announcing where vaccinations will be available in their counties and how individuals can receive them.
  - On Thursday, Jan. 21, the state (ODH) will launch an online tool on the coronavirus where individuals will be able to see who is distributing vaccinations in their counties and to what eligible group.
  - During the week of Jan. 25, vaccinations will be available to individuals with severe congenital, developmental, or early-onset medical disorders.
  - On Jan. 25, the state anticipates vaccinations will be available to Ohioans age 75 years and older. The following week, it will be open to people 70 years and older; Feb. 8, the vaccination will be available to those 65 years and older.
  - During the week of February 1, the state will begin to vaccinate school personnel. This week, the state is sending forms to be signed by superintendents. The state is asking schools to go back to full in-person or hybrid learning by March 1.

- Ohio National Guard continues to provide support to Ohio during the COVID-19 Pandemic with 14 active missions COVID-19 Sample Collection Support: Two missions currently scheduled for today in Huron and Jefferson Counties.
- Daily average of samples collected to date vs forecasted is 69%.
- No Change since 31 December 2020.

- 322 ONG personnel work in 14 food banks around the State of Ohio.
- 2 specialists support the ODH Labs. 87 medical professionals are part of the sample collection teams. 43 personnel provided COVID sample courier services on behalf of the Dept of Medicaid.
- 21 pax are working in the RSS warehouse moving PPE.

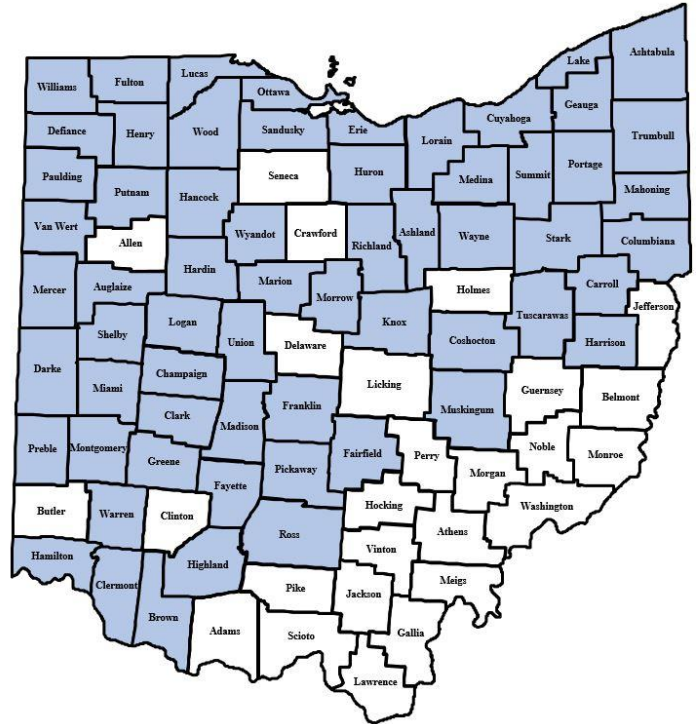

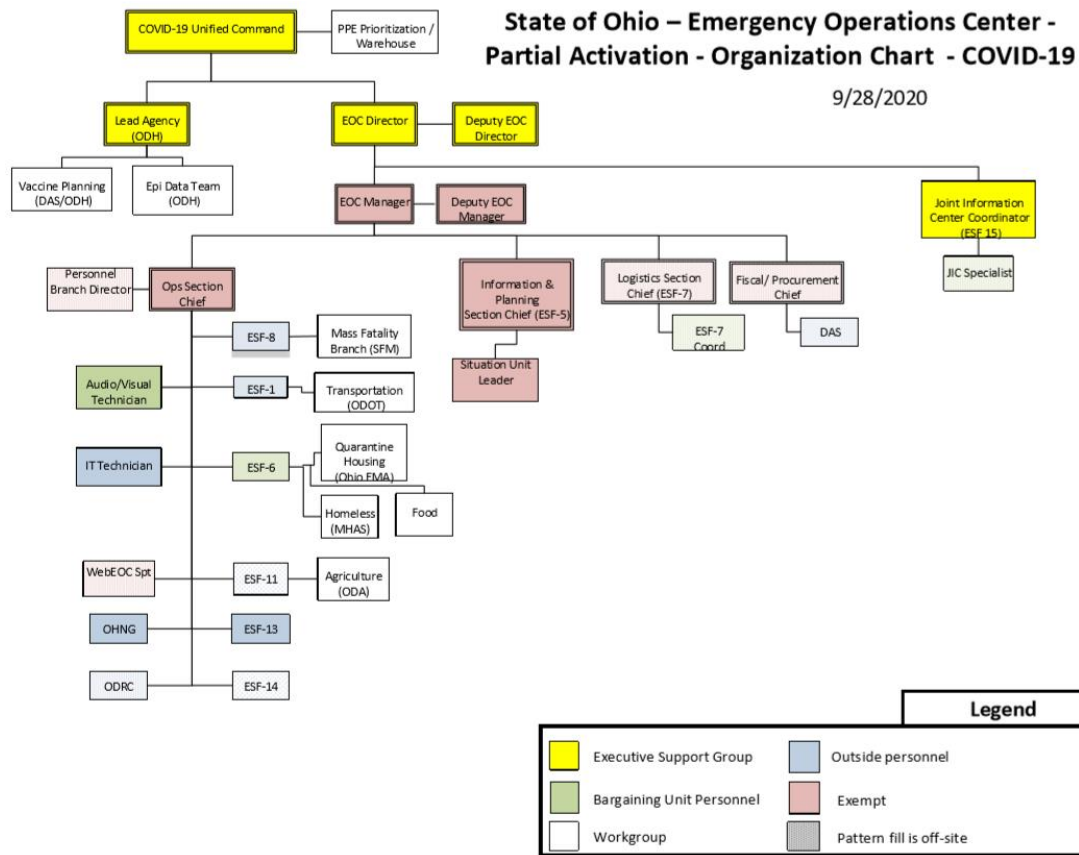
