**RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF FUNDING FOR CONNECTING THE MILL CREEK  
GREENWAY WITH HAMILTON COUNTY PARKS ADMINISTRATIVE CENTER IN WINTON  
WOODS**

**WHEREAS**, the communities of Arlington Heights, Evendale, Forest Park, Glendale, Greenhills, Lincoln Heights, Lockland, Reading, Sharonville, Springdale, Springfield Township, Sycamore Township, Woodlawn and Wyoming all share common interests in seeing greenway connections along the entirety of the Mill Creek;

**WHEREAS**, the right of way acquisitions for the greenway from the City of Wyoming to Winton Center are complete (approximately 9 miles), and Great Parks has hired an engineering firm for the planning and development of the project;

**WHEREAS**, Funding from the State of Ohio capital budget is needed for connecting the Mill Creek Greenway with the Hamilton County Parks Administrative Center in Winton Woods, thereby completing the first leg of the Triangle Trail (See attached Map);

**WHEREAS**, each member of Connecting Active Communities Coalition ("CACC"), which includes the Village of Lincoln Heights, recognizes the benefits of trails and trail planning which include:

- Creating healthy thriving communities;
- Revitalizing neighborhoods;
- Promoting economic development and growth;
- Providing safe recreational and transportation opportunities for all ages and abilities;
- Helping to retain and attract residents and businesses;
- Closing gaps in trails network;
- Increasing individual choice of travel mode and facilitating active transportation;
- Reducing road way congestion;
- Enabling extension of valuable infrastructure into northern Hamilton County such as water/sewer and broadband/fiber; and

**WHEREAS**, Trails support the health, safety and wellbeing of the general public within our communities.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council for the Village of Lincoln Heights, Hamilton County, Ohio, that:

**SECTION I.** The Village of Lincoln Heights, Hamilton County, Ohio hereby endorses the State of Ohio capital budget funding for connecting the West Fork Mill Creek greenway to Winton Woods Center project, and further supports the efforts to develop the Triangle Trail in Northern Hamilton County.

**SECTION II.** This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the health, safety and general welfare of the Village of Lincoln Heights. The reason for said emergency is the need to provide a Resolution of support while the State of Ohio is deliberating its budget for 2020.
